
RESPONSES MIGHT INCLUDE ASKING QUESTIONS OF THE TEXT, FORMING PERSONAL OPINIONS ABOUT THE TEXT, INTERPRETING THE TEXT, OR REFLECTING ON THE PROCESS OF MAKING MEANING OF THE TEXT.

HOW TO DO IT?

IN THE **RIGHT** COLUMN, WRITE DOWN YOUR OWN THOUGHTS (COMMENTARY) ABOUT THE WORDS IN THE LEFT COLUMN. YOUR COMMENTARY SHOULD BE AT LEAST 2 COMPLETE SENTENCES LONG! **CHIPS 9!!!** DRAW A HORIZONTAL LINE UNDER EACH ENTRY. DOUBLE-ENTRY JOURNAL STARTERS CHECK THESE OUT IF YOU GET STUCK!
