




DO NOW: WHAT DO YOU NEED TO MAKE A SENTENCE A "GOOD" SENTENCE?




Good Sentences

The anary wolf stalks.
The cheerful girl meanders.
The swift creature approaches.
Sharp teeth devour Grandmother.
The new strange grandmother pleads.
The evil wolf plots.

HOW TO:

- 1. START BY GIVING THIS PAGE SOME COLOR. COLOR CODE THE SUPERHEROES PURPLE, RED, BROWN
- 2. CUT THE TEMPLATE AS SHOWN BELOW.
- 3. FOLD UP THE LONG SIDE TABS SO THEY ARE READY TO GLUE. PLACE DOTS OF GLUE ON THE BACK OF THE TABS ONLY AND THEN GLUE THE LEFT AND RIGHT SIDES INTO THE NOTEBOOK.
- 4. AFTER 1-2 MINUTES, SNIP THE VERTICAL LINE IN THE CENTER. NOW YOU CAN OPEN THE TABS AND WRITE INSIDE
- 5. HIGHLIGHT OR UNDERLINE THE PARTS OF THE SENTENCES IN BROWN, RED, AND PURPLE.
- 6. REMATCH THE VIDEO TO SEE HOW THIS PATTEN WORKS IN THE MOVIE.
