The Pacific Drive Computer Science and Innovation program provides thematic computer science opportunities embedded at all grade levels for all students. This program fosters critical, creative, and computational thinking skills to support students academically, vocationally, and, most important, personally. Further, Pacific Drive supports school wide technology integration through 1:1 iPads at all grade levels.

Classroom Experience

The Dual Language program will bring together native speakers of Spanish and English. Instruction will be carefully designed and conducted in both languages. As a result, both groups of students will become literate and fluent in both English and Spanish, the target language.

The program provides the same academic content and standards as traditional educational programs while providing instruction in two languages. In this program, students will learn in a STEAM-focused technology-rich environment that will lead to language proficiency in both English and Spanish. All students in the program will receive instruction grounded in the California Content Standards and supported by state - adopted textbooks and materials. Students will learn to read, write, and communicate effectively in Spanish and English while achieving high levels of academic success.

In the Dual Language Academy, speakers of both English and the target language (Spanish) are integrated together for instruction 100% of the day. The teachers use flexible grouping and differentiation to meet the particular needs of native English speakers and English language learners.

Dual Language Classrooms

Instructional Model

In a 90:10 dual language program, the first number refers to the amount of instructional time initially spent for instruction in the target or non-English language in kindergarten. The second number refers to English. In a 90:10 model the amount of the target language decreases yearly as English increases until there is a 50:50 balance of the languages beginning in grade four and continuing through eighth.

The school day will be structured as follows:

90% - Spanish

- Language Arts/Reading
- Math
- · Social Studies
- Science

10% - English

- · Language Development
- · Physical Education
