



- Independent choice reading: setting reading goals, reflecting on reading



ELA Essentials

IB Language & Literature Year 1 is 6th grade ELA. An emphasis is placed on story analysis, higher-level thinking, and the reading and writing connection.

Objectives are divided up by:

- **Content (receptive & productive)**
- Organization
- **Style & Language Mechanics**

Class Procedures

- Most assignments will be managed through Google Classroom. Due dates, links, materials, etc. will be posted and explained on the assignment. All assignments will also be listed on the board in the classroom. Students are responsible for writing assignments in the planner, managing work time in class, and asking questions when necessary.
- Late assignments will be accepted up to 2 weeks past the due date with a max credit of 70%. Check Power School on a consistent basis for the most updated information on grades. However, please understand that longer assignments, typically writing, take longer to grade.
- Academic honesty requires that students produce work that is their own. Students should not use another person's assistance, notes, etc. to complete assignments unless permitted by the teacher. Please refer to the Beechwood Handbook for more information.
- Extra credit is not generally offered. Students are encouraged to work hard on all assignments the first time.

Hornework Daily reading 30 minutes

Reading Logs

- Students will need to read 30 minutes a day and log how many pages were read on our class reading log (Students will be given new log each week).
- Please sign and check students reading log to ensure they are reading daily.

Book Reports

- Students will complete **1** book report per trimester (3 total in a year)
- Books reports will need to be completed on the Book Report form provided in class and turn it in before the end of the trimester.
- Students may choose what book they want to do the book report on.

Classroom Assignments

- Most assignment will be done in class and students will have ample time to complete them (Including some time for daily reading).
- If assignments are completed in class it will be the students responsibility to complete them as homework.

Absences & Late Work

iPad Expectations

→ Use iPad in appropriate manner

iPads are to be used as an <u>instructional tool</u>. Students who violate classroom/instructor rules may receive a strike. Appropriate and kind digital citizenship is expected at all times. Ex: off task, not on correct app/page, inappropriate content, etc. At teacher's discretion.



Citizenship Point System

Students will receive 60 points for each day of the trimester. Each teacher will track points in their own class. Points are deducted for not following class rules.

Point Value for Citizenship Grade

(60 days)

'O' Outstanding = 60-54 points (100-90%)

'S' Satisfactory = 53-30 points (89-50%)

'N' Needs to Improve = 29-15 points (49-30%)

'U' Unsatisfactory = 15-0 points (29-0%)

- ★ Students receiving an 'N' or a 'U' will not be eligible to participate in Honor Roll.
 - ★ Students receiving 'N' or 'U' will not be eligible to receive National Honor Society status.

<u>6th Grade Instrumental Music - Mrs. Uys</u>

<u>Students may choose between band and string orchestra in 6th grade and no experience is necessary to join any music classes.</u>

*String orchestra consists of violin, viola, cello and bass and classes will meet 1st period Tuesdays and Fridays.

*Band consists of all of the blowing instruments and percussion (flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, french horn, trombone, baritone) and will meet 1st period Mondays and Thursdays..

*Beginners with no musical experience through advanced musicians are welcome to join these electives.

*Beechwood Advanced Orchestra will meet after school on Wednesdays beginning August 31 and is designed for students who have played their instruments for 2 or more years
