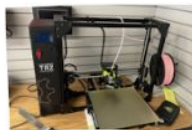


CAD - 3D Printing and Design I



Dress Code

- **Shirts:** No inappropriate designs and/or messages on shirts, regardless of cover-up garments. No plain white t-shirts. No low-cut tops, bare midriffs, halter tops, spaghetti straps, off-the-shoulder, strapless regardless of cover-up garments.
 - Showing undergarments or cleavage is unacceptable.
- **Pants/Shorts/Skirts:** No sagging, extremely baggy pants, or extremely low-rise pants. Shorts must have a minimum 3 inch inseam. Skirts and dresses must be mid-thigh in length.
- **Sweaters/Jackets:** No oversized clothing allowed.
