



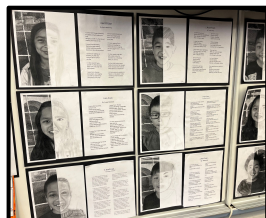

School Mission/Vision/Demographics

The Laguna Road School mission is to empower and enable every student to succeed by educating them to think creatively, to take responsible risks, and to make impactful changes in their community through acts of public service and social responsibility. The school vision through Project Impact is to provide a space for every student to discover, build, and create so that they can find their way to impact the world.

Laguna Road has unique programs for its students. It has the first Korean Dual Language Academy in the Fullerton School District. It has 1:1 iPads for Learning in every classroom. We also focus on making a positive impact through an NGSS-aligned STEAM program where students develop their ability to think critically and creatively, communicate effectively, and collaborate with others in meaningful ways. We have highly qualified and dedicated teachers who design rigorous learning experiences and facilitate important future ready skills including creativity, communication, critical thinking, collaboration, character education, and citizenship. High levels of student engagement, academic achievement, attendance, and parent involvement contributes to a positive school culture and strong sense of community.

Laguna Road School is located in the northwestern section of the city of Fullerton in Orange County and serves students in grades transitional kindergarten through sixth grade. The school population is composed of 623 students from diverse backgrounds with 69% Asian, 11% Hispanic/Latino, 11% White, 2% Filipino, and 7% identified as two or more races. We are an amazing and unique community of learners.





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School Data

The California School Dashboard utilizes a color-coded system to represent school performance across various indicators, with colors ranging from blue (highest performance) to red (lowest performance). The "Red" and "Orange" performance categories indicate areas requiring significant improvement. According to the 2024-2025 California School Dashboard, Laguna Road Elementary School has achieved commendable performance across all evaluated indicators, with no areas falling into the "Red" or "Orange" categories. Laguna Road consistently demonstrates high academic achievement across various subjects and student demographics.

However, in Mathematics, 75.71% of students met or exceeded the state standard in mathematics, with a slight decrease of 2.8% from the prior year. Laguna Road will work toward increasing the percentage of students meeting or exceeding math standards to 77.9%, the percentage it met the prior year. Additionally, Laguna Road will focus on reducing the achievement gap among demographic groups in the area of math instruction. This includes students who are socioeconomically disadvantaged, English Learners, or in Special Education.

In English Language Arts, 84.46% of students met or exceeded the state standard, reflecting a 0.58% increase from the previous year. Looking at subgroups, Asian Students: In ELA, 90% met or exceeded standards; Hispanic Students: In ELA, 73.68% met or exceeded standards, White Students: In ELA, 66.67% met or exceeded standards. Laguna Road will continue to focus on increasing ELA achievement for all sub groups by providing differentiated instruction and tier 2 and tier 3 interventions.

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Goal 1: Student Achievement

In English Language Arts, measured by spring, the percentage of students in grades K-2 scoring in levels 1 and 2 ("not mastered") on the final district diagnostic assessments in ELA will decrease by at least 10%. By Spring 2025, the overall ELA distance from standard (DFS) score on the SBAC, students in grades 3rd - 6th will maintain or increase by 3 points from 86.5 to 89.5. By Spring 2025, the percentage of English Learners in grades 3-6 making progress on the reading portion of the ELPAC will increase by at least 10% from the results from the ELPAC.

In Mathematics, by spring, the percentage of students in grades K-2 scoring in levels 1 and 2 ("not mastered") on the final district diagnostic assessments in Math will decrease by at least 10% from the district diagnostic one results. By Spring 2025, the overall math distance from standard (DFS) score on the SBAC, students in grades 3rd - 6th will increase by 3 points from 69.2 to 72.2.

To reach our goal in the area of mathematics, we will implement targeted math interventions for students who score below standard. We will also increase the use of hands-on and real-world math applications to improve engagement. Teachers will continue with strategic, standards-based planning, and vertical articulation.

Laguna Road will maintain effective practices such as developing guaranteed & viable curriculum, monitoring student progress, providing tier 2 interventions, targeted professional development, teacher planning and release time, grade level PLC meetings, vertical articulation, and use of instructional aides in TK through second grade.

Goal 2: Digital and Informational Literacy

Laguna Road students and staff will have access to and demonstrate mastery of 21st century learning tools, resources, and skills in support of relevant and rigorous learning experiences so that each student demonstrates creativity, communication, critical thinking, and collaboration. This goal is implemented through the following:

All teachers will teach and foster curiosity through inquiry-based learning, utilize the STEAM Lab to support Project Impact and a makerspace, their iPads to and from school, students may participate in Speech & Debate, Math Field Day, the Congressional App Challenge, and after-school clubs for drones and robotics, every classroom teaches Common Sense Media lessons, Laguna Road is a Common Sense Media School, and typing and 21st-century skills will be appropriately prioritized from primary grades through 6th grade.

This goal is measured through consistent access to technology, maintaining a Common Sense Media title, pursuing Apple Distinguished Distinction, and student showcases through class and grade level projects during Open House and throughout the school year.



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Goal 3: Safe and Secure Environment

Laguna Road will provide a safe and secure environment by collaborating with stakeholders to create clear, consistent routines and procedures that ensure safety for students, staff, parents, and the community. This goal is implemented through the following:

Implementation of a school-wide PBIS program to teach students clear expectations and build a positive school culture. Staff meetings and professional development days that build a positive school culture and increase morale for all staff. Create opportunities to celebrate with staff, students, and parents through cultural lessons and activities and by maintaining an attitude of gratitude toward one another. Implement tier two and tier three resources for students who need additional layers of support with the support of our tier two and tier three support teams. Provide teachers opportunities to collaborate with the MTSS team to respond and meet the needs of students who need more social, emotional, or academic support. Implement safety drills, meet with the safety team three times a year, and annually update safety equipment. Collaborate with the district to improve safety across the school through continued progress in fencing, security cameras, training, clearly marked parking and traffic protocols, and general up-to-date safety protocols. Consistent communication and collaboration with parent groups and organizations to provide a positive school/parent relationship for a safe and welcoming environment.

This goal is measured through parent surveys and input, student behavior data, MTSS data, and CA Dashboard data for attendance and suspension.

Goal 4: Parent and Community Engagement

Laguna Road will provide a positive school environment where parents feel part of the community, feel their voice is heard, and can work collaboratively with the school for the benefit of all students. This goal is achieved through participation in School Activities, Communication, and Advisory and Advocacy Roles.

Examples include: Back to School Night, Parent, Teacher Conferences, and Open House. PTA Events such as Walk to School Day, Turkey Trot, School Dances, and Bookfair. Parent volunteers and room parents in every classroom. SOS events: Carnival, STEAM Night, and Movie Night. Family Arts Night, Weekly Sunday message, up-to-date website, Social Media, and a school marquee to share school information.

Examples include: ELAC, the English Language Advisory Committee, which meets four times a year. School Site Council, which meets four times a year. PTA who meets monthly. Korean Outreach, an extension of PTA for parents who speak Korean, meets monthly. SOS, Laguna Road School Foundation, also meets monthly.

This goal is measured through parent surveys and input, along with parent participation at different events. We are actively monitoring parent engagement and listening to input and feedback from parents.
