Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)

- In 2013, the Governor proposed full funding flexibility for local school districts.
- LCFF will fund every student at the same base rate, but districts will receive varying amounts of supplemental and concentration (FSD not eligible) grants.

 Supplement funds are based on the number of English Learners, low income pupils, and foster youth.



LCFF requires school district stakeholders to develop a funding Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP). The LCAP will share FSD's story....explain how actions and services contribute to achieving our goals, demonstrate equity, and support transparency and simplicity.




Overall Score





CA Assessment of Student Performance and Progress Performance and Progress (CAASPP) (CAASPP) Smarter Balanced Assessments The CA Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) System is intended to provide parents and students more accurate and actionable information about what students are learning. The assessments that comprise the CAASPP CA Science Assessments administration are a mix of online and paper-pencil assessments. The online component contains the Smarter Balanced CA Alternate Assessment English language arts/literacy (ELA) and mathematics tests. The paper-pencil component includes CST/CMA/CAPA science Smarter Balanced: All students in grades 3 through 8 and 11 will participate in the Smarter Balanced tests, which include both ELA and mathematics content areas. These tests are administered online California Standards Tests (CSTs): The CSTs in Science are to be administered to students in grades 5, 8, and 10. These tests are paper-pencil tests. California Modified Assessment (CMA): The CMA for Science tests are to be administered to students in grades 5, 8, and 10 who have an individualized education program (EP). Assignment of the CMA is made in the student's IEP only. California Alternate Performance Assessment (CAPA): The CAPA for Science tests are individually administered performance assessments for students in grades 5, 8, and 10 who have significant cognitive disabilities and who are unable to take either the CSTs even with accommodations or modifications. California Alternate Assessments (CAA): The CAA for English-language arts and mathematics tests are individually administered to students in grades 3 through 8 and 11 who have significant cognitive disabilities. All eligible students are required to participate in a field test of these new, online California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) English Language Arts/Literacy and **Mathematics Summative Assessments** Smarter Balanced California Alternate Assessment Science California Standards Test


