




Host a virtual Family Arts Night with Asian culture weaved into each art lesson!




## California EL Road Map

#### Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELO) Grant

**<u>Purpose</u>:** Provide Increased Opportunities for Learning Recovery for High-Need Students

<u>How:</u> Provide supplemental instruction and supports to students.

When: Summer 2021 August 2021 to June, 2022 Summer 2022

#### What is Supplemental Instruction? (Academic)

 "Supplemental instruction" means the instructional programs provided in addition to and complementary to the District's regular instructional programs.

**Examples:** 

- Intervention (Reading/Math)
- Small group tutoring
- Summer School

#### What type of supports can be funded? (Non-Academic)


"Support" means services that are designed to meet students' needs for behavioral, social, emotional, and other student supports, in order to enable students to engage in, and benefit from, the supplemental instruction being provided.

**Examples:** 

- Health, counseling, or other mental health services
- Social-emotional skill-building activities/programs
- Access to school meal programs
- Training for school staff on strategies to engage families in addressing students' social-emotional health and academic needs
