




#### The ELPAC is a test that:

- Measures how well students understand English when it is not their primary language
- Provides information that helps your child's teacher support them in the right areas
- Provides information to parents about their child's progress in learning in English

#### The ELPAC has two assessments:

- 1. The Initial ELPAC
- 2. The Summative ELPAC





## What does the **ELPAC** Test?

#### Listening

Students can listen to a variety of scenarios, including conversations, presentations, and stories and answer questions about what they heard.





#### **Speaking**

Students can speak in English for a variety of purposes: to talk about an illustration or scene, support their opinion, retell a story and summarize an academic presentation.

#### Reading

Students can read a variety of materials and answer questions about what the they've read.





#### Writing

Students can write about a variety of topics for different purposes including giving their opinion, describing a picture, and writing about an experience or academic information.

#### What is the ELPAC?



#### For students on an Individualized Education Program (IEP):

English Learners, who are also identified for special education services, will be assigned according to their Individualized Education Program (IEP).

 <u>Resource Specialist/ Speech and Language Program</u> – students receive English Language Development by a rotation program in elementary schools developed at each site to provide instruction according to individual student's proficiency level. At the Junior High School level students in these programs receive an English Language Development class provided by an English Language Arts teacher.

#### Title III Letter

- The Title III Letter is an annual notification to inform guardians of their child's continued identification as an English Learner.
- The letter also includes their child's most recent language assessment results (ELCAP comprehensive scores) and district assessments.

# Reclassification (Exit) Criteria for 2021-2022

#### Criteria for Grades K-8

- 1. ELPAC: Overall Score of 4
- 2. District Assessments: "At grade level"/ Proficient on most recent district assessments
- 3. FSD Writing: Score of 3 or higher on most recent writing assessment
- 4. Teacher evaluation of student academic performance
- 5. Parent opinion and consultation
