
The District must complete an Attestation process required by the the Orange County Healthcare Authority and OCDE prior to reopening any school or District facility.

- Air Filters replaced with MERV-13 Filters
- Social Distancing Floor Decals
- One-Way Directional Signage
- Hand Washing Stations and Hand Sanitizers throughout the site
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) provided: Masks/Gloves/Sanitizer

Transportation

- Temperature Checks before entering the bus
- Hand Sanitizer on each bus
- One Student (Family) per seat
- Masks worn by Driver and Students (per orders)
- Bus cleaned and sanitized between groups of students

Nutrition Services

- Students will eat breakfast and lunch in classroom
- Lunch will be staggered between 10:30 and 12:30
- Students will be supervised by Noon Supervisors in classrooms

Distance Learning Changes

Because LEAs were compelled to shut down quickly, they received blanket flexibility to complete the school year, including an ADA hold harmless and waived penalties for minimum instructional minutes and instructional days

Confirm and provide technology for all students


Content aligned to grade level standards, and quality and intellectual challenge equivalent to in-classroom instruction

Supports for students performing below grade level, English learner students, students with disabilities, foster youth, and homeless youth

Accommodations to ensure individualized education plans can be executed

For English learner students, continue assessments of English language proficiency and ability to reclassify as English proficient

Daily live interaction with teachers and classmates



Fullerton School District COVID-19 Board Presentation Back-to-School Learning Options



- Students are provided in-class core instruction 2 full days per week and on alternating short Wednesdays
 - Monday/Thursday OR Tuesday/Friday and every other Wednesday
 - With their elementary grade-level/jr. high assigned teacher(s)
 - Classroom seating is in rows based on social distancing guidelines.



- Extended learning opportunities are provided on the other days with activities
 - May include art, outdoor activities, STEM, Social Emotional Learning and academic interventions with support staff.
 - In cases of inclement weather, such as extreme heat, high winds, rain, where social distancing may not be possible, we will follow safety and health guidelines from the California Dept. of Public Health.



- Students are provided in-class core instruction 2 full days per week and on alternating short Wednesdays
 - Monday/Thursday OR Tuesday/Friday and every other Wednesday
 - With their elementary grade-level/jr. high assigned teacher(s)
 - Classroom seating is in rows based on social distancing guidelines.



On the non-student attendance days, students are provided with independent activities, such as Project Based Learning, to apply knowledge using online resources to complete **at home**.





Independent Distance Learning Activities







- Students are assigned to an FSD teacher who will provide distance learning.
- Students living within the boundary area will be guaranteed enrollment for the 2021-2022 school year.
 - For students on intra-district and inter-district transfers, we will follow FSD's regular transfer protocols.



- A trimester/semester commitment to the program is **recommended**.
 - At the end of the trimester/semester, students may reconsider options 1 or 2 contingent upon space at their site.
 - If space is not available at the home site, parents will be provided with the choice to have their child attend school at district sites that have space in classrooms offering options 1 and 2.



DLA - Five Days of Learning and Hybrid

- Teachers will provide instruction in the target language during the student's regular classroom time based on grade level percentages.
- Percentages may be increased at the beginning of the year to mitigate any learning losses due to school closures.
- Students will have the opportunity to attend Extended Learning Rotations that will continue instruction in the target language:
 - STEM / Computer Science
 - All the Arts/VAPA
 - Rtl Spanish
 - Read Alouds
 - Social Emotional Learning (SEL)
















Fullerton School District COVID-19 Board Presentation Timeline for Program Option Choice
