INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and **Daniela Arbizzi**, (address on file), hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Services</u> to be provided by CONTRACTOR: mentoring preschool teachers, developing curriculum that reflects different approaches to ensure individual learning needs are met, and setting up the indoor and outdoor environments focusing on the strategies of the world renowned schools in Reggio Emilia, Italy. Services shall be provided by Daniela Arbizzi.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on **January 18, 2012**, and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by **May 23, 2012**.
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to **Four Thousand Three Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$4,320.00)**. CONTRACTOR shall submit a detailed invoice to DISTRICT for services satisfactorily rendered in performance of the required services under the terms of this AGREEMENT.
- 4. <u>Expenses</u>. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as

follows: Not Applicable.

5. <u>Independent Contractor.</u> CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility

social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees.

6. <u>Materials</u>. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and

for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance,

practices of his/her profession.

7. Originality of Services. CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by

DISTRICT as a basis for such services.

8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>: CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT.

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9. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within thirty (30) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the thirty (30) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

- 10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its Governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
 - (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the

services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

- (b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the DISTRICT's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property, caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.
- (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.
- 11. <u>Insurance</u>. Pursuant to Section 10, CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance with limits of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory." CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its Governing Board, officers, and employees as additional insureds under said policy. No later than five (5) business days from execution of this AGREEMENT by the DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation, modification or reduction in coverage.
 - 12. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT

shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR. Any such assignment shall be null and void and shall be deemed a basis for termination of this AGREEMENT.

- 13. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such services.
- 14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 15. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This AGREEMENT and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the AGREEMENT.

SUBJECT: APPROVE/RATIFY AGREEMENT REGARDING THE IMPOSITION AND

PAYMENT OF CAPITAL FACILITIES CAPACITY CHARGES (CFCC)

Background: On June 24, 2008, the Board of the Fullerton School District authorized the

Orange County Office of Education (OCDE) and a delegation of Chief Business Officials to negotiate on behalf of twenty Orange County educational agencies (including Fullerton School District) a tentative agreement regarding the calculation of Capital Facilities Capacity Charges (CFCC) to be charged by the

Orange County Sanitation District (OCSD).

OCSD levies the CFCC fee on property owners to generate revenues to pay for the capital construction of new facilities to accommodate projected growth. Property owners must pay the CFCC when they (1) newly connect to OCSD's system, or (2) expand the use of property that is already connected to OCSD's system. OCSD calculates the amount of CFCCs for non-residential properties based on the estimated relative demand for water associated with different property uses. OCSD categorizes each non-residential property use as low demand, average demand, or high demand. CFCCs are calculated on the net increase in square footage of a replacement or remodeled structure as

compared with the previously existing structure.

OCDE has successfully completed negotiations with OCSD, resulting in the reclassification of the school districts from the "average demand" use category to the "low demand" use category. This rate will be assessed on new capital

projects begun after July 1, 2011.

Rationale: Passage of the agreement allows the District to pay the lowest rates on any

new construction undertaken in the District that requires an increase in water

usage.

<u>Funding:</u> Currently, the base CFCC charges for low demand is \$279.00 per 1,000 square

feet of a new or expanded structure. OCSD will adjust the amount of CFCCs annually based on the increase in the Engineering News-Record construction cost index for Los Angeles ("ENR Index") as of December of the prior year. CFCCs are also adjusted periodically based on updates to OCSD's Facilities

Master Plan.

If the District undertakes a capital project which is subject to CFCC charges, they will be paid for from the funding source for that project (i.e., Deferred

Maintenance Fund, Capital Projects Fund, etc.).

Recommendation: Approve/Ratify agreement regarding the imposition and payment of Capital

Facilities Capacity Charges (CFCC).

AGREEMENT REGARDING THE IMPOSITION AND PAYMENT OF CAPITAL FACILITIES CAPACITY CHARGES

This Agreement Regarding the Imposition and Payment of Capital Facilities Capacity Charges ("Agreement") is entered into between the Orange County Sanitation District ("OCSD") and <u>Fullerton School District</u> ("the School District"). The Agreement is effective as of July 1, 2011. OCSD and the School District are sometimes individually referred to in this Agreement as each "Party," and collectively referred to as the "Parties."

RECITALS

Whereas, OCSD collects, treats, and disposes of wastewater generated within its boundaries. The School District owns and operates properties within OCSD's boundaries, and discharges wastewater from these properties to the OCSD collection, treatment, and disposal system.

Whereas, OCSD levies a fee on property owners known as the "Capital Facilities Capacity Charge" ("CFCC"). OCSD uses CFCC revenues to pay for the capital construction of new facilities to accommodate projected growth. Property owners must pay the CFCC when they (1) newly connect to OCSD's system, or (2) expand the use of property that is already connected to OCSD's system. The requirements for payment of CFCCs are currently set forth in Ordinance No. OCSD-40.

Whereas, OCSD calculates the amount of CFCCs for non-residential properties based on, *inter alia*, the estimated relative demand for water associated with different property uses. OCSD categorizes each non-residential property use as low demand, average demand, or high demand. Currently, the base CFCC charges for low demand uses and average demand uses are Two Hundred and Seventy Nine dollars (\$279) and One Thousand Seven Hundred and Thirty Two dollars (\$1,734), respectively, per 1,000 square feet of a new or expanded structure.

Whereas, Sections 2.11 and 2.12 of Ordinance OCSD-40 specify how CFCCs are calculated for replacement structures and remodeled structures. Under these sections CFCCs are, in effect, based on the net increase in square footage of a replacement or remodeled structure as compared with the previously existing structure.

Whereas, Ordinance No. OCSD-40 currently requires OCSD to adjust the amount of CFCCs annually based on the increase in the Engineering News-Record construction cost index for Los Angeles ("ENR Index") as of December of the prior year. CFCCs are also adjusted periodically based on updates to OCSD's Facilities Master Plan. Each Master Plan identifies the capital improvement projects that will be necessary over the following twenty years to meet OCSD's needs, and the estimated cost of those projects. The CFCCs are based on the cost estimates set forth in the most recent Facilities Master Plan.

Whereas, pursuant to California Government Code Section 54999.3, OCSD and the School District have negotiated the terms under which the School District will pay CFCCs to OCSD. These terms are set forth in this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Low Demand Category</u>. For purposes of calculating CFCCs, OCSD shall categorize the School District's use of property that it owns within OCSD as "low demand."
- 2. <u>Payment of CFCCs</u>. Effective July 1, 2011, the School District shall pay CFCCs to OCSD pursuant to the requirements of Ordinance No. OCSD-40, as those requirements may be amended from time to time through successor ordinances, resolutions, and/or other documents. Without limiting the foregoing, the School District acknowledges that the amount of the CFCC may be adjusted annually based on the ENR Index, and otherwise adjusted periodically based on updates to OCSD's Facilities Master Plan, all as described in the Recitals above.
- 3. <u>Property Leased to Others Non-Education Related Uses</u>. The School District acknowledges that Section 1 above does not apply to property that the School District leases to another person or entity for a purpose unrelated to education. OCSD may categorize any such property as average or high demand, as appropriate, based on the policies and criteria in place when the CFCC is imposed.
- 4. <u>Termination</u>. The obligations of the Parties under this Agreement shall terminate if and when OCSD should ever (1) recategorize the School District's use of property that it owns as either average demand or high demand, or (2) modify the CFCC requirements such that CFCCs for replacement and remodeled structures are not, in effect, based on the net increase in square footage of a replacement or remodeled structure as compared with the previously existing structure. If the Agreement is so terminated, the School District shall remain responsible for CFCCs incurred prior to termination.
- 5. <u>Attorneys Fees and Costs</u>. The Parties shall bear their own attorneys fees and costs incurred in connection with this matter, including but not limited to fees and costs incurred in connection with the Board Proceeding and the preparation of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice, request, demand, consent, approval or other communication required or permitted hereunder or by law shall be deemed given or made only if in writing and deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid and addressed to the party for whom intended, addressed as follows, or to such other address as may, from, time to time, be designated by written notice to the other Parties:

- 7. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties hereto with respect to the subject matter set forth herein and supersedes any and all prior or other contemporaneous understandings, correspondence, negotiations, or agreements, written or oral between them respecting the within subject matter.
- 8. <u>Amendments in Writing</u>. Any amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all of the Parties.
- 9. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon the Parties and their respective heirs, representatives, successors and assigns.
- 10. <u>Interpretation</u>. This Agreement is the result of negotiations in which each party was represented by counsel of their own selection. Each of the Parties hereby waives any provisions of law to the effect that an ambiguity in a contract or agreement should be interpreted against the Party that drafted the contract, agreement or instrument.
- 11. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Contract shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of California.
- 12. <u>No Admission of Liability</u>. This is a compromise settlement of disputed claims. Neither the execution of this Agreement nor anything contained in it is intended to be, nor shall be deemed to be, an admission by either party of any liability to anyone or an admission of the existence of facts upon which liability could be based.
- 13. Ownership of Claims. The Parties, and each of them, hereby warrant that they are the owners of, and the party legally entitled to settle and release, every claim referred to herein.
- 14. <u>Severability</u>. In the event any part of this Agreement should be found invalid, unenforceable, or nonbinding, the remaining portion will remain in force and fully binding.
- 15. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute one and the same agreement.

<u>Background</u>: In order to operate its emergency communications system, the District is in

need of an antenna and supporting structures and improvements. District staff has determined that the most efficient and effective placement would be on the top of the administration building of the North Orange County Community College District (NOCCCD). NOCCCD has agreed to the District's request to install the antenna and supporting equipment on their rooftop. This license

agreement formalizes the arrangement.

The term of this agreement is for one year beginning on January 18, 2012, with automatic renewals for four additional one-year terms, unless either party notifies the other party in writing at least thirty days before the expiration of the

term.

Rationale: By installing the antenna and supporting equipment on the NOCCCD

administration building rooftop, the District will be able to use its emergency radios on a Districtwide basis. This is essential in the case of an emergency,

when phone lines and cell phones may not work.

<u>Funding:</u> There is no cost to the District for this agreement.

Recommendation: Approve license agreement with the North Orange County Community College

District (NOCCCD), effective January 18, 2012.

LICENSE AGREEMENT (ANTENNA)

THIS LICENSE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into this 18th of January, 2012, ("Effective Date") by and between the NORTH ORANGE COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, a California community college district duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the state of California ("College District") and FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT, a public school district duly organized and existing under Chapter 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Education Code of the State of California ("School District"). College District and School District are sometimes hereinafter referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

The Parties hereto for the consideration hereinafter expressed, covenant and agree as follows:

Section 1. <u>License for Use of Premises.</u> Subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, College District hereby authorizes School District to use a portion of the College Site (as defined below) owned by College District, and described in Exhibit A, consisting of an approximately ____ square feet (the "Premises"), for the purposes of erecting, maintaining and operating an antenna and supporting structures and improvements for the School District's emergency communications system, including any necessary easements over other portions of College District's property necessary for access and utilities (the "School District's Facilities"), as substantially depicted on the Preliminary Site Plan drawing attached hereto as Exhibit B. The Premises constitutes a portion of College District's land commonly known as the Anaheim Campus located at 1830 West Romneya Drive, Anaheim, CA 92801 (including access thereto) and referred to herein as the "College Site."

Section 2. Permitted Uses of Premises. A Preliminary Site Plan drawing/dimension sketch of the School District's Facilities is included as Exhibit B and is attached hereto. The School District's Facilities shall be maintained as depicted in the dimension sketch attached as Exhibit B. The Premises may be used by School District for the operation of an antenna and supporting structures and improvements for the School District's emergency communications system. School District may not erect or install any other facilities or use any other equipment of any kind not otherwise depicted on Exhibit B without obtaining College District's prior written approval, which approval shall be at the sole discretion of the College District. Such approval, if given, will be given only after School District obtains any permits or other approvals from the City of Anaheim, the Division of the State Architect ("DSA") or other public agencies, as applicable, and any other consent as specified by the College District's Board of Trustees. The foregoing notwithstanding, with respect to its equipment located on the ground, School District may perform maintenance, modifications, repairs, upgrades, enhancements, additions to, and replacement of School District's Facilities within the Premises that will not alter the appearance of the School District's Facilities without the prior written approval of College District, unless such changes or modifications would otherwise require additional approvals or permit applications from the appropriate zoning or planning boards.

(a) <u>Governmental Approvals</u>. To the extent governmental permits and approvals are required for School District to install and/or use the School District's Facilities; School District shall obtain and maintain such permits and approvals. School District shall submit plans for the School District's Facilities to the appropriate agencies within sixty (60) days of executing this

Agreement. School District shall notify the College District, in writing, prior to submitting plans or contacting outside agencies in regard to the construction of the School District's Facilities. When School District has obtained all required governmental permits and approvals for the installation and use of the School District's Facilities, School District shall give College District written notice (the "Commencement Letter"), which shall state the date on which School District shall commence installation of the School District's Facilities (the "Construction/Operational Phase Commencement Date"). School District shall give the College District written notice of intent to commence installation of the School District's Facilities at least thirty (30) days in advance of the anticipated Construction/Operational Phase Commencement Date. The written notices described above shall be sent to: Richard Williams, Director, Facilities Planning and Construction at 1830 West Romneya Drive, Anaheim, CA 92801.

(b) Testing. Prior to the Construction/Operational Phase Commencement Date School District, its employees, agents, contractors, and subcontractors may enter the Premises during normal College District business hours, provided that such access by School District is supervised and shall not unreasonably interfere with College District's programs and/or activities, for the purpose of making necessary inspections and engineering surveys and other reasonably necessary tests (collectively "Tests") to determine the suitability of the Premises for the School District's Facilities and for the purpose of preparing for the installation of the School District's Facilities. During any Tests or pre-installation work, School District shall carry required insurance as set forth below. School District shall notify College District of any proposed Tests or pre-installation work and will coordinate the scheduling of the same with College District. School District shall comply with any check-in or notice requirements established by the College District and shall require its employees, agents, contractors, and subcontractors or others under the control of the School District to do the same. These requirements include checking in at Building A of the College Site before accessing the Premises.

Section 3. <u>Term.</u> The Term of this License (the "Term") shall be for one (1) year, commencing upon the Effective Date, unless sooner terminated pursuant to the terms hereof. The Agreement shall automatically renew for four (4) additional one (1) year terms ("Renewal Terms") so long as School District is not in default under any terms of this License and unless either Party notifies the other Party in writing at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the Term or Renewal Term, of its intention not to renew this Agreement. The terms and conditions for each Renewal Term shall be the same terms and conditions as in this Agreement.

Section 4. Access to Premises. College District permits School District, its employees, agents, contractors, and subcontractors the right to supervised access to the Premises during normal College District business hours only, provided that such access by School District shall not unreasonably interfere with College District's programs and/or activities, vehicular and pedestrian ingress to and egress from the College Site on a non-exclusive basis to install and service School District's Facilities. School District, its employees, agents, contractors, and subcontractors shall coordinate such access to the Premises and College Site with College District. School District's exercise of such rights shall not cause undue interference to College District. School District shall comply with any check-in or notice requirements established by the College District and shall require its employees, agents, contractors, and subcontractors or others under the control of the School District to do the same. These requirements include checking in at Building A of the College Site before

accessing the Premises. If emergency access is required after normal business hours the School District should contact Security Department at (714) 808-4901.

Section 5. <u>License Use Fee</u>. There shall be no license use fee charged.

Section 6. <u>Conditions to Use</u>.

- 1. <u>Property Installed by School District</u>. It is expressly understood and agreed that any and all improvements of whatsoever nature at any time erected or installed on the Premises by School District shall be and remain property of the School District.
- 2. <u>Appearance of Improvements</u>. School District, at School District's own cost and expense at all times during the term of this Agreement, agrees to keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, the School District's Facilities and all improvements erected or installed upon the Premises in a good state of appearance and repair, reasonable wear and tear excepted.
- 3. Approvals and Permits. School District agrees to comply with all applicable governmental codes, laws, rules, statutes and regulations relating to its installation and operation of the School District's Facilities on the Premises. College District shall be allowed to make alterations to the Premises to ensure that School District's equipment and School District's Facilities comply with all applicable federal, state or local laws, rules or regulations. School District shall, at its own cost and expense, obtain all necessary approvals and permits for installation of its School District's Facilities on the Premises. College District agrees to cooperate with School District in obtaining such permits or approvals as necessary, provided, however, that College District shall not incur any costs or expenses, including legal fees, in connection with such permits and approvals and/or compliance with any applicable federal, state or local laws. rules or regulations. If payment directly from the College District is necessary. the College District shall require payment from the School District in advance for any cost or expenses, including legal fees.

4. Reserved.

5. <u>Utilities</u>. School District agrees to be solely responsible for payment of all utilities associated with the operation of the School District's Facilities, including all costs associated with the installation of separate metering devices for the operation of the School District's Facilities. Upon School District's request, College District may assist in negotiating recordable utility easement(s), provided, however, that College District shall not incur any costs or expenses, including legal fees, in connection therewith. School District acknowledges that easements granted by the College District must be in accordance with the requirements set forth in Education Code section 81310 *et seq*. Within thirty (30) days of receiving an invoice from the College District detailing costs and expenses, School District agrees to reimburse College

District for reasonable costs or expenses, including legal fees, incurred in assisting School District in obtaining easements.

- 6. Taxes. The School District shall be liable for any and all taxes which may be levied or assessed upon the College Site that are directly attributable to the Agreement. School District, therefore, must recognize and understand in accepting this Agreement that School District and/or College District may be subject to a possible tax and such tax shall be the liability of and be paid by the School District. In the event real property taxes are assessed against College District that are directly attributable to the Agreement, reimbursement of any such tax shall be due to College District thirty (30) days following School District's receipt of a written request and reasonable evidence of amount for which School District is responsible.
- 7. <u>DSA Inspector and Materials Testing</u>. The College District shall hire the DSA Inspector directly, if necessary. College District shall hire any testing consultants directly, if necessary. College District shall not incur any costs or expenses, including legal fees, in connection with hiring the DSA Inspector or any testing consultants. School District shall deposit the amount of DSA Inspector fees or testing consultant fees plus related costs with the College District prior to the College District hiring the DSA Inspector or testing consultant. College District shall provide supporting documentation for such costs.
- 8. <u>DSA Close-Out and Certification</u>. School District may not use or operate the School District's Facilities until the project of constructing the School District's Facilities is closed-out and certified by DSA, if applicable. School District shall provide evidence of close-out and certification, in a form acceptable to the College District. Such documentation shall be sent to Richard Williams, Director, Facilities Planning and Construction at 1830 West Romneya Drive, Anaheim, CA 92801. If the evidence of DSA close-out and certification is acceptable to the College District, the College District will provide written authorization to use and operate the School District's Facilities. Use and/or operation of the School District's Facilities prior to College District authorization shall be considered a breach of this Agreement.

Section 7. Insurance.

(a) <u>Commercial General Liability and Premises Damage</u>. School District agrees to maintain in full force and effect a suitable policy or policies of commercial general liability and property damage insurance throughout the duration of the Agreement. Such insurance shall be in amounts not less than One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) combined single limit coverage per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage, and Two Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) aggregate, which coverage may be satisfied through an umbrella coverage or excess policy.

- (b) <u>Automobile Liability</u>. School District also agrees to maintain in full force and effect with regard to any vehicles which School District brings onto the Premises a suitable policy or policies of automobile liability insurance with a combined single limit of One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident throughout the duration of the Agreement.
- (c) <u>Workers Compensation</u>. School District shall also maintain in full force and effect throughout the term of this Agreement Workers' Compensation insurance in accordance with the laws of California, and employers' liability insurance with a limit of not less than One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per employee and One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence.
- (d) <u>Indemnity Obligation</u>. All insurance required under this Agreement shall be broad enough to insure the indemnity obligation set forth in this License under Section 8 of this Agreement.
- (e) <u>Notice</u>; <u>Additional Insureds</u>. All insurance required under this Agreement shall contain an endorsement requiring thirty (30) days written notice from the insurance School District to both Parties before cancellation or change in coverage, scope or amount of any policy, and shall designate College District and its officers, agents and employees as additional named insureds. All insurance required under this Agreement shall be primary and shall waive all rights of subrogation. Any insurance carried by College District is excess and non-contributory with such primary insurance.
- (f) <u>Certificate of Insurance</u>. Concurrently with the execution of the License and prior to installing its School District's Facilities or any portion thereof on the Premises, School District will provide College District with a certificate(s) or with acceptable proof of insurance from a joint powers agency, or similar entity, formed for the purpose of providing insurance to public agencies verifying such insurance and the terms described herein.
- (g) <u>Self-Insurance</u>. The Parties agree that self insurance through a Joint Powers Authority or other self-insurance program that satisfies all School District's obligations under this section is acceptable.

Section 8. Indemnification.

School District and its successors and assigns shall indemnify, protect, defend and hold harmless College District and its successors and assigns from and against any and all actual or potential claims, liens, actions, demands, proceedings, lawsuits, liabilities, damages, losses, fines, penalties, judgments, awards, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees, litigation expenses and court costs) of every kind and character including, without limitation, on account of death, injury or damage to persons or property, arising out of, or caused, in whole or in part, by School District's use of or access to the Premises or the exercise by School District of any rights or obligations under this Agreement; provided, however, that School District shall not be liable for damages caused by College District's willful misconduct or active or passive negligence.

College District and its successors and assigns shall indemnify, protect, defend and hold harmless School District and its successors and assigns from and against any and all actual or potential claims, liens, actions, demands, proceedings, lawsuits, liabilities, damages, losses, fines, penalties, judgments, awards, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees, litigation expenses and court costs) of every kind and character including, without limitation, on account of death, injury or damage to persons or property, arising out of, or caused, in whole or in part, by the exercise by College District of any rights or obligations under this Agreement; provided, however, that College District shall not be liable for damages caused by School District's willful misconduct or active or passive negligence.

The provisions of this Section 8 shall survive the termination or expiration of this License.

Section 9. Interference.

School District's Facilities and operations shall not interfere with the communications, configurations, frequencies or operating equipment which exists on College District's College Site on the effective date of this Agreement ("Pre-existing Communications"), and School District's Facilities and operations shall comply with all non-interference rules of the FCC. Upon written notice from College District of apparent interference by School District with Pre-existing Communications, School District shall have the responsibility to promptly terminate such interference or demonstrate to College District with competent information that the apparent interference in fact is not caused by School District's Facilities or operations. College District shall have the right to install its own communications devices and allow other communications carriers to use College District's College Site. If there is subsequent interference with School District use, School District agrees that its remedy to terminate this Agreement shall be School District's exclusive remedy against College District and School District hereby waives any other rights or remedies it may have at law or in equity against College District.

Section 10. <u>Termination</u>. This License may be terminated by either Party without further liability upon thirty (30) days written notice of a breach of any covenant, condition or term hereof by the other Party, which default is not cured within sixty (60) days of receipt of written notice of default.

Section 11. Environmental Matters.

As of the Effective Date: (1) School District hereby represents and warrants that it shall not use, generate, handle, store or dispose of any Hazardous Material in, on, under, upon or affecting the Premises, School District's Facilities or College Site in violation of any Environmental Law (as defined below), and (2) College District hereby represents and warrants that (i) it has no knowledge of the presence of any Hazardous Material located in, on, under, upon or affecting the Premises or College Site in violation of any Environmental Law; (ii) no notice has been received by or on behalf of College District from, and College District has no knowledge that notice has been given to any predecessor, owner or operator of the Premises or College Site by, any governmental entity or any person or entity claiming any violation of, or requiring compliance with any Environmental Law for any environmental damage in, on, under, upon or affecting the Premises; and (iii) it will not permit itself or any third party

to use, generate, handle, store or dispose of any Hazardous Material in, on under, upon, or affecting the Premises, School District's Facilities or College Site in violation of any Environmental Law.

- (a) Indemnification of College District. School District shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless College District from and against all judgments, suits, proceedings, liabilities, losses, costs, judgments, orders, obligations, damages, expenses or claims (whether by third parties or governmental authorities) arising out of or in any way relating to any such claims, costs, remediation, cleanup or damages which are incurred by College District as a result of a release or discharge of Hazardous Materials, as defined below, onto or in the Premises, School District's Facilities or College Site caused by the acts or omissions of School District, its agents, representatives or employees during its possession of the Premises, School District's Facilities or presence on the College Site.
- (b) Scope of Indemnification. The indemnity obligation includes, but is not limited to, remedial, removal, response, abatement, cleanup, legal, investigative, and monitoring costs, penalties, fines and disbursements, (including, without limitations, reasonable attorneys', consultants', and experts' fees) of any kind whatsoever, which may at any time be imposed upon or incurred by any indemnitee under this Section 11 arising, directly or indirectly, (i) from requirements of any federal, state or local environmental law; (ii) in connection with claims by government authorities or third parties related to the condition of the demised premises; and/or (iii) from the failure of any indemnitor under this Section 11, or any other party connected with such indemnitor, to obtain, maintain, or comply with any environmental permit.
- (c) <u>Hazardous Materials</u>. The term "Hazardous Materials" means any hazardous, toxic or dangerous substance, waste, containment, pollutant, gas or material, including, without limitation, gasoline, waste oil and other petroleum products and constituents thereof, which are now or may become regulated under any federal, state or local statute, regulation, ordinance or other law now or hereafter in effect, including, without limitation, any substance, waste or material which is now or hereafter (i) designated as a "hazardous substance" under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act and/or the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, (ii) designated as a hazardous waste or regulated substance pursuant to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, (iii) designated or listed as a hazardous material under the Hazardous Material Transportation Act, or (iv) is in any way regulated under the laws of the State of California.
- (d) Environmental Laws. The term "Environmental Laws" means all applicable federal, state, and local environmental health and safety statutes, ordinances, codes, rules, regulations, orders, and decrees regulating, relating to or imposing liability or standards concerning, or in connection with, Hazardous Materials.

Section 12. <u>Assignment / Sublicensing</u>. School District may not assign or sublicense this Agreement without the written consent of the College District, which consent may be granted in the sole discretion of the College District.

Section 13. <u>Legal Interpretation of Instrument</u>. The Parties expressly understand and agree that this Agreement constitutes a license for use of the Premises, and a non-exclusive license for any associated ingress and egress to the Premises, and is neither intended by the Parties, nor shall it be legally construed to convey a leasehold, easement, or other interest in real property. Should either Party be compelled to institute arbitration, legal, or other proceedings against the other for or on account of the other Party's failure or refusal to perform or fulfill any of the covenants or conditions of this Agreement on its part to be performed or fulfilled, the Parties agree that the rules and principles applicable to licenses shall govern such actions or proceedings. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.

Section 14. <u>Attorneys' Fees</u>. If any legal action is necessary to enforce any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys, fees in addition to any other relief to which it may be entitled.

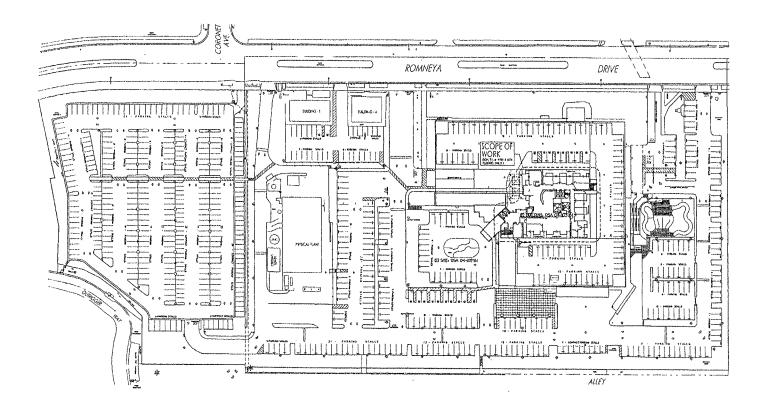

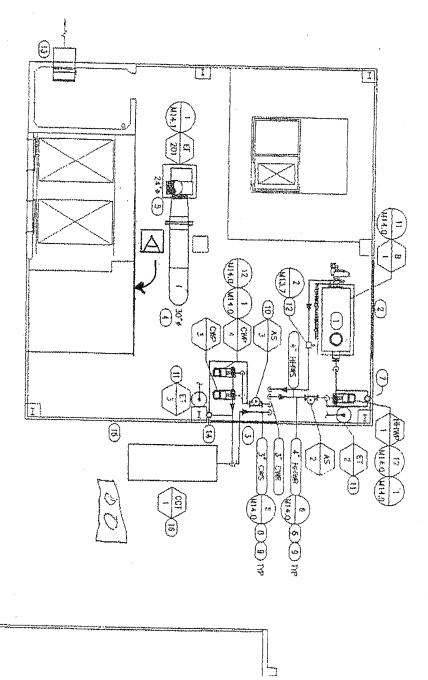
EXHIBIT "A" Premises Description and Map

TITLE III FOR ENGLISH LEARNERS

<u>Background</u>: The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) mandates that districts develop a

Local Educational Agency Plan (LEA Plan) as a requirement for receiving federal funding.

On June 28, 2011, the Board of Trustees approved revisions to the 5-year, Local

Educational Agency Plan for the 2008-2013 school years.

In September 2011, Fullerton School District was identified as a Year 2, Program Improvement District under Title III Accountability. The District is required to meet all three Annual Measurable Achievement Objectives (AMAOs) for English learners based upon the California English Language Development Test (AMAO 1 and 2) and the California Standards Test (AMAO 3). The District continues to make growth on all required State and federal goals for English learner students. However, for AMAO 3, the District did not make Adequate Yearly Progress requiring a revision to the LEA Plan. The CDE has provided each district with guidance and a template for revisions of the LEA Plan Title III.

A copy of revisions of the LEA Plan Title III is available in the Superintendent's Office for

review.

Rationale: The District met AMAO 1 and AMAO 2, but failed to meet AMAO 3 in English Language

Arts and Mathematics for the English learner subgroup. As a result, the California Department of Education (CDE) requires that all districts revise their LEA Plan Title III in consultation with staff and parents. The LEA Plan Title III addresses specific actions that will increase student achievement including teaching and learning needs for English learner students, incorporate research-based instructional strategies, measurable achievement goals and targets, professional development needs, intervention

opportunities, and promote parental involvement.

Recommendation: Approve revisions to the Local Educational Agency Plan (LEA Plan) Title III for English

learners.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and **Jane R. Vogel, M.A., Consultant, Inc.** hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Services</u> to be provided by CONTRACTOR: Vision Specialist will provide vision assessment, which may include observation, consultation, training, monitoring, meeting attendance, and program development.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on **December 16, 2011** and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by **June 15, 2012.**
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed **Four thousand** Dollars (\$4,000.00). **The payment shall be made at the rate of One Hundred Thirty-Five dollars (\$135.00) per hour.** CONTRACTOR shall submit a detailed invoice to DISTRICT for services satisfactorily rendered in performance of the required services under the terms of this AGREEMENT.
- 4. <u>Expenses</u>. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as

follows: N/A.

5. <u>Independent Contractor.</u> CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees.

- 6. <u>Materials</u>. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.
- 7. Originality of Services. CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.
- 8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>: CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT.

9. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within thirty (30) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the thirty (30) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

- 10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its Governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
 - (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the

services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

Dated July 1, 2011 for identification purposes only, between Fullerton School District (hereinafter DISTRICT), a public school district in Fullerton, California, and Buena Park School District (hereinafter BPSD), a public school district in Buena Park, California.

<u>Background:</u> Nicolas, Beechwood, and Fisler Schools have requested permission to take eighth grade

students on an overnight educational tour/field study (American Heritage Tour) during the 2011/2012 school year. In addition, Fisler School has requested permission to take fourth grade students on an overnight educational tour/field study (California Heritage Tour) during the 2011/2012 school year. These instructional programs have been reviewed and approved by Educational Services and will be supervised by certificated staff during the tours.

Required certificates and forms have been reviewed and approved by Risk Management for these 2012 educational tour/field study programs. The District provides student medical

insurance for the duration of the educational tour/field study programs.

Prior to these educational tour/field study programs, teachers will conduct lessons in American/California history, as applicable, through interdisciplinary units in Language Arts, Social Studies, Arts, and Technology. Students who are not able to attend the educational tour/field study program will participate in the appropriate and relevant educational program at their home school. Administrators and/or certificated staff will hold meetings with parents, students, and travel contractor in preparation for these educational tour/field study programs.

Supervising certificated staff and parent chaperones attend the trip to ensure an adult to student ratio of not less than 1:12. All parents/non-certificated Fullerton School District employees shall be fingerprinted and cleared prior to departure.

A copy of the Travel Contractor Agreement containing the Educational Tour/Field Study Program Details (Exhibit A), Travel Contractor Services/Itinerary and Costs (Exhibit B), Cancellation Schedule (Exhibit C), as well as the field trip permission slip, health form and the Travel Agent's Certificate of Liability Insurance and American Society of Travel Agents (ASTA) membership are available for review in the Superintendent's Office.

Rationale: These educational tour/field study programs will provide enriched instruction for students

related to their studies. Participants will have the opportunity to see history "come alive" by

touring historical sites found in their textbooks.

<u>Funding:</u> Fundraising activities are planned for the educational tour/field study package price so that

all students may attend regardless of economic status. General fund cost for student medical insurance during the educational tour/field study programs is approximately

\$2,400.00.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and **Augmentative Communication Therapies**, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services</u> to be provided by CONTRACTOR:

Assistive Technology Specialist will provide services in augmentative communication and assistive technology, including assessments, consultation, training, and direct services.

- 2. <u>Term.</u> CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on **December 16, 2011** and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by **June 15, 2012.**
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed **One Thousand One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,150.00)**. **The payment shall be made at the rate of One Hundred Forty-Five dollars (\$145.00) per hour for services billed, and Eight Hundred Fifty dollars (\$850.00) per assistive technology evaluation.** CONTRACTOR shall submit a detailed invoice to DISTRICT for services satisfactorily rendered in performance of the required services under the terms of this AGREEMENT.

- 4. <u>Expenses</u>. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: **N/A**.
- 5. <u>Independent Contractor.</u> CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees.
- 6. <u>Materials</u>. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.
- 7. Originality of Services. CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.
- 8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>: CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or

patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT.

9. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within thirty (30) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the thirty (30) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

- 10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its Governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
 - (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the

CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

- (b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the DISTRICT's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property, caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.
- (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.
- Insurance. Pursuant to Section 10, CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability, which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory." CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its Governing Board, officers, and employees as additional insureds under said policy. No later than five (5) business days from execution of this AGREEMENT by the DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation, modification or reduction in coverage.

instructional practices that will help increase student achievement. These funds are specifically targeted for program improvement schools such as Orangethorpe. Shannon Harken is providing training at OCDE in Response to Intervention (RtI) and will expand program development and strategic teaching strategies to Orangethorpe's entire teaching staff. RTI seeks to prevent academic failure through systematic intervention, frequent progress measurement, and increasingly intensive research-based instructional interventions for children who continue to

have difficulty.

On January 26, Orangethorpe School's Leadership Team will examine their depth of understanding of implementing Rtl. The team will explore issues related to leading staff through the various phases of Rtl implementation, including

consensus building and infrastructure development.

The following day, all Orangethorpe School staff will participate in training to deepen their understanding of the definition of Rtl and critical components through the various Rtl phases: consensus building, infrastructure development, and implementation. This session will provide information that addresses the necessary systems, practices, beliefs, and data based decision making to create a sustainable model of Rtl needed to support the needs of all students. The time together will include presentation, reflection on current beliefs and practices,

collaboration time, and question/answer opportunities.

Rtl practices that increase student achievement.

 - (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the

DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

- (b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the DISTRICT's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property, caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.
- (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.
- Insurance. Pursuant to Section 10, CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability, which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory." CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its Governing Board, officers, and employees as additional insureds under said policy. No later than five (5) business days from execution of this AGREEMENT by the DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation, modification or reduction in coverage.
- 12. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR. Any such assignment shall be null and void and shall be deemed a basis for termination of this AGREEMENT.

- 13. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such services.
- 14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 15. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This AGREEMENT and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the AGREEMENT.
- 17. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, marital status or age of such persons.
- 18. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.
- 19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be

considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. - 21. <u>Attorney Fees/Costs</u>. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this AGREEMENT, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorneys' fees.
- 22. <u>Governing Law</u>. The terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California. This AGREEMENT is made in and shall be performed in Orange County, California.

Free and Reduced-Price Meals

BP 3553

Business and Non-Instructional Operations

Board Adopted: April 7, 1987 Board Revised: June 9, 1998

The Board of Trustees recognizes that adequate nutrition is essential to the development, health, and learning of all students. The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate and encourage the participation of students from low-income families in the District's food service program.

National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program regulations require that lunches all districts provide at least one nutritionally-adequate meal during each school day be provided for to needy students when family income is insufficient to provide the basic necessities, including food of the proper quality and amount for good nutrition as defined in Education Code 49552 as those who meet federal eligibility criteria for free or reduced-price meals.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that meals provided through the free and reduced-price meals program meet applicable State and/or federal nutritional standards in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation.

Eligibility for free or reduced-price meals shall be based on federal regulations as provided by the State California Department of Education.

Parents shall be informed of the District policy concerning free or reduced-price meals. A letter and application form shall be **mailed and/or** distributed to all **households of continuing students** parents during the first few weeks of school **on/after July 1**st and before school begins for the new **school year**. The letter shall contain information on eligibility standards, application procedures, and appeal procedures, and the federally-approved non-discrimination statement. This information and application form shall be provided whenever a new student is enrolled.

Applications for free or reduced-price meal programs shall be available to students at all times during the regular school day. (Education Code 49557)

Confidentiality/Release of Records

All applications and records concerning any individual made or kept by any public officer or agency in connection with the administration of any provision of this code relating to free or reduced-price meal eligibility shall be confidential and shall not be open to examination for any purpose not directly connected with the administration of any free or reduced-price meal program, or any investigation, prosecution, or criminal or civil proceeding conducted in connection with the administration of any free or reduced-price meal program.

The Board of Trustees may allows the use of individual records pertaining to pupil participation in any free or reduced-price student program solely for the purpose of disaggregation of academic achievement data or to identify pupils eligible for public school choice and supplemental educational services pursuant to the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 provided that the District assures the following:

1. No public release of information regarding individual pupil participation in any free or reduced-price meal program is permitted;

- 2. Only student program eligibility may be shared;
- 3. Other information such as family size, income, Social Security numbers, etc. must remain confidential and may not be shared for this purpose;
- 4. No individual indicators of participation shall be maintained in the permanent record of any pupil not otherwise allowed by law;
- 5. All other confidentiality provisions required by law are met; and,
- 6. The information collected regarding individual pupils certified to participate in the free or reduced-price meal program is destroyed when it is no longer needed for its intended purpose.

Only student eligibility status may be shared. Other information, such as family size, income, social security numbers, etc., must remain confidential and may not be shared for this purpose.

Furthermore, no individual indicators of participation shall be maintained in the permanent record of any pupil not otherwise allowed by law. Data may be provided for this use these purposes only to the persons in the following positions: Director of Instructional Support Educational Services; Director of Informational Technology and Media Services; Coordinator of Educational Technology Assessment and Accountability; and, Director of Administrative Services.

If a student transfers from the District to another district or to a private school, the Superintendent or designee may release the student's eligibility status or a copy of his/her free and reduced-price meal application to the other district or school to assist in the continuation of the student's meal benefits.

A public news release containing information and eligibility standards for free er and reduced-price meals shall be made available to local news media, the employment office, and any major employers who are contemplating large layoffs in the attendance area of the District early in near the beginning of the school year. Copies of this public release shall be made available upon request to any interested party. Subsequent changes in the District eligibility standards during the school year, which are approved by the State agency, shall also be announced publicly.

California Education Code 49557 requires the District to develop a plan ensuring that students receiving free and reduced-price meals are not discriminated against in the implementation of the food services program. The **Fullerton School District's approved** plan shall ensures that:

- 1. The names of the children shall not be published, posted, or announced in any manner, or used for any other purpose other than as specified in Education Code 49558.
- 2. There shall be no overt identification of any of the children by the use of special tokens or tickets or by any other means.
- 3. The children shall not be required to work for their meals or milk.
- 4. The children shall not be required to use a separate dining area, go through a separate entrance, or consume their meals or milk at a different time.
- 5. When more than one lunch, breakfast or type of milk is offered, the children shall have the same choice of meals or milk that is available to those children who pay the full price.

The Board of Trustees believes that all children should have the opportunity to receive educational services. Staff shall encourage parents/guardians to enroll all school-aged children in school.

The Superintendent/designee shall maintain procedures which provide for the verification of all entrance requirements specified in law and in Board policies and regulations.

Parents/guardians may be required by school or district officials to present verification of their residential address at the time of registration or at any other time officials may deem necessary.

Students with valid visas or other immigration documents should present them for inspection at the time of enrollment. Copies of these documents may be made and kept on file with other enrollment documentation.

Verification of residency is required for the first enrollment of any student within the District. If the student moves from the school attendance area of first enrollment into a different school attendance area, a new verification of residency will be required. Definition of "residency" includes district residency, foster care residency, McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act residency, and other provisions as set forth in the education code.

No child shall be unconditionally admitted to any District school without presentation of a fully documented immunization record as required by law, unless otherwise exempted.

Board Deleted:

The Board of Trustees may authorize the creation of specialized and innovative programs within-schools to provide quality academic experiences for students through unique approaches, techniques, strategies and/or curricular focus. These specialized and innovative programs will be categorized as "District Choice Programs". Such specialized and innovative programs should be consistent with current research on effective educational practices. All District Choice Programs will be required to offer a comprehensive educational experience that assists all students in meeting State and District standards and expectations by teaching the District adopted core curriculum.

Each District Choice Program, while located on a specific school campus, will have no resident student population and will be open to all residents of the Fullerton School District and, if space is available, may be open to Interdistrict Transfer students. District Choice Programs may not result in a segregated program nor discriminate on the basis of race, ethnicity, gender, religion, national origin, sexual orientation or handicapping condition, inequitable distribution of staff or resources, unequal access to programs, or any other circumstance that may adversely affect the learning environment of students not enrolled in the program.

Students must apply for admission to these programs. District Choice Programs may establish specific entrance procedures, criteria and requirements. These and any other unique procedures, criteria and requirements of a District Choice Program must be uniformly applied to all applicants and program participants in a fair, unbiased and equitable manner. Academic achievement and/or athletic ability may not be considered when approving applications to District Choice Programs.

If the number of qualified students exceeds the available space in a District Choice Program then the principal/designee will utilize the processes outlined in Board Policy and Regulation 5116 to determine the order of admission and/or placement on waiting lists. District policies and regulations regarding Interdistrict Transfer students will apply to such students applying for admission to any District Choice Program.

Students accepted into a District Choice Program may be dismissed from the program following the criteria and procedures contained in Board Policy and Regulations 5116 or 5117. Students accepted into a District Choice program will be expected to remain in the program for the entire school year unless dismissed from the proram as provided in Board Policy and Regulations.

The Superintendent/designee shall annually evaluate each District Choice Program in accordance with applicable laws and standards and will present the results of the evaluation to the Board. Such programs shall be discontinued if they fail to demonstrate positive effects on student achievement over a reasonable period of time or if interest in the program declines and no longer justifies the allocation of staff and/or other district resources.

Agenda Content

Fullerton School District Board **meeting** agendas shall state the meeting time and place and shall briefly describe each business item to be transacted or discussed, including items to be discussed in Closed Session. **(Government Code 54954.2)**

The agenda shall provide members of the public the opportunity to address the Board on any agenda item before or during the Board's consideration of the item. The agenda shall **also** provide members of the public an opportunity to speak at regular meetings on matters which are not on the agenda but which are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. (**Education Code 35145.5**; **Government Code 54954.3**)

The agenda shall specify that an individual who requires disability-related accommodations or modifications, including auxiliary aids and services, in order to participate in the Board meeting should contact the Superintendent or designee. (Government Code 54954.2) Notification 72 hours prior to a Board meeting will enable the District to make reasonable arrangements to ensure accommodation and accessibility to the meeting.

Agenda Preparation

The Board President and the Superintendent, as Secretary to the Board, shall work together to develop the agenda for each regular and special meeting. Each agenda shall reflect the District's vision and goals and the Board's focus on student learning.

When a Board Member requests a possible future agenda item during a Board Meeting, Board Protocol shall be followed before an item is placed on a meeting agenda.

A Board member may submit an item for the Board agenda. Items submitted less than ten (10) working days before the scheduled meeting date may be placed on the agenda of a later meeting.

A member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the **Superintendent's Office** with supporting documents and information.

The **Board President and** Superintendent shall decide whether a request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. Items not within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board may not be placed on the agenda. In addition, the Board President and/or Superintendent shall determine if the item is merely a request for information or whether the issue is covered by an existing policy or administrative regulation before placing the item on the agenda.

The Board President and Superintendent shall decide whether an agenda item is appropriate for discussion in Open or Closed Session, and whether the item should be an action item subject to Board vote, an information item that does not require immediate action, or a consent item that is routine in nature and for which no discussion is anticipated how the item shall be stated on the agenda.

BB 9322

Members of the public with complaints about individual employees should utilize District complaint policies and procedures before bringing complaints to the Board for consideration.

Consent Items

In order to promote efficient meetings, the Board may act upon more than one item by a single vote through the use of a consent agenda. Consent items are items of a routine nature or items for which no Board discussion is anticipated and for which the Superintendent recommends approval.

In accordance with law, the public has a right to comment on any consent items. At the request of any member of the Board, an item on the consent agenda shall be removed and given individual consideration for action as a regular agenda item.

Board Member Preparation

A copy of the agenda shall be forwarded to each Board member at least three days before each regular meeting. Board members should carefully review agenda packets prior to the meeting. They are encouraged to contact the Superintendent prior to the meeting for clarification or for responses to any questions that they may have on agenda items.

Agenda Dissemination to Board Members and Members of the Public

At least three days (72 hours) before each regular meeting, the Board Agenda will be posted on the District's web site for review by Board Members, District staff, and the public. The agenda will include minutes to be approved and a brief description of each Board Agenda item for discussion at the upcoming Board meeting.

When special meetings are called, the Superintendent or designee shall post the Special Board Agenda and supporting documents, if any, on the District's web site at least one day (24 hours) prior to the meeting for review by Board Members, District staff, and the public. Per AB 1344, the Board is prohibited from calling a special meeting regarding salaries, salary schedules, or compensation paid in the form of fringe benefits.

Board members shall access electronic files and review agenda materials before each meeting. In order to give opportunity for staff to provide well-researched answers, individual members are encouraged to contact the Superintendent with questions or ask for further clarification and information from the Superintendent about Board Agenda items in a timely manner prior to the Board Meeting.

If a document is posted or distributed to the Board, the Superintendent or designee shall make the document available for public inspection at the time the document is distributed to a majority of the Board provided that the document is a public record under the Public Records Act and related to an agenda item for an Open Session of a regular Board Meeting. The Superintendent or designee may also post the document on the District's web site in a position and manner that makes it clear that the document relates to an agenda item for an upcoming meeting. (Government Code 54957.5)

Any documents prepared by the District or the Board and distributed during a public meeting shall be made available for public inspection at the meeting. Any documents prepared by another person shall be made available for public inspection after the meeting. These requirements shall not apply to a document that is exempt from public disclosure under the Public Records Act. (Government Code 54957.5)

Upon request, the Superintendent or designee shall make the agenda, agenda packet, and/or writings distributed at the meeting available in appropriate alternative formats to persons with a disability, as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act. (Government Code 54954.1)

Any request for mailed copies of agendas or agenda packets shall be in writing and shall be valid for the calendar year in which it is filed. Written requests must be renewed following January 1 of each year. (Government Code 54954.1) Persons requesting mailing of the agenda or agenda packet shall pay an annual fee, as determined by the Superintendent or designee, not to exceed the cost of providing the service.

Meeting Conduct

Bylaws of the Board Board Adopted: November 25, 1997

Board Revised:

Meeting Procedures

All Fullerton School District Board of Trustees meetings shall begin on time and shall be guided by an agenda prepared in accordance with Board bylaws and posted and distributed in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act (open meeting requirements) and other applicable laws. Rosenberg's Rules of Order shall govern the parliamentary procedure when procedures are questioned.

The Board President shall conduct Board meetings in accordance with Board bylaws and procedures that enable the Board to efficiently consider issues and carry out the will of the majority.

The Board believes that late night meetings deter public participation, can affect the Board's decisionmaking ability, and can be a burden to staff. Regular Board meetings shall be adjourned by no later than 9:00 p.m. 10:30 p.m. unless extended to a specific time determined by a majority of the Board. The meeting shall be extended no more than once and subsequently may be adjourned to a later date.

Quorum and Abstentions

A majority of the number of filled positions on the Board constitutes a quorum.

Unless otherwise provided by law, an affirmative vote by a majority of all membership of the Board is required to approve any action under consideration, regardless of the number of members present.

The Board shall act by majority vote of all of the membership constituting the Board. (Education Code 35164)

The Board believes that when no conflict of interest requires abstention, its members have a duty to vote on issues before them. When a member abstains, his/her abstention shall not be counted for purposes of determining whether a majority of the membership of the Board has taken action.

Public Participation

Members of the public are encouraged to attend Board meetings and may address the Board concerning any item on the agenda or within the Board's jurisdiction. Persons attending Board meetings shall not be requested to sign in, complete a questionnaire, or otherwise provide their name or other information as a condition of attending the meeting. All public communications with the Board are subject to requirements of relevant Board policies and administrative regulations.

In order to conduct District business in an orderly and efficient manner, the Board requests requires that public presentations to the Board comply with the following procedures:

1. Prior to the start of the meeting, persons wishing to speak will, on forms provided, indicate their name, city, and item on which they intend to speak.

BB 9323

1. The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board either before or during the Board's consideration of the items of business to be discussed at regular or special meetings on any item of interest to the public that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, either before or during the Board's consideration of the item. Persons wishing to address the Board are requested to complete and submit a "Request to Speak" slip to the secretary. The Board President shall control debate as to repetitive or irrelevant remarks so that all have an opportunity to speak before others speak for a second time. No person shall speak more than twice during the same meeting on the same question or issue, not shall any one person speak longer than three minutes on a topic without leave of the Board. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.3)

When a group wishes to address the Board on the same subject, the President may request that a spokesperson be chosen to speak for the group so as to avoid unnecessary repetition.

- 2. At a place At a time so designated on the agenda at a regular meeting, members of the public may bring before the Board, at a regular meeting, matters that are not listed on the agenda that are within the Board jurisdiction. The Board may refer such a matter to the Superintendent/designee or take it under advisement, but shall not take no action or discussion on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, except as authorized by law. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.2)
- 3. Without taking action, Board members or District staff members may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed by the public about items not appearing on the agenda. Additionally, on their own initiative or in response to questions posed by the public, a Board or staff member may ask a question for clarification, make a brief announcement, or make a brief report on his/her own activities. (Government Code 54954.2)

Furthermore, the Board may respond to the public by referring the comment/question to the Superintendent for a response, provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, or by asking the Superintendent staff to report back to the Board concerning the any matter.

- 4. The Board need not allow the public to speak on any item that has already been considered by a committee composed exclusively of Board members at a public meeting where the public had the opportunity to address the committee on that item. **However**, if the Board determines that the item has been substantially changed since the committee heard it **the item**, the Board shall provide an opportunity for the public to speak. (Government Code 54954.3)
- 5. A person wishing to be heard by the Board shall first be recognized by the President and shall then proceed to comment. Individual speakers shall be allowed three minutes to address the Board on each agenda or nonagenda item. The Board limits the total time for public input on each item to 20 minutes. The total time allowed for public comment shall be 30 minutes. Public comments about an item that is on the posted agenda will be heard at the time the agenda item is considered by the Board. Public comments about an item that is not on the posted agenda will be heard at the beginning of the Board meeting agenda. With Board consent, the President may increase or decrease the time allowed for public presentation, depending on the topic and the number of persons wishing to be heard. If there has been a prior speaker addressing the same viewpoint, the speaker shall address new information pertaining to the subject. The President may take a poll of speakers for or against a particular issue and may ask that additional persons speak only if they have something new to add.
- 6. The Board President, in consultation with the Superintendent, may rule on the appropriateness of a topic. If the topic would be more suitably addressed at a later time, the President may indicate the time and place when it should be presented.

The Board shall not prohibit public criticism of its policies, procedures, programs, services, acts, or omissions. (Government Code 54954.3) Whenever a member of the public initiates specific complaints or charges against an employee, the Board President shall inform the complainant that in order to protect the employee's right to adequate notice before a hearing of such complaints and charges, and also to preserve the ability of the Board to legally consider the complaints or charges in any subsequent evaluation of the employee, it is the policy of the Board to hear such complaints or charges in closed session unless otherwise requested by the employee pursuant to Government Code 54957. The Board President shall also encourage the complainant to file a complaint using the appropriate District complaint procedure.

7. The Board President shall not permit any disturbance or willful interruption of Board meetings. Persistent disruption by an individual or group shall be grounds for the chair President to terminate the privilege of addressing the Board.

The Board may remove disruptive individuals and order the room cleared if necessary. **When such disruptive conduct occurs, the Superintendent or designee may contact local law enforcement.** In this case, members of the media not participating in the disturbance shall be allowed to remain, and individual(s) not participating in such disturbances may be allowed to remain at the discretion of the Board. When the room is ordered cleared due to a disturbance, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda. (Government Code 54957.9)

- 8. The District has an established procedure for considering complaints regarding individual employees. Members of the public are urged to avail themselves of the procedure so that their concerns can be addressed fully and dealt with fairly. If any person, including members of the Board, school administrators, and members of the public, requests an opportunity to present complaints to the Board about a specific employee, he or she shall first notify the Superintendent or Board President. Notice will be given to the person against whom the complaints are directed. If the complaint is not resolved satisfactorily at the administrative level, the matter will be scheduled for a Closed Session meeting of the Board. The employee complained against must be given at least 24 hours written notice of the opportunity to request that such complaints be heard in Open Session of the Board, or to be present in Closed Session if the Board so agrees.
- 9. The procedures are not designed to restrict public criticism of policies, procedures, programs or services of the District, or the acts or omissions of the Board. To the extent that the law permits members of the public to insist that their criticism of or charges against identified employees be heard during the Open Session portions of the board meeting, it shall (except in exceptional circumstances) be the practice of this Board to listen without comment. Moreover, it shall (except in exceptional circumstances) be the practice of this Board to take no action with regard to complaints or charges unless they have been handled through the steps of the District's complaint procedure and, if review by the Board is requested, heard by the Board in Closed Session.

Recording by the Public

The Superintendent or designee shall designate locations from which members of the public may broadcast, photograph, or tape record open meetings without causing a distraction.

If the Board finds that noise, illumination, or obstruction of view related to these activities would persistently disrupt the proceedings, these activities shall be discontinued or restricted as determined by the Board. (Government Code 54953.5, 54953.6)

SUBJECT: TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN REPORT

Background: Senate Bill 1381 changed California's entry-age for kindergarten from five years

of age by December 2 to September 1. To allow districts time to prepare for implementation, the new age requirement will be phased-in over three years beginning in the 2012/2013 school year. For those "young fives" the bill creates

transitional kindergarten to build a bridge between early learning and

kindergarten. Transitional Kindergarten (TK) is defined as the first year of a two-year kindergarten program that uses a modified kindergarten curriculum

that is age and developmentally appropriate.

Rationale: SB 1381 requires school districts to begin phasing in Transitional Kindergarten

(TK) in the 2012/2013 school year. However, current fiscal uncertainty in the

State may potentially impact the Transitional Kindergarten program

implementation. The Governor's preliminary budget proposal eliminates the mandate to provide a TK program, but retains the enrollment date change to November 1 from December 2 for 2012/2013. A foundational TK program has been designed by a District committee of kindergarten teachers, principals, and District staff. It is standards-based and is delivered through a developmental, hands-on, 21st Century arts and technology program. The TK program or an Early Admission Kindergarten (EAK) program will be implemented if funding

remains in place.
