Background: Friday Night Live Partnership Mission Statement: To build partnerships for positive

and healthy youth development, which engages youth as active leaders and

resources in their communities.

The Orange County Friday Night Live Partnership Services (OCFNLPS) takes the form of a partnership service program on school campuses and in community-based organizations. The voluntary program provides support and opportunities for young people to develop meaningful skills while addressing alcohol, tobacco, and other drug and violence issues at their schools and in their communities.

Each partnership service program consists of a group of young people, along with an adult advisor, who work together to make positive changes in their schools and communities. OCFNLPS staff provide technical assistance, leadership training, and support for chapter development. Students meet during the lunch break.

Laguna Road School and Nicolas Jr. High School have offered a Friday Night Live Partnership Services program since the program was developed several years ago. The Orange County Department of Education, as part of an agreement with the County of Orange, wishes to contract with Fullerton School District, Laguna Road School and Nicolas Jr. High School. Orange County Department of Education is offering a total of \$2,000 in stipends. The two staff members at Laguna Road School and Nicolas Jr. High School who serve as advisors to the program will receive the stipends upon presentation of satisfactory documentation. 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AGREEMENT FOR PROVISION OF ORANGE COUNTY FRIDAY NIGHT LIVE PARTNERSHIP SERVICES BETWEEN

This AGREEMENT, entered into this 1st day of September, 2016, which date is enumerated for purposes of reference only, is by and between Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa, California 92626, hereinafter referred to "SUPERINTENDENT", and Fullerton School District, 1401 West Valencia Drive, Fullerton, California 92833, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT has entered into an AGREEMENT with the COUNTY OF ORANGE, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY", to offer Orange County Friday Night Partnership services to the residents of Orange County; and

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT is desirous of contracting with DISTRICT for the provision of Orange County Friday Night Live Partnership advisor stipends in order to comply with the Agreement with COUNTY to provide comprehensive primary prevention programs to the residents of Orange County; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is specially trained, experienced and competent to perform the services required, and is agreeable to the rendering of such services according to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

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NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1.0 SCOPE OF WORK. SUPERINTENDENT hereby engages DISTRICT as independent contractor to provide the services as described in the "2016-2017 Participation & Stipend Requirements for School-Based Chapters", which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference. SUPERINTENDENT shall provide advisor stipends to the designated Orange County Friday Night Live chapter advisor(s) at Fullerton School District, 1401 West Valencia Drive, Fullerton, California 92833. DISTRICT hereby agrees to perform said work upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth for the Community & Student Support Services Program.
- 2.0 TERM. DISTRICT shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on September 1, 2016 and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by June 30, 2017, subject to termination as set forth in this AGREEMENT.

3.0 PAYMENT.

A. SUPERINTENDENT agrees to pay DISTRICT for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to Section 1.0 of this AGREEMENT the total sum not to exceed Two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).

Reimbursement for Advisor Stipends shall be made at the maximum rate of One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for each eligible school chapter.

Verification and completion of all activities by June 1, 2017, is required to receive full stipend. Payment to DISTRICT shall be made upon satisfactory performance of activities identified in Section 1.0 of this AGREEMENT, satisfactory completion of reporting requirements, and receipt and approval of an itemized invoice. Payment shall be

mailed to: Fullerton School District, 1401 West Valencia Drive, Fullerton, California 92833, or at such other place as DISTRICT may designate in writing. Payment shall be made within thirty (30) days from receipt of an accurate invoice from DISTRICT.

- B. DISTRICT shall not claim reimbursement for food, equipment purchases, or services provided beyond the expiration and/or termination of this AGREEMENT, except as may otherwise be provided under this AGREEMENT.
- C. SUPERINTENDENT may withhold or delay any payment should DISTRICT fail to comply with any of the provisions set forth in this AGREEMENT.
- D. The obligation of SUPERINTENDENT under this AGREEMENT is contingent upon the availability of funds furnished by the State of California. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, this AGREEMENT may be terminated, and SUPERINTENDENT'S fiscal obligations hereunder shall be limited to the amount owed to DISTRICT for services thus far performed at the time notice is given to DISTRICT. SUPERINTENDENT shall provide DISTRICT written notification of such termination. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the DISTRICT or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- 4.0 EXPENSES. SUPERINTENDENT shall not be liable to DISTRICT for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by DISTRICT in performing services for SUPERINTENDENT, except as follows: N/A.
- 5.0 <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>. DISTRICT, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. DISTRICT

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understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the SUPERINTENDENT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of SUPERINTENDENT the and/or to which SUPERINTENDENT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. DISTRICT assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. DISTRICT shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to DISTRICT'S employees.

- 6.0 <u>HOLD HARMLESS</u>. DISTRICT agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the SUPERINTENDENT, the Orange County Board of Education and its officers, agents and employees from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
 - (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or
 - (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or
 - (2) above, sustained by the DISTRICT or any person, firm or corporation employed by the DISTRICT, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of

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the SUPERINTENDENT, the Orange County Board of Education, or its officers, employees or agents.

- Any injury to or death of any persons, including the SUPERINTENDENT or its officers, agents and employees, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the DISTRICT, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the DISTRICT, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off SUPERINTENDENT'S property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the SUPERINTENDENT, the Orange County Board of Education, or its officers, employees or agents.
- (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.
- ASSIGNMENT. The obligations of the DISTRICT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the DISTRICT without prior written approval of SUPERINTENDENT.
- TOBACCO USE POLICY. In the interest of public health, SUPERINTENDENT provides a tobacco-free environment. Smoking or the use of any tobacco products are prohibited in buildings and vehicles, and on any property owned, leased or contracted for by the SUPERINTENDENT pursuant to SUPERINTENDENT Policy 400.15. Failure to abide with

conditions of this policy could result in the termination of this AGREEMENT.

- 9.0 <u>NON-DISCRIMINATION</u>. DISTRICT agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such persons.
- 10.0 TERMINATION. SUPERINTENDENT or DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without case, terminate this AGREEMENT. SUPERINTENDENT and DISTRICT shall provide written notice to the other party thirty (30) days in advance of termination. SUPERINTENDENT shall compensate DISTRICT only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by SUPERINTENDENT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by DISTRICT. Notice shall be deemed given when received by SUPERINTENDENT or DISTRICT or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- 11.0 NOTICE. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by:

 (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. removed because they contained asbestos. The ceiling grid and acoustical tiles now need to be replaced with new material. As part of this project, work is to include but not limited to a new suspended ceiling grid and acoustical tile.

Pursuant to Public Contract Code section 20111(b), the current bid threshold for public agency construction contracts is \$15,000. The estimated cost of the project, including soft costs and contingency, is in excess of the current bid

limit. Therefore, the District went out to bid for the contract.

Funding: The contract amount is \$332,000 to be paid from the Special Reserve Fund for

Capital Outlay Projects.

2016-2017 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Agreement is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and **Portland Children's Museum, Opal School**, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special Services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special Services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special Services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Services to be provided by Contractor. Contractor shall provide presenters Susan Harris MacKay, Director of Teaching and Learning, and Matt Karlsen, Associate Director of Teaching and Learning, Portland Children's Museum, Opal School, to present Story Workshop, a teaching method that supports language and literacy by using materials and activities that can play an integral role in language development and strongly supports children to see themselves as storytellers and authors. Services shall be provided by Portland Children's Museum, Opal School.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> Contractor shall commence providing Services under this Agreement on **April 5, 2017**, and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by **April 5, 2017**.
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. District agrees to pay the Contractor for Services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement a total fee not to exceed **Three Thousand One Hundred** Dollars (\$3,100.00). District shall pay Contractor according to the following terms and conditions: Contractor shall submit a detailed invoice to District. Payment for Services will be made only if Services have been satisfactorily rendered under the terms of this Agreement.
- 4. <u>Expenses</u>. District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing Services for District, except as follows: **Not Applicable.**
- 5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Contractor, in the performance of the Services pursuant to this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent Contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as

they relate to the Services to be provided under this Agreement. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.

- 6. <u>Materials</u>. Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the Services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement. Contractor's Services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.
- Originality of Services/Intellectual Property. Contractor agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, ideas, and dialogue, prepared for and submitted by Contractor to the District in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, shall be wholly original to Contractor and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to Contractor by District as a basis for such Services. Contractor further agrees that all writings, materials, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, or otherwise (hereinafter referred to as "Content") submitted by Contractor to the District and/or used in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, reflect the intellectual property of, and copyright interests held by District and shall not be copied or used in whole or in part by Contractor without District's express written permission. Contractor understands and agrees that all Content produced under this Agreement is the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that District shall have all right, title and interest in said Content, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said Content in the name of the District.
- 8. <u>Standard for Performance of Services</u>. The parties acknowledge that the District, in selecting the Contractor to perform the Services hereunder, is relying upon the Contractor's reputation for excellence in the performance of the Services required hereunder. The Contractor shall perform the Services in the manner of one who is a recognized specialist in the types of services to be performed. Time is of the essence in this Agreement. All deadlines set forth in the Agreement are binding and may be modified only by subsequent written agreement of the parties.
- 9. <u>Termination</u>. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of Services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or (b) any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency. Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within thirty (30) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall

cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the thirty (30) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the District may secure the required Services from another Contractor. If the cost to the District exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the Contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District. Written notice by District shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

- 10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. Contractor agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the District and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
 - (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the Contractor or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the Services called for in this Agreement, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.
 - (b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the District's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the Contractor, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the Services covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.
 - (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Insurance</u>. Contractor shall insure Contractor's activities in connection with the Services under this Agreement and agrees to carry insurance to ensure Contractor's ability to adhere to the indemnification requirements under this Agreement.
 - 11.1 Contractor shall, at Contractor's sole cost and expense, maintain in full force and effect the following insurance coverage from a California licensed insurer with an A, VIII, or better rating from A.M. Best or an approved self insurance program, sufficient to cover any claims, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses (including attorney fees) arising out of or in connection with Contractor's fulfillment of the obligations under this Agreement:

a. Comprehensive or Commercial Form General Liability Insurance, including bodily injury, property damage and contractual liability with minimum limits as follows:

The policy may not contain an exclusion for coverage of claims arising from claims for sexual molestation or abuse. This policy shall include or be endorsed to include abuse and molestation coverage of at least \$3,000,000 or each occurrence.

- b. Business Automobile Liability Insurance for owned, scheduled, non-owned, or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. (Required only if the Contractor drives on behalf of the District in the course of performing Services.)
- c. Professional Liability Insurance with a limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, if applicable.
- d. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance in a form and amount covering Contractor's full liability under the California Workers' Compensation Insurance and Safety Act and in accordance with applicable state and federal laws. The policy shall be endorsed with the insurer's waiver of rights of subrogation against the District.
- e. Employment Practices Liability (EPL) and Directors and Officers (D&O) coverage with the following limits: \$1,000,000 per occurrence

It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage and limits referred to under a., b. and c. above shall not in any way limit the liability of the Contractor.

11.2 No later than thirty (30) days from execution of this Agreement by the District and Contractor, and prior to commencing the Services under this Agreement, Contractor shall provide District with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder.

Contractor shall provide prior written notice to the District thirty (30) days in advance of any non-renewal, cancellation, or modification of the required insurance. The certificates of insurance providing the coverages referred to in clauses a and b above shall name District, its Governing Board, officers, and employees, as additional insureds with appropriate endorsements. In addition, the certificates of insurance shall include a provision stating "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be

primary, and any insurance carried by District shall be excess and noncontributory." Failure to maintain the above mentioned insurance coverages shall be cause for termination of this Agreement.

- 12. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor.
- 13. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The Services completed herein must meet the approval of the District and shall be subject to the District's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. Contractor agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to Contractor, Contractor's business, the Services, equipment and personnel engaged in Services covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such Services.
 - 13.1 <u>Fingerprinting</u>. Contractor shall comply with the requirements of California Education Code section 45125.1, and shall provide to District all criminal background clearance(s) through fingerprints for Contractor (and all Contractor employees, if any) as required by the District. The District may require the Contractor and Contractors' employees to submit to additional criminal background checks at the District's sole and absolute discretion.
 - 13.2 <u>Tuberculosis Testing</u>. Contractor and Contractor's employees, if any, providing Services to students shall provide evidence of appropriate tuberculosis screening prior to the performance of the Services and provide annual certification thereafter. Contractor shall complete and submit to District any required documentation to verify compliance.
- 14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 15. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which Services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire Agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or Agreement with respect to the Services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement. This Agreement incorporates by this reference, any exhibits, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 17. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. Contractor agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, sex, marital status, age, or other characteristics protected by federal or state laws of such persons.

- 18. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of District or Contractor to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.
- 19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. - 19. <u>Severability</u>. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.
- 20. <u>Attorney Fees/Costs</u>. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorneys' fees.
- 21. <u>Headings</u>. The headings contained in this Agreement are provided exclusively for reference and the convenience of the Parties. No legal significance of any type shall be attached to the headings.
- 22. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be signed and delivered in two counterparts, each of which, when so signed and delivered, shall be an original, but such counterparts together shall constitute the one instrument that is the Agreement, and the Agreement shall not be binding on any party until all Parties have signed it.
- 23. <u>Authorized Signatures</u>. The individual signing this Agreement warrants that he/she is authorized to do so. The Parties understand and agree that a breach of this warranty shall constitute a breach of the Agreement and shall entitle the non-breaching party to all appropriate legal and equitable remedies against the breaching party.
- 24. <u>Governing Law.</u> The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California. This Agreement is made in and shall be performed in Orange County, California.

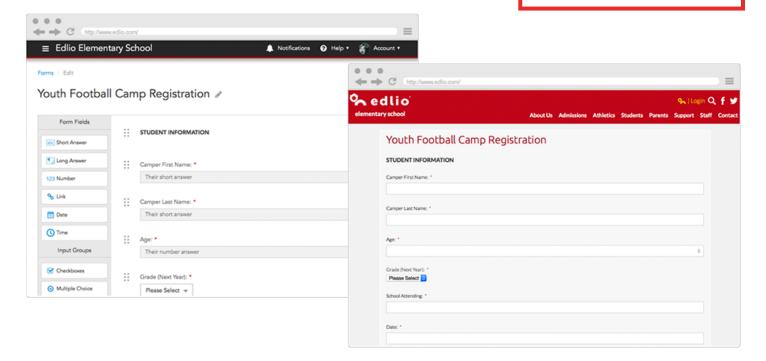

Fullerton School District Board Policy

Married/Pregnant/Parenting Students

BP 5146

Students Board Adopted:

The Board of Trustees recognizes that early marriage, pregnancy, or parenting and related responsibilities may disrupt a student's education and increase the chance of a student dropping out of school. The Board, therefore, desires to support married, pregnant, and parenting students to continue their education, attain strong academic and parenting skills, and promote the healthy development of their children.

The District shall not discriminate against any student on the basis of the student's marital status, pregnancy, childbirth, false pregnancy, termination of pregnancy, or related recovery. (Education Code 230; 34 CFR 106.40)

For school-related purposes, a student under the age of 18 years who enters into a valid marriage shall have all the rights and privileges of students who are 18 years old, even if the marriage has been dissolved.

Education and Support Services for Pregnant and Parenting Students

Pregnant and parenting students shall retain the right to participate in any comprehensive school or educational alternative program. The classroom setting shall be the preferred instructional strategy unless an alternative is necessary to meet the needs of the student and/or his/her child.

Any education program or activity that is offered separately to pregnant students, including any class or extracurricular activity, shall be equal to that offered to other District students. A student's participation in such programs shall be voluntary. (5 CCR 4950)

As required for other students with physical or emotional conditions or temporary disabilities, the Superintendent or designee may require a student, based on pregnancy, childbirth, false pregnancy, termination of pregnancy, or related recovery, to obtain certification from a physician indicating that the student is physically and emotionally able to participate in an educational program or activity. (34 CFR 106.40)

To the extent feasible, educational and related support services shall be provided, either through the District or in collaboration with community agencies and organizations, to meet the needs of pregnant and parenting students and their children. Such services may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Child care and development services for the children of parenting students on or near school site(s) during the school day and during school-sponsored activities
- 2. Parenting education and life skills instruction
- 3. Special school nutrition supplements for pregnant and lactating students pursuant to Education Code 49553, 42 USC 1786, and 7 CFR 246.1-246.28
- 4. Health care services, including prenatal care
- 5. Tobacco, alcohol, and/or drug prevention and intervention services
- 6. Academic and personal counseling
- 7. Supplemental instruction to assist students in achieving grade-level academic standards and progressing toward graduation

As appropriate, teachers, administrators, and/or other personnel who work with pregnant and parenting students shall receive related professional development.

Absences

Pregnant or parenting students may be excused for absences related to confidential medical appointments in accordance with BP/AR 5113 - Absences and Excuses.

The Superintendent or designee shall grant a student a leave of absence due to pregnancy, childbirth, false pregnancy, termination of pregnancy, and related recovery for as long as it is deemed medically necessary by a physician. At the conclusion of the leave, the student shall be reinstated to the status held when the leave began. (34 CFR 106.40)

A parenting student may request exemption from attendance because of personal services that must be rendered to a dependent.

Reasonable Accommodations

When necessary, the District shall provide reasonable accommodations to pregnant and parenting students to enable them to access the educational program.

A pregnant student shall have access to any services available to other students with temporary disabilities or medical conditions. (34 CFR 106.40)

The school shall provide reasonable accommodations to any lactating student to express breast milk, breastfeed an infant child, or address other needs related to breastfeeding. A student shall not incur an academic penalty for using any of these reasonable accommodations, and shall be provided the opportunity to make up any work missed due to such use. Reasonable accommodations include, but are not limited to: (Education Code 222)

- Access to a private and secure room, other than a restroom, to express breast milk or breastfeed an infant child
- 2. Permission to bring onto a school campus a breast pump and any other equipment used to express breast milk
- 3. Access to a power source for a breast pump or any other equipment used to express breast milk
- 4. Access to a place to store expressed breast milk safely
- 5. A reasonable amount of time to accommodate the student's need to express breast milk or breastfeed an infant child

Complaints

Any complaint of discrimination on the basis of pregnancy or marital or parental status shall be addressed through the District's uniform complaint procedures in accordance with 5 CCR 4600-4687 and BP/AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures.

Any complaint alleging District noncompliance with the requirements to provide reasonable accommodations for lactating students also may be filed in accordance with the District's procedures in AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures. A complainant who is not satisfied with the District's decision may appeal the decision to the California Department of Education (CDE). If the District or the CDE finds merit in an appeal, the District shall provide a remedy to the affected student. (Education Code 222; 5 CCR 4600-4687)

Program Evaluation

The Superintendent or designee shall periodically report to the Board regarding the effectiveness of District strategies to support married, pregnant, and parenting students, which may include data on participation rates in District programs and services, academic achievement, school attendance, graduation rate, and/or student feedback on District programs and services.

Fullerton School District Board Policy Athletic Competition

BP 6145.2

Instruction Board Adopted:

The Board of Trustees recognizes that the District's athletic program constitutes an integral component of the educational program and helps to build a positive school climate. The athletic program also promotes the physical, social, and emotional well-being and character development of participating students. The athletic program shall be designed to meet students' interests and abilities and shall be varied in scope to attract wide participation.

All athletic teams shall be supervised by qualified coaches to ensure that student athletes receive appropriate instruction and guidance related to safety, health, sports skills, and sportsmanship. Athletic events shall be officiated by qualified personnel.

The Board encourages business and community support for District athletic programs, subject to applicable District policies and regulations governing advertisements and donations.

Nondiscrimination and Equivalent Opportunities in the Athletic Program

The District's athletic program shall be free from discrimination and discriminatory practice prohibited by State and federal law. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that equivalent athletic opportunities are provided for males and females.

Any complaint regarding the District's athletic program shall be filed in accordance with the District's uniform complaint procedures.

Student Eligibility

Eligibility requirements for participation in the District athletic program, including requirements pertaining to academic achievement and residency, shall be the same as those set by the District for participation in extracurricular and cocurricular activities.

Students shall not be charged a fee to participate in an athletic program.

Sportsmanship

The Board values the quality and integrity of the athletic program and the character development of student athletes. Student athletes, coaches, parents/guardians, spectators, and others are expected to demonstrate good sportsmanship, ethical conduct, and fair play during all athletic competitions.

Students and staff may subject to disciplinary action for improper conduct.

Health and Safety

The Board desires to give student health and safety the highest consideration in planning and conducting athletic activities. Care shall be taken to ensure that all athletic trainings and competitions are conducted in a manner that will not overtax the physical capabilities of the participants. When appropriate, protective equipment shall be used to prevent or minimize injuries.

Coaches and appropriate District employees shall take every possible precaution to ensure that athletic equipment is kept in safe and serviceable condition. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all athletic equipment is cleaned and inspected for safety before the beginning of each school year.

In the event that an injury occurs, the coach or other appropriate District employee shall observe universal precautions and shall remove the student athlete from the activity and/or seek medical treatment for the student as appropriate.

- **B.** The Board finds it is in the best interests of the District and the welfare of the schools and pupils thereof to reduce and eliminate the programs and services shown in Exhibit "A", and as a result to reduce the number of certificated staff; effective at the end of the 2016-2017 school year.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD RESOLVES THAT:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct.
- 2. The programs and services described in Exhibit "A" attached to this Resolution are reduced and eliminated, starting with the 2017-2018 school year in accordance with the recommendations of the Superintendent.
- 3. The Superintendent is directed to determine which employees' services will not be required for the 2017-2018 school year as a result of this reduction and elimination in programs and services and to take all steps necessary under the law not to employ those certificated employees of the District, because of the reduction and elimination of these programs and services.
- 4. The Board has determined that there exists specific needs for personnel and that there are certificated employees who have special training and experience necessary to teach particular courses of study and/or to provide particular services, as provided in Education Code Section 44955, and other applicable law; which others with more seniority do not possess. Therefore, it is the opinion of this Governing Board that it is in the best interests of this District, the students thereof, and the District's programs for special education to skip and retain employees who possess special education credentials and who are serving in special education positions.

- 5. "Competency" for purposes of Education Code Sections 44955 and 44957 shall necessarily include possession of a valid credential, the appropriate EL authorization, and compliance with and/or Highly Qualified Status in the relevant subject matter area. Elementary teachers must have experience in performing duties in a secondary position of at least one complete school year within the last five (5) years to bump into a secondary position and secondary teachers must have experience of at least one complete school year within the last five (5) years performing duties in an elementary position to bump into a elementary position. A secondary teacher must have at least one complete school year teaching the subject matter or performing the particular service within the past ten (10) years to bump into a secondary position in that subject matter or service. An elementary teacher must have at least one complete school year teaching at a grade level within the past ten (10) years to bump into an elementary position at that grade level.
- 6. Additionally, the Superintendent or designee is authorized and directed to take such other action as may be necessary as a result of this action, pursuant to applicable provisions of law and District policy and procedures, including but not limited to affording laid off employees those re-employment rights to which they are entitled by law.

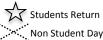

Fullerton School District Board Policy Suicide Prevention

BP 5141.52

Students Board Adopted:

The Board of Trustees recognizes that suicide is a major cause of death among youth and should be taken seriously. In order to attempt to reduce suicidal behavior and its impact on students and families, the Superintendent or designee shall develop preventive strategies and intervention procedures.

The Superintendent or designee may involve school health professionals, school counselors, administrators, other staff, parents/guardians, students, local health agencies and professionals, and community organizations in planning, implementing, and evaluating the District's strategies for suicide prevention and intervention.

Prevention and Instruction

Suicide prevention strategies may include, but not be limited to, efforts to promote a positive school climate that enhances students' feelings of connectedness with the school and is characterized by caring staff and harmonious interrelationships among students.

The District's comprehensive health education program shall promote the healthy mental, emotional, and social development of students including, but not limited to the development of problem-solving skills, coping skills, and self-esteem. Suicide prevention instruction shall be incorporated into the health education curriculum in the secondary grades. Such instruction shall be aligned with State content standards and shall be designed to help students analyze signs of depression and self-destructive behaviors, including potential suicide, and to identify suicide prevention strategies.

The Superintendent or designee may offer parents/guardians education or information which describes the severity of the youth suicide problem, the District's suicide prevention curriculum, risk factors and warning signs of suicide, basic steps for helping suicidal youth, and/or school and community resources that can help youth in crisis.

Staff Development

Suicide prevention training for staff shall be designed to help staff identify and respond to students at risk of suicide. The training shall be offered under the direction of a District counselor/spychologist and/or in cooperation with one or more community mental health agencies and may include information on:

- 1. Research identifying risk factors, such as previous suicide attempt(s), history of depression or mental illness, substance use problems, family history of suicide or violence, feelings of isolation, interpersonal conflicts, a recent severe stressor or loss, family instability, and other factors
- 2. Warning signs that may indicate suicidal intentions, including changes in students' appearance, personality, or behavior
- 3. Research-based instructional strategies for teaching the suicide prevention curriculum and promoting mental and emotional health
- 4. School and community resources and services

5. District procedures for intervening when a student attempts, threatens, or discloses the desire to commit suicide

Intervention

Whenever a staff member suspects or has knowledge of a student's suicidal intentions, he/she shall promptly notify the principal or school counselor/psychologist. The principal or school counselor/psychologist shall then notify the student's parents/guardians as soon as possible and may refer the student to mental health resources in the school or community.

Students shall be encourages to notify a teacher, principal, school counselor/psychologist, or other adult when they are experiencing thoughts of suicide or when they suspect or have knowledge of another student's suicidal intentions.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish crisis intervention procedures to ensure student safety and appropriate communications in the event that a suicide occurs or an attempt is made on campus or at a school-sponsored activity.

Fullerton School District Board Policy Social Media Policy

BP 1114

Community

The Governing Board recognizes the value of technology such as social media platforms in promoting community involvement and collaboration. The purpose of any official District social media platform shall be to further the District's vision and mission, support student learning and staff professional development, and enhance communication with students, parents/guardians, staff, and community members. It is expected that District employees will conduct themselves in a respectful, courteous, and professional manner.

The Superintendent, or designee, shall develop content guidelines and protocols for official social media platforms to ensure the appropriate and responsible use of these resources and compliance with law, Board policy, and regulation.

Guidelines for Content

Social media sites, which are overseen by a District employee (including, but not limited to Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, blogs) shall be used only for their stated purpose and in a manner consistent with this Policy and Administrative Regulation. By creating these official sites and allowing for public comment, the Board does not intend to create a limited public forum or otherwise guarantee an individual's right to free speech.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the limited purpose of the official District social media platforms is clearly communicated to users. Each site shall contain a statement that specifies the site's purposes along with a statement that users are expected to use the site only for those purposes. Each site shall also contain a statement that users are personally responsible for the content of their posts.

Official District social media platforms may not contain content that is obscene, libelous, or so incites students as to create a clear and present danger of the commission of unlawful acts on school premises, violation of school rules, or substantial disruption of the school's orderly operation.

Official District social media platforms may not contain content that endorses or urges support or defeat of a particular political party, candidate, ballot measure, or political position.

Staff or students who post prohibited content shall be subject to discipline in accordance with District policies and administrated regulations.

Social media platforms for personal use which are created by students, employees, or other individuals may sometimes include discussion of District-related issues. These discussions are not sponsored by the District; the District assumes no responsibility for content that is posted on a personal site. Use of the District logo or seal on any personal social media platform is prohibited.

Employees are prohibited from engaging in personal online social networking during working hours.

Users of official District social media platforms should be aware of the public nature and accessibility of social media and that information posted may be considered a public record subject to disclosure under the Public Records Act. The Board expects users to conduct themselves in a respectful, courteous, and professional manner.

Privacy

The Superintendent, or designee, shall ensure that the privacy rights of students, parents/guardians, staff, Board members, and other individuals are protected on official District social media platforms.

Board policy pertaining to the posting of student photographs and the privacy of telephone numbers, home addresses, and email addresses, as specified in Board Policy 1113—District and School Web Sites, shall also apply to official District social media platforms.

Social media, networking sites, and other online platforms shall not be used by District employees to transmit confidential information about students, employees, or District operations.
