Information from the Board of Trustees

SUBJECT:	APPROVE PLAN STATUS QUO, FOUR GATE SPECIAL DAY CLASS SITES TO REMAIN THE SAME: ACACIA, GOLDEN HILL, HERMOSA DRIVE AND LAGUNA ROAD BEGINNING IN THE 2005-2006 SCHOOL YEAR
Background:	At the March 9, 2004 meeting of the Board of Trustees, unanimous action was taken to approve Plan Status Quo: four GATE Special Day Class sites in 2004-2005 at Acacia, Golden Hill, Hermosa Drive, and Laguna Road schools with students from Fisler School being able to choose to attend either Acacia or Hermosa Drive schools where there was space available.
	At that same March 9, 2004 meeting, due to the strong parental interest in attending Fisler School, as a first, second or third choice in a survey of GATE parents, District staff was directed to reconsider Fisler School for designation as a GATE Special Day Class site along with the four existing sites in one year.
	Minutes of the March 9, 2004 meeting specify that when the Special Day Class sites are designated one year later, "Special Day Class sites will be determined by a combination of the number of GATE identified students in various locations, parent interest survey results, and quality of program."
	Most recently, another parent survey, developed in conjunction with the GATE Parent Advisory Committee was administered to parents of all GATE identified children in grades 3-5. This survey requested information on each family's preference for Special Day Class site attendance.
	While the survey results indicate one ordering of schools, the numbers of students residing within given attendance boundaries indicate another as shown in the Keynote presentation. Thus, program quality becomes an important component of the GATE Special Day Class sites recommendation.
	Program quality, as defined by the State of California and reflected in the FSD GATE Master Plan, depends upon maintaining adequate numbers of GATE identified children to offer the Special Day Class program option at each of the four existing schools: Acacia, Golden Hill, Hermosa Drive, and Laguna Road.

History reveals that numbers allow for straight grade level classes at Golden Hill and Laguna Road, and survey results indicate no change in this pattern. History further reveals that Hermosa Drive School maintains strong 3/4 and 5/6 combination classes, which are preferred by teachers and families in attendance at the school. With the success of the Laptop 1:1 Program in the Hermosa Drive GATE classrooms, parents unanimously endorse remaining at this site.

Acacia is the school that typically has the widest variation of program options, not always being able to guarantee straight grade level classes or combination classes to its attending GATE families. Thus, it is recommended that the GATE teachers and community embrace an identified focus in order to attract more students to its program over the coming years, in order that Acacia is able to remain a viable GATE Special Day Class site. As an alternative, Acacia might consider embracing a combination class model similar to that at Hermosa Drive.

Fisler School is in the unique position of having enough students at each grade level to form cluster groupings, but it does not yet have the identified GATE population to maintain straight grade level classes. Due to capacity enrollment, there is no room to send students from other schools to the program at Fisler School to create straight grade level classes. Thus, until Fisler School is able to maintain straight grade level classes, it is recommended that this site not be designated a GATE Special Day Class site.

Fisler students may choose to attend the GATE program at Acacia School or Hermosa Drive School where there is room, or they may choose to remain at Fisler School where cluster groupings at each grade level are a possibility.

Approve Plan Status Quo, four GATE Special Day Class sites to remain the same: Acacia, Golden Hill, Hermosa and Laguna Road beginning in the 2005-2006 school year.

- Background: The Board has authorized various programs where fees are collected from parents to pay for Apple laptop computers, childcare, food services and other programs and activities in the Fullerton School District. On occasion, the parents become delinquent in meeting agreed upon financial obligations to pay for these programs. The current District process is to notify those in arrears by letter and attempt to work out a payment plan acceptable to parents and District within a reasonable period of time. This process is not always successful resulting in lost revenue to the District.

The District would utilize the Agency and collection agreement when the above process fails. The collection agency will attempt to collect debts using collection letters, telephone calls and credit reporting to the three major credit rating bureaus. The District would agree to pay the Agency the following commissions: on returned checks, delinquent accounts less than 180 days, 27.5% of the principal amount collected; accounts that are delinquent 180 days and over, 35% of the principal amount collected. The commissions would cover all costs and expenses incurred by the Agency. *The Agreement is available for review in the Business Office.*

- Recommendation: Authorize Collection Agreement with Adler, Wallach & Associates, Inc., dba AWA Collections, to provide services for the collection of debts for various District programs, as determined by the Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, and/or the Director of Fiscal Services.

- SUBJECT: REVIEW AND UPDATE ON STUDENT ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS
- Background: The District began the review of school site boundaries and enrollment in the fall of 2002. The consulting firm of David Taussig & Associates was contracted to review the next five years of student attendance data. This attendance data was used to configure attendance boundaries for the elementary and junior high schools within the district as Fisler School was projected to open. As a part of this study the District determined some basic assumptions for school size. At the time of the study it was shown that there was an increase in junior high aged students passing through the District over the five period that would require all of the junior highs to exceed the desired capacity levels. It was also shown that the District could not convert a current elementary school site to a junior high without impacting elementary sites at the time.

The Board of Trustees took action on April 27, 2004 on recommendations to convert Beechwood School to a K-8 configuration to assist in reducing the junior high growth beyond the benchmark of 1,000 students. It has been stated that we no longer have a concern with enrollment due to declining enrollment both District and County wide. This report will help clarify student enrollment issues in relation to that reported decline.
