She attended the Golden Bell Award Luncheon.

Trustee Sugarman- She shared information regarding several programs that Chula Vista Elementary School has implemented to raise API scores. Dr. Hovey and President Berryman recognized Hermosa Drive School for obtaining the Golden Bell Award. Janny Meyer and students from Hermosa Drive School conducted a Service Learning Project that culminated with the Fullerton City Council banning smoking form Laguna Lake.

Dr. Hovey recognized Mark Douglas, Assistant Superintendent of Personnel Services, as being the recipient of the 2010 ACSA Administrator of the Year Award for HR/Personnel for Region 17.

#### Superintendent's Report

Dr. Hovey congratulated Acacia, Commonwealth, Fern Drive, Fisler, Hermosa Drive, Ladera Vista Jr. High, Laguna Road, Maple, Nicolas Jr. High, Pacific Drive, Raymond, Richman, and Rolling Hills Schools for obtaining the Phelps grant. WHEREAS, Leadership Matters for California's public education system and the more than 6 million students it serves; and

**WHEREAS**, School administrators are passionate, lifelong learners who believe in the value of quality public education, and

**WHEREAS**, The title "school administrator" is a broad term used to define many education leadership posts. Superintendents, assistant superintendents, principals, assistant principals, special education and adult education leaders, curriculum and assessment leaders, school business officials, classified educational leaders, and other school district employees are considered administrators; and

# SUPERVISED FIELDWORK AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Brandman University hereinafter called the "UNIVERSITY," and the Fullerton School District, hereinafter called "DISTRICT."

### I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE UNIVERSITY

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- A. The UNIVERSITY will assure that the student shall have completed the necessary educational prerequisites, to be eligible for supervised fieldwork including proof of negative TB test current within one year of supervised fieldwork and issuance of finger print clearance.
- A. The UNIVERSITY shall designate a faculty or staff member to coordinate, consult, and collaborate with the classroom teacher or district designee of the DISTRICT, the activities of each student assigned to DISTRICT and student fieldwork experience.
- B. The UNIVERSITY shall complete periodic observations and/or evaluations of the student regarding his/her performance at the DISTRICT as per arrangement between the UNIVERSITY faculty or staff member and the DISTRICT supervisor.
- C. The UNIVERSITY may provide monetary compensation for services rendered by the DISTRICT in an amount not to exceed the actual cost of the services rendered by the DISTRICT per Appendix A.

### II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DISTRICT

- A. The DISTRICT shall provide students with experiences with a student population that is diverse in terms of ethnicity, culture, language, socio-economics and/or special needs.
- B. The DISTRICT staff will promptly and thoroughly investigate any complaint by any participating student of unlawful discrimination or harassment at the DISTRICT or involving employees or agents of the DISTRICT, take prompt and effective remedial action when discrimination or harassment is found to have occurred, and promptly notify the UNIVERSITY of the existence and outcome of any complaint of harassment by, against, or involving any participating student.
- C. The DISTRICT staff will provide, upon request by any participating student, such reasonable accommodations at the DISTRICT as required by law in order to allow qualified disabled students to participate in the program.

- D. To provide for emergency health care of the student in case of accident at the expense of the student.
- E. To provide all participating students with a copy of the DISTRICT'S rules, regulations, policies, and procedures with which the students are expected to comply and notify the UNIVERSITY of any change in its personnel, operation, or policies which may affect the field education experience.
- F. Comply with all federal, state and local statutes and regulations applicable to the operation of the program, including without limitation, laws relating to the confidentiality of student records.
- G. The DISTRICT staff shall comply with APPENDIX B regarding the DISTRICT'S supervision of UNIVERSITY students.

### III. THE PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE

- A. The DISTRICT shall provide field experiences in such schools or classes of the DISTRICT and under the direct supervision and instruction of such employees of the DISTRICT, as specified by the duly authorized representatives of the DISTRICT and the UNIVERSITY.
- B. The DISTRICT may, for good cause, refuse to accept for field experiences, or terminate the field experience assignment of any student of the UNIVERSITY assigned to the DISTRICT in writing. Prior to removal of a student, the DISTRICT shall consult with the UNIVERSITY about its concerns and proposed course of action. The UNIVERSITY may terminate the field experience assignment or student teaching assignment of any student of the UNIVERSITY at the DISTRICT at any time, and may do so if the DISTRICT so requests in writing with a statement of reasons why the DISTRICT desires to have the student withdrawn.
- C. Neither party shall discriminate in the assignment of students on the basis of race, color, disability, sex, religion, national origin, ancestry, sexual orientation, or any other basis prohibited by law.
- D. The UNIVERSITY agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the DISTRICT, its agents, and employees from and against all loss or expense (including costs and attorney fees) resulting from liability imposed by law upon the DISTRICT because of bodily injury to or death of any person or on account of damages to property, including loss of use thereof, arising out of or in connection with this Agreement and due or claimed to be due to the negligence of the UNIVERSITY, its agents, employees, or students.
- E. The DISTRICT agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and at the UNIVERSITY'S request, defend the UNIVERSITY, its agencies and employees from and against all loss or expenses (including costs and attorney fees) resulting from liability imposed by law upon the UNIVERSITY because of bodily injury to or death of any person or on account of damages to property, including loss of use thereof, arising out of or in connection with this Agreement, and due or claimed to be due to the negligence of the DISTRICT, its agents, or employees.
- F. The parties agree that the students are considered learners who are fulfilling specific requirements for field experiences as part of a degree and/or credential requirement. Therefore, regardless of the nature or extent of the acts performed by them, students are not to be considered employees or agents of either the UNIVERSITY or the DISTRICT for any purpose including Workers' Compensation or any other employee benefit programs. The students shall not be entitled to any monetary remuneration for services performed by them in the course of their training.
- G. The parties mutually agree each shall provide and maintain commercial general liability insurance or self-insurance acceptable to both parties in the minimum amounts of

\$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$3,000,000 general aggregate and upon request shall furnish proof thereof in the form of a certificate of insurance within 30 days of the effective date of this Agreement. Except for ten (10) days notice of non-payment of premium, the Parties will require 30 days written notice for any policies that are canceled, non-renewed, or coverage/limits that are reduced or materially altered.

- H. Both parties acknowledge they are independent contractors, and nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to create an agency, joint venture, franchise or partnership relation between the parties and neither party shall so hold itself out. Neither party shall have the right to obligate or bind the other party in any manner whatsoever, and nothing contained in this Agreement shall give or is intended to give any right of any kind to third persons.
- I. Any failure of a party to enforce that party's right under any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed or act as a waiver of said party's subsequent right to enforce any provisions contained herein.
- J. Notices required or permitted to be provided under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if mailed first class to the parties that signed this agreement and to the addresses below.

- K. If any term or provision of this Agreement is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other term or provision, and this Agreement shall be interpreted as if such term or provision had never been contained in this Agreement.
- L. In the event of any material default under this Agreement, which default remains uncured for a period of twenty-one (21) days after receipt of written notice of such default, or in the event of the loss of WASC accreditation by the UNIVERSITY, this Agreement may be immediately terminated by the non-defaulting party.
- M. This Agreement fully supersedes any and all prior agreements or understandings between the parties or any of their respective affiliates with respect to the subject matter hereof. No change, modification, addition, amendment, or supplement to this Agreement shall be valid unless set forth in writing and signed and dated by both parties hereto subsequent to the execution of this Agreement.
- N. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California in effect at the time of the execution of this Agreement. Should either party institute legal action to enforce any obligation contained herein, it is agreed that the proper venue of such suit or action shall be Orange County, California.

# IV. TERM AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- A. THE TERM of this Agreement shall be effective February 23, 2010 and shall continue in full force and effect through June 30, 2015. This Agreement may be renewed for one (1) additional term of the contract by mutual written consent of the parties.
- A. THIS AGREEMENT may be terminated by either the UNIVERSITY or the DISTRICT with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice provided that (subject to the other terms of this Agreement) all students performing fieldwork at the time of notice of termination are given the opportunity to complete their fieldwork at the DISTRICT.

### Appendix A Payment for Master Teachers for Teacher Education Fieldwork Only

### I. SPECIAL PROVISIONS – RATES and PAYMENTS

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- (a) \$ 350.<sup>00</sup> Master Teacher stipend per nine (9) week session of full-time student teaching consisting of three to six (3-6) units for Multiple and Single Subject Credential candidates.
- (b) \$ 350.<sup>00</sup> Master Teacher stipend per nine (9) week session of full-time student teaching consisting of three to six (3-6) units for Education Specialist Instruction Credential (Special Education) candidates.

METHOD OF PAYMENT: Stipend is to be paid directly to the school district.

In the event the assignment of a UNIVERSITY student is terminated by the UNIVERSITY and/or the DISTRICT for any reason after the student has been in student teaching and has been at the assignment for a minimum of two weeks, DISTRICT shall receive payment for one assignment on account of each student as though there had been no termination of the assignment. Said payment is to exceed no more than six (6) units per session of terminated assignment. In the event the field experience of a UNIVERSITY student is terminated by the UNIVERSITY and/or the DISTRICT for any reason after the student has been in the field experience for a minimum of two weeks, DISTRICT shall receive payment for one assignment on account of each student as though there had been no termination of the assignment.

Within thirty (30) days following the close of each session or academic session of the UNIVERSITY, the DISTRICT shall submit an invoice, in triplicate, to the UNIVERSITY for payment at the rate provided therein for all field experiences provided by the DISTRICT under and in accordance with this agreement during said session. This process may be altered according to individual districts procedures as to the manner in which the invoicing will proceed so long as the parties mutually agree to such alteration in advance.

# <u>Appendix B</u> Specific Supervision Requirements for Each Program

### Teacher Education Fieldwork:

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- A. "Field Experience" as used herein and elsewhere in this agreement means active participation in the duties and function of classroom under the direct supervision and instruction of employees of the DISTRICT who hold valid teaching credentials issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing, authorizing them to serve as classroom teachers in the schools or classes in which the field experience is provided, and have completed a minimum of three years successful teaching experience. "Student Teaching" is used herein and elsewhere in this agreement means participation in the duties and function of classroom teaching under the direct supervision and instruction of employees of the DISTRICT who hold valid, teaching credentials issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing, authorizing them to serve as classroom teachers in the schools or classes in which the student teaching experience is provided, and have completed a minimum of three years successful teaching experience.
- B. The UNIVERSITY'S Teacher Education Policy provides that student teachers without emergency or substitute permits may not be asked by the school districts to serve and be paid for substitute teaching as, under California law, student teachers are not certificated personnel and as they require full-time supervision. Those holding substitute or emergency permits may substitute for their master teacher only (a maximum of four (4) days only): when s/he is ill; when it is determined by the principal that this is in the best interest of the students in the classroom as well as the candidate; after the first four weeks of the first assignment; and/or when the candidate is paid.
- C. "Session of Student Teaching," for Multiple Subject and Single Subject Credential candidates as used herein and elsewhere in this agreement is considered to be a full day of student teaching daily for five (5) days a week for a minimum of nine (9) weeks for elementary credential candidates (for this, the elementary credential candidate receives three to six (3-6) session units of practice teaching credit), and three periods a day for five (5) days a week for a minimum of nine (9) weeks for secondary credential candidates (for this, the secondary credential candidates (for this, the secondary credential candidate receives three to six (3-6) session units of nine (9) weeks for secondary credential candidates (for this, the secondary credential candidate receives three to six (3-6) session units of practice teaching credit).
- D. "Session of Student Teaching," for Education Specialist Instruction Credential (Special Education) candidates as used herein and elsewhere in this agreement is considered to be a full day of student teaching daily for five (5) days a week for a minimum of nine (9) weeks for elementary credential candidates (for this, the elementary credential candidate receives three to six (3-6) session units of practice teaching credit), and three periods a day for five (5) days a week for a minimum of nine (9) weeks for secondary credential candidates (for this, the secondary credential candidate receives three to six (3-6) session units of practice teaching credit).
- E. An assignment of a Multiple Subject and Single Subject Credential candidate of the UNIVERSITY to student teaching in classes of schools of the DISTRICT shall be for a two nine (9) week session as mutually agreed between the UNIVERSITY and DISTRICT.
- F. An assignment of an Education Specialist Instruction Credential (Special Education) candidate of the UNIVERSITY to student teaching in classes of schools of the DISTRICT shall be for a single nine (9) week session as mutually agreed between the UNIVERSITY and DISTRICT.
- G. The assignment of a UNIVERSITY student to field experiences and student teaching at DISTRICT shall be deemed to be effective for the purposes of this agreement as of the date the student presents to the proper DISTRICT officials the assignment papers or other documents provided by the UNIVERSITY effecting such assignment, but not earlier than the date of such assignment as shown on such card or other document.

  - b. Collaboration and consultation with school personnel and participation on interdisciplinary teams.

  - e. Home, school, community collaboration: working with parents and community members.
  - f. Learning about, helping develop, or evaluating policy, practices and programs.

- E. The DISTRICT shall ensure that the student receives an average of one hour of individual or one and one-half hours of group face-to-face supervision per week, although more time may be needed, especially at the beginning of the FIELDWORK experience.
- F. The DISTRICT supervisor, in collaboration with the UNIVERSITY faculty, will complete at least one written evaluation of the student's performance near the end of each university session.
- G. - b. Collaboration and consultation with school personnel and participation on interdisciplinary teams.
- c. Developing, implementing and evaluating academic and behavioral interventions.
- d. Providing counseling and other mental health interventions.
- e. Home, school, community collaboration: working with parents and community members.
- f. Learning about, helping develop, or evaluating policy, practices and programs.

SUBJECT: APPROVE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPOSAL TO NEGOTIATE A SUCCESSOR AGREEMENT WITH THE FULLERTON ELEMENTARY TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (FETA) FOR 2010-2013 SCHOOL YEARS

Background: Meetings and negotiations shall not take place on a proposal until the public has been given a reasonable amount of time to address the Board of Trustees and present their comments during the Public Comment period of the Board meeting.

The current Agreement with FETA expires on June 30, 2010. Negotiations for a Successor Agreement will begin with FETA no later than the agreed upon date of March 8, 2010. Once FETA's and the District's initial proposals have been submitted, the collective bargaining process may begin.

Rationale: Government Code Section 3547 requires that all initial proposals of exclusive representative and of public school employers relating to matters within the scope of representation be presented at a public meeting. Proposals become public record once they are presented at a public meeting, "sunshine."

Funding: Not applicable.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Approve Fullerton School District proposal to negotiate a Successor Agreement with Fullerton Elementary Teachers Association (FETA) for 2010-2013 School Years.

MLD:lem Attachment FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT INITIAL PROPOSAL TO FETA 2010-2013 Successor Agreement February 23, 2010

The Parties agreed to re-open for 2010-2013 Successor Agreement by March 2010. The District intends to review the entire agreement with particular emphasis on the following areas:

# **ARTICLE 5: ASSOCIATION RIGHTS**

H. The Association president may receive paid release time for up to one-half a full time unit position. Such release time shall only be used for Association business as it relates to the District. The object of the leave is to enhance communication between the District and the Association. Consequently such release time shall not be used for any purpose, which is in conflict with other provisions of the Agreement. The assignment held by the Association president must be conducive to the release time assignment requested. If not, the assignment shall be changed by mutual agreement of the parties. The Association president, whose work year is split between release time, and work time, as provided by this section, shall not use any work time for Association business.

## **ARTICLE 8: HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT**

A. The work week for a full-time teacher shall be not less than 37-1/2 hours, normally to be rendered in units of 7-1/2 hours of school-based service per day, inclusive of a thirty (30) minute duty-free lunch period. The normal seven and one-half (7-1/2) hours of school-based services per day shall be structured and directed by the teacher's immediate administrator. The service shall be in conformity with the teacher's job description and may include such activities as:

E. Teachers will be provided with one-half (1/2) day of sub time twice yearly for those with kindergarten and 3-6 grade non-CSR classes, and elementary mild moderate SDC classes. Such time shall be used for conferences, conference prep, data input, data analysis, testing, grade level meetings, and other work as mutually agreed upon between the employee and supervisor. It is intended that school sites coordinate this time among teachers and the site administrator in order to minimize the amount of substitute time provided. Unscheduled or unused substitute time shall not be carried over to the second half of the year.

# ARTICLE 9: WORK YEAR

The District has an interest in reviewing the certificated work year in an order to maintain fiscal solvency for 2010-2013 school year.

# **ARTICLE : 10 TRANSFERS**

D. District Initiated Transfer

A transfer may be initiated by the District for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Change in enrollment or staffing ratios;
- 2. Need for teachers specially credentialed and/or trained;

3. Need to move a teacher whose evaluation is negative to another evaluator or another

environment to facilitate improvement with such transfer basis not to be used in consecutive years.The welfare of the students or the welfare of the employee.

When the District initiates a transfer, the unit member shall be provided with information to support the reason(s) for the transfer. At the request of the employee, a conference will be held with the Assistant Superintendent of Personnel.

Teachers subject to district-initiated transfers shall have the right to indicate preference from a list of vacancies.

In the event that transfer is necessitated by decrease in enrollment, the Immediate Administrator shall first determine if there are volunteers for transfer. If there are no volunteers, the Immediate Administrator shall use the following criteria in designating the transferee:

- 1. Credentials to perform the required services in remaining positions;
- 2. Specialized training and experience needed in a particular assignment;

3. All other factors being equal, the teacher with the least District seniority shall be transferred. Whenever the District determines that a teacher is to be involuntarily transferred, the teacher shall be notified in writing within ten (10) days.

# **ARTICLE: 11 EVALUATION PROCEDURES**

The District has an interest in exploring options to make the evaluation process more meaningful to employees and in alignment with State and Federal focus within the "Race to the Top" philosophy.

# ARTICLE 12: PEER ASSISTANCE AND REVIEW

The Association and the District are continuously striving to provide the highest possible quality of education. Therefore, the parties agree to cooperate in the design and implementation of programs to improve the quality of instruction through expanded and improved professional development and peer assistance. Teachers participating in the program are viewed as valuable professionals who deserve to have the best resources available provided to them in the interest of improving performance to a successful standard. The District has a further interest in reviewing all aspects of the program due to reductions in funding and to facilitate removal of teachers who demonstrate little or no improvement after formal participation within the program.

# **ARTICLE 13: LEAVES OF ABSENCE**

A. Sick Leave with Pay

3. Procedure: A teacher who will be absent should notify the Principal or designee as soon as it is known that the teacher will be absent and no later than one and one-half (1-1/2) hours, if possible, before the teacher is to report for duty. Such notice shall be made by using the substitute <u>reporting</u> <u>system</u>. Teachers becoming aware of the need for absence due to surgery, maternity, or predictable or prior scheduled cause shall submit a statement to the administration as far in advance of the initial disability date as possible.

# C. Personal Necessity

1. Definition. Personal necessity means any business, civic, or personal activity, which cannot be conducted before or after the school day. Personal travel, vacations, and recreational activities not directly related to professional responsibilities are not acceptable use of such time.

# ARTICLE 14: CLASS SIZE

The District has an interest in reviewing the certificated class size ratios for 2010-2013 school years in order to maintain fiscal solvency.

# ARTICLE 16: SALARIES

The District has interest in negotiating a reduction in salaries and salary schedules for the 2010-2013 school year in order to maintain fiscal solvency for the District.

# **ARTICLE 17: FRINGE BENEFITS**

The District has an interest in reviewing Fringe Benefits for current and retired association members. This includes modifying the current plan levels offered to employees.

v) Effective May 1, 2003, the District will waive the employee's share of premiums for employees with spouses who work in the District, are eligible for insurance coverage, and are not enrolled in their own plan. Employees with spouses within the District will not be double covered.

# **ARTICLE 21: MENTOR TEACHER**

The mentor program is no longer functioning. The article should be deleted and any references to the program should be restructured within the individual program.

# ARTICLE 23: EARLY RETIREMENT

A. Group medical insurance coverage shall be provided for by the District for teachers who have at least ten (10) years service in the Fullerton School District (FSD) and are retired from FSD at age 55 or older, and who retire under the State Teachers Retirement System (STRS), or the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS).

B. This provision will apply only to those employees who remain fully retired as defined by the appropriate retirement system until the employee reaches age 65 or becomes Medicare eligible when this benefit will cease. All benefits will cease with the death of the employee.

C. Eligible retired employees may select any medical plan, up to the cost of the PPO single plan. If a less expensive plan is selected, the retiree has the option of spending the difference on spousal coverage and paying remaining cost for two-party coverage on a monthly basis.

D. In order for a spouse to be covered they must have been covered by the employee by the end of open enrollment of any school year in which they retire.

# **ARTICLE 29: MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

C. The Board shall deliver to the Association seventy-five (75) copies of this Agreement.

# **ARTICLE 30: RE-OPENERS**

A. Negotiations During the Term of the Contract

1. Total Compensation: The parties agree that compensation in the form of both Salaries, Article <u>16</u> and Fringe Benefits, Article 17, shall be determined in years two and three of this Agreement by using the combination of both of these forms of compensation when comparing to the market. The parties shall not use either salary data or fringe benefit data alone to draw conclusions about the relative position of the District to its comparator agencies, i.e., the elementary districts in Orange County.

# ARTICLE 31: SUMMER SCHOOL

A The selection of teachers for summer schools will apply to the following programs:

1. Regular education, including junior high proficiency, elementary remedial, and ESL/language acquisition.

- 2. Special education (extended year).
- 3 School age child care.

B. A teacher may apply to teach in any and all programs for which he/she holds the appropriate credential.

C. The selection process will consist of the following steps and timeline when feasible:

1. Notice of certificated vacancies will be sent to all sites for posting during the first week in March.

Background: In June 2009, the Board of Trustees approved a new three-year contract with Blackboard Connect Inc. (aka *Connect-ED*) effective July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2012.

Due to the successful implementation and Districtwide use of this parent notification system, Ladera Vista Junior High School has investigated purchasing the Blackboard Connect for Teachers Service which will enable teachers to send pre-recorded telephone messages to parents of students. There are over 500 pre-recorded messages in English and more than 200 languages. Use of this service by Ladera Vista Junior High School would allow staff members the opportunity to reach out and connect quickly to parents and students with reminders about upcoming assignments and tests, as well as the ability to send positive comments and news. Principal John Albert believes that this service will strengthen the connection between teachers and parents as they continue to partner with the parent community in the education of all students.

- Rationale: The Connect-ED parent notification system has provided web-based automated contacts with parents concerning student absences. It has also allowed messages to be sent to remind parents of important dates, changes in schedules, and most importantly, information about emergency situations. The Blackboard Connect for Teachers Service will extend the connection between the Ladera Vista Junior High School staff and parents.
- Funding:Cost of service paid with Ladera Vista Junior High School budgets as follows:<br/>February 23, 2010 to June 30, 2010 30% from #345, 70% from #102<br/>July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011 30% from #345, 70% from #102.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Approve Amendment No. 1 to Services Agreement between the Fullerton School District and Blackboard Connect Inc. for the Blackboard Connect for Teachers Services for Ladera Vista Junior High School effective February 23, 2010 to June 30, 2011.

### **AMENDMENT No. 1 to SERVICES AGREEMENT**

This Amendment Agreement ("<u>Amendment No. 1"</u>), is made to the Services Agreement ("<u>Agreement</u>"), dated May 15, 2009 ("<u>Effective Date</u>") by and between Blackboard Connect Inc., a Delaware corporation formerly known as The NTI Group, Inc. ("<u>Blackboard Connect</u>"), and Fullerton School District ("<u>Customer</u>"). The Customer and Blackboard Connect may hereinafter be collectively referred to as the "Parties" or individually, as the "Party".

For good and valuable consideration, the adequacy and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the Parties, on this date, February 23, 2010 ("<u>Amendment No. 1 Date</u>"), Blackboard Connect and the Customer agree to modify the Agreement in the manner specified below.

1. A new Section 10 is added to the end of the Agreement to read as follow:

**The Blackboard Connect For Teachers Service**. The Customer for the sole and exclusive use by Ladera Vista Junior High School may use the *Blackboard Connect for Teachers* service pursuant to this Section for the period February 23, 2010 to June 30, 2011 (" Teacher Initial Term"). *Blackboard Connect for Teachers* will enable teachers to send pre-recorded telephone comments to parents of students in a designated language. Blackboard Connect will provide support to a designated administrator ("<u>Teacher Champion</u>") at the Customer institution.

- a. Notifications.
  - i. For the period February 23, 2010 to June 30, 2010 of the Teacher Initial Term, Customer will pay \$282.92 for 10,000 Blackboard Connect for Teachers notifications ("Maximum Notification"). For the period July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011 of the Teacher Initial Term, Customer will pay \$810.90 for 20,000 Blackboard Connect for Teachers notifications per year ("Maximum Notifications"). Unused notifications in any period or year will not rollover to the following period or year and will expire. To send Blackboard Connect for Teachers notifications in excess of the Maximum Notifications, the Customer agrees to contact Blackboard Connect for additional pricing.
  - ii. For the sole purpose of this Amendment No. 1, Ladera Vista Junior High School will be invoiced.
  - iii. <u>Payment Terms</u>. Fees due, if any, will be invoiced upon execution of this Agreement and is due within 30 days of invoicing. Fees for usage above the Maximum Notifications will be due no later than thirty (30) days after the date of an invoice from Blackboard Connect. Late payments may be assessed at the lesser of 1.5% per month or the maximum allowable rate under applicable law. The fees hereunder do not include any sales, use, or other taxes, government fees or levies on the provision of the Service. Customer will be responsible for payment of all applicable taxes, fees or levies, unless the Customer is exempt therefrom and provides Blackboard Connect with a copy of Customer's tax exemption certificate or number. All payments to Blackboard Connect shall be made without any deduction or withholding, unless required by applicable law in which the Customer shall ensure that the net amount actually received by Blackboard Connect from the Customer equals the full amount Blackboard Connect would have received had no such deduction or withholding been required.
- 2. Unless otherwise defined herein, capitalized terms used shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Agreement. Except as otherwise set forth herein, all terms and conditions of the Agreement will continue in full force and effect as set forth therein and amended hereby.

# **CONSULTANT AGREEMENT**

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and **Deana Hippie**, (address on file), hereinafter referred to as "CONSULTANT."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONSULTANT is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Services to be provided by CONSULTANT:

# Provide professional development training in writing to Orangethorpe School K-6 staff to meet the California Content Standards.

Services shall be provided by **Deana Hippie**.

2. Term. CONSULTANT shall provide services under this AGREEMENT on March 3, 2010.

3. Compensation. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONSULTANT for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed **six hundred** Dollars **(\$600.00)**. CONSULTANT shall submit a detailed invoice to the DISTRICT. DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days of DISTRICT's approval of the invoice.

4. Expenses. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONSULTANT for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONSULTANT in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: CONSULTANT shall not exceed six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per day. All duplicating expenses incurred for reproducing workshop materials will be paid by Orangethorpe School. Any travel expenses shall be pre-approved in writing by the

DISTRICT.

5. Independent Contractor. CONSULTANT, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONSULTANT understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONSULTANT assumes the full responsibility for his/her own acts and/or omissions and the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONSULTANT shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONSULTANT and/or CONSULTANT's employees.

6. Materials. CONSULTANT shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows: **N/A.** CONSULTANT's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

7. Originality of Services. CONSULTANT agrees that all materials, technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONSULTANT and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONSULTANT by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.

8. Termination. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONSULTANT only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONSULTANT. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONSULTANT or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

11. Assignment. The obligations of the CONSULTANT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONSULTANT.

12. Compliance With Applicable Laws. The services to be provided herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONSULTANT agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONSULTANT, CONSULTANT's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such services.

13. Permits/Licenses. CONSULTANT and all CONSULTANT's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

14. Employment With Another Public Agency. CONSULTANT, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONSULTANT will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

15. Entire Agreement/Amendment. This AGREEMENT and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the

16. Nondiscrimination. CONSULTANT agrees that he/she will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, or age of such persons.

All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. Background: The Fullerton School District, in an effort to resolve a budget deficit over eleven million dollars, is attempting to create as many viable negotiable options to resolve the fiscal crisis. One important option discussed in negotiations with Fullerton Elementary Teachers Association (FETA) is the increase of class size ratios across the District.

The current teacher agreement allows for a Districtwide average that is less restrictive than the Education Code. Any adjustments above current class size ratios of 30:1 Districtwide average, would also require negotiations with FETA. The District will be seeking an increase up to 34:1 to allow for maximum flexibility in decreasing the budget deficit. The District's intent is to adjust the ratio only as high as is necessary to correct the budget deficit. In order to allow for increases above 29.9 in the fourth through eighth grades, a General Waiver Request must be filed with the State per Education Code 41376 (b) and (e). A public notice that includes the time, date, location, and subject of the public hearing regarding the General Waiver Request has been placed in a local newspaper to allow for public comment.

Rationale: In order to avoid the Education Code penalty, the District is seeking a waiver for Education Code 41376 (b) and (e).

Funding: Not applicable.

#### **QUESTION 6:**

**41376**. The Superintendent of Public Instruction, in computing apportionments and allowances from the State School Fund for the second principal apportionment, shall determine the following for the regular day classes of the elementary schools maintained by each school district:

(a) For grades 1 to 3, inclusive, he shall determine the number of classes, the number of pupils enrolled in each class, the total enrollment in all such classes, the average number of pupils enrolled per class, and the total of the numbers of pupils which are in excess of thirty (30) in each class.

For those districts which do not have any classes with an enrollment in excess of 32 and whose average size for all the classes is 30.0 or less, there shall be no excess declared. For those districts which have one or more classes in excess of an enrollment of 32 or whose average size for all the classes is more than 30, the excess shall be the total of the number of pupils which are in excess of 30 in each class having an enrollment of more than 30.

(b) For grades 4 to 8, inclusive, he shall determine the total number of pupils enrolled, the number of full-time equivalent classroom teachers, and the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent classroom teacher. He shall also determine the excess if any, of pupils enrolled in such grades in the following manner:

(1) Determine the number of pupils by which the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent classroom teacher for the current fiscal year exceeds the greater of the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent classroom teacher in all the appropriate districts of the state, as determined by the Superintendent of Public Instruction, for October 30, 1964, or the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent classroom teacher which existed in the district on either October 30, 1964 or March 30, 1964, as selected by the governing board.
(2) Multiply the number determined in (1) above by the number of full-time equivalent classroom teachers of the current fiscal year.

(3) Reduce the number determined in (2) above by the remainder which results from dividing such number by the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent teacher for October 30, 1964, as determined by the Superintendent of Public Instruction in (1) above.

(c) He shall compute the product obtained by multiplying the excess number of pupils, if any, under the provisions of subdivision (a) of this section by ninety-seven hundredths (0.97), and shall multiply the product so obtained by the ratio of statewide change in average daily attendance to district change in average daily attendance. Change in average daily attendance shall be determined by dividing average daily attendance in grades 1, 2 and 3 reported for purposes of the first principal apportionment of the current year by that reported for purposes of the first principal apportionment of the preceding year.

(d) If the school district reports that it has maintained, during the current fiscal year, any classes in which there were enrolled pupils in excess of thirty (30) per class pursuant to subdivision (a) of this section, and there is no excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section, he shall decrease the average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 by the product determined under subdivision (c) of this section.

(e) If the school district reports that it has maintained, during the current fiscal year, no classes in which there were enrolled pupils in excess of thirty (30) per class determined pursuant to subdivision (a) of this section, and there is an excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section, he shall make the following computation:

He shall compute the product obtained by multiplying the excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section by ninety-seven hundredths (0.97) and shall multiply the product so obtained by the ratio of statewide change in average daily attendance to the district change in average daily attendance. He shall decrease the average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 by the resulting product.

(f) If the school district reports that it has maintained, during the current fiscal year, any classes in which there were enrolled pupils in excess of thirty (30) per class determined pursuant to

subdivision (a) of this section, and there is an excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section, he shall make the following computation:

He shall add to the product determined under subdivision (c) of this section, the product determined under subdivision (e) of this section and decrease the average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 by this total amount.

The governing board of each school district maintaining elementary schools shall report for the fiscal year 1964-65 and each year thereafter the information required for the determination to be made by the Superintendent of Public Instruction under the provisions of this section in accordance with instructions provided on forms furnished and prescribed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Such information shall be reported by the school district together with, and at the same time as, the reports required to be filed for the second principal apportionment of the State School Fund. The forms on which the data and information is reported shall include a certification by each school district superintendent or chief administrative officer that the data is correct and accurate for the period covered, according to his best information and belief.

For purposes of this section, a "full-time equivalent classroom teacher" means an employee of an elementary, high school, or unified school district, employed in a position requiring certification qualifications and whose duties require him to teach pupils in the elementary schools of that district in regular day classes for the full time for which he is employed during the regular schoolday. In reporting the total number of full-time equivalent classroom teachers, there shall be included, in addition to those employees defined above, the full-time equivalent of all fractional time for which employees in positions requiring certification qualifications are required to devote to teaching pupils in the elementary schools of the district in regular day classes during the regular schoolday.

For purposes of this section, the number of pupils enrolled in each class means the average of the active enrollment in that class on the last teaching day of each school month which ends prior to April 15th of each school year.

The provisions of this section are not applicable to school districts with less than 101 units of average daily attendance for the current fiscal year.

Although no decreases in average daily attendance shall be made for the fiscal year 1964-65, reports are required to be filed under the provisions of this section, and the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall notify each school district the amount of the decrease in state allowances which would have been effected had such decrease in average daily attendance been applied.

The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall adopt rules and regulations which he may deem necessary for the effective administration of this section. Such rules and regulations may specify that no decrease in average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 shall be made for a school district on account of large classes due to instructional television or team teaching, which may necessarily involve class sizes at periods during the day larger than the standard set forth in this section.

## **QUESTION 1**

**41378**. The Superintendent of Public Instruction, in computing apportionments and allowances from the State School Fund for the second principal apportionment, shall determine the following for the kindergarten classes maintained by each school district maintaining kindergarten classes. (a) The number of pupils enrolled in each kindergarten class, the total enrollment in all such classes, and the average number of pupils enrolled per class.

(b) The total number of pupils which are in excess of thirty-three (33) in each class having an enrollment of more than thirty-three (33).

(c) The total number of pupils by which the average class size in the district exceeds 31.

(d) The greater number of pupils as determined in (b) or (c) above.

(e) He shall compute the product obtained by multiplying the excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (d) of this section by ninety-seven hundredths (0.97). He shall decrease the average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 by the resulting product.

## **QUESTION 6**

**41376**. The Superintendent of Public Instruction, in computing apportionments and allowances from the State School Fund for the second principal apportionment, shall determine the following for the regular day classes of the elementary schools maintained by each school district:

(a) For grades 1 to 3, inclusive, he shall determine the number of classes, the number of pupils enrolled in each class, the total enrollment in all such classes, the average number of pupils enrolled per class, and the total of the numbers of pupils which are in excess of thirty (30) in each class.

- For those districts which do not have any classes with an enrollment in excess of 32 and whose average size for all the classes is 30.0 or less, there shall be no excess declared. For those districts which have one or more classes in excess of an enrollment of 32 or whose average size for all the classes is more than 30, the excess shall be the total of the number of pupils which are in excess of 30 in each class having an enrollment of more than 30.

(b) For grades 4 to 8, inclusive, he shall determine the total number of pupils enrolled, the number of full-time equivalent classroom teachers, and the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent classroom teacher. He shall also determine the excess if any, of pupils enrolled in such grades in the following manner:

(1) Determine the number of pupils by which the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent classroom teacher for the current fiscal year exceeds the greater of the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent classroom teacher in all the appropriate districts of the state, as determined by the Superintendent of Public Instruction, for October 30, 1964, or the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent classroom teacher which existed in the district on either October 30, 1964 or March 30, 1964, as selected by the governing board.

(2) Multiply the number determined in (1) above by the number of full-time equivalent classroom teachers of the current fiscal year.

(3) Reduce the number determined in (2) above by the remainder which results from dividing such number by the average number of pupils per each full-time equivalent teacher for October 30, 1964, as determined by the Superintendent of Public Instruction in (1) above.

(c) He shall compute the product obtained by multiplying the excess number of pupils, if any, under the provisions of subdivision (a) of this section by ninety seven hundredths (0.97), and shall multiply the product so obtained by the ratio of statewide change in average daily attendance to district change in average daily attendance. Change in average daily attendance shall be determined by dividing average daily attendance in grades 1, 2 and 3 reported for purposes of the first principal apportionment of the current year by that reported for purposes of the first principal apportionment of the preceding year.

(d) If the school district reports that it has maintained, during the current fiscal year, any classes in which there were enrolled pupils in excess of thirty (30) per class pursuant to subdivision (a) of this section, and there is no excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section, he shall decrease the average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 by the product determined under subdivision (c) of this section.

(e) If the school district reports that it has maintained, during the current fiscal year, no classes in which there were enrolled pupils in excess of thirty (30) per class determined pursuant to subdivision (a) of this section, and there is an excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section, he shall make the following computation:

He shall compute the product obtained by multiplying the excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section by ninety-seven hundredths (0.97) and shall multiply the product so obtained by the ratio of statewide change in average daily attendance to the district change in average daily attendance. He shall decrease the average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 by the resulting product.

(f) If the school district reports that it has maintained, during the current fiscal year, any classes in which there were enrolled pupils in excess of thirty (30) per class determined pursuant to subdivision (a) of this section, and there is an excess number of pupils computed pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section, he shall make the following computation:

He shall add to the product determined under subdivision (c) of this section, the product determined under subdivision (e) of this section and decrease the average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 by this total amount.

The governing board of each school district maintaining elementary schools shall report for the fiscal year 1964-65 and each year thereafter the information required for the determination to be made by the Superintendent of Public Instruction under the provisions of this section in accordance with instructions provided on forms furnished and prescribed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Such information shall be reported by the school district together with, and at the same time as, the reports required to be filed for the second principal apportionment of the State School Fund. The forms on which the data and information is reported shall include a certification by each school district superintendent or chief administrative officer that the data is correct and accurate for the period covered, according to his best information and belief.

For purposes of this section, a "full-time equivalent classroom teacher" means an employee of an elementary, high school, or unified school district, employed in a position requiring certification qualifications and whose duties require him to teach pupils in the elementary schools of that district in regular day classes for the full time for which he is employed during the regular schoolday. In reporting the total number of full-time equivalent classroom teachers, there shall be included, in addition to those employees defined above, the full-time equivalent of all fractional time for which employees in positions requiring certification qualifications are required to devote to teaching pupils in the elementary schools of the district in regular day classes during the regular schoolday.

For purposes of this section, the number of pupils enrolled in each class means the average of the active enrollment in that class on the last teaching day of each school month which ends prior to April 15th of each school year.

The provisions of this section are not applicable to school districts with less than 101 units of average daily attendance for the current fiscal year.

Although no decreases in average daily attendance shall be made for the fiscal year 1964-65, reports are required to be filed under the provisions of this section, and the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall notify each school district the amount of the decrease in state allowances which would have been effected had such decrease in average daily attendance been applied.

The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall adopt rules and regulations which he may deem necessary for the effective administration of this section. Such rules and regulations may specify that no decrease in average daily attendance reported under the provisions of Section 41601 shall be made for a school district on account of large classes due to instructional television or team teaching, which may necessarily involve class sizes at periods during the day larger than the standard set forth in this section.

- Background: The District is in the process of assessing the financial solvency of its budget. Billions of dollars of deficit within the State's budget has exacerbated the District's budget concerns brought about by a few years of declining enrollment and program encroachment. Education Codes 44949 and 44955 specify that the Board of Trustees adopt a resolution to notify permanent and probationary certificated employees who may be laid off. This notice is to come initially as a resolution specifying the particular kinds of services that are to be discontinued. Final notices of the specific individuals to be part of the layoff process must be delivered prior to March 15, 2010.
- Rationale: A resolution must be adopted by the Board of Trustees to specify the programs and personnel who are to be part of the layoff process in accordance with Education Codes 44949 and 44955. This notice is also required by the County in the preparation and submission of the District's Second Interim Budget Report to verify what budgetary adjustments the District is recommending to maintain the required three percent reserve.

## Funding: Not applicable.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Adopt Resolution #09/10-12 to prepare for the Certificated personnel layoff process for the 2010/2011 fiscal year.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Superintendent to give notice to employees who may be laid off as a result of reduction in services prior to March 15, 2010, which notice is subject to Board review and final decision prior to May 15, 2010.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the District, or his designee, is hereby directed to give written notice to certificated employees pursuant to Education Code Sections 44949 and 44955, and any other relevant provisions of the Education Code prior to March 15, 2010, in order to reduce the number of certificated positions as set forth in the attached Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as between certificated employees who first rendered service in a probationary position on the same date, the order of termination of said employee/s shall be determined by referral to the tiebreaker criteria, as described in Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the actual layoff of any employee is subject to the final review and determination of this Board after appropriate hearings and deliberations.

# EXHIBIT B

Determination of Seniority Among Certificated Employees with the Same Seniority Date ("Tie-Breaker Resolution")

This Board determines that the needs of the District and the students of this District are best served by resolving seniority ties within the meaning of Education Code Sections 44955, subdivision (b) (third paragraph) and Section 44846, by applying the criteria set forth below; as between employees who first rendered paid service to the district in a probationary position on the same date, the order of termination of said employees shall be determined by reference to the criteria which follow and the application thereof to each employee; and the criteria set forth in paragraphs 1 through 8 below are listed in priority order and each criterion shall be used only if the preceding criteria do not delineate the order of termination:

1. An employee who possesses a credential to teach or provide a service which is not being reduced or eliminated will be regarded as having greater seniority for purposes of determining seniority.

2. An employee who is currently teaching or providing a service which is not being reduced or eliminated will be retained over an employee of the same seniority who is currently serving in a position being eliminated or reduced.

3. Between certificated employees possessing the same seniority date and who possess the following in rank order with each succeeding option being of lower status than the preceding:

- (a) Clear or standard professional credential
- (b) Preliminary credential

4. Assuming that the preceding paragraphs does not resolve all ties between employees having the same seniority date, then employees possessing one of the following in rank order with each succeeding option being of lower status than the preceding will be regarded as having greater seniority than the employee holding an item lower on the ranked list:

- (a) No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Highly Qualified Teachers as determined by the District in the subject matter authorization
- (b) Bilingual, Cross-cultural, Language and Academic Development (BCLAD) Authorization
- (c) English Language (EL) authorization to teach English Language Learners (Cross-cultural, Language, and Academic Development (CLAD/EL); emergency permits do not qualify)

5. Assuming that the preceding paragraph does not resolve all ties between employees having the same seniority date then employees possessing one of the following in rank, order(all options within a sub set being equal) with each succeeding option being of lower

status than the preceding will be regarded as having greater seniority than the employee holding an item lower on the ranked list:

- (a) Persons currently holding the listed certificate or are currently assigned to one of the following District-identified specialized assignments listed as follows:
  - i. GATE Certificate
  - ii. GATE Identified Class/Cluster (2/3 identified students)
  - iii. IB Certificate
  - iv. IB Identified Classroom
  - v. CTAP II Certificate
  - vi. Identified 1:1 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning Classroom
  - vii. Multi-age Identified Classroom
  - viii. QEIA Identified Classroom
  - ix. Teacher in a Program Improvement (PI) level 3-5 school
- (b) Two or more subject matter authorizations which include at least one of the following:
  - i. Special Education with moderate to severe authorization
  - ii. Special Education with mild to moderate authorization
  - iii. Mathematics
  - iv. Science
- (c) Two or more subject matter authorizations which include at least one of the following:
  - i. Foreign Languages
  - ii. Fine Arts
  - iii. English
  - iv. Social Sciences/Social Studies
  - v. History

6. Assuming that the preceding paragraphs do not resolve all ties between certificated employees having the same seniority date, then certificated employees will be ranked by actual step placement on the District Certificated Salary Schedule(s) starting with the greatest number of years to the least number of years.

7. Assuming that the preceding paragraphs do not resolve all ties between certificated employees having the same seniority date, then certificated employees will be ranked by actual column placement on the District Certificated Salary Schedule(s) starting with Column 4 to Column 1.

8. If the criteria listed above does not break a tie, the District shall hold a lottery at least five work days prior to the layoff hearing. Each group of tied employees shall have the right to attend the lottery and pick a lottery number. In the absence of the employee, the Assistant Superintendent of Personnel, or designee, will select a lottery number on behalf of the employee.

## Independent Study – Page 1

Board Adopted: <u>November 28, 2006</u> Revised: <u>July 21, 2009</u> Revised: <u>January 19, 2010</u> Revised: February 23, 2010

The Board of Trustees authorizes independent study as an optional alternative instructional strategy for students whose needs may be best met through study outside of the regular classroom setting. Independent study shall offer a means of individualizing the educational plan and enabling students to reach curriculum objectives and fulfill graduation requirements. As necessary to meet student needs, independent study may be offered on a full-time basis or on a part-time basis in conjunction with part-or full-time classroom study.

The Superintendent or designee shall approve independent study for an individual student only upon determining that the student is prepared to meet the District's requirements for independent study and is likely to succeed in independent study as well as or better than he/she would in the regular classroom.

The minimum period of time for any independent study option shall be five **consecutive** school days.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that a written independent study agreement, as prescribed by law, exists for each participating student. (Education Code 51747)

To foster each participating student's success in independent study, the Board **has** established the maximum lengths of time which may elapse between the date an assignment is made and the date by which the student must complete the assigned work **is** one week for students in grades K-8. (an assignment = 1 week's worth of work)

When circumstances justify a longer time, the Superintendent or designee may extend the assignment to no longer than the semester of enrollment.

When any participating student fails to complete three independent study assignments in one semester, an evaluation shall be conducted and documented in writing to determine whether it is in the student's best interest to remain in independent study.

- SUBJECT: "SUNSHINE" FULLERTON ELEMENTARY TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (FETA) PROPOSAL TO NEGOTIATE A SUCCESSOR AGREEMENT WITH THE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT, 2010-2013 SCHOOL YEARS
- <u>Background:</u> Meeting and negotiating shall not take place on any proposal until a reasonable time has elapsed after the submission of the proposal to enable the public to become informed and until the public has had the opportunity to express itself regarding the proposal at a Board meeting.

The current Agreement allows for a Successor Agreement to be negotiated up to the school years of 2010-2013 with Fullerton Elementary Teachers Association (FETA). Once FETA's and the District's initial proposals have been submitted, the collective bargaining process may begin. The Agreement that was reached for the 2009-2010 school year set the date of March 8, 2010 as the start of negotiations for the Successor Agreement.

- <u>Rationale:</u> Government Code Section 3547 requires that all initial proposals of exclusive representative and of public school employers relating to matters within the scope of representation be presented at a public meeting. Proposals become public record once they are presented ("sunshine").
