Background: On June 5, 2006 the Fullerton School District Board of Trustees, awarded a contract to CCS Presentation Systems for Audio and Video Systems in seventeen (17) new and existing Multipurpose Rooms in the amount of \$223,282.61. The next lowest responsive and responsible bid was received from Videocam Incorporated, in the amount of \$397,623.22. In the course of this project several unforeseeable technical issues have arisen that necessitated the services of an audio and video consultant to work with the contractor (CCS) and District to resolve those issues. In September of 2006, the Fullerton School District Board of Trustees, approved an Independent Contractor Agreement with Joel J. Gread Associates, Inc., to provide audio and video services for a maximum total of \$4,750.00. However, the project completion process for audio and video systems in seventeen new and existing multipurpose rooms has required a significant amount of extra time by the consultant to support the awarded contractor and insure that the best interests of the Fullerton School District are maintained on this project. The extra consulting time has been spent on resolving additional installation, equipment, documentation, and training issues for the seventeen multipurpose rooms. Numerous communications, site visits, documentation reviews, and meetings have been necessary to address and resolve various complex technical issues in the multipurpose rooms.

> Joel J. Gread Associates, Inc., has provided well over two hundred (200) hours of work since project inception with a total value of engineering services rendered at more than \$20,000. The audio and video consultant has provided invaluable technical support by augmenting Fullerton School District's in-house and construction management resources by providing experience and expertise in complex audio and video systems. The consultant has addressed numerous inadequacies in the audio video contractors' submitted system documentation, installation methods and training procedures. Joel J. Gread Associates, Inc., identified the source of a critical audio problem that was affecting the quality of multipurpose room sound, when combined with video and stage lighting components. The audio and video contractor, CCS Presentation Systems, is following Joel J. Gread Associates, Inc., recommendations to correct this serious audio issue in all multipurpose rooms.

In order to compensate Joel J. Gread Associates, Inc., for support already received, and complete the audio and video projects in all seventeen multipurpose buildings the total requested amendment amount is; \$9,262.50 (not to exceed 97.5 hours @\$95 per hour). It is anticipated that all extra consultant support efforts and project completion will occur by end of May 2007. Even with the unusual circumstances noted above, the total engineering time expended is in line with a multi-faceted project of this type and substantially below the project cost of the next lowest bidder Videocam Incorporated at \$397,623.22. (A copy of the contract, amendment, and time sheet/summary statement is available for review in the Business Office.)

- Background: New financial and accounting requirements soon will be imposed on public agencies per GASB (Governmental Accounting Standards Board) pronouncement 45 concerning other Post Retirement Benefits (OPEB's). For an agency of Fullerton School District's size, the deadline for implementation is 2007/08, and the establishment of an irrevocable trust is one of the first stages of the process. Establishing a Fund 71 will set up the irrevocable trust. The initial funding source will be a transfer of funds currently totaling \$2,239,907 in Fund 20, the Special Reserve for Post Employment Benefits Fund. Fund 20 is not an irrevocable trust hence the need for the new fund and the Interfund transfer. In June 2005, the District had an actuarial study prepared to establish the extent of the District's OPEB liability projected at that time to be \$18.3 million as of 2005. That actuarial study is currently being updated, and staff will bring the results of that study and a funding plan back to the Board at a later date.
- Funding: Fund 20 Special Reserve for Post Employment Benefits

- Background: The State of California reduces school district revenue limit income by the amount of money a school district saves by not paying into the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) at the base rate established in the 1981-82 fiscal year. Classified salaries that are charged to federal funding sources are excluded from this reduction, and thus the revenue limit income is not reduced. The Food Services Fund does not account for the expenditure of funds by income source, making this exclusion difficult to identify. By adopting this resolution annually, the District will be able to continue to exclude additional classified salaries to the full extent of federal funds received, versus just a pro-rata portion. Based upon 07/08 budget data, all classified salaries would be excludable, resulting in continued annual estimated savings to the Food Services Fund of \$50,000.
- Funding: Savings to Food Services Fund
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Adopt Resolution No. 06/07-16 approving the first use of federal Child Nutrition revenues for the 2007/08 fiscal year.

- SUBJECT: SELECT OPTION #1, 2, 3, 4 OR 5 FOR FENCING AT ROBERT FISLER SCHOOL
- Background: Since the opening of the new Robert Fisler School in the fall of 2003, the District has been paying for temporary fencing around the perimeter of the new school. To date the District has paid \$23,788 for this temporary fencing. Neighbors and community members living in the Amerige Heights area have continued to express a desire for the District to install permanent, wrought iron fencing (versus chain link fencing) at the school in order to coordinate with the existing fencing of the Amerige community. The cost of the wrought iron fencing would be approximately \$47,000. To offset this cost, donations totaling \$1,330 have been collected to date.

In addition to wrought iron fencing (Option #1 / \$47,000), other options are green plastic coated chain link fencing (Option #2 / \$26,000), standard galvanized chain link fencing (Option #3 / \$24,000), install custom fabricated fence to match existing fence on west side of school (Option #4/ \$63,197), and aluminum fencing (Option #5/ \$51,382). Longevity is estimated at 10 years for wrought iron, 20 years for green, plastic coated chain link and fabricated fence, and 30 years for standard galvanized chain link. Longevity of aluminum fence varies depending on application, but is not recommended for this application.

As background, a few years ago the City of Fullerton and the District shared 50% / 50% the cost of installing a green wrought iron fence on the south side of Maple School when the City renovated the park. The District installed a green plastic coated chain link fence at the southwest corner of Woodcrest School, and recently installed a 4 ft. wrought iron fence in front of Woodcrest School to keep non-school related foot traffic off District property during the school day.

Staff recommends the Board of Trustees select one of these five options for the fence needed at Robert Fisler School.

- Funding: Developer Fees Fund (25) and donations.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Select Option #1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 for fencing at Robert Fisler School.

<u>Background</u> :	Thirty-five kindergarten through eighth grade teachers participated in the science textbook piloting process that extended from December 2006 to May 2007. Science textbooks and materials were on public display at the District from March through April. Notices appeared in local newspapers, at school sites, and at the public library. Throughout the process, the Curriculum Steering Committee, comprised of parents, teachers, and administrators, was informed of the adoption process through presentations given by pilot teachers and administrators. Following the piloting process and the completion of an on-line evaluation survey, the pilot teachers voted on the science textbook series believed to best meet the needs of the Fullerton School District grades K-5 and 6-8 students.
	After evaluation of science textbook instructional materials for grades K-5 and 6-8, the selected materials were presented to the Curriculum Steering Committee (CSC). On May 17, 2007 the Curriculum Steering Committee voted to recommend to the Board of Trustees the <i>MacMillan/McGraw Hill Science</i> textbook materials for grades kindergarten through five and <i>McDougal Littell Science</i> for grades six through eight.
	The recommended textbook materials are on the current California Department of Education Adoption List and are aligned with the California Science Standards and the Fullerton School District Hands-On Science, Standards-Based Curriculum. The technology components of the science textbook programs include on-line textbooks, science lab simulations, classroom presentation software, and web-based assessment options.
<u>Funding</u> :	The cost for science materials for grades K-5 and 6-8 is approximately \$900,000.00. Funds are budgeted in Account #0138055101-4100 (Instructional Materials Fund).
Recommendation:	Adopt grades K-5 and 6-8 science standards-based textbook materials.

- SUBJECT: APPROVE REQUESTS FROM GOLDEN HILL, HERMOSA DRIVE, LADERA VISTA JUNIOR HIGH AND PARKS JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS TO WAIVE LAPTOP SURVEY PERCENTAGE REQUIREMENT FOR INCOMIING STUDENTS AS AUTHORIZED IN THE ACLU SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT
- Background: Parents at schools participating in the Laptops for Learning program were surveyed regarding their interest in participating in this program during the 2007-08 school year. The settlement agreement with the ACLU requires that for new students, at least 90% of families need to indicate a willingness to participate in a lease-purchase agreement or to request a grant-in-aid or scholarship to help defray the cost of the laptop. The school can also use any of its local/State/federal funding apart from the District's unrestricted funds to supplement family contributions.

Four schools are requesting that they be allowed to use local categorical funds or funds raised through school or Foundation fund-raising efforts. Hermosa Drive 5/6 parents indicated 66% support. Golden Hill is seeking to reestablish its laptop program in grade 6. Its incoming parents indicated 72% support. Ladera Vista is seeking to establish a FAME 1:1 program, and its parents indicated 85% support. Parks is seeking to establish a science and technology 1:1 program, and its parents indicated 77% support. These schools are requesting the Board's approval to waive the 90% support requirement and be allowed to make up the difference in funding with school categorical funds or funds raised through school and Foundation fund-raising activities.

Staff believes that based on past performance, the needed fund rasing will happen, and therefore supports the requests.

<u>Funding:</u> Categorical funds and funds raised through local and Foundation efforts.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Approve requests from Golden Hill, Hermosa Drive, Ladera Vista Junior High and Parks Junior High Schools to waive the laptop survey percentage requirement for incoming students as authorized in the ACLU settlement agreement.

INSTRUCTION

Homework - Page 1

The Board of Trustees recognizes that homework contributes toward building responsibility, selfdiscipline and life-long learning habits, and that time spent on homework directly influences students' ability to meet the District's academic standards. The Board expects students, parents/guardians and staff to view homework as a routine and important part of students' daily lives.

Homework is defined as out-of-class tasks assigned to students as an extension or elaboration of classroom work. There are three types of homework: practice, preparation, and extension.

Homework may include pencil and paper tasks as well as reading, Internet search, watching a specific program, long term projects, etc. At the middle/junior high schools, long term projects should be interdepartmental. Classwork that is not completed during the day and sent home is also considered homework. Homework is never given as a punishment.

When considering the amount of time a student should spend per night on homework, the Board supports the recommendations of a number of research studies:

Primary students: 10 - 30 minutes per night
Upper elementary students: 30 - 90 minutes per night
Middle school/junior high students: 50 - 120 minutes per night

The Board recognizes the importance of student involvement in after-school activities. Sleep requirements for students must be taken into consideration. Research shows that elementary students should have 10 to 12 hours of sleep each night, while junior high students require from 9 to 11 hours nightly.

District, site administrators, and teachers must fully comprehend the components of a strong homework program. The District is responsible for communicating the homework policy to administrators, teachers, parents, and students. It is also the responsibility of the District to guarantee that site administrators fully understand their responsibilities in implementing a sound homework program, including the training of teachers.

Principals are responsible for overseeing the training of teachers, focusing on the District's homework policy, appropriate homework assignments, how to ensure that students are receiving feedback on homework, etc. In addition, principals need to ensure that parents are informed regarding the District's homework policy.

Teachers are responsible for informing parents regarding the District's homework policy. The homework they assign should be for practice, preparation, and/or extension. It is the responsibility of the teacher to differentiate homework assignments to ensure a child is spending the appropriate amount of time on homework. Teachers should provide feedback to students on all homework assignments and notify parents if homework is not completed in a timely manner.

Homework - Page 2

Students are responsible for completing their homework independently and should request clarification from their teacher regarding homework assignments, as appropriate. Parent involvement in homework should be kept to a minimum.

Parents are responsibile to provide a suitable study area and the necessary tools to complete homework assignments. Parents should set a schedule with their child and allow sufficient time to complete homework. However, if a child is spending more than the allotted average time on homework, the parent should feel free to contact the classroom teacher.

ARTICLE 8 HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT

B. Each teacher, in addition to the work week described above, may be required to attend <u>one</u> school and <u>or</u> district sponsored events <u>per year</u>. School site principal and staff will make a reasonable effort to set a yearly site calendar, including school-wide and District sponsored events. Changes and adjustments may still occur throughout the year, but the principal will confer with the staff to assist in calendaring such events.

ARTICLE 9 WORK YEAR

C. School Calendar

There shall be a Calendar Committee which shall meet as needed to develop the school calendar. The committee shall include representatives of all interested parties as decided by the District after consultation with FETA. The committee shall include a least one (1) member nominated by FETA. The committee shall send a recommendation to the Board of Trustees for action at a Board meeting that occurs no later than 15 March of the school year in which the committee is meeting.

ARTICLE 10 TRANSFERS

D. District Initiated Transfer

A transfer may be initiated by the District for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Affirmative action goals of the District;
- 2. Change in enrollment;
- 3. Need for teachers specially credentialed and/or trained;
- Need to move a teacher whose evaluation is negative to another evaluator or another environment to facilitate improvement with such transfer basis not to be used in consecutive years.
- 5. The welfare of the students in the school district or the welfare of the employee.

When the District initiates a transfer, the unit member shall be provided a specific explanation of the reason(s) of the transfer.

Teachers subject to district initiated transfers shall have the right to indicate preference from a list of vacancies. This list of vacancies shall be posted by March 15 and shall be updated each ten (10) days thereafter.

In the event that transfer is necessitated by decrease in enrollment, the Immediate Administrator shall first determine if there are volunteers for transfer. If there are no volunteers, the Immediate Administrator shall use the following criteria in designating the transferee:

- 1. Credentials to perform the required services in remaining positions.
- 2. Specialized training and experience needed in a particular assignment.
- 3. All other factors being equal, the teacher with the least District seniority shall be transferred. Whenever the District determines that a teacher is to be involuntarily transferred, the teacher shall be notified in writing within ten (10) days.

ARTICLE 16 SALARIES

A. The Certificated Salary Schedules in effect on June 30, 2007 (Appendix A) shall be increased effective July 1, 2007 by an amount equal to the percentage increase above the District's 2006-07 state, federal, and local revenues, growth monies less mandated costs, and a pro rata share of the District's Unappropriated Fund Balance which exceeds the General Fund's recommended minimum reserve percentage.

I. Provide stipends to unit members who teach special education and combination classes.

ARTICLE 17 FRINGE BENEFITS

2. The District shall purchase life insurance through M.E.B.A. that provides coverage for all unit members equal to a unit member's annual salary. Additional coverage may be purchased by the unit member.

3. Improve the Delta Dental Plan in the following manner:

- a. Eliminate the \$25 per person & \$75 per family deductibles (in-network and out-ofnetwork)
- b. Change the Basic Benefits (in-network and out-of-network) from 80% allowed fee to 80-100% approved fee
- c. Change the Crowns, Jackets, and other Restorations (in-network and out-of-network) from 80% allowed fee to 80-100% approved fee
