The District's Plan Administrator is hereby authorized to implement the plan(s), execute the PARS legal documents on behalf of the District and to take whatever additional actions are necessary to maintain the District's participation in PARS and to maintain PARS compliance of any relevant regulation issued or as may be issued; therefore, authorizing him/her to take whatever additional actions are required to administer the District's PARS plan(s).

ARTICLE 8 HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT

B. Each teacher, in addition to the work week described above, may be required to attend <u>one</u> school and <u>or</u> district sponsored events <u>per year</u>. School site principal and staff will make a reasonable effort to set a yearly site calendar, including school-wide and District sponsored events. Changes and adjustments may still occur throughout the year, but the principal will confer with the staff to assist in calendaring such events.

ARTICLE 9 WORK YEAR

C. School Calendar

.

There shall be a Calendar Committee which shall meet as needed to develop the school calendar. The committee shall include representatives of all interested parties as decided by the District after consultation with FETA. The committee shall include a least one (1) member nominated by FETA. The committee shall send a recommendation to the Board of Trustees for action at a Board meeting that occurs no later than 15 March of the school year in which the committee is meeting.

ARTICLE 10 TRANSFERS

D. District Initiated Transfer

A transfer may be initiated by the District for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Affirmative action goals of the District;
- 2. Change in enrollment;
- 3. Need for teachers specially credentialed and/or trained;
- 4. Need to move a teacher whose evaluation is negative to another evaluator or another environment to facilitate improvement with such transfer basis not to be used in consecutive years.
- 5. The welfare of the students in the school district or the welfare of the employee.

When the District initiates a transfer, the unit member shall be provided a specific explanation of the reason(s) of the transfer.

Teachers subject to district initiated transfers shall have the right to indicate preference from a list of vacancies. This list of vacancies shall be posted by March 15 and shall be updated each ten (10) days thereafter.

In the event that transfer is necessitated by decrease in enrollment, the Immediate Administrator shall first determine if there are volunteers for transfer. If there are no volunteers, the Immediate Administrator shall use the following criteria in designating the transferee:

- 1. Credentials to perform the required services in remaining positions.
- 2. Specialized training and experience needed in a particular assignment.
- 3. All other factors being equal, the teacher with the least District seniority shall be transferred. Whenever the District determines that a teacher is to be involuntarily transferred, the teacher shall be notified in writing within ten (10) days.

ARTICLE 16 SALARIES

A. The Certificated Salary Schedules in effect on June 30, 2007 (Appendix A) shall be increased effective July 1, 2007 by an amount equal to the percentage increase above the District's 2006-07 state, federal, and local revenues, growth monies less mandated costs, and a pro rata share of the District's Unappropriated Fund Balance which exceeds the General Fund's recommended minimum reserve percentage.

I. Provide stipends to unit members who teach special education and combination classes.

ARTICLE 17 FRINGE BENEFITS

2. The District shall purchase life insurance through M.E.B.A. that provides coverage for all unit members equal to a unit member's annual salary. Additional coverage may be purchased by the unit member.

3. Improve the Delta Dental Plan in the following manner:

- a. Eliminate the \$25 per person & \$75 per family deductibles (in-network and out-ofnetwork)
- b. Change the Basic Benefits (in-network and out-of-network) from 80% allowed fee to 80-100% approved fee
- c. Change the Crowns, Jackets, and other Restorations (in-network and out-of-network) from 80% allowed fee to 80-100% approved fee

- Background: Fullerton School District receives payments from parents and others for various programs and services the District offers. Payments made by personal check are accepted by District staff and deposited in the appropriate program's/services' bank account. Currently, Fullerton Community Bank electronically presents the check twice if the check writer has non-sufficient funds (NSF) the first time to pay the check. If the check remains NSF, the checks are returned to the District. The District remains unpaid, the funds are not collected, and the District is charged the bank's NSF fee.

Attempts by District staff to collect these funds have been time consuming and typically unsuccessful. In the 2005/06 fiscal year, the District received at least \$68,000 in uncollected NSF checks. Various programs experience deep financial shortfalls such as Child Care, Food Services, ASB, Student Body Accounts, and other General Fund programs.

District staff recommends that the District enter into an Agreement with eCollect of Ohio, Inc. to handle collection of NSF checks. There is no cost to the District for this service. Under the proposed Agreement, Fullerton Community Bank presents each check only once for payment. Fullerton Community Bank then forwards all NSF checks to eCollect at no out-of-pocket cost to the District. eCollect electronically re-presents the check up to two times, and when the funds are collected, a \$25 fee per check is electronically paid to eCollect from the check writer's account. The full face value of the check is then paid to the District weekly through the Automated Clearing House (ACH). The District receives only the face value of the check, so the District makes no profit from using this service. If eCollect cannot collect the funds after 2 electronic representments, the check is returned to the District at no cost.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Approve/Ratify Agreement with eCollect of Ohio, Inc. to handle collection of non-sufficient funds (NSF) checks processed by Fullerton Community Bank for Fullerton School District bank accounts.

CLIENT'S bank account will credited every seven- (7) business days on collected checks. COMPANY shall retain any fees collected from the check writer.

AGREEMENT

INSTRUCTION

Homework – Page 1

The Board of Trustees recognizes that homework contributes toward building responsibility, selfdiscipline and life-long learning habits, and that time spent on homework directly influences students' ability to meet the District's academic standards. The Board expects students, parents/guardians and staff to view homework as a routine and important part of students' daily lives.

Homework is defined as <u>meaningful</u> out-of-class tasks assigned to students as an extension or elaboration of classroom work. There are three types of homework: practice, preparation, and extension.

Homework may include pencil and paper tasks as well as reading, Internet search, watching a specific program, long term projects, etc. At the middle/junior high schools, long term projects should be interdepartmental. Classwork that is not completed during the day and sent home is also considered homework. Homework is never given as a punishment.

When considering the amount of time a student should spend per night on homework, the Board supports the recommendations of a number of research studies:

Primary students: 10 - 30 minutes per night
Upper elementary students: 30 - 90 minutes per night
Middle school/junior high students: 50 - 120 minutes per night

The Board recognizes the importance of student involvement in after-school activities. Sleep requirements for students must be taken into consideration. Research shows that elementary students should have 10 to 12 hours of sleep each night, while junior high students require from 9 to 11 hours nightly.

District, site administrators, and teachers must fully comprehend the components of a strong homework program. The District is responsible for communicating the homework policy to administrators, teachers, parents, and students. It is also the responsibility of the District to guarantee that site administrators fully understand their responsibilities in implementing a sound homework program, including the training of teachers.

Principals are responsible for overseeing the training of teachers, focusing on the District's homework policy, appropriate homework assignments, how to ensure that students are receiving feedback on homework, etc. In addition, principals need to ensure that parents are informed regarding the District's homework policy.

Teachers are responsible for informing parents regarding the District's homework policy. The homework they assign should be for practice, preparation, and/or extension. It is the responsibility of the teacher to differentiate homework assignments to ensure a child is spending the appropriate amount of time on homework. Teachers should provide feedback to students on all homework assignments and notify parents if homework is not completed in a timely manner.

INSTRUCTION

Homework - Page 2

Students are responsible for completing their homework independently and <u>Students</u> should request clarification from their teacher regarding homework assignments, as appropriate. Parent involvement in homework should be kept to a minimum.

Parents are responsibile to provide a suitable study area and the necessary tools to complete homework assignments. Parents should set a schedule with their child and allow sufficient time to complete homework. However, if a child is spending more than the allotted average time on homework, the parent should feel free to contact the classroom teacher.

- SUBJECT: ADOPT DECLARATION OF NEED FOR FULLY QUALIFIED EDUCATORS FOR THE 2007-2008 SCHOOL YEAR

Background: As of 1996, a "Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators" must be completed and adopted yearly based on the anticipated need for the subsequent school year. This Declaration has to be Board adopted and submitted to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing before any credentials may be renewed.

The Fullerton School District has the following general needs that may be met through the emergency credential and/or waiver process:

• Classroom teachers to meet authorization for instruction to limited English proficient students per Williams Lawsuit in schools ranked in deciles 1-3.

• All CORE Academic Subject teachers to become NCLB compliant.

• Filling English language development, special education positions for which a specialist credential is required in addition to a basic teaching credential.

• Filling Preschool, special education positions for which a specialist credential is required.

• Filling Speech Therapist positions where there is such a shortage of specialists.

• Filling positions at the junior high which are hard to find, i.e., home economics, health, foreign language, science, math, English or English Language Learners, and band.

• Obtaining certification for those teachers, who, because of scheduling needs, teach one or two periods outside their credentialed area, i.e., five periods of English and one period of physical education.

• Filling positions with teachers from out of state or private schools to allow these educators additional time to complete California credentialing requirements.

The Board of Trustees is required to adopt the "Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators" at a public meeting certifying that there may be an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the District's specific employment criteria for identified positions. The completed Declaration is filed with the Commission on Teacher Credentialing and permits the District to obtain short-term certifications as needed during the school year.

- <u>Background</u>: Assembly Bill 939 (Chapter 390, Statutes of 1999) became effective in January 2000. This bill added a section to the California Education Code, requiring that a district governing board discuss plans and proposals for expenditures of funds for deferred maintenance at a public hearing.

California Education Code, Section 17582 through 17592 provides the State Deferred Maintenance Program (Program). The Program annually grants matching funds for school districts to perform specified repair and replacement of existing school building components as delineated on the District's approved 5-Year Deferred Maintenance Plan.

Plan changes and updates must be approved and submitted in order to receive state matching funds.
