Background: The first complete year of the agreement with TechRoom, Inc. is due to end on September 30, 2007. Both parties wish to continue the agreement for computer maintenance and problem prevention of hardware and software. Food Services has 20 personal computers operating the daily meal counting and related financial software at school sites. These computers are operating in kitchen environments, operating outside during the meal service, and are on mobile carts. Thus they are subject to high volume usage on a daily basis by more than one user under physical conditions that are not ideal. These computers are connected to the District network and transfer student meal count and finance data daily. AGREEMENT FOR SPECIAL SERVICES Fiscal and Mandate Information Services

This is an agreement between the **FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT**, hereinafter referred to as "Client," and **SCHOOL SERVICES OF CALIFORNIA**, **INC.**, hereinafter referred to as "Consultant," entered into as of July 1, 2007.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Client needs assistance regarding issues of school finance, legislation, school budgeting, general fiscal issues, and the state-mandated program cost claims process; and

WHEREAS, SCHOOL SERVICES OF CALIFORNIA, INC., is professionally and specially trained and competent to provide these services; and,

WHEREAS, the authority for entering into this agreement is contained in Section 53060 of the Government Code and such other provisions of California law as may be applicable;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties to this agreement do hereby mutually agree as follows:

- 1. Consultant agrees to perform such duties relating to issues of school finance, including:
 - a. Delivery of "one copy" of each edition of the *Fiscal Report* containing information on issues of school finance, budgets, or practices that impact school district fiscal policies and one copy of the booklet *Analysis of the Governor's Budget*.
 - b. Providing the option to the Client of receiving information on Consultant's Internet website regarding major school finance and policy issues.
 - c. An analysis of all major school finance/fiscal legislation and reports on its legislative/executive branch progress.
 - d. Preliminary school district revenue limit worksheets for the Client's use in developing the annual budgets as quickly as possible following adoption of the major annual school finance legislation.
 - e. Participation at the Consultant's client rate at the Consultant's school finance conferences and workshops.
- 2. Consultant agrees to perform such duties relating to the education reimbursable mandated program as set forth herein. Consultant shall:

- a. Counsel the Client on information relating to the local mandate reimbursement process for all applicable legislation already adopted that contains a reimbursement appropriation.
- b. Counsel the Client on new mandates and represent the Client when appropriate before the Commission on State Mandates.
- c. Provide the Client with information on the Consultant's mandate website regarding pending legislation, Commission on State Mandates actions, and test claims filed on new laws.
- d. Maintain liaison with the State Controller, the Commission on State Mandates, the State Department of Finance, and the various departments whose actions relative to mandate claims impact upon the Client.
- e. Provide one copy of each edition of the Mandate Report containing information on state-mandated reimbursement issues.
- 3. The Consultant shall provide the Client with services as requested to a total of twelve (12) direct service hours during the 12-month period of this agreement at no additional cost beyond the annual fee. The hours of service may be used as the Client directs on fiscal and mandate service issues, including mandate counseling, revenue limit calculations, special education calculations, analysis of specific client revenue or expenditure issues, analysis of specific legislative or regulatory issues, including a "quick query" service to provide telephone response to specific fiscal or mandate questions of the Client. Services for which the base service hours may not be used include Client-specific economy, efficiency, or management studies; demographic or school facility studies; special education revenue maximization studies; direct collective bargaining or factfinding assistance; legislative representation or advocacy; appearance as an expert witness; provision of depositions or declarations for district legal issues; or major customized research projects or studies.
- 4. In consideration of the services described above, the Client agrees to pay to Consultant, for services rendered under this agreement:
 - a. \$3,000 annually, plus expenses, or payable at \$250 per month, plus expenses, upon receipt of a billing from Consultant.
 - b. For all requested services in excess of twelve (12) direct service hours as indicated in Item 3 above in the 12-month period, the applicable hourly rate for the person(s) performing the services shall apply.
 - c. "Hours" are defined as hours of direct service to the Client, as well as reasonable travel time to and from the Client's site.
 - d. "Expenses" are defined as actual, out-of-pocket expenses, such as transportation, lodging, meals, long-distance telephone charges, cellular



telephone charges, FAX charges, postage, and duplication (other than for one copy of the above-mentioned publications).

- 5. This agreement shall be for the period of one year, beginning July 1, 2007, and terminating June 30, 2008. Either party hereto on 30 days' written notice may terminate it at any time prior to June 30, 2008. In the event that the Client elects to terminate services at the end of the agreement, the Client shall give a 30-day written notice of non-renewal. Consultant will provide continuing services for 90 days after the expiration date of the agreement or until the client provides written notice. The client is responsible for these accrued charges and SSC may bill these additional days. In the case of cancellation, the Client shall be liable for any costs accrued to the date of cancellation.
- 6. It is expressly understood and agreed to by both parties that Consultant, while carrying out and complying with any of the terms and conditions of this agreement, is an independent contractor and is not an employee of the Client.

- Background: Orangethorpe School sits adjacent to Orangethorpe Park. Currently, there is no physical barrier separating one from the other. Because there is no barrier, the school playfields are used as a thoroughfare to and from the park, or park patrons simply wander onto the playfields during school hours. Installation of a chain link fence at the property line would deter this type of activity, but the fence would bisect two large baseball diamonds rendering both useless. Large portions of each ball field are on Park property. Changing the orientation of the two baseball diamonds won't allow enough space for either ball field. Instead, a new fence will enclose both baseball diamonds. Most of the new fence will reside on the Park. This agreement allows the District to lock the gates and close off access to our playfields while school is in session. When school is not in session, the gates will be open and the ball fields can be used as normal. The cost of the fence is not expected to exceed \$9,100.

This agreement has been reviewed and approved by OCDE legal council and is available for review in the Superintendent's office.

> With the formation of CFD No. 2001-1 and the issuance of Special Tax Bonds, Annual Special Taxes need to be levied on Taxable Property to pay interest and principal to the bondholders, Accordingly, please find attached Resolution No. 06/07-24 which authorizes and provides for the levying of Special Taxes in CFD No. 2001-1 for Fiscal Year 2007-08. The Special Taxes were calculated and levied in accordance with the Rate and Method of Apportionment previously Board approved.

A resolution will be presented to the Board of Trustees each summer for the next 26 years to approve the Special Tax levy of CFD No. 2001-1.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2001-1 (AMERIGE HEIGHTS) AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVYING OF SPECIAL TAXES WITHIN SAID DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Fullerton School District (the "Board") has heretofore taken proceedings pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, (the "Act") for the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2001-1 (the "District") for the purpose of providing educational facilities for the use of residents of the District; and

WHEREAS, following a special election of the qualified electors of the District, this Board on August 28, 2001, acting as the governing body of the District, adopted Ordinance No. 01/02-1 ("Ordinance") which provided for the levying and collection of special taxes within the District, "as provided in the Act and Ordinance and as approved by the qualified electors; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and appropriate that this Board levy and collect the special taxes for fiscal year 2007-2008, by the adoption of a resolution as specified by the Act and Ordinances;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u> In accordance with the Act and Ordinances, there is hereby levied upon all properties within the District, including all annexed territory, which are not otherwise exempt from taxation under the Act or Ordinances the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2007-2008 set forth in the Ordinances at the tax rates as set forth therein and in Exhibit "A" hereto, as may be amended without further action of the Board to reflect updated information on assessor's parcel numbers from the County of Orange. The Assistant Superintendent, Business Services is hereby authorized and directed to establish the final rates to be levied, which final rates shall not exceed the maximum rates.

<u>Section 2</u> The above-authorized special taxes shall be collected in the same manner as ad valorem property taxes on the secured roll by the Treasurer-Tax Collector of the County of Orange and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for such ad valorem taxes.

Section 3. The Clerk and Assistant Superintendent of Business, are hereby authorized to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Orange County Auditor-Controller, together with other supporting documentation as may be required in order to place said special taxes on the secured property tax roll for Fiscal Year 2007-2008 and to perform all other acts which are required by the Act, Ordinances or by-law in order to accomplish the purpose of this Resolution.

- Background: On June 13, 2000, the Fullerton School District formed Community Facilities District ("CFD") No. 2000-1 pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, on 14.71 net acres of property owned by Fullerton 104/AFX, LTD., a California limited partnership of which Van Daele Development Corporation, a California corporation, was the general partner. CFD No. 2000-1 issued 2001 Special Tax Bonds in the amount of \$1,195,000 on November 1, 2001.

With the formation of CFD No. 2000-1 and the issuance of Special Tax Bonds, Annual Special Taxes need to be levied on Taxable Property to pay interest and principal to the bondholders. Accordingly, please find attached Resolution No. 06/07-25 which authorizes and provides for the levying Special Taxes in CFD No. 2000-1 for Fiscal Year 2007-08. The Special Taxes were calculated and levied in accordance with the Rate and Method of Apportionment previously Board approved.

A resolution will be presented to the Board of Trustees each summer for the next 23 years to approve the Special Tax levy of CFD No. 2000-1.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2000-1 (VAN DAELE) AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVYING OF SPECIAL TAXES WITHIN SAID DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Fullerton School District (the "Board") has heretofore taken proceedings pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, (the "Act") for the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2000-1 (the "District") for the purpose of providing educational facilities for the use of residents of the District; and

WHEREAS, following a special election of the qualified electors of the District, this Board on June 27, 2000, acting as the governing body of the District, adopted Ordinance No. 99/00-1 ("Ordinance") which provided for the levying and collection of special taxes within the District, "as provided in the Act and Ordinance and as approved by the qualified electors; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and appropriate that this Board levy and collect the special taxes for fiscal year 2007-2008, by the adoption of a resolution as specified by the Act and Ordinances;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u> In accordance with the Act and Ordinances, there is hereby levied upon all properties within the District, including all annexed territory, which are not otherwise exempt from taxation under the Act or Ordinances the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2007-2008 set forth in the Ordinances at the tax rates as set forth therein and in Exhibit "A" hereto, as may be amended without further action of the Board to reflect updated information on assessor's parcel numbers from the County of Orange. The Assistant Superintendent, Business Services is hereby authorized and directed to establish the final rates to be levied, which final rates shall not exceed the maximum rates.

<u>Section 2</u> The above-authorized special taxes shall be collected in the same manner as ad valorem property taxes on the secured roll by the Treasurer-Tax Collector of the County of Orange and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for such ad valorem taxes.

Section 3. The Clerk and Assistant Superintendent of Business, are hereby authorized to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Orange County Auditor-Controller, together with other supporting documentation as may be required in order to place said special taxes on the secured property tax roll for Fiscal Year 2007-2008 and to perform all other acts which are required by the Act, Ordinances or by-law in order to accomplish the purpose of this Resolution.

- Background:Section 39656 of the California Education Code authorizes the
governing board of a school district to delegate its powers to contract to
the District Superintendent or his designee, subject to subsequent
ratification by the governing board. In July 2004 the Board of Trustees
adopted Resolution No. 04/05-03 delegating contract authority in the
amount of \$50,000 to the District Superintendent and the Assistant
Superintendent of Business Services. Due to increased construction
costs over the past few years, the District Administration is requesting
that the Board adopt Resolution No 06/07-26 delegating contract
authority in the increased amount of \$100,000 to the District
Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent of Business Services.
This contract authority would be ongoing until replaced or terminated.

This delegation is needed at different times of the calendar year when the District needs to enter into contracts prior to Board approval for various building projects and signing of applications for State and other funding. The Board then ratifies contract approval.

Funding: Not applicable.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Adopt Resolution No. 06/07-26 delegating contract authority for projects up to \$100,000 to the District Superintendent and the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services subject to ratification by the Board of Trustees.

- Background: The District is continuing the "One to One" Laptop Program that began with the 04/05 school year. The District will purchase approximately six hundred laptops this upcoming year. In turn, parents whose students are in the program will lease many of these laptops at the District's cost. Categorical funds, donations, and benefactors will pay for the remaining computers. In order to ease the cash-flow impact on parents and the District, the laptops and accompanying services will be financed over a three-year period. Apple has agreed to reduce the cost of their equipment by the same amount as the interest cost of this lease to make it more affordable.

A Master Lease Agreement setting forth the terms and conditions of financing with Academic Capital Group, Inc. was approved by the Board on June 22, 2004.
