<u>Background:</u> Fullerton School District contracts with the Orange County Department of

Education (OCDE) for network support services, including access to the Internet. To facilitate school district applications for Erate subsidies for Internet access, the OCDE provides the contract for these services early in the school year. Accordingly, the Board has previously approved the

original agreement for these services.

The Fullerton School District pays the OCDE an annual fee for providing access to the Internet for an unlimited number of computers throughout the District. The charge for Internet access in 2007-2008 is \$12,312.00. If the California K-12 High Speed Network receives State funding for these services, the charge to the District for Internet access will be waived. The OCDE also charges districts for Internet content filtering. These charges were not included in the original agreement since the charges are not eligible for Erate subsidies. The OCDE has requested that this amendment to the original agreement, which includes Internet

content filtering charges, be approved.

Rationale: OCDE is requesting that the Board approve an amendment to the original

agreement that includes content filtering fees of \$8,280. Content filtering is required under the Children's Internet Protection Act for the District to be eligible for Erate and other federal funds. This fee will not be waived

SUBJECT: APPROVE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF

FULLERTON FOR CROSSING GUARD SERVICES

Background: In May 17, 1998, the City of Fullerton and the Fullerton School District entered

into an agreement regarding staffing and cost sharing considerations for the

installation of crossing guards throughout the District. The agreement

terminated in April 2007. The City and the District have agreed in principle to a new agreement covering crossing guard services. In essence, the agreement states that the City and the District will share the cost to keep in place eight crossing locations that do not meet traffic warrants. The City also agreed to restudy three locations in May 2008. If these locations are found to meet warrants at that time, the City will pick up the cost. The City and the District have agreed

to a Memorandum of Agreement to examine the possibility of upgrading crossing signage to newer color standards or technology upgrades. (The Memorandum of Agreement is available for review in the Superintendent's

Office.)

Rationale: Mutual agreement between the City and the Fullerton School District will keep

in place the successful crossing guard program the City and District have

enjoyed these many years and will assist in keeping students safe.

Background: Since 1979, when Proposition 4 (the GANN Amendment) was approved by the

voters of California, all school districts must establish a GANN Limit for the preceding and current fiscal year in accordance with the provision of the GANN

Amendment and applicable statutory law.

Rationale: The California Department of Education is requesting these forms in accordance

with Government Code Section 7906 (f), which states:

"Each school district shall report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and to the Director of Finance at least annually its appropriation limit, its appropriations subject to limitation, the amount of its state aid apportionments and subventions included within the proceeds of taxes of the school district, and amounts excluded from its appropriations limit, at a time and in a manner prescribed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction

and approved by the Director of Finance."

Funding: Not applicable.

ADOPT RESOLUTION 07/08-06 APPROVING THE RECALCULATION OF THE 2006/07 APPROPRIATIONS LIMITATION AND ESTABLISHING THE 2007/08 ESTIMATED APPROPRIATIONS LIMITATION CALCULATIONS (GANN)

- WHEREAS, in November of 1979, the California electorate did adopt Proposition 4, commonly called the Gann Amendment, which added Article XIII-B to the California Constitution; and,
- WHEREAS, the provisions of that Article establish maximum appropriation limitations, commonly called "Gann Limits," for public agencies, including school districts; and,
- WHEREAS, the District must establish a revised Gann limit for the 2006/07 fiscal year and a projected Gann Limit for the 2007/08 fiscal year in accordance with the provisions of Article XIII-B and applicable statutory law; and,
- WHEREAS, Government Code Section 7902.1 provides that school districts may increase their Gann Limits under specified circumstances;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does provide public notice that the attached calculations and documentation of the Gann limits for the 2006/07 and 2007/08 fiscal years are made in accordance with applicable constitutional and statutory law;
- AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board does provide public notice that the attached calculations and documentation of the Gann Limits for the 2006/07 and 2007/08 fiscal years include a decrease of \$579,386.02 to the 2006/07 Gann Limit pursuant to the provisions of Government Code Section 7902.1;
- AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent notifies the Director of the State Department of Finance of the decrease to the 2006/07 Gann Limit;
- AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board does hereby declare that the appropriations in the Budget for the 2006/07 and 2007/08 fiscal years do not exceed the limitations imposed by Proposition 4;
- AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent provides copies of this resolution along with the appropriate attachments to interested citizens of this District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the documentation used in determining the appropriations limit shall be available to the public at 1401 West Valencia Drive, Fullerton, California 92833.
