The Resolution for the availability of textbooks and instructional materials complies with the Williams Case requirements.

> Notice of the public hearing was posted on September 8, 2017, at Fullerton School District Office, Acacia School, Beechwood School, Commonwealth School, Fern Drive School, Fisler School, Golden Hill School, Hermosa Drive School, Laguna Road School, Maple School, Orangethorpe School, Pacific Drive School, Raymond School, Richman School, Rolling Hills School, Sunset Lane School, Valencia Park School, Woodcrest School, Ladera Vista Jr. High School of the Arts, Nicolas Jr. High School, and Parks Jr. High School.

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose, and;

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119, the Board is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the District, and bargaining unit leaders, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to provide 10-days' notice of the public hearings, and;

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district, and;

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teacher and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the District and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the State Board of those subjects, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 19, 2017, which is on or before the eighth week of school and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the district has, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code 33126 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board:

- (i) Mathematics,
- (ii) Science,
- (iii) History-social science,
- (iv) English / language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program and Intensive Intervention,
- (v) Visual & Performing Arts.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing Board makes the determination that each pupil of the district, has available sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the

curriculum framework adopted by the State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2017/2018 school year, the Fullerton School District, has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board for those subjects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2017/2018 school year, the Fullerton School District has provided sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board, to each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course.

2017-2018 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special Services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special Services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special Services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services to be provided by Contractor</u>. Contractor shall plan, coordinate, and implement a variety of educational personalized learning and technology innovations for various departments at the Fullerton School District.

2. <u>Term</u>. Contractor shall commence providing Services under this Agreement on <u>September 20, 2017</u>, and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by <u>June 30</u>, 2018.

3. <u>Compensation</u>. District agrees to pay the Contractor for Services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement a total fee not to exceed **Fifteen Thousand Dollars** (\$15,000.00) at the hourly rate of \$150. District shall pay Contractor according to the following terms and conditions: <u>Contractor shall submit a detailed invoice to the District</u>. Payment for Services will only be made if Services have been satisfactorily rendered under the terms of this Agreement.

4. <u>Expenses</u>. District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing Services for District, except as follows: <u>N/A</u>

5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Contractor, in the performance of the Services pursuant to this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent Contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the Services to be provided under this Agreement. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for

payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.

6. <u>Materials</u>. Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the Services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement, except as follows:

Contractor's Services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

7. Originality of Services/Intellectual Property. Contractor agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, ideas, and dialogue, prepared for and submitted by Contractor to the District in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, shall be wholly original to Contractor and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to Contractor by District as a basis for such Services. Contractor further agrees that all writings, materials, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, or otherwise (hereinafter referred to as "Content") submitted by Contractor to the District and/or used in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, reflect the intellectual property of, and copyright interests held by District and shall not be copied or used in whole or in part by Contractor without District's express written permission. Contractor understands and agrees that all Content produced under this Agreement is the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. 8. <u>Standard for Performance of Services</u>. The parties acknowledge that the District, in selecting the Contractor to perform the Services hereunder, is relying upon the Contractor's reputation for excellence in the performance of the Services required hereunder. The Contractor shall perform the Services in the manner of one who is a recognized specialist in the types of services to be performed. Time is of the essence in this Agreement. All deadlines set forth in the Agreement are binding and may be modified only by subsequent written agreement of the parties.

9. <u>Termination</u>. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of Services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or (b) any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency. Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within thirty (30) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the thirty (30) days cease

and terminate. In the event of such termination, the District may secure the required Services from another Contractor. If the cost to the District exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the Contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District. Written notice by District shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. Contractor agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the District and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the Contractor or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the Services called for in this Agreement, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the District's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the Contractor, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the Services covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this Agreement.

11. <u>Insurance</u>. Contractor shall insure Contractor's activities in connection with the Services under this Agreement and agrees to carry insurance to ensure Contractor's ability to adhere to the indemnification requirements under this Agreement.

11.1 Contractor shall, at Contractor's sole cost and expense, maintain in full force and effect the following insurance coverage from a California licensed insurer with an A, VIII, or better rating from A.M. Best or an approved self insurance program, sufficient to cover any claims, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses (including attorney fees) arising out of or in connection with Contractor's fulfillment of the obligations under this Agreement:

a. Comprehensive or Commercial Form General Liability Insurance, including bodily injury, property damage and contractual liability with minimum limits as follows:

The policy may not contain an exclusion for coverage of claims arising from claims for sexual molestation or abuse. This policy shall include or be endorsed to include abuse and molestation coverage of at least \$3,000,000 or each occurrence.

b. Business Automobile Liability Insurance for owned, scheduled, nonowned, or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. (Required only if the Contractor drives on behalf of the District in the course of performing Services.)

c. Professional Liability Insurance with a limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, if applicable.

d. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance in a form and amount covering Contractor's full liability under the California Workers' Compensation Insurance and Safety Act and in accordance with applicable state and federal laws. The policy shall be endorsed with the insurer's waiver of rights of subrogation against the District.

e. Employment Practices Liability (EPL) and Directors and Officers (D&O) coverage with the following limits: \$1,000,000 per occurrence

It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage and limits referred to under a., b. and c. above shall not in any way limit the liability of the Contractor.

The Services completed herein must meet the approval of the District and shall be subject to the District's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. Contractor agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to Contractor, Contractor's business, the Services, equipment and personnel engaged in Services covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such Services.

- 13.1 <u>Fingerprinting</u>. Contractor shall comply with the requirements of California Education Code section 45125.1, and shall provide to District all criminal background clearance(s) through fingerprints for Contractor (and all Contractor employees, if any) as required by the District. The District may require the Contractor and Contractors' employees to submit to additional criminal background checks at the District's sole and absolute discretion.
- 13.2 <u>Tuberculosis Testing</u>. Contractor and Contractor's employees, if any, providing Services to students shall provide evidence of appropriate tuberculosis screening prior to the performance of the Services and provide annual certification thereafter. Contractor shall complete and submit to District any required documentation to verify compliance.

14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.

15. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which Services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.

16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire Agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or Agreement with respect to the Services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement. This Agreement incorporates by this reference, any exhibits, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein.

17. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. Contractor agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, sex, marital status, age, or other characteristics protected by federal or state laws of such persons.

18. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of District or Contractor to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. 21. <u>Attorney Fees/Costs</u>. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorneys' fees.

22. <u>Headings</u>. The headings contained in this Agreement are provided exclusively for reference and the convenience of the Parties. No legal significance of any type shall be attached to the headings.

23. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be signed and delivered in two counterparts, each of which, when so signed and delivered, shall be an original, but such counterparts together shall constitute the one instrument that is the Agreement, and the Agreement shall not be binding on any party until all Parties have signed it.

24. <u>Authorized Signatures</u>. The individual signing this Agreement warrants that he/she is authorized to do so. The Parties understand and agree that a breach of this warranty shall constitute a breach of the Agreement and shall entitle the non-breaching party to all appropriate legal and equitable remedies against the breaching party.

25. <u>Governing Law</u>. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California. This Agreement is made in and shall be performed in Orange County, California.

- Background: The California Healthy Kids Survey is the largest statewide survey of resiliency, protective factors, and risk behaviors in the nation. With this survey, schools, districts, counties, and the State have set a standard tool that promotes the collection of uniform data within and across local education agencies that are also comparable to existing State and national survey datasets.
- Rationale:The California Healthy Kids Survey is mandated by the State of California
Department of Education to be administered every two years for students in
grades 5, 7, 9, and 11 to comply with Title IV State requirements. Fullerton
School District is administering only those sections of the survey that are
required by the State of California Department of Education. The survey
provides schools with the developmentally appropriate data they need to guide
the implementation of health, prevention, and youth development programs.
The survey data will help guide the development of prevention programs
targeting specific risk behaviors, as well as fostering youth assets and
resilience that protect against these behaviors. Students in grade 5 must have
parental permission to take the exam; students in grade 7 must have a letter

Welfare and Attendance budget 510, not to exceed \$3,500.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Approve Memorandum of Understanding between Fullerton School District and the California School Climate, Health, and Learning Survey System (CAL-SCHLS) as they relate to the administration of the California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) for the 2017/2018 school year.

DISTRICT NAME:

This agreement outlines conditions to be met by the above named district (the "District") and WestEd as they relate to access to and the administration of the California Healthy Kids Survey, the California School Staff Survey, and the California School Parent Survey, which are part of the comprehensive CalSCHLS data system, developed by WestEd under contract with the California Department of Education. <u>Survey access will not be granted until a signed copy of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is received.</u>

I. DISTRICT AGREES TO:

- Read the Guidebook. Pay special attention to the section on active and passive consent procedures.
- Coordination. Provide one district-level contact person for each participating district.
- Surveys. Use only the current version of the surveys provided by your CalSCHLS Regional Center.

SURVEY ADMINISTRATION (CHKS)

- **Grades and Schools.** Survey grades 3 through 12 as appropriate within the district. Provide current student enrollment figures for all schools by grade level.
- **Parent Consent.** Follow the active parental consent process with grades below seven, and passive parental consent with grade seven and above.
 - Follow written school board policy for active and/or passive consent, and provide notification to parents of the approximate date(s) of survey administration and the availability of survey instruments for review at school and/or district offices. This is required regardless of consent type.
- **Privacy of Students.** Preserve respondent privacy and the confidentiality of the responses by ensuring that the room set-up prevents anyone from observing how the respondent is answering the survey questions and ensure that reasonable measures are taken to protect the responses after they are collected.
- **Surveys.** Administer the elementary survey to elementary students, and the secondary Core survey to secondary students.
- Proctors. Assign survey proctors (teachers or assigned proctors) for each classroom.
- Assurance of Confidentiality Agreement. Ensure that all teachers and proctors assigned to administer the survey sign the Assurance of Confidentiality Agreement and read the Introductory Script to students.
- **Response Rates.** Make best efforts to obtain a response rate of at least 70% of students in surveyed grades.
- Data Submission and Report Preparation. Notify Cal-SCHLS Regional Center staff upon completion of each survey administration per the guidelines provided at registration.
- **Printed Survey Administration.** Provide complete information on the transmittal envelopes if administering the survey via scantron form.
- **Produce surveys.** If administering paper-and-pencil survey, reproduce from the master copy no more than the number of questionnaires needed to administer the survey.

- o Submit completed answer sheets and materials to your Regional Center.
- CalSCHLS is not responsible for transferring data from incorrect to correct answer sheets.

CALIFORNIA SCHOOL STAFF SURVEY (CSSS)

- Ensure that applicable staff complete the online California School Staff Survey (CSSS) at each school and for each grade level.
- The CSSS should be offered to all teachers, administrators, and other certificated staff, including paraprofessionals and aides, and to all personnel working in the areas of counseling, health, prevention, and safety.

CALIFORNIA SCHOOL PARENT SURVEY (CSPS)

- Coordinate with Cal-SCHLS staff regarding the administration of online and paper parent survey materials.
- Administer the CSPS to all parents, guardians, or other caregivers of students in all grades and schools in the district.
- Each family (parent/guardian/caregiver) should complete only one CSPS per school regardless of number of children enrolled in that school.

PAYMENT

Make payment of all CalSCHLS fees, at the current rates for the applicable school year within thirty (30) days of completion of services and receipt of deliverables. See attached fee schedule for the 2017-2018 school year.

II. WESTED AGREES TO PROVIDE:

- Comprehensive technical assistance via email and phone.
- Access to the CHKS online system or master copies of the survey instrument with scantrons and materials.
- Access to the CSSS online system.
- Access to the CSPS online system and master copy of the survey instrument.
- Access to the CalSCHLS System website (chks.wested.org).
- Scanning and online services.
- District-level reports within six to ten weeks after receipt of accurate and complete survey information and materials.

III. ACCESS

Under the California Public Records Act, any third party (for example, the media) can request existing district reports from CDE. Raw data may be provided to public agencies and research agencies by request for analyses only after the requesting agency has executed an agreement with WestEd and/or CDE and has agreed to conditions of strict confidentiality in compliance with state and federal regulations, including, but not limited to, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR part 99), the California Information Practices Act (California Civil Code § 1798 et. seq.), and the Privacy Act of 1974, as amended (5 U.S.C. § 552).

Cal-SCHLS Regional Center staff post Cal-SCHLS reports (CHKS and CSSS) to the Cal-SCHLS System websites in November of the year following survey administration.

IV. CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENT

Districts agreeing to administer any of the CalSCHLS surveys (CHKS, CSSS, and CSPS), understand that data will be subject to the conditions stated above. Once produced, district level reports will be available to outside agencies via the CalSCHLS website or upon request, and raw data may be provided to public and research agencies for analysis under strict conditions of confidentiality.

District further agrees to use the CalSCHLS surveys only for use in its own district, and only for so long as this MOU is in effect. Upon expiration or termination of this MOU, District agrees to return all CalSCHLS materials to WestEd or CDE.

V. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Terms. This MOU is effective on September 1, 2017 and expires on August 31, 2018.

<u>Amendments</u>. This MOU may be amended at any time by mutual agreement of the parties without additional consideration, provided that before any amendment shall take effect, it shall be in writing and signed by both parties.

<u>Indemnification</u>. District shall defend, indemnify, and hold WestEd, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this MOU but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or resulting from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of District, its officers, agents, or employees.

WestEd shall defend, indemnify, and hold District, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this MOU but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or resulting from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of WestEd, its officers, agents, or employees.

<u>Dispute resolution</u>. District and WestEd shall exercise their respective best efforts to settle any claim, controversy, or dispute (collectively, "Dispute") arising out of or relating to this MOU. The Parties shall discuss any Dispute no later than fifteen (15) days after either Party gives written notice to the other Party of a Dispute, including the legal and factual basis for such Dispute. No arbitration or other proceeding may be commenced before the Parties have met pursuant to this provision. In the event that a Dispute cannot be resolved through good faith negotiations, the Parties agree that such Dispute shall be finally settled through binding arbitration. The arbitration shall be administered by JAMS, in San Francisco, California, pursuant to its Comprehensive Arbitration Rules and Procedures. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and conclusive upon the Parties. Judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrators may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party may seek injunctive or provisional relief to protect confidential information at any time.

<u>Assignment</u>. District shall not voluntarily or by operation of law, assign or otherwise transfer its rights or obligations under this MOU without prior written consent from WestEd. Any purported assignment in violation of this paragraph shall be void.

Execution. Each of the persons signing this MOU represents that he or she has the authority to sign on behalf of and bind their respective party.

AGREEMENT FOR GOVERNANCE CONSULTING SERVICES

THIS Agreement made and entered into by and between the CALIFORNIA SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION, a nonprofit California corporation, hereinafter referred to as "CSBA" and Fullerton School District hereinafter referred to as "District."

CONDITION PRECEDENT

To be eligible for this program, the district must be a member in good standing of CSBA.

The parties hereby agree as follows:

1. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF DISTRICT

- 1.1 District agrees to:
 - a. assure attendance by all board members, and the superintendent of Fullerton School District as requested by CSBA;
 - b. provide appropriate facilities for each session; and
 - c. provide necessary food and refreshments.

2. DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF CSBA

- 2.1 CSBA agrees to:
 - a. conduct phone interviews with board members and superintendent as appropriate;
 - b. provide governance consulting services, which may include a workshop to be completed not later than June 30, 2018 on governance leadership, such as district goal setting, board self-evaluation, superintendent evaluation, developing norms and protocols, developing a governance planning calendar, and other governancerelated activity as CSBA and District may agree.
 - c. provide any necessary copyrighted course materials as needed for the governance leadership workshop;
 - d. provide summary materials from the governance consulting services.

3. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES

3.1 In consideration for the consulting services, the District agrees to pay CSBA a base fee of \$2700, plus reasonable travel expenses.



- 3.2 Payment is due within 30 days upon receipt of invoice from CSBA, following the service delivery.
- 3.3 In the event that District cancels the workshop after it is scheduled, District agrees to reimburse CSBA for any travel expenses already incurred by the consultant at the time of the cancellation.

4. CONTRACT TERMINATION

- 4.1 The terms of the Agreement shall terminate no later than June 30, 2018, or sooner if all provisions have been satisfied.
- 4.2 Unless otherwise terminated pursuant to this Agreement, CSBA or District may terminate this agreement without cause by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.
- 4.3 Should CSBA default in the performance of this Agreement or materially breach any of its provisions, District may terminate this Agreement by giving written notification to CSBA.
- 4.4 Should District default in the performance of this Agreement or materially breach any of its provisions, CSBA may terminate this Agreement by giving written notification to District.

5. GENERAL PROVISIONS

2017-2018 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Agreement is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and **ABBY ROZENBERG, M.S. CCC-SLP**, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special Services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special Services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special Services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services to be provided by Contractor</u>. Contractor shall provide **Cognitive Behavior Therapy Services**, hereinafter referred to as "Services".

2. <u>Term</u>. Contractor shall commence providing Services under this Agreement on September 20, 2017 and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by June 30, 2018.

3. <u>Compensation</u>. District agrees to pay the Contractor for Services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement a total fee not to exceed **Five Thousand dollars (\$5,000)**. District shall pay Contractor according to the following terms and conditions:

In-Clinic individual speech language therapy	\$135/hour
Out-of-Clinic individual speech language therapy	\$150/hour
Independent Educational Evaluation (IEE)	\$1,800 each
IEP participation	\$135/hour

4. <u>Expenses</u>. District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing Services for District, except as follows: N/A.

5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Contractor, in the performance of the Services pursuant to this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent Contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the Services to be provided under this Agreement. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.

6. <u>Materials</u>. Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the Services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement, except as follows:

Contractor's Services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

7. Originality of Services/Intellectual Property. Contractor agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, ideas, and dialogue, prepared for and submitted by Contractor to the District in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, shall be wholly original to Contractor and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to Contractor by District as a basis for such Services. Contractor further agrees that all writings, materials, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, or otherwise (hereinafter referred to as "Content") submitted by Contractor to the District and/or used in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, reflect the intellectual property of, and copyright interests held by District and shall not be copied or used in whole or in part by Contractor without District's express written permission. Contractor understands and agrees that all Content produced under this Agreement is the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. Contractor and agrees that District shall have all right, title and interest in said Content, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said Content in the name of the District.

8. <u>Standard for Performance of Services</u>. The parties acknowledge that the District, in selecting the Contractor to perform the Services hereunder, is relying upon the Contractor's reputation for excellence in the performance of the Services required hereunder. The Contractor shall perform the Services in the manner of one who is a recognized specialist in the types of services to be performed. Time is of the essence in this Agreement. All deadlines set forth in the Agreement are binding and may be modified only by subsequent written agreement of the parties.

9. <u>Termination</u>. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of Services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or (b) any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency. Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within thirty (30) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the thirty (30) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the District may secure the required Services from another Contractor. If the cost to the District exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the Contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District.

Written notice by District shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. Contractor agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the District and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

Background: California State Senate passed AB 2616 requiring school districts to individually address the truancy issues of individual students. Students who are habitually truant have long-term costs not only for themselves, but also for their family, and school district. Truancy is clearly identified as one of the early warning signs that students potentially are headed for delinquent activity, social isolation, and educational failure.

Fullerton School District implemented a Truancy Prevention Program that first began during the 2014/2015 school year. Ms. Linda Fredrickson, a Retired Juvenile Probation Officer and Certified Facilitator with The Parent Project, facilitated group sessions for junior high students who were identified as chronic or habitual truants. Participating students were referred by the Child Welfare and Attendance Department and/or already involved in the School Attendance Review Board (SARB) process and participation was mandatory as part of compliance with the SARB behavior contracts.

Based on reports and data submitted by Ms. Fredrickson, assessment had been conducted regarding the effectiveness of the work. Junior high students who participated in a Truancy Intervention Group learned the importance of attending school, and data was collected that indicated an improvement in attendance for many of these students. It has been determined that there continues to be a need for truant junior high students to participate in a Truancy Intervention Group. Data and program effectiveness will continuously be monitored throughout the school year as the District continues to implement its Truancy Prevention Program.

- Rationale:Entering into this Independent Contractor Agreement enables Fullerton SchoolDistrict to continue its Truancy Intervention Program as a requirement of AB 2616.
- <u>Funding:</u> Cost not to exceed \$7,500 from the Unrestricted General Fund.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Approve Independent Contractor Agreement between Fullerton School District and Linda Fredrickson for facilitation of Truancy Intervention Groups effective September 20, 2017 through June 1, 2018.

2017-2018 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Agreement is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and **Linda Fredrickson** hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special Services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special Services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special Services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services to be provided by Contractor</u>. Contractor shall facilitate two sessions of Truancy Intervention Groups at Ladera Vista Junior High School, Nicolas Junior High School, and Parks Junior High School, respectively. Contractor will meet with school site administrators in September. Session 1 will run during October with follow-up visits in November and December. Session 2 will run from January to February with follow-up student visits in April and May. Each junior high will have students participating in each session with no more than ten (10) participants per Truancy Intervention Group.

Services shall be provided by Linda Fredrickson.

2. <u>Term</u>. Contractor shall commence providing Services under this Agreement on **September 20, 2017** and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by **June 1, 2018**.

3. <u>Compensation</u>. District agrees to pay the Contractor for Services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement a total fee not to exceed Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars, \$7,500 Dollars. District shall pay Contractor according to the following terms and conditions: Contractor shall submit a detailed invoice to the District in two increments. Payment of each invoice shall only be made if Services have been satisfactorily rendered under the terms of this Agreement.

4. <u>Expenses</u>. District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing Services for District, except as follows: **N**/**A**

5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Contractor, in the performance of the Services pursuant to this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent Contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the

Services to be provided under this Agreement. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.

6. <u>Materials</u>. Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the Services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement. Contractor's Services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

7. Originality of Services/Intellectual Property. Contractor agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, ideas, and dialogue, prepared for and submitted by Contractor to the District in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, shall be wholly original to Contractor and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to Contractor by District as a basis for such Services. Contractor further agrees that all writings, materials, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, or otherwise (hereinafter referred to as "Content") submitted by Contractor to the District and/or used in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, reflect the intellectual property of, and copyright interests held by District and shall not be copied or used in whole or in part by Contractor without District's express written permission. Contractor understands and agrees that all Content produced under this Agreement is the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. Contractor and cannot be used without District's express written permission. Contractor additional agrees that District shall have all right, title and interest in said Content, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said Content in the name of the District.

8. <u>Standard for Performance of Services</u>. The parties acknowledge that the District, in selecting the Contractor to perform the Services hereunder, is relying upon the Contractor's reputation for excellence in the performance of the Services required hereunder. The Contractor shall perform the Services in the manner of one who is a recognized specialist in the types of services to be performed. Time is of the essence in this Agreement. All deadlines set forth in the Agreement are binding and may be modified only by subsequent written agreement of the parties.

9. <u>Termination</u>. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of Services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or (b) any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency. Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within **thirty (30) days** after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the **thirty (30) days** cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the District may secure the required Services from another Contractor. If the cost to the District exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the Contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District. Written notice by District shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. Contractor agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the District and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the Contractor or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the Services called for in this Agreement, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the District's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the Contractor, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the Services covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this Agreement.

11. <u>Insurance</u>. Contractor shall insure Contractor's activities in connection with the Services under this Agreement and agrees to carry insurance to ensure Contractor's ability to adhere to the indemnification requirements under this Agreement.

11.1 Contractor shall, at Contractor's sole cost and expense, maintain in full force and effect the following insurance coverage from a California licensed insurer with an A, VIII, or better rating from A.M. Best or an approved self insurance program, sufficient to cover any claims, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses (including attorney fees) arising out of or in connection with Contractor's fulfillment of the obligations under this Agreement:

a. Comprehensive or Commercial Form General Liability Insurance, including bodily injury, property damage and contractual liability with minimum limits as follows:

The policy may not contain an exclusion for coverage of claims arising from claims for sexual molestation or abuse. This policy shall include or be endorsed to include abuse and molestation coverage of at least \$3,000,000 or each occurrence.

b. Business Automobile Liability Insurance for owned, scheduled, nonowned, or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. (Required only if the Contractor drives on behalf of the District in the course of performing Services.)

c. Professional Liability Insurance with a limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, if applicable.

d. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance in a form and amount covering Contractor's full liability under the California Workers' Compensation Insurance and Safety Act and in accordance with applicable state and federal laws. The policy shall be endorsed with the insurer's waiver of rights of subrogation against the District.

e. Employment Practices Liability (EPL) and Directors and Officers (D&O) coverage with the following limits: \$1,000,000 per occurrence

It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage and limits referred to under a., b. and c. above shall not in any way limit the liability of the Contractor.

11.2 No later than **five (5) business days** from execution of this Agreement by the District and Contractor, and prior to commencing the Services under this Agreement, Contractor shall provide District with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder.

Contractor shall provide prior written notice to the District thirty (30) days in advance of any non-renewal, cancellation, or modification of the required insurance. The certificates of insurance providing the coverages referred to in clauses a and b above shall name District, its Governing Board, officers, and employees, as additional insureds with appropriate endorsements. In addition, the certificates of insurance shall include a provision stating "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by District shall be excess and noncontributory." Failure to maintain the above mentioned insurance coverages shall be cause for termination of this Agreement.

12. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor.

13. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The Services completed herein must meet the approval of the District and shall be subject to the District's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. Contractor agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to Contractor, Contractor's business, the Services, equipment and personnel engaged in Services covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such Services.

- 13.1 <u>Fingerprinting</u>. Contractor shall comply with the requirements of California Education Code section 45125.1, and shall provide to District all criminal background clearance(s) through fingerprints for Contractor (and all Contractor employees, if any) as required by the District. The District may require the Contractor and Contractors' employees to submit to additional criminal background checks at the District's sole and absolute discretion.
- 13.2 <u>Tuberculosis Testing</u>. Contractor and Contractor's employees, if any, providing Services to students shall provide evidence of appropriate tuberculosis screening prior to the performance of the Services and provide annual certification thereafter. Contractor shall complete and submit to District any required documentation to verify compliance.

14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.

15. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which Services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.

16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire Agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or Agreement with respect to the Services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement. This Agreement incorporates by this reference, any exhibits, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein.

17. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. Contractor agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, sex, marital status, age, or other characteristics protected by federal or state laws of such persons.

18. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of District or Contractor to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be

considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. At the date of this Agreement, the addresses of the parties are as follows:

19. <u>Severability</u>. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.

20. <u>Attorney Fees/Costs</u>. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorneys' fees.

21. <u>Headings</u>. The headings contained in this Agreement are provided exclusively for reference and the convenience of the Parties. No legal significance of any type shall be attached to the headings.

22. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be signed and delivered in two counterparts, each of which, when so signed and delivered, shall be an original, but such counterparts together shall constitute the one instrument that is the Agreement, and the Agreement shall not be binding on any party until all Parties have signed it.

23. <u>Authorized Signatures</u>. The individual signing this Agreement warrants that he/she is authorized to do so. The Parties understand and agree that a breach of this warranty shall constitute a breach of the Agreement and shall entitle the non-breaching party to all appropriate legal and equitable remedies against the breaching party.

24. <u>Governing Law</u>. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California. This Agreement is made in and shall be performed in Orange County, California.
