Gary Drabek discussed: the irrigation at various sites and the replacement of sewer, water, and underground electrical; stated that trenching alters irrigation lines, and some of the underground repair work has been completed; is working with the contractor regarding needed repairs in the front areas of Maple and Richman Schools; the Parks Junior High soccer field was closed most of the summer because of work but has been irrigated within the last two weeks; have completed sodding and irrigating at Laguna Road and Rolling Hills Schools in addition to interior and exterior work at these sites; will be replacing underground lines at Park Junior High; will be working on front and interior of Sunset Lane School; is working on repairs at Commonwealth School; all roofing projects are completed.

Dr. Patricia Godfrey reported: there are many unknowns because of the pending October 7 election and possibly anticipates there could be more mid-year budget cuts; stated Assembly Bill 1266 is pending (bill will redesignate how to spend supplemental grant money); looking at multi-year projections, District must cut 7 1/2 to 8 million dollars over this and the next two years; noted that based on the District's current level of expenditures, the District should accomplish the 3% by June 2004, however, this year the District is still deficit spending over three million dollars; commented the District appears solvent as of June 2004, but the District needs to take steps this year to plan for the next two years.

WHEREAS, Article XIII B of the California Constitution provides certain limitations and controls on the

total annual appropriations of any school district; and

WHEREAS, Division 9, (commencing with Section 7900) of Title 1 of the Government Code provides

for the implementation of Article XIII B; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 7900 provides that the governing body of each school district

shall annually adopt a resolution to identify the estimated appropriations limit for the

district for the preceding fiscal year.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the Board of Trustees of the Fullerton School District hereby resolves and declares as follows:

The actual appropriations limit for 2002/03 was \$56,277,800 and the appropriations in the 2002/03 budget did not exceed the limitations imposed by Article XIII B of the California Constitution.

The appropriations limit for 2003/04 is estimated to be \$57,888,737 and the appropriations in the 2003/04 budget do not exceed the limitations imposed by Article XIII B of the California Constitution.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the documentation used in determining the appropriations limit shall be available to the public at 1401 West Valencia Drive, Fullerton, California 92833.

Fullerton for improvements to the playground equipment at Laguna Road School Park. The original agreement expired in 1986, and has since been automatically renewed on a yearly basis. The agreement allows for joint use of

the playground equipment by the City and the School. All repairs and

maintenance on the playground equipment have been the responsibility of the

City.

With the passage of Measure CC, one of the priorities set by the Board of Trustees is replacement of playground equipment that does not comply with the requirements of the Playground Safety Act of 2000. The Laguna Road School staff has requested that the existing playground equipment be replaced with equipment that is manufactured by Kompan, including the playground

equipment that was installed by the City. District staff has negotiated with the City and has prepared an amendment to the original agreement that allows the District to replace the equipment with the City paying 50% of the cost of the equipment itself, up to a maximum of \$25,000. Additionally, the District will assume the responsibility of maintaining and repairing the playground

equipment and maintenance of the playground. The amendment allows the City to use the equipment for recreational and civic purposes during non-school hours for 20 years. A copy of the amendment is available for review in the

Superintendent's office.

Article 4 of the Certificated Agreement outlines submission procedures for successor agreements. The teachers' initial proposal, which was due to the District no later than the first scheduled Board meeting in March 2003, was delayed in its presentation to the District until August 26, 2003. This delay has caused the District to delay its presentation and proposal, which may have an impact on the timeliness of

negotiations.

At the next regularly scheduled Board meeting on October 7, 2003, the Board will be asked to hold a public hearing on the District's initial proposal to the Fullerton Elementary Teachers Association. Once the Association and the Board's initial proposals have been sunshined, the collective bargaining process may begin.

The Certificated/District 2002-2003 Negotiated Agreement expired on June 30, 2003. The initial proposal pertains to a Successor Agreement.
