#### Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

President Thornley called the meeting to order at 5:50 p.m. Cub Scout Pack #1216 led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

#### Report from Closed Session

#### **Introductions**

Dr. Cameron McCune presented the Above and Beyond Award to Mr. Chris Lowe, Executive Director of the Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. Superintendent McCune spoke about Mr. Lowe's extensive help in promoting strong partnerships between local businesses and the District's schools and thanked him for his extraordinary leadership.

Representatives from the Veterans of Foreign Wars acknowledged Valencia Park Intermediate School Teacher Michael Hubbard, recipient of the California "Citizenship Education Teacher" Award.

#### Public Comments

Fullerton resident Ann Gread spoke to the Board about her concerns regarding the conversion of some of the District's schools into K-8 schools.

Kathy Dasney of the Fullerton Public Library explained the library's new program that will feature a particular school for one evening. Ms. Dasney stated the school, as well as the students' families, will be invited, and the library encourages parents to obtain student library cards so they can access the library's many electronic resources that are available. Ms. Dasney noted the new program will begin in October, and they are scheduling two schools per month.

#### Superintendent's Report

Dr. McCune congratulated Board President Lynn Thornley whose son recently became an Eagle Scout. Superintendent McCune reported planning meetings are underway for the new Robert C. Fisler School including collaboration with representatives from Raytheon, Beckman Coulter, Apple Computer, U.C. Irvine, and California State University, Fullerton. The focus of the new school is Science and Technology, and staffs are trying to obtain partnerships ahead of time. Dr. McCune also stated Billie Holt is doing an outstanding job of arranging these important meetings.

Trustee Ballard stated she was privileged to serve on the panel that awarded Birch Thornley the honor of Eagle Scout. Mrs. Ballard also stated The Fullerton School District Educational Foundation will have a Wine, Cheese & Wreaths silent auction benefiting the Fullerton School District Science Resource Center on Sunday, October 26.

Trustee Duncan congratulated Beechwood, Rolling Hills, and Sunset Lane on their Back to School Nights noting they were well organized and well presented.

Trustee Bass thanked Fern Drive and Pacific Drive Schools for their Back to School Nights commenting they were well presented. Mr. Bass stated he enjoyed seeing parents and enjoyed visiting the classrooms.

# Special Workshop

# 1a. Facilities

Gary Drabek stated the purpose of this presentation is to explain to the Board what will be recommended for approval at the October 7 Board meeting and emphasized the importance to move forward at this time.

Kelvin Okino reported: he is presently making sure contractors have thoroughly completed all the summer project work and is finalizing contracts; two schools still need irrigation work completed; last week received final clearance on asbestos abatement at Parks Junior High; in the process of finalizing costs for modernization contractor and abatement contractor. Mr. Okino defined the projects: Phase 1 Projects (health & safety) = \$29 million completed Summer 2003; Phase 2a Projects (health & safety) = \$10 million to be completed Summer 2004; Phase 2b Projects (not included in health & safety, but indicated as second round priority by Board) = \$16 million to be completed Summer 2004 and later. Mr. Okino discussed Project Funding (total funding from Measure CC and other restricted sources – not including Developer Fees) and detailed the Phase 2a projects (health and safety) for Summer 2004.

Gary Drabek, Tony Anderson, Fred Good, and Ken Podany discussed in detail the Phase 2b Projects: 1) technology upgrades, 2) restroom renovations, 3) window and door replacements, 4) gymnasium at Ladera Vista, 5) construction of seven multipurpose rooms, 6) conversion of K-6 schools to K-8. Also reviewed were 1) Projects on Hold (renovation of media centers and renovation of multipurpose rooms); and 2) Timelines (a: Phases 2a, 2b, K-8 = summer 2004; b: Phase 2b – multipurpose room and gymnasium = Fall 2004 to Summer 2005; c: CEQA = multipurpose rooms, gymnasium, K-8).

In conclusion, Mr. Drabek reiterated the importance for Board approval and direction at the October 7 Board Meeting to proceed with implementing Summer 2004 projects.

- Background: In 2001 the District completed a Request for Proposal process wherein PJHM Architects Southwest (PJHMSW) was awarded a contract to perform architectural/engineering and various other consulting services as requested for the District. PJHMSW is a firm skilled in dealing with State requirements regarding K-12 facility construction projects, and with the complexities of State funding applications. Design fees were competitive with other firms, and recommendations were positive. PJHMSW had performed excellent work for the District in the past. PJHMSW performed good work with this past summer's projects, and is well underway in the planning and design of upcoming Measure CC projects that have been presented to the Board of Trustees at recent Board meetings. Board approval is requested for Addendum # 3 to the original contract. This Addendum is structured to save Measure CC design and contract administration dollars and reflects discounted fees for buildings of the same design as relates to seven multipurpose rooms and three gymnasiums, specifying a 15% discount for the second building and a 20% discount for the third and additional buildings. The hourly fees for various other consulting services requested by the District remain unchanged from the 2001 hourly rates.

Addendum #3 to the Agreement for Architectural Services by and between the Fullerton School District and PJHM Architects Southwest, Inc.

This Addendum modifies the original agreement dated March 1, 2001, as follows:

The District directs Architect to provide services necessary to plan, design and construct the following school facilities-related projects pursuant to the District's Facilities Improvement Program as primarily funded through Measure CC bond proceeds:

Multipurpose Rooms at each of the following elementary school sites – Beechwood, Laguna Road, Pacific Drive, Richman, Rolling Hills, Sunset Lane, and Woodcrest; Gyms at each of the following junior high school sites – Ladera Vista, Nicolas, and Parks, and Health and Safety, infrastructure related projects and additionally identified "Measure CC" projects at sites throughout the District.

The basic architectural fee will be calculated for each separate project as specified in Article V, using project cost estimates as specified in Article III. A fifteen percent (15%) basic architectural fee discount will be applied to the multipurpose room project at Laguna Road School and the gymnasium project at Nicolas Junior High School. A twenty percent (20%) basic architectural fee discount will be applied to the multipurpose room projects at Beechwood, Richman, Rolling Hills, Sunset Lane, Woodcrest, and the gymnasium project at Parks.

- Background: The following schools have requested permission to take their students on overnight field trips during the 2003-2004 school year. These trips are sponsored by the Orange County Outdoor Science School, Ocean Institute, and Camp High Trails Outdoor Science School. Accommodations for students unable to attend any field trip will be made in one of the other classrooms. Information about the coordinating agencies, teachers, students and parent volunteers, follows:

<u>Orange County Outdoor Science School</u>: Prior to the overnight field trip, the 6th grade classes at Beechwood School will have studied earth science. This study will occur before and after the field trip and will serve to integrate into social science and language arts.

Extensive classroom activities will have prepared the students for what they will experience on the field trip. Classroom preparation and follow-up will enhance the learning of the students as they have the opportunity to experience, firsthand, what they have been studying.

Seventy students will attend along with participating teachers: Becky D'Arrigo, Jody Dyer, Margaret Rogan. The cost of the four-day trip is \$270.00 per student. Copies of the field trip requests are on file in the Superintendent's office.

Orange County Ocean Institute (OI) Overnight Programs:

<u>Lazy W. Ranch</u>: Prior to attending the camp, Acacia, Hermosa Drive and Orangethorpe's 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be involved in science activities relating to: ecology organisms in ecosystems; exchange energy and nutrients; photosynthesis; sea life and the marine environment, and the classification of plants and animals.

The program is integrated into social science and language arts. Seventy-two to one hundred students from each school will participate in the three-day program. Participating teachers from Acacia include: Veronica Carder, Paul Cone, and Kathy Kellerman. Participating teachers from Hermosa Drive include: Pamela Zinnel, Dona Miller, Janny Meyer, and Dora Muro. Participating teachers from Orangethorpe include: Stacy Hollenbeck, Kaye Cogdill, Debra Kojima, and

Roger Prasser. Copies of the field trip requests are on file in the Superintendent's office.

<u>Camp High Trails Outdoor Science School</u>: Prior to the overnight field trip, the 6<sup>th</sup> grade classes at Rolling Hills and Raymond Schools will participate in science study about animals, their habitats, ecology and the earth as well as astronomy. These studies will occur before and after the field trips and will be integrated in social science and language arts. Sixty-six students from Rolling Hills School will participate in the three-day program. Participating teachers include Sandra Hearst and Yvette Edwards. Thirty students from Raymond School will participate in the four-day program. Participating teachers include Carol Watts and Mark Jacobs. The cost is \$200.00 per student. - 8. The school district (charter school) will submit final enrollment counts on the J-7CSR form to the School Facilities Planning Division by May 7, 2004.

Background: Prior to the summer Modernization Projects at six schools, District staff, along with the Project Manager, conducted interviews with several asbestos consulting firms that responded to the District's Request for Proposals. CF Environmental was selected to perform asbestos monitoring for the projects because of the company's previous experience with the District, positive references from other clients, and competitive pricing for necessary services.

When an unexpected release of previously encapsulated asbestos containing material occurred at Parks Junior High School during the Modernization Program, it became necessary to have monitoring services provided that exceeded the originally planned scope of work. In order to separate the additional expense from the original agreement, the District has negotiated a separate agreement with CF Environmental for the asbestos monitoring at Parks Junior High School. The agreement is available for review in the Superintendent's office.

- Funding: Measure CC (Fund 22).
- <u>Recommendation</u>: Approve agreement with CF Environmental for asbestos monitoring at Parks Junior High School – special asbestos removal project for a total amount not to exceed \$90,000.00.

- Background: The Principal Training Program, authorized by Assembly Bill 75 provides funding to districts for training principals and vice principals using the State Board of Education approved training providers. The training provides site administrators with skills and knowledge necessary for their challenging and complex roles as instructional leaders. Our selected program has been customized to meet the needs of the site leaders in the Fullerton School District.

AB 75 requires 80 hours of Core Training and 80 hours of follow-up practicum. The practicum hours are tailored to the individual needs of the site administrators. Site Administrators have 2 years to complete the program.

The training covers three integrated modules designed to support site administrators: Module I, Leadership and Support of Student Instructional Programs (45 hours in-class training and 20 hours individual practicum); Module 2, Leadership and Management for Instructional Improvement: Maximizing Financial and Human Resources (15 hours in-class training and 20 hours individual practicum); and Module 3, Instructional Technology to Improve Pupil performance (20 hours in-class training and 20 hours individual practicum).

The approved provider selected by the Fullerton School District is the Orange County Office of Education (OCDE). The OCDE program will provide site administrators with deep exploration of newly adopted instructional materials, mastering the use of formative and summative data, creating the CDE required single school plan, establishing the culture and climate in the new accountability system, aligning teacher observation and instructional support, maximizing the use of technology resources, optimizing site financial and personnel management. Principals and Assistant Principals will participate in Module 3, Technology this fall. A copy of the Consultant Agreement is on file in the Superintendent's office.

- <u>Funding</u>: There is no cost to the District. The cost for Module 3, Technology is \$800 per participant. The total cost of all three modules is \$3,600 per participant. The California Department of Education AB 75 Grant and the Bill Gates Foundation will reimburse the District for the cost of training sixteen principals and seven assistant principals.
- <u>Recommendation</u>: Approve the AB75 Principals Training Consultant Agreement for Module 3 Technology with the Orange County Office of Education.

- Additional modernization at Maple School to expend minimum required matching funds
- Technology upgrades
- Renovation of primary and upper grade restrooms at thirteen sites. (This
  item has been placed separately on the agenda to allow the Board to

- Replacement of windows at Orangethorpe and Valencia Park Schools
- Construction of gymnasium/performing arts facility at Ladera Vista Junior High

- SUBJECT: EMERGENCY CONTRACT TO PERFORM ADDITIONAL WORK AT PARKS JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL AS A RESULT OF ASBESTOS REMOVAL
- Background: Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 20111(d), all California school districts are required to utilize competitive bidding on any work in excess of \$15,000.00, or any equipment purchase in excess of \$59,600.

Public Contract Code Section 20111(d) allows for award of a contract without bids when, in the opinion of the district, there is an emergency requiring repairs, alterations, work, or improvement to any facilities to permit the continuance of existing school classes. In times of such emergencies, the local school board, with a unanimous vote, finds that an emergency exists and enters into a contract for the performance of labor and furnishing of materials or supplies without advertising for or inviting bids. Approval from the Orange County Superintendent of Schools is also necessary.

The asbestos abatement and encapsulation that was performed at Parks Junior High School necessitated the removal of the ventilation ducting and light fixtures. This removal now requires that these items be replaced at an estimated cost of \$700,000. If this additional scope of work is contracted using the normal bidding process, it will delay the completion of the modernization at Parks for several months and could result in multiple General Contractors coordinating projects resulting in possible delay claims against the District. For these reasons, staff has determined that the additional work should be contracted to the same General Contractor that is performing the original modernization, Tadros and Youseff Construction.

Funding: Measure CC.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Find that an emergency exists to perform additional work at Parks Junior High School as a result of asbestos removal.

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
