Dr. Hovey's report: enrollment is up by 188 students from last year, total enrollment at 13,244; attended presentation by Ron Bennett at OCDE regarding the State budget; represented the District at the Neighbors United for Fullerton Education Forum at the Public Library, answered questions from the audience; per the latest release of the 2008/2009 Academic Performance Index (API) scores, 18 of 20 of the District's schools made positive growth with 14 of the 20 schools achieving double-digit increases, and the District as a whole achieved a double-digit increase; Happy Birthday to Trustee Berryman this Thursday, September 24; Ken Valburg accepted a position as Principal in the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District, Glenda Thompson is now the Interim Principal at Orangethorpe School, District will consult with staff and parents to obtain input regarding desired characteristics for the next Principal of Orangethorpe School, will advertise opening throughout the State; congratulations to Hermosa Drive School and Teacher Janny Meyer on the upcoming Golden Bell Award validation visit.

SUBJECT:	APPROVE 2009/2010 STIPENDS FOR PEER ASSISTANCE AND REVIEW (PAR) JOINT PANEL TEACHER MEMBERS
Background:	Assembly Bill 1X (Chapter 4, Statutes of 1999) established the California Peer Assistance and Review (PAR) program which allows exemplary teachers to assist veteran teachers who need to develop their subject matter knowledge, teaching strategies, or both.
	One of the provisions of the program is the establishment of a Joint Panel comprised of four (4) teachers and three (3) school administrators. The Director of Educational Services will oversee the program (Section 2: Joint Panel-Peer Assistance and Review Agreement). According to the Agreement, (Section 6: B-Compensation) teacher members of the Joint Panel will receive release time as needed to perform their duties. The Joint Panel receives a stipend of \$1,000.00 per academic year.
	The four teachers and one alternate selected for the Joint Panel by the Fullerton Elementary Teachers Association are Karen Bell (Beechwood School), Jeff Dotson (Ladera Vista Junior High), Janet Langford (Acacia School), Darlene Naslund (Commonwealth School), and alternate Leslie Santillan (Robert C. Fisler School).
Rationale:	PAR Joint Panel oversight is critical to monitor and guide support activities for teachers. The Panel stipend is paid according to the current contract.
<u>Funding:</u>	The PAR program is funded through the California Department of Education (CDE) and the State law, which regulates the use of these funds. Funds will be applied to General Fund (01) income. The stipend for 2009/2010 is to be paid in two installments to Karen Bell, Jeff Dotson, Janet Langford, and Darlene Naslund as follows: \$500.00 on January 31, 2010, and \$500.00 on June 30, 2010, for a total of \$1,000.00 for each member from PAR funds (#306).

<u>Background:</u>	Class Size Reduction (CSR) will continue to operate at the kindergarten, first, and second grade levels during the 2009/2010 school year. A small number of third grade classes are also participating this year. Due to the budget problem at the State level, the method of calculating Class Size Reduction has changed from previous years. The 2009/2010 entitlement is capped at the number of classes reported on the 2008/2009 CSR application presented to the Board of Trustees on January 30, 2009. Actual revenue will be based on the average daily enrollment of 226 classes as of April 15, 2010, the end of the reporting period. Income was included in the Adopted Budget.
Rationale:	As a condition of applying for and receiving Class Size Reduction Operation Program funds, the Governing Board of the Fullerton School District must certify that the statements included on the attached application are true and accurate.
Funding:	Estimated income of \$3,819,439.00.

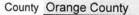

SUBJECT: AMEND 2010/2013 SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN PARADIGM HEALTHCARE SERVICES AND THE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR LOCAL EDUCATION AGENCY MEDI-CAL AND MEDI-CAL ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES BILLING CLAIMS

- Background: Paradigm has provided the billing services for the District in filing our Local Education Agency (LEA) Medi-Cal billing claims. Based upon new requirements, Paradigm will also provide the documentation required by the Orange County Department of Education, which serves as the LEA for our Medi-Cal Administrative Activities (MAA) billing. As of July 1, 2006, the State Department of Health Services (DHS) implemented the State Plan Amendment (SPA 03-024), which shifts various regulatory aspects of the program and introduces a new aspect. Starting in the 2007/2008 school year, the Cost and Reimbursement Reconciliation Schedule (CRCS) will also be provided by Paradigm for the District. This amended service agreement provides for the 3% charge by Paradigm on the three-year period, and outlines the parameters of the services previously approved by the Board on August 26, 2006.
- <u>Rationale</u>: Extend the Paradigm contract through 2013 and expand services to fulfill all requirements.
- <u>Funding</u>: The LEA Billing Services fees for claims submitted by Paradigm will be a percentage of the gross amount earned for the Fiscal Year in the areas of LEA, MAA and CRCS Services.
- <u>Recommendation</u>: Amend 2010/2013 Service Agreement between Paradigm Healthcare Services and the Fullerton School District for Local Education Agency Medi-Cal and Medi-Cal Administrative Activities billing claims.

SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Service Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into as of the 1st day of July 2009 between Paradigm HealthCare Services, LLC, a California Corporation doing business as Paradigm HealthCare Services ("Paradigm") and Fullerton Elementary School District, a Local Education Agency ("LEA").

RECITALS

Paradigm is engaged in the business of providing healthcare billing services to school districts, County offices of education, and local education consortia within the state of California.

LEA is a school district or other association of schools comprising a Local Education Agency. LEA desires to retain Paradigm, and Paradigm desires to be retained by LEA, to provide the services described in greater detail below.

Accordingly, in consideration of the mutual obligations undertaken herein, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

TERMS

1. Retention.

LEA hereby retains Paradigm and grants it the exclusive right to perform the services described below subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

2. Term.

This Agreement shall commence on the date first set forth above and shall continue in full force and effect through June 30, 2012 ("Initial Term"). Unless either party sends written notice to the other party at least 60 days prior to the end of the Initial Term or any subsequent term, this agreement shall automatically renew for an additional year on each July 1 following the Initial Term, subject to termination provisions herein. The phrase "Term of the Agreement" shall refer to the Initial Term and any subsequent renewal period. The phrase "Fiscal Year" as used in this Agreement shall refer to the period July 1 though June 30. The Agreement will govern activities required to be performed by either party to complete obligations undertaken under this Agreement, regardless whether those activities are to be performed during or after the term of the Agreement.

3. Paradigm LEA Billing Services.

a. <u>Eligibility</u>. Using its proprietary algorithms and know-how, Paradigm will determine Medi-Cal eligibility and identify Medi-Cal numbers within limits imposed by the DHS and county governments upon commencement of LEA's Billing Services and quarterly thereafter. Eligibility match information will be retained by Paradigm and will be used solely to provide Services hereunder. b. <u>Provider Logs</u>. If the LEA prefers to document its healthcare services on Paradigm forms, Paradigm will supply LEA with specially designed monthly provider logs for use by the LEA's healthcare providers, at no extra charge to LEA.

c. <u>Training</u>. Paradigm will provide initial training of LEA health managers through one (1) day training classes to help them carry out their responsibilities for submitting information. Classes will be offered monthly, provided that Paradigm determines the demand is sufficient, in different locations throughout the State as necessary. LEA may send personnel to as many of the classes offered as it chooses.

d. <u>Claims Submittal</u>. Paradigm will make commercially reasonable efforts to submit each Medi-Cal claim within thirty (30) days of receipt from LEA of all information necessary for processing that claim. Paradigm will also make reasonable efforts to bill retroactive claims existing at the commencement of this Agreement so as to minimize revenue lost due to Medi-Cal's one (1) year billing limit.

e. <u>Reports</u>. Paradigm will provide LEA with management reports using provider, procedure, and/or site parameters, the character and frequency of which will be determined by mutual agreement of Paradigm and LEA and will be based on LEA's use of LEA's Billing Services.

4. LEA's Billing Service Obligations.

a. <u>Provider Logs</u>. LEA will maintain complete and accurate provider logs of all healthcare services provided by LEA and will return the completed logs to Paradigm at the end of each month.

b. <u>Student Data</u>. Upon commencement of the Agreement and quarterly thereafter (October 15th, December 15th, March 15th, and June 15th), LEA will provide Paradigm with a computer file in a format specified by Paradigm of all student data requested by Paradigm from LEA's computer systems or from the computer systems of the individual schools that LEA comprises.

5. Paradigm CRCS Services.

Paradigm will prepare the annual Cost and Reimbursement Comparison Schedule (CRCS) Workbook in accordance with the claim guidelines approved by DHS based on information supplied by LEA for each fiscal year in accordance with the term of this contract. LEA will have final approval over the CRCS Workbook submission prepared by Paradigm.

6. LEA's CRCS Obligations.

LEA will submit to Paradigm all elements needed to complete the CRCS Workbook for each provider for whom reimbursement is sought. Documentation will be submitted to Paradigm no later than sixty (60) days after the end of the Fiscal Year for which the claim is to be submitted.

7. Termination of CRCS Services.

Either party may terminate Paradigm's performance of CRCS services upon written notice sent no later than 60 days prior to the end of a Fiscal Year for which the CRCS services apply. Absent termination in accordance with the requirements of this Section, LEA will be obligated to pay the full annual CRCS fee. Any termination otherwise shall be in accordance with the termination provisions of the Agreement and shall not extinguish the parties' other rights or obligations hereunder.

8. Paradigm MAA Services.

a. <u>MAA Operational Plan</u>. Paradigm will assist the LEA with the development and submission to the Lead County or Regional Agency (as defined by the DHS, such as a Local Government Agency or Local Education Consortium) of a MAA Operational Plan encompassing each claiming unit (e.g. Nursing, Healthy Start) in accordance with the DHS MAA Operational Plan instructions. LEA will have final authority to approve such MAA Operational Plan prepared by Paradigm before submission to the Lead County or Regional Agency.

b. <u>Eligibility</u>. Using its proprietary algorithms and know-how, Paradigm will determine Medi-Cal eligibility and identify Medi-Cal numbers within limits imposed by the DHS and county governments upon commencement of MAA Billing Services and quarterly thereafter. Eligibility match information will be retained by Paradigm and will be used solely to provide Services hereunder.

c. <u>Training</u>. Paradigm will provide key staff, which has been mutually agreed upon by Paradigm and LEA, with the appropriate training, knowledge and skill to adequately complete time surveys and understand program activity codes.

d. <u>Documentation for Claim Submission</u>. Paradigm will assist LEA in the calculation of transportation direct charge rates, provided that LEA supplies Paradigm with the information necessary to make such calculations in accordance with the claim guidelines as expressed in the MAA Operational Plan (as approved by DHS). LEA will have final approval of the MAA claim submissions prepared by Paradigm.

e. <u>Agency Coordination</u>. Paradigm will coordinate the submittal of MAA Operational Plan and claims to the County or Regional MAA Coordinator and provide information requested by regional, State and federal agencies as related to the MAA Operational Plan and claims submitted thereunder.

9. LEA's MAA Obligations.

a. <u>MAA Operational Plan</u>. LEA will provide to Paradigm all pertinent information needed for developing each MAA Operational Plan in a timely manner. LEA will designate individuals to serve as Paradigm contacts for the collection of such information.

b. <u>Training</u>. LEA will ensure that appropriate personnel attend training and are trained to complete the annual time survey as selected by the State using form DHS 7094.

c. <u>DHS required Time Survey</u>. If consistent with LEA's MAA Operational Plan, LEA will submit to Paradigm each time survey that is required by DHS for each participant on a quarterly basis or other time frame requirement as selected by the State using DHS approved documentation. All time surveys will be submitted to Paradigm no later than thirty (30) days after the end of the month in which the time survey was completed.

d. <u>Transportation Documentation</u>. If consistent with LEA's MAA Operational Plan, LEA will provide Paradigm with an annual list in writing or in a computer file in a format specified by Paradigm of all students receiving non-healthcare transportation who have said transportation designated in their Individual Education Program or Individual Health and Support Plan. Transportation documentation must be submitted to Paradigm no later than thirty (30) days after the end of the first quarter of the school year.

e. <u>MAA Claim Submittal</u>. LEA will submit to Paradigm all elements needed to complete the detailed MAA Claim form for the provider unit that undertook the activities for which reimbursement

is sought. Documentation will be submitted to Paradigm no later than sixty (60) days after the end of the quarter for which the claim is to be submitted.

f. <u>Compliance</u>. LEA will comply with enabling legislation, regulations, administrative claiming process directives, policies, and program letters of the DHS, as well as directives from the Lead County or Regional Agency, and with the terms of the approved MAA Operational Plan, which define allowable MAA and processes for appropriate MAA reimbursements.

g. <u>Student Data</u>. Upon commencement of the Agreement and quarterly thereafter (October 15th, December 15th, March 15th, and June 15th), LEA will provide Paradigm with a computer file in a format specified by Paradigm of all student data requested by Paradigm from LEA's computer systems or from the computer systems of the individual schools LEA comprises.

10. Additional LEA Obligations.

In addition to the specific obligations set forth above, LEA will take such other reasonable actions as Paradigm may request to facilitate Paradigm's provision of services under this Agreement.

11. Fees and Payment Terms.

a. <u>Fees for LEA Services</u>. The LEA Billing Services fee for claims submitted by Paradigm or originating during the term of this Agreement will be equal to a sliding scale percentage of the gross amount paid to LEA by DHS (without including DHS administrative deductions or holdbacks) ("DHS Reimbursement") in each Fiscal Year or part of a Fiscal Year in which payment for such claims is paid to LEA according to the following schedule:

15% of gross amounts paid to LEA, up to \$500,000

12% of gross amounts paid to LEA, from \$500,001 to \$1 million

10% of gross amounts paid to LEA, above \$1 million

For purposes of computing the DHS Reimbursement for any Fiscal Year, all payments will be deemed to fall within the Fiscal Year in which payment is received by LEA, regardless when the claim originates or is submitted to DHS for payment. Nothing in this Section shall constitute a limitation or waiver of Paradigm's entitlement to receive fees based on the foregoing schedule even after termination of the Agreement. Paradigm will invoice LEA monthly based on payment received by LEA from DHS.

b. <u>Fees for CRCS Services.</u> The fee for each Fiscal Year for which CRCS services are rendered will be equal to the lesser of: (i) \$10,000 or (ii) 3% of the "Medi-Cal Maximum Reimbursable" amount for all LEA services as set forth on Worksheet A to the CRCS Workbook for that Fiscal Year. Paradigm will invoice LEA for CRCS services on an annual basis.

c. <u>Fees For MAA Billing Services</u>. The MAA Billing Services fee applicable to each fiscal quarter during the term of the Agreement will be equal to \$125.00 multiplied by the sum of: (i) the number of Time Survey participants claimed on LEA's MAA Invoice for that fiscal quarter and (ii) the number of individuals identified as a direct charge in LEA's MAA Invoice for that fiscal quarter. Paradigm will invoice LEA quarterly based on MAA payments received by LEA from DHS.

d. <u>Late Fees.</u> LEA will incur a late fee of two percent (2%) per month or any part thereof, or the maximum fee allowed by law, whichever is less, on any invoiced amount unpaid after sixty (60) days. The fees specified herein do not include taxes or similar surcharges, which are the sole responsibility of LEA (other than taxes on Paradigm's gross income).

e. <u>Substitution of Alternative Fee Terms</u>. In the event that the foregoing fee arrangements or any part thereof is or becomes inconsistent with applicable state or federal law, regulation, or court

order, Paradigm may, in its sole discretion, and on thirty (30) days written notice, substitute a new fee arrangement. Provided however, such substitute fee arrangements shall not increase the total amount LEA would otherwise have been required to pay Paradigm for services under this Agreement.

12. Protection of Confidential Information.

a. <u>Definition</u>. "Confidential Information" shall mean all information disclosed by either party to the other that, at the time of first disclosure: (i) is clearly marked "confidential" or "proprietary;" (ii) is otherwise disclosed under circumstances of confidence; or (iii) reasonably should be understood by the receiving party to be confidential. LEA Confidential information shall include without limitation all LEA student healthcare data and shall exclude any information that is or becomes publicly known through no fault of Paradigm, is already known by Paradigm at the time of disclosure, or is rightfully received or independently developed by Paradigm after disclosure. Paradigm's Confidential Information shall include without limitation all business, marketing, technical, financial, customer, supplier, or other information, data entry means, processed claiming data, instructions, management reports, data file specifications, instructional materials, algorithms, software, forms, boilerplate plans, technologies, and know-how related to making eligibility determinations, and data and results derived from the foregoing.

b. <u>Protection of Confidential Information</u>. Each party shall use reasonable and appropriate measures to safeguard and keep confidential all Confidential Information of the other party and shall not disclose, use, or copy any Confidential Information except as necessary to perform its obligations hereunder. Such reasonable and appropriate measures shall be no less than the measures taken by each to protect its own confidential information of a similar nature. Each party may disclose Confidential Information of the other party to its responsible employees and independent contractors providing such employees and independent contractors have a need to know such Confidential Information for purposes of fulfilling the party's obligations hereunder, have been informed of the confidentiality provisions of this Agreement, and have agreed in writing to be bound by such provisions to the same extent as the parties. Each party shall be responsible for any breach of the confidentiality provisions of this Agreement by its employees and independent contractors.

c. <u>Retention of Confidential Information</u>. LEA authorizes Paradigm in its discretion to dispose of service documentation (including but not limited to paper-based documentation such as provider logs) in a manner that preserves the confidentiality of such documentation provided that no documentation of Medi-Cal eligible services shall be discarded earlier than three years after the service date and no documentation of services that are not Medi-Cal eligible shall be discarded earlier than 1 year after the service date.

d. <u>Direct Control By LEA</u>. The parties acknowledge that, notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, LEA has taken reasonable and appropriate steps to ensure that Paradigm's practices with respect to confidential student information comply with FERPA requirements and LEA remains legally responsible for any FERPA violations that may occur in the course of Paradigm's performance of services under this Agreement.

e. <u>Lawful Disclosure</u>. This Section shall not be construed as prohibiting either party from disclosing information to the extent required by law, regulation, or court order, provided such party notifies the other party promptly after becoming aware of such obligations and permits the other party to seek a protective order or otherwise to challenge or limit such required disclosure.

f.<u>Continuing Obligations</u>. The obligations contained in this Section shall survive for a period of twenty (20) years after the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

13. Accuracy of Information.

a. <u>LEA Efforts</u>. LEA shall use its best efforts to insure that the information supplied to Paradigm hereunder shall be true, complete, and accurate in all respects. LEA assumes sole responsibility, and Paradigm shall have no liability, for the truth, completeness and accuracy of all information supplied to Paradigm.

b. Paradigm Efforts.

(1) Paradigm shall make reasonable efforts to verify the completeness and accuracy of information underlying the claims it submits on LEA's behalf. Due to the volume of data being processed from manual data entry forms and the necessity of correlating student records from several databases maintained by Paradigm, it is inevitable that some requests for reimbursement (or categories of requests or patients) will be denied due to incorrect or incomplete supporting data or healthcare insurance information. Paradigm will make reasonable efforts to minimize such denials. LEA acknowledges that such denials are normal, and will not constitute a breach of Paradigm's obligations under this Agreement. LEA's sole and exclusive remedy for any such reimbursement denial is to request that Paradigm re-bill any denied claims. Paradigm will determine in its sole and absolute discretion if such rebilling is reasonable and cost effective. Except as set forth in this paragraph, Paradigm shall not be liable, and LEA shall have no remedy, for any reimbursement denial for healthcare or administrative services that are not reimbursable under state or federal law.

(2) Paradigm shall make reasonable efforts to submit all operational plans and claims made thereunder in a timely manner. However, Paradigm shall not be responsible in any way in the event that any operational plan or any claim made thereunder is submitted late or incomplete directly or indirectly because of the failure or delay by LEA or its employees, students, agents or independent contractors in making all necessary information available to Paradigm, or any third party's failure or delay in submitting documentation to the DHS.

(3) LEA acknowledges that Paradigm is not providing LEA with legal, medical or healthcare information or services and that any forms, software, and other materials supplied to LEA hereunder are not intended to provide legal, medical, or healthcare advice.

14. Limitation of Liability.

In no event shall Paradigm be liable to LEA for any incidental, indirect, consequential, special, or punitive damages arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including without limitation damages for lost reimbursements, lost healthcare services, or lost data, regardless of whether Paradigm has been advised of the possibility of such damages, and regardless of whether the claim for damages sounds in contract, tort, or other form of action. In the event LEA elects not to utilize Paradigm's services to prepare its annual CRCS Workbook, or fails to make available information necessary to timely complete the Workbook, Paradigm will not be liable in any manner for resulting termination of LEA from participation in the LEA Billing Option or for any resulting disallowance of LEA claims. In no event shall Paradigm's total liability for damages to LEA arising out of or related to this Agreement exceed the net fees paid to Paradigm hereunder during the six (6) month period preceding the date on which the first claim alleged to give rise to damages occurs, regardless of the number of claims, causes of action or amount of the alleged losses.

15. Licenses and Permits.

LEA represents and warrants that: (a) it has all licenses and permits necessary or appropriate to render the medical services it currently provides to its students, and to be eligible for reimbursement from Medi-Cal; (b) LEA will maintain such licenses in full force and effect during the term and all renewal terms of this Agreement; and (c) LEA has all necessary authority, including approval by the Board of Education if necessary, to enter into this Agreement and to perform all of its obligations hereunder.

16. Indemnification.

LEA shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Paradigm, its officers, directors, employees, agents and shareholders against and from any all claims, demands, losses, obligations, proceedings, debts, damages, causes of action, liability, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees and costs), whether accrued or paid, arising directly or indirectly from, or relating to any of LEA's actions arising out of this Agreement or any request for reimbursement submitted by Paradigm on behalf of LEA under this Agreement including without limitation: (a) breach of any provisions of this Agreement by LEA; (b) failure of LEA or its healthcare providers, to provide the healthcare services for which reimbursement is sought; (c) failure of LEA or its employees, agents, or independent contractors to provide healthcare and related services according to professional standards; (d) inaccuracy in the LEA's Confidential Information; or (e) failure of LEA or its employees, agents, or registrations required to render the healthcare and related services for which reimbursement is sought. These obligations shall survive expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason.

17. Termination.

a. <u>For Cause</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the other party if the other party is in material breach of its obligations under this Agreement and such breach is not cured within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of the specific nature of such breach (or, in the case of nonpayment of fees within fifteen (15) days after receipt of written notice). The non-breaching party shall give its reasonable cooperation and assistance to the breaching party in any efforts made to cure such breach.

b. <u>Without Cause</u>. The parties may terminate this Agreement at any time by written agreement of both parties, effective as of the date specified in such agreement.

c. <u>Effect of Termination</u>. Upon the expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason: (1) Paradigm shall submit for reimbursement and shall be entitled to receive payment pursuant to this Agreement for all claims arising from healthcare services provided by LEA during the Term of this Agreement, provided that such claims are documented and submitted to Paradigm for reimbursement within six (6) months after the earlier of expiration or termination of this Agreement; (2) all fees LEA owes to Paradigm shall immediately become due and payable; (3) LEA shall, upon request, return or destroy, at Paradigm's option, all Confidential Information received from Paradigm and shall certify to Paradigm its compliance with this provision; and (4) except as otherwise set forth herein, all definitions, the parties' rights and obligations with respect to this Agreement (other than the "Payments" and "Parties' Efforts" Sections) and all other provisions that by their nature should survive, shall survive.

18. Paradigm Proprietary Rights.

LEA acknowledges and agrees that Paradigm retains all right, title, and interest, including without limitation all intellectual property rights, in and to Paradigm's Confidential Information (as defined above) and all forms, materials, submissions, and software prepared or supplied by Paradigm. Except as and to the extent otherwise provided in this Agreement, neither this Agreement nor Paradigm's performance of the Services shall give LEA any ownership interest in or license to any of Paradigm's intellectual or other property.

19. Miscellaneous.

a. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice required or permitted to be give under this Agreement shall be in writing and may be delivered in person, by overnight courier, or by facsimile if confirmed by first class mail, or sent by certified or registered mail, addressed to the other party at the addresses set forth on the signature page of this Agreement. Notice will be effective as of the date personally delivered, or if by facsimile, when confirmed electronically by the sending facsimile machine, or otherwise when actually received.

b. <u>Relationship</u>. It is intended that the relationship of Paradigm to LEA shall at all times be that of an independent contractor. Nothing contained in this Agreement is intended or to be construed so as to create any partnership, joint venture, employment, agency, franchise or other representative relationship between the parties. No party hereto, or their respective officers, directors, employees, or agents shall have any express or implied right or authority to assume or create any obligations on behalf of or in the name of the other party, or to bind the other party to any contract, agreement, or undertaking with any third party.

c. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties under it shall be subject to, governed by, construed, and enforced pursuant to the laws of the State of California without giving effect to any choice of law principles. Headings are for convenience only.

d. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is held by a court or arbitrator to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining portions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, and such court or arbitrator shall be empowered to substitute provisions similar to said provision, or other provisions, so as to provide the parties the benefits intended by said provision, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law.

e. <u>Arbitration</u>. Any dispute arising in connection with the interpretation or enforcement of this Agreement shall be resolved by compulsory binding arbitration under the auspices of and in accordance with the commercial arbitration rules of the American Arbitration Association in San Francisco, California before a single arbitrator to be selected by mutual agreement of the parties or, failing such agreement, by AAA from a list of three arbitrators proposed by each side. The decision of the arbitrator will be final and not appealable. The arbitrator shall interpret and enforce this Agreement in accordance with the laws of the State of California. The arbitrator shall be empowered to award the prevailing party any remedy available in law or equity not specifically precluded by this Agreement, including without limitation injunctive or declaratory relief, and attorneys fees and costs.

f. <u>Other Remedies</u>. The parties acknowledge and agree that any actual or threatened misappropriation or infringement of intellectual property or breach of the confidentiality provisions of this Agreement will cause irreparable harm for which there is no adequate remedy at law, and accordingly, in addition to any other available remedies, a party may seek to enforce its rights with respect to the protection of confidential information or intellectual property hereunder through injunctive relief in any court of competent jurisdiction. In the event that any party is required to commence an action or arbitration to interpret or enforce any of the terms of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to an award of reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

g. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Neither party shall be liable for any delay or failure to perform its obligations hereunder (except for any obligation to pay fees) resulting from any cause beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to acts of God, terrorism, weather, fire, explosions, floods, strikes, work stoppages, slowdowns, industrial disputes, accidents, riots, civil disturbances, or acts of government.

h. <u>Entire Agreement</u>; <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement contains the entire understanding and agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior agreements,

understandings, negotiations, and discussions of the parties, whether oral or written, relating to its contents. There are no agreements, understandings, restrictions, representations or warranties other than those set forth in this Agreement. This Agreement may be amended only by an instrument in writing signed by all parties.

i. <u>Assignment</u>. LEA shall not assign or transfer this Agreement without the consent of Paradigm, which shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. Any assignment or transfer in violation hereof shall be null and void.

j. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their successors, assignees and legal representatives. It creates no rights in any third parties including any individual in connection with which reimbursement is sought by LEA.

k. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of faxed or original counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original, but all of which together will constitute one and the same instrument.

SUBJECT: APPROVE/RATIFY AGREEMENT WITH THE ORANGE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR THE AB 430 ADMINISTRATOR TRAINING PROGRAM, SEPTEMBER 1, 2009 – JUNE 30, 2011

Background: The Administrator Training Program AB 430, which reauthorizes the Principal Training Program AB 75, became effective July 1, 2006. The training supports professional development that focuses on building leadership skills for new administrators and provides information for their challenging and complex roles as instructional leaders. The Fullerton School District will apply, through the California Department of Education, for AB 430 grant funding to support the cost in the amount of \$3,000.00 per principal/assistant principal. Districts are required to provide \$1,000.00 in local matching funds for each participant. Five additional administrators will participate in the training program. Funding for these five additional participants is available through various grant programs. Administrators have two years to complete the program.

> Program training will be provided and organized into three modules: Module 1: Leadership and Support of Student Instructional Programs; Module 2: Leadership and Management for Instructional Improvement and; Module 3: Instructional Technology to Improve Pupil Performance. Each District must select a provider approved by the California Department of Education. The approved provider selected by the Fullerton School District for training is the Orange County Office of Education (OCDE). The OCDE program will include training on Core academic standards, curriculum frameworks, instructional materials, and mastering the use of formative and summative assessment data.

- <u>Rationale</u>: The Administrator Training Program ensures the leadership, infrastructure, and support for full implementation of effective instructional programs to improve student achievement.
- Funding:The cost per participant for Module 1 is \$2,000.00, Module 2 is \$900.00, and Module
3 is \$900.00 for a total fee of \$19,000.00. Participants will be paid from AB 430
Administrator Training grant funding budget (#325) and Title II Teacher/Principal
Staff Development grant funding (#217).

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approve/Ratify Agreement with the Orange County Department of Education to provide professional development for the AB 430 Administrator Training Program, September 1, 2009 – June 30, 2011.

- Background: As part of Ladera Vista's implementation of a Professional Learning Community, it is vital to reflect on areas that need improvement to assure student achievement. It is imperative to provide the Ladera Vista staff an avenue to share best practices. UCLA's School Management Program trains teachers to conduct productive classroom "walkthroughs" within their schools and coaches them to share best practices among colleagues. With the implementation of Late Start Wednesdays at Ladera Vista, this training will provide administrators and teachers the capacity to identify the issues we need to improve and the ability to use our collective leadership skills to change how we do things to increase student achievement. Building on the training and implementation of Professional Learning Communities, Ladera Vista has built a culture of trust and collaboration.
- <u>Rationale:</u> As a follow up for next steps to last year's training, UCLA in collaboration with the Ladera Vista Instructional Leadership Team, conceptualized, developed, prepared materials, and facilitated the CWT process. The training included reviewing and deepening understanding of clarifying and probing questions, identifying steps based on patterns and trends developed by the site, work on the next focus question, and participation in a team building experiential learning experience.

<u>Funding:</u> Cost not to exceed \$1,500.00 to be paid from School and Library Improvement Program fund (#304) and Title II Teacher/Principal Staff Development grant fund (#217).

<u>Recommendation:</u> Approve/Ratify Consultant Agreement between Fullerton School District and the University of California, Los Angeles (ULCA) School Management Program for Ladera Vista Jr. High School for professional development conducted on September 25, 2009.

CONSULTANT AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and UCLA School Management Program 4223 MATH SCIENCE BUILDING, LOS ANGELES, CA. 90095-7168 310-825-2488, hereinafter referred to as "CONSULTANT."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONSULTANT is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Services to be provided by CONSULTANT:
 - UCLA will, in collaboration with the LV instructional leadership team, conceptualize, develop, prepare materials, and facilitate a four-hour whole staff training as a follow up for next steps as part of the CWT process.

Services shall be provided by UCLA School Management Program

Term. CONSULTANT shall provide services under this AGREEMENT on September 25,
 2009 only.

3. Compensation. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONSULTANT for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed **Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00)**. This amount includes the following:

• Four-hour whole staff training

CONSULTANT shall submit a detailed invoice to the DISTRICT. DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days of DISTRICT's approval of the invoice.

4. Expenses. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONSULTANT for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONSULTANT in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: **N**/**A**

5. Independent Contractor. CONSULTANT, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONSULTANT understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONSULTANT assumes the full responsibility for his/her own acts and/or omissions and the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONSULTANT shall assume full responsibility for

payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONSULTANT and/or CONSULTANT's employees.

6. Materials. CONSULTANT shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows: **N/A.** CONSULTANT's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

7. Originality of Services. CONSULTANT agrees that all materials, technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONSULTANT and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONSULTANT by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.

8. Termination. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONSULTANT only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONSULTANT. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONSULTANT or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

9. Hold Harmless. CONSULTANT agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its Governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONSULTANT, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONSULTANT, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT.

10. Insurance. Pursuant to Section 10, CONSULTANT agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance to protect CONSULTANT and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability that may arise out of this AGREEMENT. Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory.

11. Assignment. The obligations of the CONSULTANT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONSULTANT.

12. Compliance With Applicable Laws. The services to be provided herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONSULTANT agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONSULTANT, CONSULTANT's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such services.

13. Permits/Licenses. CONSULTANT and all CONSULTANT's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

14. Employment With Another Public Agency. CONSULTANT, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONSULTANT will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

15. Entire Agreement/Amendment. This AGREEMENT and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the AGREEMENT.

16. Nondiscrimination. CONSULTANT agrees that he/she will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, or age of such persons.

17. Non-Waiver. The failure of DISTRICT or CONSULTANT to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

18. Notice. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. Press releases were sent to the Los Angeles Times, Orange County Register, Korean Times, Korean Central Daily News and the Fullerton Observer.

<u>Rationale:</u> Districts must comply with the above Education Code, California Code of Regulations, and Williams Case requirements within the eighth week of school.

WHEREAS, Education code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of text books and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose, and;

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119 and 60422(b), the Board is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the District, and bargaining unit leaders, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to provide 10 days notice of the public hearings, and;

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district, and;

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teacher and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the District and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board of those subjects, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on October 13, 2009, which is on or before the eighth week of school and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the District has, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frame work adopted by the State Board:

- (i) Mathematics,
- (ii) Science,
- (iii) History-social science,
- (iv) English / language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program and Intensive Intervention,
- (v) Visual & Performing Arts.

For students in K-8, the instructional materials were purchased from an approved standards-aligned state adoption list as required by *CCR*, *Title 5*, *Section 9531*.

WHEREAS, between the 2008-09 through the 2012-12 fiscal years, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" also means that all students who are enrolled in the same course

within the Fullerton School District / Orange County Department of Education, have standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials from the same adoption cycle.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Board makes the determination that each pupil of the District, has available sufficient textbooks and instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the California State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2009/2010 school year, the Fullerton School District, has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the California State Board for those subjects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2009/2010 school year, that the Governing Board of the Fullerton School District hereby certifies that as of this date, each pupil in the District in kindergarten through grade eight has been provided with a standards-aligned textbook or basic instructional materials purchased from the approved standards-aligned adoption list in the areas of history/social science, mathematics, reading/language arts, science, and to each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course.

- <u>Background:</u> California School Employees Association (CSEA) Chapter #130 and the Fullerton School District were not able to finalize contract negotiations for 2007/2008. The District and CSEA were unable to reach a settlement and agreed to enter Mediation/Fact Finding.

After two sessions of mediation, the attached mediated agreement was tentatively agreed upon by both parties. CSEA #130 ratified the attached mediation agreement and is now being presented to the Board for approval.

The AB 1200 Report is attached for review.

- Rationale: Government Code Section 3547.5 requires that negotiated agreements between an exclusive representative and public school employers, relating to matters within the scope of representation, be presented at a public meeting.
- Funding: Not applicable.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Approve settlement agreement between the Fullerton School District and California School Employees Association Chapter #130 relating to mediation settlement reached on September 11, 2009 and requires AB 1200 disclosures.

Mediated Tentative Agreement in the Matter of Fullerton School District and California School Employees Association Chapter 130 – Case Number LA-IM-3515-E

- 1. The term of the Agreement shall be July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2012.
- 2. The Agreement shall include previous tentative agreements on Article 4- Organizational Rights, Article 12- Leaves and Article 17-Safety.
- 3. For fiscal year 2009/2010 the classified salary schedule shall remain unchanged from the salary schedule that was in effect for fiscal year 2008/2009.
- 4. Negotiations for fiscal year 2009/2010 shall be concluded with the exception of negotiations over Article 8- Health Insurance. The parties shall commence negotiations on this article no later than October 15, 2009.
- 5. For fiscal year 2010/2011 and 2011/2012 the parties shall reopen on Article 6- Pay and Allowances; Article 8-Health Insurance plus one additional article per party.
- 6. For fiscal year 2009/2010 there shall be no additional layoffs of classified unit members, except as provided herein. "Layoffs" pursuant to this section means that no unit member shall receive notice pursuant to Education Code 45117, except as provided herein.
 - a. This provision is intended to mean that there will be no further reductions in classified positions as a result of the general assertion of "lack of work or lack of funding" for the 2009-2010 school year.
 - b. This provision applies only to a staffing reduction that takes place with an effective date within the 2009-2010 school year. This does not preclude the District from initiating the staffing reduction process for a subsequent year.
- 7. The parties recognize that during fiscal year 2008/2009 the classified bargaining unit did not receive, and therefore deferred, the 3% on-scale salary increase that the certificated teacher's unit received. To address this issue and promote parity in the salary settlement history, the parties agree as set forth below.
 - a. The parties agree that to provide parity in raises between bargaining units, the classified salary schedule shall at some point be increased by 3.0%, subject to the provisions of sub-paragraphs b., c., and d. below.
 - b. It is anticipated that at some future time, the district will once again be in a position to grant compensation increases. Prior to granting any future across the board salary increase for the certificated teacher's unit, the district agrees to grant a 3% salary increase to the classified salary schedule. The effective date of the implementation of the 3% increase shall be not later than July 1st of the fiscal year in which the district negotiates a salary increase for the certificated teacher's unit.
 - c. In the event that the certificated teacher's unit agrees in fiscal years 2009/2010 or 2010/11 to roll-back all or a portion of the 3% salary increase received for fiscal year 2008/2009, the amount the district is required to place on scale for the classified unit as described in section 7.a. above shall be reduced by a percentage amount equal to that by which the certificated teacher's unit salary schedule is reduced.
 - d. For the duration of this agreement, any increase implemented pursuant to section 7 above shall be in addition to a "me too" agreement granting the classified unit the same overall across the board percentage salary increase as the certificated teacher's unit for that year.
- 8. The terms and conditions of this Agreement represent a settlement with respect to all issues relevant to the parties' successor Agreement negotiations.
