The 07/08 contract cost to the Fullerton School District is \$71,746 an increase of \$2,759 or 4.0 percent over the 06/07 cost. This cost was included in the 07/08 Adopted Budget.
Rationale:	Sungard Bi-Tech is the financial system used by the Fullerton School District. OCDE is the service provider and software support provider. The proposed contract defines the terms of service, software support, charges, and any additional requirements of either party.

SUNGARD BI-TECH SYSTEM SUPPORT IMPLEMENTATION AND SOFTWARE SUPPORT SERVICE AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby made and entered into this 1st day of July, 2007, by and between the Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa, California 92628, hereinafter referred to as SUPERINTENDENT, and the Fullerton School District, 1401 West Valencia Drive, Fullerton, California 92833, hereinafter referred to as DISTRICT. SUPERINTENDENT and DISTRICT shall be collectively referred to as the Parties.

9NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto mutually agree as follows:101.0BASIS OF AGREEMENT

11 The SUPERINTENDENT will provide professional services for the 12 operation of the SunGard Bi-Tech System, including on-going training 13 services for present and future employees, future SunGard Bi-Tech 14 software enhancements and support services. Services will include 15 Basic Financial/Budget, School Site Finance, Stores Inventory and 16 Fixed Asset systems.

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#### 2.0 <u>NETWORK INFRASTRUCTURE</u>

The network standard protocol is TCP/IP. Each DISTRICT site that uses 18 the SunGard Bi-Tech System must have a Local Area Network connected 19 via the DISTRICT office. DISTRICT will, at DISTRICT's expense, 20connect to SUPERINTENDENT's County-wide computer network via high 21 speed data circuit and data communication devices for the services set 22 forth in this AGREEMENT. DISTRICT costs associated with connectivity **2**3 will be invoiced separately according to the terms of the DISTRICT's 24 Intranet Network Support Service Agreement with SUPERINTENDENT. 25 Computer processing will be performed on UNIX type computers at 26 SUPERINTENDENT'S offices. DISTRICT will access SunGard Bi-Tech 27 software from DISTRICT microcomputers through the DISTRICT's Local

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Area Network and from similar microcomputers located at each of the DISTRICT's school sites.

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#### 3.0 <u>ANNUAL SOFTWARE SUPPORT SERVICES</u>

A. SUPERINTENDENT agrees to provide DISTRICT access to and application of SunGard Bi-Tech System services via a leased high speed data circuit to the SUPERINTENDENT'S UNIX based computers located at 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa. DISTRICT will be responsible for the recurring cost of the leased high speed data circuit. DISTRICT shall have the ability to use the following services (in Standard Mode):

Basic Financial/Budget

School Site Finance

Stores Inventory

Fixed Assets

14 B. The DISTRICT shall be entitled to ongoing software support and assistance during normal business hours, provided however, that 15 16 the availability or performance of this software support service shall 17 not be construed as altering or affecting SUPERINTENDENT's obligations as set forth in this AGREEMENT. SUPERINTENDENT's technical support 18 via telephone shall be provided to DISTRICT without charge Monday 19 through Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., excluding SUPERINTENDENT's 20 holidays. 21

22 C. SUPERINTENDENT may, upon mutual agreement of the parties, 23 provide other services which may include but not be limited to: 24 special reporting and other software assistance. The DISTRICT shall 25 pay SUPERINTENDENT for such additional services at a rate mutually 26 agreed between the parties.

**27** 4.0 <u>TERM</u>

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The term of the annual software support services portion of this

AGREEMENT shall be for one (1) year commencing July 1, 2007 and ending June 30, 2008. This AGREEMENT shall automatically be renewed annually, unless DISTRICT gives written notice to SUPERINTENDENT six (6) months prior to the end of each one (1) year renewal period. In no event shall this AGREEMENT exceed a five (5) year period, and shall terminate by its own terms on June 30, 2012.

> The Fiscal Services Department is requesting that obsolete items, which have been collected from District sites, be declared as surplus property and "not suitable for school purposes". These surplus items were collected from all sites at the direction of site managers. All items have been made available to District employees to claim for school use prior to holding a public auction. The remaining items are designated as "not suitable for school purposes" and offered for sale. For those items that do not sell, the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services requests Board authorization to declare the property is of insufficient value to defray the costs of arranging for another sale, and to dispose of said property by other means as allowed by Education Codes 17545 and 17546.

<u>Rationale:</u> The surplus holding areas are nearing capacity and need to be cleaned out after Summer pick up throughout the Fullerton School District.

Funding: Not applicable.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Declare listed items as surplus not suitable for school purposes and authorize District staff to dispose of items at a public auction or by other means as allowed in Education Codes 17545 and 17546.

SUBJECT: APPROVE 2007-2008 MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE ORANGE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND PROCEDURES

- Background: The Orange County Department of Education within this Memorandum of Understanding outlines the parameters within which the school districts in the County may utilize the County special education programs and services to individuals with exceptional needs requiring intensive educational services, such as profoundly delayed students, behaviorally challenged students and hard of hearing students. The County provides programs to school districts, when the District does not have an appropriate placement for the child. This agreement is effective for the period beginning July 1, 2007 and ending June 30, 2008. Program placements are jointly approved by the school district and the Orange County Department of Education. An explanation of the funding for placement and services is within the context of this MOU as well as scope of the program. Transportation of students is addressed in the context of the MOU. OCDE has also included a copy of their budget as well as their unaudited actuals for the 2006-2007 school year. In addition, the Excess Cost actual credit/refund is included in the document. (Attached is a copy of the Memorandum of Understanding With The Orange County Department of Education for Special Education Programs and Procedures)
- Rationale: School district on occasion do not have programs to serve students who require intensive educational services. Programs for the profoundly delayed or profoundly behaviorally challenged students may be recommended for placement in a County program. A number of years ago, a regional program for the hearing impaired was terminated as a regional program based upon the district not desiring to be the regional program. Due to this, OCDE took over the oral program for hearing impaired students at the elementary and Jr. High school level.
- <u>Funding:</u> Funding for this program is provided through an Excess Cost determined by OCDE billed to districts monthly.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Approve 2007-2008 Memorandum of Understanding with the Orange County Department of Education for Special Education Programs and Procedures.

The Orange County Superintendent of Schools, which operates the Division of Special Education Services within the Orange County Department of Education, hereinafter referred to as "OCDE" and the "Fullerton Elementary School District," herein referred to as "District," and collectively referred to herein as the "Parties," mutually agree as follows (Agreement):

#### 1. Basis of Agreement

Pursuant to the authority established in Education Code Sections 56195, 56195.1, 56195.3 and 56195.5, OCDE may provide for the education of individual pupils in special education programs who reside in other districts or counties. OCDE's Division of Special Education Services operates OCDE's Special Schools Program to provide special education programs and services to individuals with exceptional needs requiring intensive educational services, including a regional deaf and hard of hearing program.

## 2. <u>Term of Agreement</u>

This Agreement is effective for the period beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008.

#### 3. Acknowledgment of Special Education Funding Formula

It is acknowledged that, in accordance with Part 30 of the Education Code, Chapter 7.2, Section 56836 et seq., the California State funding formula for special education programs, services and administration generates an entitlement based on the average daily attendance of pupils in the local education agencies that comprise a Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA). It is further acknowledged that the SELPA base year calculations for special education funding under Assembly Bill 602 (AB 602) include a dollar amount that is transferred back to the SELPA of residence for pupils served in special education programs prior to implementation of AB 602. The Parties acknowledge that both the distribution of these special education funds and the District's fiscal responsibility for students served outside the SELPA of residence are determined by the Local Plan of the SELPA of residence.

#### 4. <u>Scope</u>

OCDE shall conduct special education programs and services for those eligible pupils of the District referred by their Individualized Education Program (IEP) Teams when it is jointly determined by the District and OCDE that the pupil's educational needs as specified in the pupil's IEP can be appropriately met by the programs and services operated by OCDE. The District and OCDE acknowledge that the District, as the pupil's district of residence, maintains primary responsibility as the local education agency (LEA) to ensure the pupil receives a free appropriate public education. OCDE shall maintain and provide special education programs for District pupils during the 2007-08 school year within the administrative parameters established by the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee. Class size ranges and student-adult ratios shall be maintained in a manner which allows OCDE to meet the programmatic, health and safety needs of the pupils.

#### 5. <u>Annual and Triennial Reviews</u>

The District shall be notified of annual reviews scheduled for its pupils participating in an OCDE Special Schools Program and may provide a representative who will participate in the development of the annual IEP. For initial placement, triennial review, recommendation for home instruction, or a change in eligibility or services specified on the current IEP, a District representative who is authorized to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified District resources necessary for the implementation of the pupil's IEP shall attend the IEP team meeting. For pupils enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program who are participating in a general education program on the school site in the school district where the Special Schools Program is located ("Host District") OCDE will work with the Host District to provide a general education teacher at IEP team meetings. In the event the Host District is unable to provide a general education teacher for the IEP team meeting, the District agrees to provide a general education teacher unless otherwise waived in writing by the pupil's parent in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and State law. For all other pupils enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program, the District agrees to provide a general education teacher at IEP team meetings unless otherwise waived in writing by pupil's parent in accordance with the IDEA and State law. Progress reports relating to goals and objectives in a pupil's IEP shall be sent by OCDE to parents per the pupil's IEP schedule for progress reporting and to the Director of Special Education of the District upon request. When requested by District or parent, an updated report shall be provided if there is no current progress report whenever a pupil is scheduled for an IEP review or when pupil's enrollment in OCDE is terminated.

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### 6. Integration/Mainstreaming Opportunities

The Host District where OCDE Special Schools Programs operate often provide opportunities for pupils enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program to integrate with non-disabled typical peers during the school day. These opportunities are typically in non-core curriculum areas such as physical education, art, music, assemblies, recess and lunch. Some pupils enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program will participate in core curriculum activities for a portion of the school day in a program operated by the Host District, however, such pupils are supervised by OCDE staff at all times during such activities. In the event a pupil enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program is participating in core curriculum activities in a program operated by the Host District for more than 50% of the school day, the Host District will be reimbursed for any costs incurred resulting from such pupil's participation, upon OCDE's receipt of appropriate documentation of such costs.

# 7. Assessments/Independent Educational Evaluations

OCDE and District shall coordinate and collaborate in conducting assessments for pupils participating in an OCDE Special Schools Program. In the event OCDE staff is not available to conduct a requested assessment, OCDE shall notify the District and/or District's SELPA to assist in conducting such assessment(s).

In the event a request is made for an independent educational evaluation (IEE), OCDE shall immediately forward such request to the District and the District shall determine how to respond to the request for an IEE. OCDE and/or the District may also schedule an IEP team meeting to further discuss the requested IEE.

# 8. Pupil Count

A count shall be taken of the number of pupils enrolled in OCDE's Special Schools Program as of the first day of each calendar month, July 1, 2007 through June 1, 2008. A pupil shall be counted as "enrolled" in an OCDE Special Schools Program on the first day of attendance in the program or fourteen (14) days after the IEP team has met and an approved IEP has been executed for the pupil's educational placement in an OCDE Special Schools Program, whichever occurs sooner. Pupils continuing in an OCDE Special Schools Program from the previous school year shall be counted as "enrolled" on the first school day in September unless written notification of withdrawal is received from either the parent or district of residence. If a continuing pupil has not attended school by the eleventh (11<sup>th</sup>) day of the first school month, OCDE shall notify the district of residence and a determination shall be made regarding continuing enrollment. In the event either OCDE or District are informed that a pupil has been withdrawn by the parent from an OCDE Special Schools Program, each agency shall immediately notify the other of such withdrawal. Any pupil withdrawn by the parent from an OCDE Special Schools Program is no longer counted as "enrolled" or considered a continuing pupil for the following school year.

# 9. Definitions

a. "Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee" shall be a committee comprised of the Orange County Special Education Local Plan Area Directors, Chief Business Officials representing each SELPA and OCDE representatives including the Chief of Special Education Services Division, Director of Special Schools and Programs, Business Administrator, and the Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, or designee.

b. "Regional Special Education Programs" are the special education classes and support services operated by OCDE for severely disabled and medically fragile pupils, pupils with low incidence disabilities, pupils with autism spectrum disorders, pupils with emotional disturbances and other eligible pupils.

c. "Regional Deaf/Hard of Hearing (D/HH) Program" shall include classes and services operated by OCDE for Deaf and Hard of Hearing pupils who are learning through total communication, utilizing sign language, note-takers, oral speech and residual hearing.

d. "Regional Oral Deaf Program" shall include classes and services operated by OCDE for Deaf and Hard of Hearing pupils who are learning through oral and written communication using oral speech, speech reading, residual hearing, auditory devices and cochlear implants.

e. "Special Education Program Income" shall be defined as the sum of all State and Federal funds generated by or on behalf of pupils transferred to regional programs operated by OCDE Special School Programs under this Agreement. For the purposes of this Agreement:

f. "Special Education Program Expenditures" shall include Direct Costs, Direct Support Costs and Indirect Cost of Special Schools Programs.

g. "Average Cost Per Pupil" shall refer to the Special Education Program Expenditures attributable to the program divided by the average number of pupils enrolled during the year.

h. "Average Number of Pupils" shall refer to the total of the number of pupils counted on the first school day of each calendar month divided by the number of calendar months in the period specified.

# 10. Funding

In consideration of the enrollment of pupils in special education programs conducted by OCDE, the SELPA and/or the school district transferring pupils to the regional programs operated by OCDE agree to pay the average cost per pupil based on expenditure categories and ratios reviewed by the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee and shall provide for program funding as follows:

a. The District shall be responsible for the Average Cost per Pupil in an OCDE Special Schools Program, including the Regional Deaf/Hard of Hearing Program, multiplied by the average number of pupils enrolled, minus Special Education Program income received by OCDE for the purpose of educating said pupils including, but not limited to Revenue Limit, AB 602 funds, and Federal I.D.E.A. Local Assistance Grant funds. The District shall be responsible for the Average Cost Per Pupil in the Regional Oral Deaf Program multiplied by the average number of pupils enrolled, minus Special Education Program income received by OCDE for the purpose of educating said pupils including, but not limited to Revenue Limit, AB 602 funds, and Federal I.D.E.A. Local Assistance Grant funds.

b. Special Circumstance Paraeducators – The District, as specified in its' SELPA's Local Plan, shall be responsible for the full cost of additional personnel required for the benefit of and specified in the IEP for individual pupils who are residents of the District.

c. The following documents shall be used as a basis for all figures reported:

- (1) Various Program Cost Reports
- (2) State Form 01
- (3) In-House Accounting Reports

d. OCDE Special Schools Program income and expenditures shall be listed in accordance with The California School Accounting Manual Standardized Account Code Structure for Special Education as of April 19, 1999, with a summary page as shown in Appendix A, incorporated herein.

e. Indirect cost for Special Education Programs operated by OCDE shall be at the State approved rate not to exceed 7.5% of total Program expenditures.

f. OCDE shall bill the District on a monthly basis and forward invoices to the District's accounting department.

# 11. Related Services/Designated Instructional Services (DIS)

OCDE provides the following related services as part of its special education programs: Language, Speech and Hearing, Audiology, Sign Language Interpreter, Adapted Physical Education, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Health and Nursing, Specialized Physical Health Care, Vocational Counseling, Adult Transition, Assistive Technology, Vision Training, Orientation and Mobility, Behavior Management/Intervention and Psychological Counseling. Any other related services necessary for the pupil to benefit from the special education program shall be provided by the District or as otherwise agreed to by OCDE and the District, including translator services at IEP meetings and/or translation of documents. In addition, OCDE shall separately bill the District for the services provided by a 1:1 paraeducator as required by the pupil's IEP.

# 12. Home Instruction

In the event a District pupil enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program requires instruction in the home or hospital as a result of a medical condition such as those related to surgery, accidents, shortterm illness or medical treatment for a chronic illness, OCDE shall refer the pupil to the District in accordance with the District's policy and procedure for home or hospital instruction.

When a pupil is absent from school for more than five (5) consecutive school days as a result of a medical condition and is expected to have an extended health related absence, the pupil's IEP team shall

review the IEP and determine appropriate educational services. A District representative who is authorized to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified District resources necessary for the implementation of the pupil's IEP shall attend the IEP team meeting when considering a placement for home or hospital instruction. When recommending placement for home or hospital instruction, the IEP team shall consider documentation from the pupil's treating physician indicating the pupil's condition, verifying that the condition prevents the pupil from attending school and providing a projected date for the pupil's return to school. Any in-home or hospital instruction, including other related services, shall be provided by the District or as otherwise agreed to by OCDE and the District. In the event OCDE and the District agree that OCDE will provide such in-home or hospital instruction to the pupil, OCDE shall separately bill the District for such services.

# 13. <u>Transportation</u>

### a. <u>Transportation by the Orange County Department of Education</u>

The District shall provide transportation for its pupils participating in an OCDE Special Schools Program unless otherwise agreed between the District and OCDE. In the event OCDE agrees to transport a pupil, the District shall be responsible for the difference between the Direct and Direct Support Cost of home-to-school transportation as shown on the annual State Transportation Report plus one percent (1%) indirect support costs and the State transportation allocation received by the OCDE on a per pupil basis pursuant to Appendix B, incorporated herein. The District shall pay for the full cost of one-on-one transportation assistants as specified in the pupil's IEP. In the event OCDE is transporting five (5) or more District pupils from one Special Schools Program site, the District shall provide OCDE written notice on or before December 1 of each year of any proposed changes in the number of students requiring OCDE transportation. Similarly, OCDE shall provide the District written notice on or before December 1 of each year of any proposed changes in OCDE's transportation services, not including cost projections.

# b. Transportation by District

Districts transporting pupils to an OCDE Special Schools Program shall ensure that buses arrive at the school site with sufficient time to unload students prior to the beginning of the instructional day and to load them at the end of the instructional day. Delays requiring either overtime supervision or causing portions of the instructional program to be missed and subsequently made up may result in charges to the District for additional costs incurred by OCDE related to such delays.

# 14. Due Process and Complaints

OCDE and District agree to collaborate and fully cooperate in any due process proceeding involving a pupil currently attending or formerly enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program, including resolution sessions, mediations and hearings, as well as producing documents regarding the pupil.

In the event OCDE is named as the sole LEA in a due process complaint, OCDE and District agree that District, as the pupil's school district of residence, is a necessary party to the due process proceedings.

OCDE and District shall also fully participate in the investigation and provision of documentation related to any complaint filed with the State of California, the Office for Civil Rights, or any other State and/or federal governmental body or agency.

# 15. Estimated Billing

The estimated billing for 2007-08 will be based on actual information for 2006-07 plus COLA as set forth in the most current State Budget plus any budgeting projections for step and column, and salary and benefit increases.

# 16. Final Accounting

An accounting accompanied by completed Appendices A and B with appropriate supporting documentation shall be sent to each District by September 15 of the following year. In addition, OCDE shall provide a quarterly expenditure report to the District's Director of Special Education. Corrections to prior year OCDE Special Schools Program costs resulting from adjustments to income or expenditure calculations shall be credited or billed to the District affected by the correction or adjustments.

# 17. Projected Enrollment/Facilities and Staffing Needs

In order to assist OCDE in planning for both facilities and staffing needs for its programs, each District shall submit to OCDE, in writing, on or before December 1 of each year, the projected number of pupils expected to be transferred to OCDE programs for special education and support services in the following school year. Absent a projection, the number of District pupils reported in the current year December 1 Federal Pupil Count shall be used for facilities, staffing and budget planning by OCDE for the following school year. In the event the District intends to withdraw five (5) or more pupils from a specific OCDE Special Schools Program or enroll five (5) or more pupils in a specific OCDE Special Schools Program for the following school year, the District shall notify OCDE in writing of such intention on or before December 1 of each year. OCDE shall forward such written notice to the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee for its review and consideration. Absent appropriate notice from the District of any proposed change in enrollment in an OCDE Special Schools Program for the following school year, the District may be solely responsible for funding the costs related to such change in enrollment.

If the District is a Host District for any OCDE Special Schools Program, the District shall submit to OCDE, in writing, on or before December 1 of each year, notice of any proposed facilities projects, including but not limited to modernization or new construction projects at the school site where the OCDE Special Schools Program is located, as well as any potential impact such projects may have on the operation of an OCDE Special Schools Program, including opportunities for integration with typical peers at the Host District school site. In the event any such project would require relocation of an OCDE Special Schools Program, the District shall provide OCDE with at least one (1) year prior written notice to allow OCDE sufficient time to plan accordingly. OCDE shall forward such written notice to the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee for its review and consideration.

In the event OCDE intends to close a Special Schools Program in which District pupils are enrolled, OCDE shall notify the District in writing of such intention on or before December 1 of each year.

# 18. <u>Program Cost for 2007–08</u>

On or before fifteen (15) days after the release of the May revise each year, the Orange County Superintendent of Schools shall compute the projected Special Education Program Income and Special Education Program Expenditures for the following year with an Average Cost per Pupil for pupils enrolled in Special Schools Programs based on the Projected Enrollment data, and provide it to District Student Services and Business Directors.

# 19. Proposed OCDE Program for Emotionally Disturbed Students

In the 2007-08 school year, OCDE's Special Schools Program, in conjunction with OCDE's Division of Alternative, Community, and Correctional Education Schools and Services (ACCESS) intends to operate a special education program for eligible students identified with an emotional disturbance (OCDE ED Program). OCDE's ED Program will be designed to serve students residing within Orange County subject to a separate agreement between OCDE and the students' school district of residence.

# 20. Notices

All notices to be given pursuant to this Agreement, by either party to the other, shall be in writing and (a) delivered in person; (b) deposited in the United States Mail duly certified or registered, return receipt requested with postage prepaid; or (c) sent by Federal Express or other similar overnight delivery service. Notice is deemed to have be duly given and received upon (a) personal delivery; (b) as of the third business day after deposit in the Unities States Mail; or (c) the immediately succeeding business day after deposit with an overnight delivery service. Notices hereunder shall be provided to the following addresses, and such addresses may be changed by providing written notice in accordance with this Section:

# 21. No Waiver

The failure of OCDE in any one or more instances to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms of this Agreement or to exercise any option herein conferred shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment to any extent of the right to assert or rely upon such terms or option on any future occasion.

# 22. Hold Harmless

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the acts or omissions of employees, agents and officers of the District, OCDE agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend the District and its governing board, officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising from or connected with OCDE's performance of services during the term of this Agreement. To the extent permitted by law, and except for the acts or omissions of employees, agents and officers of OCDE, the District agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend OCDE and its governing board, officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising from or connected with the District's performance of services during the term of this Agreement.

# 23. <u>Complete Agreement</u>

This Agreement is the complete Agreement of the Parties. Any amendments hereto shall be in writing and shall be dated and executed by both Parties.

# 24. Applicable Law

This Agreement is governed by California state and federal law, and shall be interpreted as if jointly drafted by the Parties to this Agreement.

# 25. Counterparts

This Agreement may be signed in counterparts. A copy or original of this document with all signature pages appended together shall be deemed a fully executed Agreement. Facsimile signatures shall be deemed as binding as original signatures.

SUBJECT: RATIFY/APPROVE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT BETWEEN ELLEN FISHER AND THE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE 2007-2008 SCHOOL YEAR

Background: Ms. Ellen Fisher, retired Coordinator of the Child Welfare and Attendance Office, was contracted in August 2005 to research resources and develop a K-6 online health curriculum, and to research and develop a School Wellness Policy for the Fullerton School District. In July 2006, Ms. Fisher reformatted the online health curriculum for grades four through six, and confirmed and monitored the validity of the websites she had selected for inclusion in this curriculum. She also developed the K-3 online health curriculum, modeling it after the grades 4-6 curriculum with adjustments for appropriateness for the primary grade levels. In addition, Ellen Fisher researched and reviewed Board Policies related to Health and Wellness to assist FSD in updating existing policies.

After meeting with the pilot teachers of the grades 4-6 online health curriculum in the spring of 2007, it was evident that regular monitoring and reviewing of the websites is necessary to identify those that may have become inactive, as well as to replace those which are no longer available. For the 2007-2008 school year, Ms. Fisher will work on the development of generalized assessment tools for the health curriculum. She will closely monitor and support the K-3 teachers who will pilot the K-3 online curriculum this year.

- Rationale: Based on the many standards that K-6 teachers must address in the areas of English Language Arts, math, history and social science, and science, it became necessary to create an integrated health curriculum program. With technology highly emphasized in the District, an online health curriculum was developed by Ms. Fisher. Students can receive this online health curriculum in many ways such as a directed teacher lesson using a teacher's computer with LCD projector or individual student laptop computer for independent work.
- <u>Funding:</u> Cost not to exceed \$10,000.00 to be paid from School Based Coordinated Program (SBCP) budget #0130452211-5805 and Curriculum Development budget #0140155239-5805.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Ratify/Approve Independent Contractor Agreement between Ellen Fisher and the Fullerton School District for the 2007-2008 school year.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Services to be provided by Contractor:
- a. <u>Monitor progress of grade 4-6 online health curriculum; review and edit</u> websites as needed; develop both generalized and website specific <u>assessment items -</u>
- b. Participate in pilot program for grades K-3 online health curriculum, monitor progress of implementation of curriculum; review and edit websites as needed; develop both generalized and website specific assessment items -
- c. <u>Monitor progress toward goals of Local School Wellness Policy; gather</u> <u>data to be used in annual report on implementation of the policy; revise</u> <u>and edit policy as requested by District staff</u>

# d. <u>Meet with District and/or site staff to discuss progress of online health</u> <u>curriculum, edit, evaluate or promote its use as needed.</u>

2. <u>Term</u>. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on <u>September 11, 2007</u> and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by <u>June 30, 2008</u>.

3. <u>Compensation</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed \_\_\_\_\_\_

Ten thousand dollars(\$10,000)DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions:Reimbursement shall be at a rate not to exceed \$60 per hour, billedguarterly.

4. <u>Expenses</u>. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: <u>None</u>

5. Independent Contractor. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind of nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees.

7. <u>Originality of Services</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.

8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

9. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment

for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within <u>thirty (30)</u> days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the <u>thirty (30)</u> days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

- (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.
- (b) Any injury to or death of any persons, including the DISTRICT or its officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered

by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.

11. <u>Insurance</u>. Pursuant to Section 10, CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance with limits of one million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory."

12. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR.

13. <u>Compliance with Applicable Laws</u>. The service completed herein must meet approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in operations covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such operations.

14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

15. <u>Employment with Public Agency</u>. CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the

actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This AGREEMENT and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the AGREEMENT.

17. <u>Affirmative Action Employment</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such persons.

18. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. At the date of this AGREEMENT, the addresses of the parties are as follows:

20. <u>Severability</u>. If any term, condition or provision of this AGREEMENT is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.

Rationale:	PAR Joint Panel oversight is critical to monitor and guide support activities for teachers. The Panel stipend is paid according to the current contract.

<u>Background:</u>	Sue Neuen, Director of Professional Development for the California Science Center, invited the Fullerton School District to participate in an investigative science grant that was recently awarded to the California Science Center by the Dreyfus Foundation. This \$16,690.00 science grant funds the purchase of Lab- Aids chemistry kits, "Investigating Waste Water: Solutions and Pollution", a one day science kit training, and a 1-1/2 hour evaluation meeting for eighth grade science teachers. The Fullerton School District will be responsible for maintaining the science kit inventory and refurbishment for future years using these grant funds, and will identify three eighth grade science teachers to be teacher trainers for the implementation of the chemistry science kit.	
<u>Rationale:</u>	The extension of hands-on science investigations in junior high school is necessary to further develop student interest and skill in science concepts. The Arnold and Mabel Beckman Foundation Grant has been providing supplementary grant support for hands-on science inquiry for grades K-6. Support for the Fullerton School District's junior high school science program is consistently sought from year to year. Background:The Fullerton School District began its Laptops for Learning program at<br/>three schools during the 2004-05 school year. At that time, an important<br/>goal of the program was to provide an on-going evaluation of its impact<br/>on teaching and learning. Dr. Mark Warschauer from the Department of<br/>Education at UCI conducted the first year evaluation study. Dr. Loretta<br/>Donovan from the Department of Education at CSUF provided the<br/>second year evaluation. Both of these evaluation reports are posted on<br/>the Fullerton School District web site. This fourth year study will focus<br/>on how laptop use changes across the grade levels and what impact the<br/>program has had on the instructional process. Data will also be<br/>collected to investigate how one-to-one computing has impacted<br/>student attendance, test scores and discipline. The focus of the study<br/>will be on the six schools in which the laptops go home with the<br/>students each day.

This evaluation will be done in three phases. The first phase involves interviewing selected students in focus group meetings twice monthly during the school year. The second phase involves the research team making classroom observations at least monthly during the year, and the third phase involves an examination of data regarding test scores, attendance records, discipline logs and teacher created materials such as lesson plans and handouts. A preliminary report will be provided in January 2008, and a final report will be provided by July 2008. The evaluators will present their findings at a future Board meeting.

- Rationale:It is important to assess how the laptop program alters how instruction<br/>occurs in the classroom and whether a significant benefit is observed.<br/>Evaluation data can assist in improving how the laptop program is<br/>implemented and in determining changes that may be needed.
- <u>Funding:</u> The total cost for the fourth year evaluation study is \$4,500 from budget #0152657719-5805 (Superintendent, Consultants).

Recommendation: Approve Independent contractor agreement with Dr. Loretta Donovan and Dr. Timothy Green for evaluation of the Laptops for Learning program for the 2007-08 school year.

### INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the **Fullerton School District**, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT" and **Dr. Loretta Donovan and Dr. Timothy Green** hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal, or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services requires; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Services to be provided by Contractor:

Dr. Loretta Donovan and Dr. Timothy Green will provide an evaluation report for the District's Laptops for Learning Program.

- <u>Term</u>. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this agreement on November 1, 2007, and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by June 30, 2008.
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed

Four thousand Five hundred dollars (\$4, 500.00). DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions: Upon completion of services.

- <u>Expenses</u>. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: \_\_\_\_\_\_
- 5. Independent Contractor. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees, or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security, and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR'S

employees.

Materials. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies, and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows:
 DISTRICT will copy, distribute and collect student assent and parent consent forms for participation in this evaluation. CONTRACTOR'S

services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

- 7. Originality of Services. CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.
- 8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT'S express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all rights, title, and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR'S name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance, and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.
- 9. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the

CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:

(a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or

(b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or CONTRACTOR is adjudged as bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a received is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR'S insolvency.

Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within <u>------- (------)</u> days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the <u>------- (--</u> <u>-----)</u> days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner. Hold Harmless. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage, or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees, or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any persons, including the DISTRICT or its officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm, or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT'S property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees, or agents. (c) Any liability for damages, which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.

Press releases were sent to the Los Angeles Times, Orange County Register, Korean Times, Korean Central Daily News and the Fullerton Observer.

<u>Rationale:</u> Districts must comply with the above Education Code, California Code of Regulations, and Williams Case requirements within the eighth week of school.

WHEREAS, Education code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of text books and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose, and;

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119 and 60422(b), the Board is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the District, and bargaining unit leaders, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to provide 10 days notice of the public hearings, and;

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district, and;

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teacher and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the District and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board of those subjects, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on October 23, 2007, which is on or before the eighth week of school and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the District has, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frame work adopted by the State Board:

- (i) Mathematics,
- (ii) Science,
- (iii) History-social science,
- (iv) English / language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program.

For students in K-8, the instructional materials were purchased from an approved standards-aligned state adoption list as required by *CCR*, *Title 5*, *Section 9531*.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Board makes the determination that each pupil of the District, has available sufficient textbooks and instructional materials, or both, that are

aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the California State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2007-2008 school year, the Fullerton School District, has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the California State Board for those subjects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2007-2008 school year, that the Governing Board of the Fullerton School District hereby certifies that as of this date, each pupil in the District in kindergarten through grade eight has been provided with a standards-aligned textbook or basic instructional materials purchased from the approved standards-aligned adoption list in the areas of history/social science, mathematics, reading/language arts, science, and to each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course.
