Orange County Ocean Institute (OI) Overnight Programs:

<u>Chaparral</u>: Prior to attending the camp, Commonwealth and Fisler School's sixth grade students will be involved in a number of science activities, which include the scientific process in the study of nature and the five Southern California ecosystems. These studies will be integrated in Social Science and Language Arts.

Seventy students from Commonwealth School and sixty-seven students from Fisler School will participate in the three-day programs. Participating teachers from Commonwealth School are Nancy Garceau and Lorraine Paredes. Participating teachers from Fisler School are Kyle Stava and Linda Beecher. The cost is \$215.00-\$225.00 per student.

- Background: The Fullerton School District has a new opportunity to join ScienceWorks Consortium (a collaboration of the Huntington Beach City School District, Fountain Valley School District and the Westminster School District) to enhance and strengthen science instruction. The Consortium will provide opportunities for the Fullerton School District to collaborate with these three districts to access professional development, science resources and curriculum. In addition, assistance will be provided to refurbish the hands-on science materials kits for the implementation of science lessons.

A copy of the Agreement is on file in the Superintendent's office. This agreement was drafted and approved by Parker and Covert legal firm and risk management (ASCIP).

Funding:Funds are budgeted in Account #0109555109 (Beckman Science Grant Funds
and science donations). Costs are expected not to exceed \$75.00 per
classroom kit with some costs at \$150.00 per kit. Initially, a credit for the
science materials currently in stock will be applied to the total refurbishment
cost. Fullerton School District anticipates refurbishment of 968 kits for all K-6
classrooms in trimesters 2 and 3. The total will not exceed \$82,000 less the
inventory value for the 2004-05 school year.

Background:	The District began its Modernization and Local Bond projects with approximately \$61 million. Since the projects began \$58 million of the original amount has either been expended or committed, leaving an available balance of approximately \$3 million. The additional funding available from Measure CC will provide approximately \$5 million in construction dollars after allowing for estimated inflation due to increases in construction costs, bringing the total available amount to approximately \$8 million for construction.
	District staff has identified projects (see Exhibit A) that will fulfill the Board's direction that Bond funding be expended on projects focusing on student health and safety, and site equity, and recommends that the Board approve these projects. These projects total an estimated \$7.57 million, leaving \$430,000 unexpended for potential contingencies. The Board will continue to be updated regarding the status of these projects and potential impact of construction inflation on project completion. Staff has also researched the use of Multi-prime contracting for the completion of the projects currently underway and plans to use this method of construction management rather than using the practice of awarding the projects to General Contractors.

APPROVE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS AND RELEASE OF SERIES B FUNDING FROM BOND MEASURE CC EXHIBIT "A" October 26, 2004

1. Security Systems - \$700,000

Under the category of Health and Safety, security systems provide a means of protecting District facilities, classroom contents, student records, etc. They also provide a means for preventing fire damage since any intrusions are monitored by a central security service that will notify District personnel and city police.

There are currently monitored alarm systems at Beechwood, Fisler, Richman, Valencia Park and Woodcrest. New alarm systems will be installed at Acacia, Commonwealth, Fern Drive, Golden Hill, Hermosa Drive, Laguna Road, Orangethorpe, Pacific Drive, Raymond, Rolling Hills, Sunset Lane, Ladera Vista, Nicolas and Parks.

*note: Maple will also be receiving a monitored alarm system, but it will be funded from Proposition 47 funds.

2. Fill-in Media Center Pits - \$140,000

Under the category of Health and Safety, there are seven schools that currently have Media Center buildings. These schools are Beechwood, Laguna Road, Pacific Drive, Richman, Rolling Hills, Sunset Lane and Woodcrest. The original design of the buildings included a "pit" area for performances. Due to several injuries sustained in recent years due to falls, the District's liability insurance carrier and Attorney have recommended that these "pit" areas be filled to provide a flat surface throughout the Media Center buildings. This will be accomplished by filling the areas with concrete and covering with new carpet. The "pit" area at Beechwood School was previously raised using wood framing. It will be changed to a concrete fill to match the other six Media Centers.

3. Exterior Lighting - \$180,000

Under the category of Health and Safety, six schools have requested additional lighting in parking areas. These schools are Acacia, Hermosa Drive, Maple, Orangethorpe, Woodcrest and Ladera Vista. The above amount includes lighting for parking areas only.

4. Site Fencing - \$30,000

Under the category of Health and Safety, three schools have requested security fencing at campus perimeters to help prevent further damage and theft due to increasing vandalism. These schools are Fern Drive, Orangethorpe and Nicolas.

5. Upgrade Existing Multi-purpose Rooms - \$5.5 million

The seven new Multi-purpose buildings and one gymnasium will be air conditioned and equipped with performance platforms. Ten of the existing multi-purpose rooms, which were constructed over 40 years ago, will be significantly less equitable than those at the other sites. Under the category of Equity, the ten Multi-purpose rooms will be retrofit with air conditioning, new flooring, upgraded ceilings, interior paint, performance platforms and new in-wall tables and benches. The schools involved are Acacia, Commonwealth, Fern Drive, Golden Hill, Hermosa Drive, Ladera Vista, Nicolas, Orangethorpe, Raymond and Valencia Park. Also included in this project is removal of classrooms that were built in the stage areas at Commonwealth and Raymond. Roof replacement on these buildings is also necessary to complete the Health and Safety component.

6. Upgrade Offices at Four Schools - \$600,000

Beechwood School will be converting to a K-8 facility, Orangethorpe and Richman schools each house over 900 students. The current office areas are too small to provide adequate service for these student populations. Commonwealth School has also requested that the office areas be re-configured. To accomplish this, several modifications will be made to existing offices, some classroom and/or storage space will be converted, or use of modular office space will be incorporated. At Richman and Beechwood, the former "pit" areas could be modified to provide additional office support space.

7. Kindergarten Restroom Upgrades - \$420,000

Under the category of Equity Upgrades, primary and upper grade restrooms were remodeled and upgraded during the 2004 projects. Kindergarten restrooms were not included at 12 sites because of budget limitations. The sites involved are Acacia, Beechwood, Commonwealth, Fern Drive, Golden Hill, Hermosa Drive, Orangethorpe, Pacific Drive, Raymond, Richman, Valencia Park and Woodcrest. Remodeling of Kindergarten restrooms will provide upgraded facilities for all grade levels at all schools.
