### **Public Comments**

Lauralyn Eschner, on behalf of the All the Arts for All the Kids Foundation, presented the quilt that Louise Phelps Shamblen designed and produced to help raise funds for the Foundation. Mrs. Shamblen was inspired after seeing the notecards containing student artwork. There is a suggested donation of \$1.00 per ticket for an opportunity to receive this beautiful quilt during the *Give Your Hearts to the Arts* Luncheon in the spring. This quilt will be shared with community groups for the next several months. Ms. Eschner expressed her gratitude for this kind donation from Mrs. Shamblen. She also reported that the profit from the recent Pin Auction was approximately \$60,000. She mentioned that this is the same amount as last year's auction and is grateful to District personnel and local community and business leaders for their continued support of arts education for students within the Fullerton School District.

## Introductions/Recognitions

The International Art Exchange Program was recognized. Dr. Hovey introduced Mike Oates from the Sister City Association who gave a brief history and background for this program. The Sister City Association has been involved with the Fullerton School District for over ten years. October was Art Month in the State of California. Students from Yongin, Korea; Morelia, Mexico, and Fukui, Japan exchanged artwork with students from Acacia and Fern Drive Schools. Lauralyn Eschner and Dr. Stephen Tsai received certificates of recognition for coordinating this art exchange. Acacia School Principal Sue Faassen and Fern Drive School Principal Gaye Besler received certificates for their school sites, as well as certificates for students from their sites who participated in this program. Artwork will be on permanent display at the Muckenthaler Cultural Center. President Sugarman thanked Lauralyn Eschner, Dr. Tsai, Sue Faassen, Gaye Besler, and Mike Oates for working on this International Art Exchange Program.

### Superintendent's Report

He recognized Maple School for its recent Mind Institute grand opening program, mentioned that he enjoyed attending the recent National Elementary Honor Society recognition and thanked Maple School Principal Susan Mercado for her great work and dedication to Maple students.

Confirmation was received regarding Hermosa Drive School being honored as a California School Boards Association (CSBA) *Golden Bell Award* winner at the upcoming Golden Bell Luncheon during the CSBA Annual Education Conference in December. Janny Meyer's 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> grade GATE/1:1 classroom will be recognized for its Learn-Serve-Achieve Watershed and Smoking Ban project. On another note, three schools recently received notification that they are eligible to apply for CA Distinguished School – Fern Drive, Golden Hill, and Sunset Lane. Lastly, he reported that almost 300 students attended the first SSOAR (Saturday School Opportunity Attendance Recovery) Program, which offered students the opportunity to receive instruction for those who were out ill and for average daily attendance (ADA) to be recaptured by the District.

## Information from the Board of Trustees

Trustee Duncan reported that he had been busy with fundraising activities. He also visited the SPARKS PE training and enjoyed the Teacher of the Year event at the Disneyland Hotel. He mentioned that it was California Retired Teachers Week and complimented Maple School on its Mind Institute Program and appreciated the opportunity to visit this fascinating program.

Trustee Thornley reported that, since the Board last met, many celebrations have been held – Teacher of the Year recognizing Kim Bass as the Fullerton School District Teacher of the Year; Celebrate Hope at which Dr. Hovey received the *Spirit of Hope Award*; and All the Arts for All the Kids Foundation Pin Auction event where it was fascinating to see the support of the community that made for a wonderful evening. Congratulations were expressed to all.

Trustee Berryman also congratulated the All the Arts for All the Kids Foundation on a wonderful Pin Auction event. She also enjoyed the District Office Halloween celebration and appreciated the friendly staff dressing up and enjoying the daylong potluck event. Ms. Berryman was able to attend the Fullerton Joint Union High School District Superintendent's Advisory Committee Meeting and has been busy working with Trustee Duncan on the Arts Community Savings Card program.

Trustee Ballard attended the iPhone class taught by Ted Lai and plans to attend Kyle Stava's class on digital photography. She shared the recent edition of the Fullerton Observer in which Kristin Montoya's Foods Class from Ladera Vista Junior High School was featured on the front cover.

President Sugarman also commented on the SPARKS PE program and the community partnership with St. Jude Medical Center. ### CSEA – no report

FETA representative Karla Turner provided a copy of *California Educator* and alerted Board members to the information contained within this publication with regards to a *Race to the Top* (the new name for No Child Left Behind). She expressed her concern about continued efforts to attach test scores to teacher evaluations and mentioned that the California Teachers Association asked that this new legislation be erased. She wanted individuals to remember that it is more than a test score that defines a student. It is a journey, not a race. In races, there are winners and losers and we cannot afford for any of our students to be losers.

PTA Council President Luz Howchin reminded everyone about her goal to begin and end PTA Council Meetings on time. Felt there was good information shared by Dr. Hovey and John Albert, Ladera Vista Junior High School Principal, at the recent October 27<sup>th</sup> PTA Council Meeting. This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and **Action Learning Systems, Inc., 135 S. Rosemead Blvd, Pasadena CA 91107 626-744-5344**, hereinafter referred to as CONSULTANT."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and WHEREAS, CONSULTANT is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Services to be provided by Consultant:

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT", and **Professional Tutors of America, Inc., 3350 East Birch Street, Suite 108, Brea, CA 92821, (714) 784-3459,** hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR".

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis; the No Child Left Behind Act, 20 U.S.C. Section 6316(e) outlines the requirements for supplemental educational services; Section 6316(e)(3) contains the following requirements:

- a. Requires District to develop, in consultation with parents (and the provider chosen by parents), a statement of specific achievement goals for the student, how the student's progress will be measured (pre and post assessment results), and a timetable for improving achievement, in the case of a student with disabilities, is consistent with the student's IEP.

- d. Requires provisions with respect to the making of payments to the provider by District;
- e. Prohibits the provider from disclosing to the public the identity of any student eligible for, or receiving, supplemental educational services without the written permission of the parent of such student.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Services to be provided by Contractor: Supplemental educational services pursuant to 20 U.S.C. Section 6316(e). Pursuant to application form submitted to the California Department of Education, supplemental services shall be provided by CONTRACTOR who will provide tutoring services to eligible students at the Sylvan Learning Center location at 1539 South Harbor Blvd., Fullerton, CA 92832.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on **November 18, 2009**, and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by June 4, 2010.
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed **Nine Hundred Thirty Seven Dollars** (\$937.00) as established by the California Department of Education (CDE) per qualifying student. DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions: CONTRACTOR will provide tutoring services at a rate of \$44.62 per hour for a maximum of 21 hours of tutoring. CONTRACTOR will invoice DISTRICT on a monthly basis. The final invoice must be received by DISTRICT from CONTRACTOR no later than June 11, 2010.
- 4. <u>Expenses</u>. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: **N/A**
- 5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind of nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees.

- 6. <u>Materials</u>. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows: **N/A**. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.
- 7. Originality of Services. CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.
- 8. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within **fifteen (15)** days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the **fifteen (15)** days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT

shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

- 9. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
  - (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.
  - (b) Any injury to or death of any persons, including the DISTRICT or its officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.
  - (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.
- 10. <u>Insurance</u>. Pursuant to Section 10, CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance with limits of one million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against

liability or claims of liability, which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory." No later than ten (10) days from execution of this AGREEMENT by the DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a ten (10) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policy.

- 11. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR.
- 12. <u>Compliance with Applicable Laws</u>. The service completed herein must meet approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in **services** covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such **services**.
- 13. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 14. <u>Employment with Public Agency</u>. CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 15. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This AGREEMENT and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the AGREEMENT.

- 16. <u>Affirmative Action Employment</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such persons.
- 17. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.
- 18. <u>Background Checks and Fingerprinting.</u> CONTRACTOR will provide DISTRICT with assurance of background checks and/or fingerprinting, or proof thereof, on CONTRACTOR'S employees who are working directly with children to provide supplemental services prior to rendering supplemental services in DISTRICT.
- 19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. At the date of this AGREEMENT, the addresses of the parties are as follows:

- 21. <u>Attorney Fees/Costs.</u> Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this AGREEMENT, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorneys' fees.
- 22. <u>Governing Law</u>. The terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California.

## INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE PARENT INSTITUE FOR QUALITY EDUCATION (PIQE)

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into this 17th day of November, 2009, by and between the Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa, California 92626, hereinafter referred to as SUPERINTENDENT, and the Fullerton School District, 1401 West Valencia Drive, Fullerton, California 92833, hereinafter referred to as DISTRICT. SUPERINTENDENT and DISTRICT shall be collectively referred to as the Parties.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1.0 <u>SCOPE OF WORK</u>. DISTRICT hereby engages SUPERINTENDENT as an independent contractor to perform the following described work and SUPERINTENDENT hereby agrees to perform said work upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth. Specifically, SUPERINTENDENT shall perform the following services:

- 1.1 Provide six (6) hours of custom technology training on "Dreamweaver" for twenty (20) designated faculty/staff at DISTRICT'S facility.
- 2.0 <u>TERM</u>. This AGREEMENT shall commence on December 3, 2009, and end on December 3, 2009, subject to termination as set forth in section 9.0 of this AGREEMENT.
- 3.0 <u>COMPENSATION</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the SUPERINTENDENT for services satisfactorily performed pursuant to Section 1.0 of this AGREEMENT a total sum not to exceed Seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), which shall be paid by California Technology Assistance Project (CTAP) Certificates issued by SUPERINTENDENT. Payment shall be mailed to: Orange County Superintendent of Schools, Attn: Accounting Manager, 200 Kalmus Drive, P.O. Box 9050, Costa Mesa, California 92628-9050, or at such other place as SUPERINTENDENT may designate in writing.
- 4.0 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. SUPERINTENDENT, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. SUPERINTENDENT understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. SUPERINTENDENT assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. SUPERINTENDENT shall

assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to SUPERINTENDENT'S employees.

#### 5.0 HOLD HARMLESS/INDEMNIFICATION.

A. SUPERINTENDENT hereby agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless DISTRICT, its Governing Board, officers, agents, and employees from liability and claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease, or death of any person or persons, or damage to any property, real personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents or officers of SUPINTENDENT or the Orange County Board of Education during the period of this AGREEMENT.

B. DISTRICT herby agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless SUPERINTENDENT, the Orange County Board of Education, and its officers, agents, and employees from liability and claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease, or death of any person or persons, or damage to any property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents or officers of DISTRICT during the period of this AGREEMENT.

- 6.0 <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. The obligations of the DISTRICT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the DISTRICT without prior written approval of SUPERINTENDENT.
- 7.0 <u>TOBACCO USE POLICY</u>. In the interest of public health, the SUPERINTENDENT provides a tobacco-free environment. Smoking or the

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use of any tobacco products are prohibited in buildings and vehicles, and on any property owned, leased or contracted for by the SUPERINTENDENT pursuant to SUPERINTENDENT Policy 400.15. Failure to abide with conditions of this policy could result in the termination of this AGREEMENT.

NON-DISCRIMINATION. SUPERINTENDENT and DISTRICT agree that 8.0 they will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such persons.

TERMINATION. Either party may terminate this AGREEMENT with or without reason with the giving of thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. DISTRICT shall compensate SUPERINTENDENT only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by SUEPRINTENDENT. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the SUPERINTENDENT or DISTRICT or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

NOTICE. All notices or demands to be given under this 10.0 AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage Service shall be considered given when received if prepaid. personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in

Rationale: In order to meet anticipated cash flow demands of the District, the District will

likely need to temporarily borrow sufficient funds to meet expenditure

obligations during the 2009/2010 fiscal year.
