NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

REGULAR BOARD MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES are held in the District Administration Building Board Room, unless otherwise noted, at 5:00 p.m. with closed session, 6:00 p.m. open session. Board meetings are scheduled once during the months of January, February, March, April, May, July, August, October, and November, and twice during the months of June, September, and December. The Regular Board agenda is posted a minimum of 72 hours prior to the meeting, and a Special Board meeting agenda is posted a minimum of 24 hours prior to the meeting.

AGENDA ITEMS – Per Board Bylaw 9322, a member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent's Office with supporting documents and information. The Board President and Superintendent shall decide whether a request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. Items not within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board may not be placed on the agenda. In addition, the Board President and/or Superintendent shall determine if the item is merely a request for information or whether the issue is covered by an existing policy or administrative regulation before placing the item on the agenda.

PUBLIC COMMENTS/PERSONS ADDRESSING THE BOARD – The Board meeting follows rules of decorum. Per Board Bylaw 9323, individual speakers shall be allowed three minutes to address the Board on each agenda or non-agenda item. The Board limits the total time for public input on each item to 20 minutes. The total time allowed for public comment shall be 30 minutes. Public comments about an item that is on the agenda will be heard at the time the agenda item is considered by the Board. Public comments about an item that is not on the posted agenda will be heard at the beginning of open session when called upon by the Board President. No action or discussion may take place on an item that is not on the posted agenda except as expressly authorized by law. Since the Board cannot take action on items that are not on the agenda, such items will be referred to the Superintendent for handling. Board Members may request that any item be placed on a future agenda for further discussion. The Board President and Superintendent will determine the best time to place an item on the agenda. Persons wishing to address the Board are invited to complete and submit a "request to speak" slip to the Executive Assistant. These slips are available at the reception counter.

Open Session, Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, Report from Closed Session – Board Room

The District agrees to pay Petitioners' attorney's fees and legal costs in the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) as full and final settlement of all outstanding claims for attorney's fees and legal costs relating to the Disputes and any and all claims by Petitioners against the District through the date of this Agreement.

Public Hearing

Trustee Thompson conducted a public hearing at 6:45 p.m. to allow for public comment to receive direct input from the public regarding proposed trustee-area maps.

Larry Ferchaw from the Dolinka Group shared information regarding the process and timelines for change in district method of election of Board of Trustees. He reported the upcoming two board meetings (November 17 and December 8, 2015) will hold public hearings to give an opportunity for the public to address the Board. The District will apply for a waiver to bypass putting the process to a public vote. At the December 8, 2015 Board Meeting, the Board will select the maps as well as decide which two areas will be up for election in November 2016. Three community input meetings will be held as follows: October 27 (Ladera Vista JHS, 6:00 p.m.), October 28 (Parks JHS, 6:00 p.m.), and October 29 (Nicolas JHS, 6:00 p.m.). An executive summary will be distributed to the Board after the community input meetings. Trustee areas are revisited every ten years with new census data.

Public comments during the public hearing:

Susan Wright, community member, commented that she and many other people do not know what are the responsibilities of a board member. Trustee Sugarman briefly shared some of the many responsibilities of a board member such as hiring the Superintendent and making decisions that are in the best interest of all students and the community. The Board's sentiment is that they represent all students fairly.

Jeanette Vasquez, teacher and community member, shared her concern that the community input meetings are very important and it is critical that community members know ahead of time of these meetings. Mrs. Vasquez recently found out the dates for the community input meetings.

Egleth Nuncci, parent and community member, commented her desire for people to give to others because it is the right thing to do. She encouraged principals to disseminate information to the community regarding the timeline for changes in at-large trustee areas and about the community input meetings.

Daniel Bravo, community member, commented it is important for translators to be available for parents that English is a second language.

Dr. Pletka commented that the law requires the District to abide by a timelines and the District has informed the community of such timeline and public input meetings through the Fullerton School District website and social media.

The public hearing was closed at 7:55 p.m. The Board recessed at 7:56 p.m. and resumed Open Session at 8:00 p.m.

It was then moved by Lynn Thornley, seconded by Janny Meyer and carried 4-1 (President Thompson opposed for not agreeing with the matrices format of the District's agreements with labor unions) to approve Tentative Agreement between the Fullerton School District and Fullerton Elementary Teachers Association (FETA) for 2015/2016.

Discussion/Action Item 2d addressed at this time.

2d. Approve compensation adjustments for Fullerton School District's management group for 2015/2016.

The Board held discussion regarding the "me too" practice for compensation raises for employees. It was discussed that in the future, the Board would like to negotiate raises instead of an across the Board raise for management based on labor union negotiations. It was then moved by Lynn Thornley, seconded by Janny Meyer and carried 4-1 (President Thompson opposed due to his sentiment that he disagrees with across the board raises) to approve compensation adjustments for Fullerton School District's management group for 2015/2016.

2b. Approve revision to the 2015/2016 employment contract for the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services.

President Thompson shared his opinion that he would like to negotiate with each Assistant Superintendent their own pay raise versus across the board pay raises. Mrs. Hume is a certified public accountant and merits a 2% pay increase similar to other certificated or classified staff who receive a 2% stipend for holding a doctorate degree. It was then moved by Hilda Sugarman, seconded by Janny Meyer and carried 4-1 (President Thompson opposed due to his sentiment that he disagrees with across the board raises) to approve revision to the 2015/2016 employment contract for the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services.

Discussion/Action Item #2f addressed now.

2f. Approve revision to the 2015/2016 employment contracts for the Assistant Superintendent, Personnel Services and the Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services.

It was moved by Lynn Thornley, seconded by Janny Meyer and carried 4-1 (President Thompson opposed due to his sentiment that he disagrees with across the board raises) to approve revision to the 2015/2016 employment contracts for the Assistant Superintendent, Personnel Services and the Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services. *(The Board shared their desire to look at different options in the future to providing a raise for Assistant Superintendents).*

The Superintendent contract does not hold a "me too" pay raise clause. It was moved by Hilda Sugarman, seconded by Janny Meyer and carried 4-1 (President Thompson opposed due to his sentiment that he disagrees with across the board raises) to approve revision to the 2015/2016 employment contract for the Superintendent. *(The Board shared their desire to look at different options in the future to providing a raise to the Superintendent)*

2g. Respond to City of Fullerton regarding property located at 800 block of Bastanchury next to Beechwood School.

The City of Fullerton has informed the District the appraised value of the property to be \$3,660,000. The Fullerton School District is not financially capable of leasing or purchasing at the appraised value. The District will be responding to the City of Fullerton that the District is not capable of leasing or purchasing the property.

SUBJECT: APPROVE SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT AND EFILEFOLDERS EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 18, 2015

Background: Document management is a large service aspect of Personnel Services and the Benefits Office. Studies show that going paperless can save money, boost productivity, save space, make documentation and information sharing easier, keep personal information more secure, and help the environment.

Fullerton School District wishes to partner with eFileFolders to implement a paperless environment. eFileFolders will initiate the transition to a paperless environment by scanning all existing files designated by Personnel Services. Once files are converted, a representative will train Personnel staff on system utilization. A monthly service fee will be charged to store electronic files on a secure server and may be canceled at any time.

Rationale: Reducing paper files is more cost effective and more in alignment with 21st Century technological methods. The department will have immediate hands-on access to personnel and benefits files whereby improving its efficiency and customer service.

Funding: Cost not to exceed one-time set up fee of \$19,127, and ongoing monthly service fee of \$399 from Personnel Services budget #521.

Recommendation: Approve service agreement between Fullerton School District and eFilefolders effective November 18, 2015.

2015-2016 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Agreement is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and **eFilefolders** hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Services to be provided by Contractor: Contractor shall provide (hereinafter referred to as "Services"). **Personnel and Benefit files (active and inactive) will be taken off site and scanned at a resolution of 300 dpi. Scanned files will be indexed per file folder. Electronic files will be available the District via the eFilefolders software and via the external backup hard drive. Once files are scanned, they will be returned to the District in inventoried boxes. Software training will be provided by eFilefolders to Personnel and Benefit employees.**

2. Term. Contractor shall commence providing services under this Agreement on **November 18, 2015**, and will diligently perform as required and complete performance **on a monthly basis until agreement is terminated.**

3. Compensation. District agrees to pay the Contractor for Services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement a total fee not to exceed **Nineteen Thousand One Hundred Twenty Seven Dollars (\$19,127) for initial startup cost, and a Three Hundred Ninety Nine (\$399) monthly service fee.** Contractor shall submit a detailed invoice to District. Payment for Services will only be made if Services have been satisfactorily rendered under the terms of this Agreement.

4. Expenses. District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing the Services for District, except as follows: **(none).**

5. Independent Contractor. Contractor, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that Contractor and all of Contractor's employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of Contractor's employees as they relate to the Services to be provided under this

Agreement. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, State and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.

6. Materials. Contractor shall furnish, at Contractor's own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the Services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement. Contractor's Services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of Contractor's profession.

7. Originality of Services/Intellectual Property. Contractor agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, and ideas prepared for and submitted by Contractor to the District in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, shall be wholly original to Contractor and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to Contractor by District as a basis for such Services. Contractor further agrees that all writings, materials, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, or otherwise (hereinafter referred to as "Content") submitted by Contractor to the District and/or used in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, reflect the intellectual property of, and copyright interests held by, District and shall not be copied or used in whole or in part by Contractor without District's express written permission. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that District shall have all right, title and interest in said Content, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said Content in the name of the District.

8. Standard for Performance. The parties acknowledge that the District, in selecting the Contractor to perform the Services hereunder, is relying upon the Contractor's reputation for excellence in the performance of the Services required hereunder. The Contractor shall perform the Services in the manner of one who is a recognized specialist in the types of services to be performed. Time is of the essence in this Agreement. All deadlines set forth in the Agreement are binding and may be modified only by subsequent written agreement of the parties.

9. Termination. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for the Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of Services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; (b) any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency. Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within thirty (30) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the thirty (30) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the District may secure the required services from

another contractor. If the cost to the District exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the Contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District. Written notice by District shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. Hold Harmless. Contractor agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the District and its Governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the Contractor, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the Services called for in this Agreement, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the District's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property, caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the Contractor, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the Services covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this Agreement.

11. Insurance. The Contractor, at Contractor's sole cost and expense, shall insure Contractor's activities in connection with the Services under this Agreement and shall obtain, keep in force, and maintain insurance as follows:

a. Comprehensive or Commercial Form General Liability Insurance (contractual liability included) with limits as follows: (minimum limits)

(1)	Each Occurrence	\$1,000,000
(2)	Products/Completed Operations Aggregate	\$1,000,000
(3)	Personal and Advertising Injury	\$1,000,000
(4)	General Aggregate (Not Applicable to the Comprehensive Form)	\$1,000,000

The policy may not contain an exclusion for coverage of claims arising from claims for sexual

molestation or abuse. This policy shall include or be endorsed to include abuse and molestation coverage of at least \$1,000,000.00 for each occurrence.

b. Business Automobile Liability Insurance for owned, scheduled, non-owned, or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. (Required only if the Contractor drives on behalf of the District in the course of performing services.)

c. Professional Liability Insurance with a limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, if applicable.

d. Workers' Compensation as required by California State law.

It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage and limits referred to under a., b., and c. above shall not in any way limit the liability of the Contractor. The Contractor shall furnish the District with certificates of insurance evidencing compliance with all requirements no later than five (5) business days from execution of this Agreement and prior to commencing the Services under this Agreement. Contractor agrees to provide a thirty (30) day written notice to District of cancellation, modification, or reduction in any insurance coverage required pursuant to this section. Such certificates shall:

- (1) Indicate that the District and its Governing Board, officers, and employees have been endorsed as additional insureds under the coverages referred to under a. and b.; and
- (2) Include a provision that the coverages will be primary and will not participate with nor be excess over any valid and collectible insurance or program of self-insurance carried or maintained by the District.

12. Assignment. The obligations of the Contractor and the performance of the Services pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor. Any such assignment shall be null and void and shall be deemed a basis for termination of this Agreement.

13. Compliance With Applicable Laws. The Services must meet the approval of the District and shall be subject to the District's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. Contractor agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to Contractor, Contractor's business, equipment and personnel engaged in the Services covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such Services.

13.1 Fingerprinting. Contractor shall comply with the requirements of California Education Code Section 45125.1, and shall provide to District all criminal background clearance(s) through fingerprints for Contractor (and all Contractor employees, if any) as required by the District. The District may require the Contractor and Contractor's employees to submit to additional criminal background checks at the District's sole and absolute discretion.

13.2 Tuberculosis Testing. Contractor and Contractor's employees, if any, providing Services to students shall provide evidence of appropriate tuberculosis screening prior to the performance of the Services and provide annual certification thereafter. Contractor shall complete and submit to District any required documentation to verify compliance.

14. Permits/Licenses. Contractor shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of the Services pursuant to this Agreement.

15. Employment With Public Agency. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which the Services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.

16. Entire Agreement/Amendment. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the Services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement.

17. Nondiscrimination. Contractor agrees that Contractor will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, sex, marital status, age or other characteristics protected by federal or state laws of such persons.

18. Non-Waiver. The failure of District or Contractor to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

19. Notice. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section.

This Agreement may be signed and delivered in two counterparts, each of which, when so signed and delivered, shall be an original, but such counterparts together shall constitute the one instrument that is the Agreement, and the Agreement shall not be binding on any party until all parties have signed it.

24. Authorized Signatures. The individual signing this Agreement warrants that he/she is authorized to do so. The parties understand and agree that a breach of this warranty shall constitute a breach of the Agreement and shall entitle the non-breaching party to all appropriate legal and equitable remedies against the breaching party.

25. Governing Law. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California. This Agreement is made in and shall be performed in Orange County, California.



Background: Due to the poor soil conditions at Fisler School main play field, turf renovation is needed to correct those conditions. A running track around the play field will also be added.

Pursuant to Public Contract Code section 20111(b), the current bid threshold for public agency construction contracts is \$15,000. The estimated cost of the project, including soft costs and contingency, is in excess of the current bid limit. Therefore, the District went out to bid for the contract.

Rationale: In accordance with the California Contract Code, advertisement for this project was published in a newspaper of general circulation, and bids were opened on October 27, 2015. The successful low bidder was Principles Contracting, Inc., with a bid of \$158,292.

Funding: The contract amount is \$158,292, to be paid from District 48 (Amerige Heights). The Fisler School PTA had previously donated \$27,585 towards the total cost; thus the net cost to District 48 (Amerige Heights) is \$130,707.

Recommendation: Award Contract FSD-14-15-AH-01 to Principles Contracting, Inc., for Robert C. Fisler Track/Field Renovation.

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Agreement"), dated the 17th day of November 2015, in the County of Orange, State of California, by and between the **Fullerton School District**, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT" or "OWNER" and **Principles Contracting, Inc.**, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR."

WITNESSETH:

That DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR, for the consideration stated herein, agree as follows:

1. Contract

The complete Contract includes all of the contract documents, including the (1) Notice to Contractors Calling for Bids, (2) Information for Bidders, (3) Scope of Work Summary, (4) Bid Form, (5) Non-collusion Declaration, (6) Site Visit Certification, (7) Designation of Subcontractors, (8) Bid Bond, (9) Information Required of Bidder, if applicable, (10) Contractor Prequalification Documents, if applicable, (11) DVBE Participation Goal Compliance, if applicable, (12) Bidder's Acknowledgement of Project Schedule, (13) Storm Water Pollution Prevention Certification, (14) DVBE Compliance Forms, if applicable, (15) this Agreement, (16) Performance Bond, (17) Payment Bond, (18) Workers' Compensation Certification, (19) Drug-Free Workplace Certification, (20) Conduct Rules for Contractor(s), (21) Asbestos and Other Hazardous Materials Certification, (22) Lead Based Paint Certification, (23) Criminal Records Check Certification, (24) Escrow Agreement for Security Deposits in Lieu of Retention, if applicable, (25) Shop Drawing Transmittal Form, (26) Change Order Form, (27) Guarantee, (28) General Conditions, (29) Special Conditions, if any, (30) Project Schedule, (31) Plans, (32) Drawings, (33) Specifications, (34) Insurance Policies, and all modifications and amendments thereto, and by this reference are incorporated herein (the "Contract Documents"). The Contract Documents are complementary, and what is called for by any one shall be as binding as if called for by all.

2. Statement of Work

CONTRACTOR shall perform that work designated in CONTRACTOR's Bid Form which constitutes at least 15% of the total Work, exclusive of supervisory and clerical work, without the services of any Subcontractor. CONTRACTOR shall perform within the time set forth in Paragraph 4 of this Agreement everything required to be performed, and shall provide and furnish all the labor, materials, necessary tools, expendable equipment, and all utility and transportation services as described in the complete Contract and required for the Work described as follows:

in accordance with Drawings and Specifications prepared by Architecture 9 PLLLP, dated November 18, 2014. All of said Work to be performed and materials to be furnished shall be completed in a good workmanlike manner in strict accordance with the Plans, Drawings, Specifications and provisions of the complete Contract. CONTRACTOR shall be liable to DISTRICT for any damages arising as a result of a failure to fully comply with this obligation, and CONTRACTOR shall not be excused with respect to any failure to so comply by any act or omission of ARCHITECT, Engineer,

Inspector, Division of the State Architect, or representative of any of them, unless such act or omission actually prevents CONTRACTOR from fully complying with the requirements of the documents, and unless CONTRACTOR protests at the time of such alleged prevention that the act or omission is preventing CONTRACTOR from fully complying with the Contract Documents. Such protest shall not be effective unless reduced to writing and filed with DISTRICT OFFICE within three (3) working days of the date of occurrence of the act or omission preventing CONTRACTOR from fully complying with the Contract Documents.

The Work required to be performed by this Agreement shall be subject to the payment of prevailing wages, as described in the Labor Code, by CONTRACTOR and each Subcontractor on the Project. The Work shall further be subject to the fulfillment of the requirements related to the payment of prevailing wages, including, but not limited to, the obligation to furnish certified payroll records to the Labor Commissioner as required by the Labor Commissioner. Payments to CONTRACTOR shall not be made when payroll records are delinquent or inadequate. The prevailing rate of per diem wages and a description of employer payments are on file at DISTRICT's Facilities office and are available to any interested party upon request. CONTRACTOR shall post a copy of such wage rates at the job site. CONTRACTOR shall also post at the job site a notice containing the following language:

This public works project is subject to monitoring and investigative activities by the Compliance Monitoring Unit (CMU) of the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement, Department of Industrial Relations, State of California. This Notice is intended to provide information to all workers employed in the execution of the contract for public work and to all contractors and other persons having access to the job site to enable the CMU to ensure compliance with and enforcement of prevailing wage laws on public works projects.

The prevailing wage laws require that all workers be paid at least the minimum hourly wage as determined by the Director of Industrial Relations for the specific classification (or type of work) performed by workers on the project. These rates are listed on a separate job site posting of minimum prevailing rates required to be maintained by the public entity which awarded the public works contract. Complaints concerning nonpayment of the required minimum wage rates to workers on this project may be filed with the CMU at any office of the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement (DLSE).

Complaints should be filed in writing immediately upon discovery of any violations of the prevailing wage laws due to the short period of time following the completion of the project that the CMU may take legal action against those responsible.

Complaints should contain details about the violations alleged (for example, wrong rate paid, not all hours paid, overtime rate not paid for hours worked in excess of 8 per day or 40 per week, etc) as well as the name of the employer, the public entity which awarded the public works contract, and the location and name of the project.

For general information concerning the prevailing wage laws and how to file a complaint concerning any violation of these prevailing wage laws, you may contact any DLSE office. Complaint forms are also available at the Department of Industrial Relations website found at www.dir.ca.gov/dlse/PublicWorks.html.

3. Compensation

DISTRICT shall pay to CONTRACTOR, as full consideration for the faithful performance of the Contract, subject to any additions or deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the sum of **One Hundred Fifty-Eight Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety-Two and 00/100** Dollars (**\$158,292.00**) said sum being the total amount stipulated in the proposal.

Payment shall be made as set forth in the General Conditions.

Should any Change Order result in an increase in the Contract Price, the cost of such Change Order shall be agreed to in advance by CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT, subject to the monetary limitations set forth in Public Contract Code section 20118.4. In the event that CONTRACTOR proceeds with a change in Work without an agreement between DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR regarding

the cost of a Change Order, CONTRACTOR waives any claim of additional compensation for such additional Work.

4. Commencement of Work and Time for Completion

CONTRACTOR shall not start the Work until it has received DISTRICT's Notice to Proceed for the Project. CONTRACTOR shall commence the Work within three (3) Days from the date of said Notice. Commencement of Work shall include reasonable and evident efforts on the Project site.

Time for completion of the Project shall be within Sixty (60) consecutive calendar days. The Starting Date shall be the date of DISTRICT's Notice to Proceed. Said Notice shall not be issued prior to five (5) Days after award of the Contract, and shall not require that Work be commenced less than forty-eight (48) hours from the date of said Notice. **DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR stipulate and agree that the amount of time for completion as specified in this paragraph is reasonable.**

5. Claims

As required by Article 60 of the General Conditions, if CONTRACTOR should claim that any instruction, request, drawing, specification, action, condition, omission, default, or other situation out of CONTRACTOR's control, obligates DISTRICT to pay additional compensation to CONTRACTOR or to grant an extension of time for the completion of the Contract, CONTRACTOR shall notify DISTRICT and ARCHITECT, in writing, of such claim in accordance with the procedure specified in Article 57 of the General Conditions. CONTRACTOR's failure to notify DISTRICT and ARCHITECT within the specified period shall be deemed a waiver and relinquishment of such a claim against DISTRICT. If such notice is given within the specified time, the procedure for its consideration shall be as stated in Article 60 of the General Conditions. CONTRACTOR hereby acknowledges that it understands this provision and that it will abide by it.

6. Liquidated Damages

Time is of the essence. IT IS AGREED BY CONTRACTOR AND DISTRICT THAT, IF THE PROJECT FAILS TO REACH SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION WITHIN THE CONTRACT TIME PLUS ANY AUTHORIZED EXTENSION OF TIME HEREUNDER, THEN (a) AS COMPENSATION TO DISTRICT FOR THE LOSS OF THE BENEFICIAL USE OF THE PROJECT DURING THE PERIOD OF THE DELAY, THERE SHALL BE ASSESSED AGAINST CONTRACTOR AS LIQUIDATED DAMAGES, BUT NOT AS A PENALTY, THE SUM OF FIVE HUNDRED **(\$500.00)** FOR EACH DAY THEREAFTER UNTIL THE DATE THAT PHYSICAL COMPLETION OF THE WORK AND THE PROJECT HAS REACHED COMPLETION, AND (b) AS COMPENSATION FOR THE ACTUAL ADDITIONAL OUT-OF-POCKET COSTS AND EXPENSES INCURRED BY DISTRICT AS A RESULT OF THE DELAY IN COMPLETION, THERE SHALL ALSO BE ASSESSED AGAINST CONTRACTOR

THE ACTUAL AND VERIFIABLE OUT-OF-POCKET COSTS AND EXPENSES INCURRED BY DISTRICT AS A RESULT OF THE DELAY (SUCH AS, FOR EXAMPLE, ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION PAID TO DISTRICT'S ARCHITECT AND OTHER CONSULTANT(S) AND AGENTS AND THE LEGAL FEES AND EXPENSES INCURRED BY DISTRICT IN CONNECTION WITH THE DELAY). IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY CONTRACTOR AND DISTRICT THAT IT WOULD BE IMPRACTICABLE AND EXTREMELY DIFFICULT TO FIX THE ACTUAL DAMAGE TO DISTRICT SHOULD THE ENTIRE WORK AND PROJECT NOT BE COMPLETED WITHIN THE TIME PERIOD SPECIFIED ABOVE PLUS ANY AUTHORIZED EXTENSIONS OF TIME HEREUNDER AND DISTRICT BE DEPRIVED OF THE BENEFICIAL OCCUPANCY OF THE PROJECT AS A RESULT THEREOF. THE LIQUIDATED DAMAGES PROVIDED FOR IN (a) ABOVE OF THIS PARAGRAPH REPRESENT THE PARTIES' REASONABLE ESTIMATE OF THE ACTUAL DAMAGES THAT DISTRICT WILL INCUR IF ITS BENEFICIAL USE OF THE PROJECT IS DELAYED BEYOND THE EXPIRATION OF THE CONTRACT TIME AND SUCH LIQUIDATED DAMAGES DO NOT CONSTITUTE A PENALTY NOR ARE THEY INTENDED TO COMPENSATE DISTRICT FOR (OR COVER) THE ACTUAL OUT-OF-POCKET DAMAGES INCURRED BY DISTRICT IN CONNECTION WITH ANY SUCH DELAY (WHICH ACTUAL OUT-OF-POCKET DAMAGES SHALL BE SEPARATELY RECOVERABLE BY DISTRICT PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH 6(b)). THE PAYMENT OF THE AMOUNTS DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 6(a) AS LIQUIDATED DAMAGES IS NOT INTENDED AS A FORFEITURE OR PENALTY WITHIN THE MEANING OF CALIFORNIA CIVIL CODE SECTION 3275 OR 3369, BUT IS INTENDED TO CONSTITUTE LIQUIDATED DAMAGES TO DISTRICT PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA CIVIL CODE SECTIONS 1671, 1676 AND 1677. THE PARTIES EXPRESSLY AGREE THAT DISTRICT SHALL BE PERMITTED TO RECOVER ITS ACTUAL OUT-OF-POCKET DAMAGES INCURRED AS A RESULT OF ANY DELAY IN COMPLETION (IN ADDITION TO THE LIQUIDATED DAMAGES THAT MAY BE RECOVERED FOR THE LOSS OF THE BENEFICIAL USE OF THE PROJECT DURING THE PERIOD OF THE DELAY), AND THAT SUCH ACTUAL OUT-OF-POCKET DELAY DAMAGES ARE NOT LIQUIDATED HEREUNDER, BECAUSE UNLIKE THE DAMAGES RESULTING FROM THE LOSS OF THE BENEFICIAL USE OF THE PROJECT, SUCH ACTUAL OUT-OF-POCKET DAMAGES ARE NOT IMPRACTICABLE OR DIFFICULT TO FIX.

DISTRICT may deduct liquidated and/or actual out-of-pocket delay damages described in Paragraph 6 from any unpaid amounts then or thereafter due CONTRACTOR under this Agreement in accordance with Article 64 of the General Conditions. Any liquidated and/or actual out-of-pocket delay damages not so deducted from any unpaid amounts due CONTRACTOR shall be payable to DISTRICT at the demand of DISTRICT, together with interest thereon from the date of demand until paid at a rate equal to ten percent (10%) per annum.

7. Indemnification

CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify and hold harmless DISTRICT, ARCHITECT, INSPECTOR OF RECORD, and their respective officers, agents, and employees from every claim or demand made, and every liability, loss, damage, or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

(a) Liability for damages for (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising under either (1) or (2) above, sustained by CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by CONTRACTOR upon or in connection with the Work called for in this Agreement, except for liability resulting from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of DISTRICT, ARCHITECT, INSPECTOR OF RECORD, or their respective officers, employees, agents or independent contractors who are directly employed by DISTRICT, and except for liability resulting from the active negligence of DISTRICT, ARCHITECT, or INSPECTOR OF RECORD.

(b) Any injury to or death of persons or damage to property caused by any act, neglect, default or omission of CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm, or corporation employed by CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, including all damages due to loss or theft, sustained by any person, firm or corporation, including DISTRICT, ARCHITECT, or INSPECTOR OF RECORD arising out of, or in any way connected with the Work covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off school district property, if the liability arose from the negligence or willful misconduct of anyone employed by CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, and not by the active negligence of DISTRICT, ARCHITECT, or INSPECTOR OF RECORD.

(c) In the event CONTRACTOR is required to access DISTRICT's computer system or network in the performance of the Contract, CONTRACTOR shall provide 48-hours advance notification to DISTRICT. In the event such access infects DISTRICT's computer network, system, or device with a virus, Trojan Horse, worm, or any other computer programming routine that is intended to damage, detrimentally interfere with, surreptitiously intercept or expropriate any system data or personal information, CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify DISTRICT and pay for any and all losses, damages and expenses incurred by DISTRICT to remedy any such infection.

(d) Liability for fines, penalties, or other monetary damages incurred by DISTRICT for CONTRACTOR's, or its Subcontractor's, failure to comply with applicable Storm Water Requirements as generally described in the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Certification executed by CONTRACTOR.

CONTRACTOR, at CONTRACTOR's own expense, cost, and risk, shall defend any and all actions, suits, or other proceedings that may be brought or instituted against DISTRICT, ARCHITECT, INSPECTOR OF RECORD, or their respective officers, agents or employees, or any such claim, demand or liability, and shall pay or satisfy any judgment that may be rendered against DISTRICT, ARCHITECT, INSPECTOR OF RECORD, or their respective officers, agents or employees in any action, suit or other proceedings as a result thereof.

DISTRICT shall not be required to make any adjustment in the Contract Price or the Contract Time in connection with any failure by CONTRACTOR to comply with the requirements of this Section.

Execution of the Agreement by CONTRACTOR is a further representation that CONTRACTOR has examined all documents provided to CONTRACTOR pertaining to the Work, has correlated its personal observations at the Project site with the requirements of the Contract Documents, has read carefully and is fully aware of the critical time restriction for performance of the Work, is fully aware of the provisions and requirements of the Drawings and Specifications, and recognizes that it must perform the Work consistent with the appropriate standard of care regarding safety, protection of existing structures and other facilities in the area, protection of pedestrians, health and sanitation laws and ordinances, and protection of existing facilities, utilities, neighboring property and adjacent walks and streets.

Execution of the Agreement by CONTRACTOR is a further representation that CONTRACTOR is a licensed contractor who possesses a reasonable level of experience and expertise in the business administration, construction, construction management, and superintendence of projects of the size, complexity, and nature of this particular Project, is able to furnish the tools, materials, supplies, equipment, and labor required to complete the Work and perform its obligation hereunder, has sufficient experience and competence to do so, and will perform the Work in accordance with the appropriate standard of care.

The above representations and warranties shall survive the execution and delivery of the Agreement, any termination of this Agreement, and the final completion of the Work.

10. Copies of Drawings and Specifications

Electronic copies of Drawings and Specifications to be furnished to CONTRACTOR free of charge, as provided in the General Conditions. Hard copies may be obtained at cost of reproduction. See the Notice to Contractors Calling for Bids for additional information.

11. Required Number of Executed Copies

The number of executed copies of the Agreement, the Contractor's Certificate, the Performance Bond and the Payment Bond required is four.

12. Inspector's Field Office

The inspector's field office shall be not less than N/A square feet of floor area.

13. Substitution of Securities

Pursuant to Section 22300 of the Public Contract Code, this Agreement permits the substitution of securities for any monies withheld by DISTRICT to ensure performance under this Agreement. At the request and expense of CONTRACTOR, securities equivalent to the amount withheld shall be deposited with DISTRICT, or with a state or federally chartered bank in California as the Escrow Agent, who shall then pay such monies to CONTRACTOR. Upon satisfactory completion of the Contract, the securities shall be returned to CONTRACTOR. Alternatively, CONTRACTOR may request and DISTRICT shall make payment of retentions earned directly to the Escrow Agent at the expense of CONTRACTOR.

Securities eligible for investment under this section shall include those listed in Section 16430 of the Government Code, or bank or savings and loan certificates of deposit. CONTRACTOR shall be the beneficial owner of any securities substituted for monies withheld and shall receive any interest thereon.

14. Corporate Status

If CONTRACTOR is a corporation, the undersigned hereby represents and warrants that the corporation is duly incorporated and in good standing in the State of _____, and that _____ whose title is chairman of the board/president/vice president (circle applicable office(s)), and/or _____ whose title is secretary/assistant secretary/chief financial officer/assistant treasurer (circle applicable office(s)) is/are authorized to act for and bind the corporation. See Paragraph 4 of Information for Bidders for additional information.

15. Required Provisions

Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in the Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein and the Contract shall be read and enforced as though it were included herein, and if through mistake or otherwise any such provision is not inserted, or is not correctly inserted, then, upon application of either party, the Contract shall forthwith be physically amended to make such insertion or correction.

16. Entire Agreement

The complete Contract as set forth in Paragraph 1 of this Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties. No other agreements, oral or written, pertaining to the Work to be performed under this Agreement, exists between the parties. This Agreement can be modified only by an agreement in writing, signed by both parties and pursuant to action of the Governing Board.

FSD will offer a \$2500 Early Notification of Retirement Incentive to certificated employee that meet the following criteria:

1. Employee must be in a paid status by the District
2. Employee must be in a permanent status (hire date prior to July 1, 2011)
3. Employee must be on a full contract (or work 7.5 hrs. a day)

Employee must submit a letter of retirement effective the date after the completion of contracted work year to the Assistant Superintendent of Personnel Services **no later than 4:00pm on February 1, 2016.**

Background: Fullerton School District operates the State Preschool Program, which is funded by the State Department of Education Child Care and Development Division and serves three- to five-year-olds in classes at Commonwealth, Maple, Orangethorpe, Pacific Drive, Richman, Valencia Park, and Woodcrest Schools. The State Preschool Program participates in Race to the Top Quality Start Orange County. Funding has been received through the California State Preschool Program Quality Rating and Improvement System Block Grant in the amount of \$71,600 from Orange County Superintendent of Schools to enhance and maintain quality standards of the State Preschool Program. The funds support professional learning communities for early childhood teaching staff to engage in dialogue about curriculum, assessment and family engagement.

Rationale: The interactions teachers have with children can impact life-long learning and development. CLASS is the observation tool developed to assess these interactions from infant care through 12th grade. Information derived from assessment is used for coaching and professional development.

The Block Grant requires a series of professional development trainings. Orange County Department of Education will provide the four-hour Introduction to CLASS Training for Preschool instructional aides on January 4, 2016 and the two-day CLASS Reliability Training for Preschool staff on January 20 and February 3, 2016 at a cost not to exceed \$2,650.

Funding: Total cost not to exceed \$2,650 from Child Development Services budget #340

Recommendation: Approve Agreement between Fullerton School District and Orange County Department of Education for Preschool Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) Trainings on January 4 and 20, 2016 and February 3, 2016.

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into this 28th day of October, 2015, by and between the Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa, California 92626, hereinafter referred to as SUPERINTENDENT, and Fullerton School District, 1401 West Valencia, Fullerton, California 92833, hereinafter referred to as DISTRICT. SUPERINTENDENT and DISTRICT shall be collectively referred to as the Parties.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1.0 SCOPE OF WORK. DISTRICT hereby engages SUPERINTENDENT as an independent contractor to perform the following described services and SUPERINTENDENT hereby agrees to perform said services upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth. Specifically, SUPERINTENDENT shall provide the following services:

1 1.1 Conduct two (2) different CLASS (Classroom Assessment
2 Scoring System) trainings as described in Exhibit "A",
3 "Customized Coaching and Training (CCAT) Letter of
4 Confirmation", which is attached hereto and incorporated
5 by reference herein.

6 2.0 TERM. SUPERINTENDENT shall commence providing services under
7 this AGREEMENT on January 4, 2016 and will diligently perform as
8 required and complete performance by February 3, 2016, subject to

10 3.0 PAYMENT. DISTRICT agrees to pay the SUPERINTENDENT for services

Background: Board approval was granted on June 9, 2015 for Momentum in Teaching to provide writing workshop professional development to K-6 teachers. They address achievement gaps by utilizing Common Core Standards and a personalized approach to teaching writing.

Rationale: Teachers and Administrators will benefit from this standards-based academic program that utilizes research-based instructional strategies with effective and timely feedback. This Common Core Writing program will support teachers in the development of effective writers. Teachers at Rolling Hills and Sunset Lane Schools will be trained in teaching informative writing to their students. These teachers will have completed the required three-days of narrative training by January 4, 2016.

Funding: Additional cost is not to exceed \$4,500 to be paid as follows:
Rolling Hills: \$2,250 budget 0130426109-5805
Sunset Lane: \$2,250 budget 0130427109-5805

Recommendation: Approve Amendment between Fullerton School District and Momentum in Teaching to provide additional training for a research-based, Common Core aligned writing program, writing workshop, to K-6 teachers and administrators at Sunset Lane and Rolling Hills Schools on January 4, 2016.

Background: Nicolas Junior High School will be working in conjunction with Technology & Media Services to provide a pilot training program for low-income parents in the use of technology to support their student's education. Training will be conducted by Community Union, Inc., (One Million New Internet Users), which will provide trainers and curriculum for 35 parents to complete a five-week course centered on parent proficiency using technology. Participating parents will be provided with a Mobile Wi-Fi unit enabling Internet access at home during the course. This pilot requires both One Million New Internet Users and Kajeet, which will provide the Mobile Internet Devices and broadband access and filtering for this program.

Rationale: Computer literacy is essential for our parent community to assist, guide, and protect their children when using technology in their daily lives.

Funding: Cost is \$3,725 for Community Union, Inc., and \$9,982.84 for Kajeet. Total cost is not to exceed \$13,707.84 and is to be paid from Nicolas Junior High School's Title I Fund.

Recommendation: Approve Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Fullerton School District and Community Union, Inc., (One Million New Internet Users), and Agreement with Kajeet, for a parent-training pilot at Nicolas Junior High School effective November 18, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BY AND BETWEEN

**Fullerton School District
AND
Community Union, Inc.**

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is made and entered into November 21, 2015, by and between Fullerton School District (FSD), and Community Union, Inc. (CU), hereinafter jointly referred to as “PARTIES”.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, FSD intends to improve the quality of life for the Fullerton community,

WHEREAS, FSD intends to enhance parents’ access and training to technology so they may better engage in their child’s education,

WHEREAS, Community Union is an organization with over 22 years of experience in community-based technology and Internet training,

WHEREAS, FSD serves students whose demographics include low-income and monolingual (non-English) speaking parents,

WHEREAS, Community Union seeks to bring community-based technology training services to FSD, with the intent of using the Parent EMPOWERMENT through Technology program,

NOW, THEREFORE, all of the named parties hereby acknowledge, and as an expression of common intent, the PARTIES hereto agree as follows:

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to define the manner in which the PARTIES will participate in establishing a strategic relationship to form collaboration as a means to facilitate the delivery of the Parent EMPOWERMENT through Technology (PE+T) Program to serve parents of Nicolas Junior High students. PE+T furthers the effort to better engage parents in their child’s education. Core to this MOU is fundraising that will enable all low-income parents to enroll into the PE+T course free of charge.

II. GENERAL PROVISIONS



A. TERM

The term this MOU begins upon execution by the PARTIES for a period of one year, unless otherwise terminated as provided for in Section D below. Services under this MOU will be rendered during the 2015-2016 school year.

B. RESPONSIBILITIES

The following shall describe the responsibilities to the MOU:

1. Fullerton School District
 - a) Will provide the computer room or laptop cart to conduct Parent EMPOWERMENT through Technology (PE+T) courses, Fullerton School District at Nicolas Junior High School, 1100 W Olive Ave., Fullerton, CA 92833 a maximum of 35 parents to attend courses, see **Exhibit B**
 - b) Will provide a printer for parents to print completed exercises at the end of each session,
 - c) Will support outreach efforts to parents, including but not limited to coordinating with school staff and Community Union to obtain parent contact information,
 - d) Will provide parents with log-in information to access the Internet from the site as needed,
 - e) Will meet with CU staff as needed during the pre-planning phases of the PE+T, and every other week once sessions commence to discuss successes and challenges if any,
 - f) Provide space for and participate in PE+T Graduation Ceremony to be conducted at conclusion of program,
 - g) Agrees to pay a flat fee of \$3,725 for a maximum of 35 parents,
2. CU – will manage:
 - a) Outreach and recruitment of parents,
 - b) Organization of initial parent orientation meeting,
 - c) Follow-up phone calls to parents,
 - d) Recruitment, training and management of trainers using the PE+T system,
 - e) All classes and class schedules, See **Exhibit B**,
 - f) And provide supplies,
 - g) Delivery of PE+T as described herein, and incorporated, See **Exhibit A and C**,
 - h) Safety and Clean-up of Computer Lab,
 - i) Progress reporting, tracking and attendance using PE+T system,
 - j) And provide status reports to FSD upon request,



- k) And maintain communication with FSD staff as needed regarding the PE+T program,
 - l) Graduation ceremony, announcements, invitation and day of event,
 - m) Promotion of class successes with local leaders and media,
 - n) And cover all remaining costs,
3. Prior to changes in schedules of this agreement Parties agree to discuss and determine a strategy convenient and mutually beneficial to both.

C. CONFIDENTIALITY

No person will publish or disclose, use, or permit, cause to be published, disclosed or used, any confidential information pertaining to the clients (parents and students), applicants, participants or customers of the PARTIES.

D. TERMINATION

This MOU may be terminated by mutual consent with a 30 day written notice by either party.

E. ASSIGNMENT

PARTIES may not transfer or assign interest in this MOU without the previous written consent of all parties. Any such attempt to transfer or assign shall be null and void.

F. INDEMNIFICATION

Each party agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other partners, their boards, officers, agents, employees, assigns and successors in interest from and against all suits or causes of action, claims, losses, demands and expenses, including, but not limited to, attorney's fees and cost of litigation, damage or liability of any nature whatsoever, for death or injury to any person, including each party's employees and agents, or damage or destruction of any property of either party hereto or of third parties, arising in any manner by reason of negligent acts, errors omissions or willful misconduct incidents to the performance of this MOU.

G. GENERAL INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

PARTIES mutually agree to maintain their own corporate insurances, including but not limited to commercial general liability policy, workers compensation, officers and directors insurance, bonding, automobile, and employer's liability.



H. MODIFICATION

The terms and conditions of this MOU may only be amended by mutual written agreement of the PARTIES.

Parent EMPOWERMENT through Technology (PE+T)

The Parent EMPOWERMENT through Technology (PE+T) program streamlines key elements to parent involvement, with cultural relevance at its center. When parents lack appropriate tools to fully engage in the health and education of their family, they tend to step out of their role. A balanced use of online information and tools can lead to parent empowerment and engagement on all levels. Parents gain critical research skills with PE+T training. PE+T gives parents the power of information—giving them the opportunity to make well-educated choices that benefit their entire family.

1. Organizational Background and History

Community Union, Inc.(Established 1993)

Mission: Setup, sustain and expand education and economic opportunities in low-income communities via community-based computer and Internet training.

Community Union, Inc. is a corporation based in Los Angeles, California. Community Union (CU) provides training from community technology centers located in low-income neighborhoods throughout California.

In 1993, while Mr. Larry A. Ortega was attending law school at Western State University School of Law, Fullerton, CA, he founded CU. CU first launched their courses working with children, but quickly realized that training parents in technology was key to impacting the digital divide, student achievement and graduation rates. A year after its inception, CU launched courses to serve parents in English, Korean, and Spanish.

Community Union, in cooperation with the One Million NIU (New Internet Users) Coalition, have successfully negotiated the opening of community-based technology training centers in over 30 cities, helping more than 25,000 parents, youth and senior citizens improve their quality of life through access and training to Internet resources. College students and NIU graduating parents enter and complete the Train the Trainer Program and become NIU Trainers for new sessions. Trainers have found the NIU experience to be a great career launching-pad as they move into professional endeavors.



2. Why Parent EMPOWERMENT through Technology?

A majority of low-income parents want to improve the quality of life for their family. However, many lack the skills required to engage in their education and health in a way that leads to improvement. This lack of improvement is more evident among parents with lower incomes and educational attainment, as well as among first generation immigrants who are English learners.

The Parent EMPOWERMENT through Technology program presents an opportunity to make a focused effort to help parents engage in their family's health and education via the Internet. There are a wide array of websites and on-line content in English, Korean and Spanish that help parents positively effect change in their family. CU has taught low-income parents how to access and use on-line resources for over 22 years and in our expert opinion, significantly improves the quality of life of graduates and their families.

3. Target Population

Maximum of 35 low-income parents who have children attending Nicolas Junior High will be enrolled in PE+T (**Exhibit C**), and will attend courses per **Exhibit B**.

4. Proposed Methodologies

Community Union believes it is a moral and economic imperative that we empower parents with research skills in education and health via technology training. A parent that can navigate the Internet to find reliable information is better equipped to make sound decisions for their family.

Parents will attend class two times per week, for two hours each day, for 5 weeks for a total of 20 hours of PE+T-Module I and/or 20 hours PE+T- Module II training, see **Exhibit B**.

PE+T Modules I & II *outcomes* for parents:

- 1) Development of Internet on-line resource navigation skills using key websites, addressing both health and education needs,
- 2) Development of a full-color multipage e-tools Resource Guide in PowerPoint that contains the following information:
 - a. A healthy food pyramid,
 - b. A through G requirements (UC/CSU college entry requisites),
 - c. Local Fullerton Unified resources available on-line,
 - d. Internet safety,
 - e. Detailed benefits of common fruits, vegetables, superfoods, supplements and organics,
 - f. Local farmer's markets and,
 - g. Healthy recipes.



- 3) Improved public speaking skills and advocacy strategies that will assist them in ensuring their family has access to health and education resources.

PE+T not only provides the foundational understanding needed by parents such as A-G requirements, education resources, college options, etc., but because the parents will have on-going access to on-line resources, they will be empowered to forever engage and advocate for the improved health and quality education for their family.

5. Project Goals, Operation and Evaluation:

PE+T's task-list, see **Exhibit C** below, is a list of exercises parents will complete during each 20 hour Module. PE+T takes parents through step by step on how-to use a computer, access the Internet and develop computer and Internet navigation skills while building an e-tools Resource Guide in PowerPoint, using health focused, college, school district and Internet safety websites. Manuals, exercises and instruction are available in English, Korean, Spanish and Mandarin Chinese.

Module I:

- A-1 – Develop a Vision Statement: Parents develop a 'vision' statement articulating desired goals and outcomes from the course, and beginning E-mail navigation, parents set up email address,
- A-2 – Introduction to Word, parents learn basic functions, typing skills, and development of a formal communication letter,
- A-3 – Introduction to PowerPoint, parents are introduced to the tool to be used to build e-tools Resource Guide,
- A-4 – Beginning Internet Navigation: Parents build research project using on-line resources to obtain information about education, health, and Internet safety.
- e-tools Resource Guide Completion: Parents compile exercises and PowerPoint slides completed during the course into a clear-covered portfolio that will be called their e-tools Resource Guide and will serve as evidence of skills learned and will be used to assist parents to better engage in their family's health and education.
- Simultaneously, this same portfolio will be used to enhance employment endeavors.

Module II:

- A-1 – Develop a Vision Statement II: Parents develop a 'vision' statement articulating desired HEALTH goals and outcomes from the course, and a refresher on Internet/E-mail navigation,
- A-2 – Refresher on Word, parents are reminded of basic functions, typing skills, and develop a formal communication letter,
- A-3 – Refresher on PowerPoint, parents are reminded of to the tool to be used to build e-health Tools Resource Guide,



- A-4 – Intermediate Internet Navigation: Parents build research project using on-line resources to obtain information about healthy living.
- e-health Tools Resource Guide Completion: Parents compile exercises and PowerPoint slides completed during the course into a clear-covered portfolio that will be called their e-health Tools Resource Guide and will serve as evidence of skills learned and will be used to assist parents to better engage in their family's health.

Evaluation:

- Paramount to the proposed project is the evaluation of program effectiveness.
- Quantitative methods such as pre and post surveys will be used. Also, graduating participant's focus group interviews will create feedback that will be used to create qualitative data to fine-tune PE+T,

In summary, after the completion of the PE+T program the following Major Goals will be accomplished:

1. parents gain increased Internet navigation knowledge for the purpose of improving the quality of life for their family,
2. parents will develop an e-tools Resource Guide and/or an e-health Tools Resource Guide to ensure they have key information to better engage in the health and education goals of their family,
3. parent leaders emerge and become sustainable resources for other parents through a parent alumni advocate network.

6. Funding, Roles and Responsibilities

1. Community Union, Inc.
 - a. Project Management and Administration (attendance, instruction, program progress reporting, etc.), training staff, PE+T training manuals and materials,
2. Outside Consultant (funded by Community Union)
 - a. Curriculum Specialist and Program Evaluation
 - b. 20 hours evaluation, testing and reporting on PE+T outcomes, within the scope of this proposal,
3. FSD
 - a. Utilization of computer lab where training will take place. Utilities, rent, security, administration staff and maintenance to be provided as an in-kind contribution,
4. Community Union and FSD
 - a. Marketing and promotion consultation, news briefs, press releases, collateral materials, event/school presentations, and out-reach,



5. Cost:

- a. FSD will pay \$3,725 for a maximum of 35 parents.
- b. FSD agrees to pay CU within 30 days after being invoiced.
 - a. Upon commencement of outreach, money for Invoices received by FSD is considered earned.
 - b. Upon commencement of classes, money for Invoices received by FSD is considered earned, unless otherwise expressed in writing from FSD.
- c. FSD agrees to pay the \$3,725 in the following manner:
 - a. FSD will pay upon receiving Invoice #1 for \$1,862.50 from Community Union *at the start of PE+T* to cover start-up costs, which include IT Visit to coordinate computer lab, PE+T Manuals to be used in training sessions, fliers, and other supplies needed to launch training sessions; and upon receiving Invoice #2 for \$1,862.50 after verifying that the training and other services covered by this agreement have all occurred at the conclusion of sessions.

Background: On July 28, 2015, the Board directed a shift to by-trustee area elections. To facilitate this change, the District is seeking waivers of sections 5019, 5020, 5021, and 5030 of the Education Code. The District is seeking a waiver of the requirement that a move from an at-large election system to a by-trustee area election system for District Board members be submitted to the electorate for its approval.

Information regarding the change in election process has been widely disseminated through the press, social media, school-site, and District meetings. Feedback from interested entities has been solicited and summarized for the Board. Additionally, three community meetings were held November 27-29 at each of the District's junior high schools.

Rationale: The District desires to have the requested Education Code sections waived because the waiver of these sections will allow the District to successfully adopt trustee areas and establish a by-trustee election process as expeditiously as possible thereby eliminating the need to go through the expense and uncertainty of a ballot measure on this subject.

It is imperative that the District adopt these areas and establish this process without delay and without interference so that the District can avoid liability under the California Voting Rights Act of 2001 ("CVRA") as a result of its current at-large election system.

As part of the process for adopting trustee-area maps, the Board is required to hold a public hearing to receive direct input from the public regarding a waiver application to the State Board of Education with respect to a shift to by-trustee area elections.

This will be the public hearing and opportunity for the community to provide both written and oral information to the Board regarding the proposed waiver application to the State Board of Education with respect to a shift to by-trustee area elections. Staff has received no comments thus far.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION**

WHEREAS, on July 28, 2015, the Board of Trustees of the Fullerton School District (the "Board") took action to move from an at large election system to a by-trustee area election system for District Board members; and

WHEREAS, California Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the Orange County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee"), upon application of a school district's governing board, to change the method of election in a school district under its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, if the County Committee approves this request to change the method of electing board members, Education Code section 5020 requires the County Committee's resolution of approval to be submitted to the electorate for its approval; and

WHEREAS, an election to approve the change in voting methods will result in a cost to the District, and Education Code sections 33050-33053 authorize the State Board of Education to waive this voter-approval requirement, which could reduce the costs associated with this proposed change in the manner of electing board members; and

WHEREAS, in light of the above, the District wishes to request that the State Board of Education waive the election requirement set forth in the Education Code; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2015, the District held a public hearing on the proposed waiver application to solicit input from the public and District stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, the District properly posted a timely notice of the aforementioned public hearing in the newspaper and at each school of the District and at an additional public place in the District; and

WHEREAS, the District properly notified its collective bargaining units of the District's intent to seek a waiver pursuant to sections 33050-33053 of the Education Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Fullerton School District as follows:

1. The above recitals are true and correct.
2. The Board hereby authorizes the District to seek a full waiver of Education Code section 5020, and partial waivers of Education Code sections 5019, 5021, and 5030 as set forth in Exhibit A, or as otherwise required by the State Board of Education to effectuate the District's goal of moving to a by-trustee election system.
3. The District Superintendent/designee are hereby authorized and directed to take any other actions necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.

FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT**

Education Code or California Code of Regulations sections to be waived

Request to waive the following sections and portions of the Education Code lined out below:

§ 5019. Trustee areas and size of school district governing boards; powers of county committee; proposal and hearing

(a) Except in a school district governed by a board of education provided for in the charter of a city or city and county, in any school district or community college district, the county committee on school district organization may establish trustee areas, rearrange the boundaries of trustee areas, abolish trustee areas, and increase to seven or decrease to five the number of members of the governing board, or adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members specified in Section 5030.

(b) The county committee on school district organization may establish or abolish a common governing board for a high school district and an elementary school district within the boundaries of the high school district. The resolution of the county committee on school district organization approving the establishment or abolition of a common governing board shall be presented to the electors of the school districts as specified in Section 5020.

(c) (1) A proposal to make the changes described in subdivision (a) or (b) may be initiated by the county committee on school district organization or made to the county committee on school district organization either by a petition signed by 5 percent or 50, whichever is less, of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 2,500 or fewer qualified registered voters, by 3 percent or 100, whichever is less, of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 2,501 to 10,000 qualified registered voters, by 1 percent or 250, whichever is less, of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 10,001 to 50,000 qualified registered voters, by 500 or more of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 50,001 to 100,000 qualified registered voters, by 750 or more of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 100,001 to 250,000 qualified registered voters, or by 1,000 or more of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 250,001 or more qualified registered voters or by resolution of the governing board of the district. For this purpose, the necessary signatures for a petition shall be obtained within a period of 180 days before the submission of the petition to the county committee on school district organization and the number of qualified registered voters in the district shall be determined pursuant to the most recent report submitted by the county elections official to the Secretary of State under Section 2187 of the Elections Code.

(2) When a proposal is made pursuant to paragraph (1), the county committee on school district organization shall call and conduct at least one hearing in the district on the matter. At the conclusion of the hearing, the county committee on school district organization shall approve or disapprove the proposal.

(d) If the county committee on school district organization approves pursuant to subdivision (a) ~~the rearrangement of the boundaries of trustee areas for a particular district, then the rearrangement of the trustee areas shall be effectuated for the next district election occurring at least 120 days after its approval, unless at least 5 percent of the registered voters of the district sign a petition requesting an election on the proposed rearrangement of trustee area boundaries. The petition for an election shall be submitted to the county elections official within 60 days of the proposal's adoption by the county committee on school district organization. If the qualified registered voters approve pursuant to subdivision (b) or (c) the rearrangement of the boundaries to the trustee areas for a particular district, the rearrangement of the trustee areas shall be effective for the next district election occurring at least 120 days after its approval by the voters.~~

~~§ 5020. Presentation of proposal to electors~~

~~(a) The resolution of the county committee approving a proposal to establish or abolish trustee areas, to adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members specified in Section 5030, or to increase or decrease the number of members of the governing board shall constitute an order of election,~~

and the proposal shall be presented to the electors of the district not later than the next succeeding election for members of the governing board.

~~(b) If a petition requesting an election on a proposal to rearrange trustee area boundaries is filed, containing at least 5 percent of the signatures of the district's registered voters as determined by the elections official, the proposal shall be presented to the electors of the district, at the next succeeding election for the members of the governing board, at the next succeeding statewide primary or general election, or at the next succeeding regularly scheduled election at which the electors of the district are otherwise entitled to vote, provided that there is sufficient time to place the issue on the ballot.~~

~~(c) If a petition requesting an election on a proposal to establish or abolish trustee areas, to increase or decrease the number of members of the board, or to adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members specified in Section 5030 is filed, containing at least 10 percent of the signatures of the district's registered voters as determined by the elections official, the proposal shall be presented to the electors of the district, at the next succeeding election for the members of the governing board, at the next succeeding statewide primary or general election, or at the next succeeding regularly scheduled election at which the electors of the district are otherwise entitled to vote, provided that there is sufficient time to place the issue on the ballot. Before the proposal is presented to the electors, the county committee on school district organization may call and conduct one or more public hearings on the proposal.~~

~~(d) The resolution of the county committee approving a proposal to establish or abolish a common governing board for a high school and an elementary school district within the boundaries of the high school district shall constitute an order of election. The proposal shall be presented to the electors of the district at the next succeeding statewide primary or general election, or at the next succeeding regularly scheduled election at which the electors of the district are otherwise entitled to vote, provided that there is sufficient time to place the issue on the ballot.~~

~~(e) For each proposal there shall be a separate proposition on the ballot. The ballot shall contain the following words:~~

~~"For the establishment (or abolition or rearrangement) of trustee areas in _____ (insert name) School District--Yes" and "For the establishment (or abolition or rearrangement) of trustee areas in _____ (insert name) School District--No."~~

~~"For increasing the number of members of the governing board of _____ (insert name) School District from five to seven--Yes" and "For increasing the number of members of the governing board of _____ (insert name) School District from five to seven--No."~~

~~"For decreasing the number of members of the governing board of _____ (insert name) School District from seven to five--Yes" and "For decreasing the number of members of the governing board of _____ (insert name) School District from seven to five--No."~~

An inconsistent proposal approved by a lesser number of voters than the number which have approved a proposal to adopt one of the methods of election of board members specified in Section 5030 shall not be effective.

§ 5021. Incumbents to serve out terms despite approval of change

(a) If a proposal for the establishment of trustee areas formulated under Sections 5019 and 5020 is approved by a majority of the voters voting at the election, any affected incumbent board member shall serve out his or her term of office and succeeding board members shall be nominated and elected in accordance with Section 5030. In the event two or more trustee areas are established at such election which are not represented in the membership of the governing board of the school district, or community college district the county committee shall determine by lot the trustee area from which the nomination and election for the next vacancy on the governing board shall be made.

(b) If a proposal for rearrangement of boundaries is approved by a majority of the voters voting on the measure, or by the county committee on school district organization when no election is required, and if the boundary changes affect the board membership, any affected incumbent board member shall serve out his or her term of office and succeeding board members shall be nominated and elected in accordance with Section 5030.

(c) If a proposal for abolishing trustee areas is approved by a majority of the voters voting at the election, the incumbent board members shall serve out their terms of office and succeeding board members shall be nominated and elected at large from the district.

§ 5030. Alternate method of election

Except as provided in Sections 5027 and 5028, in any school district or community college district having trustee areas, the county committee on school district organization and the registered voters of a district, pursuant to Sections 5019 and 5020, respectively, may at any time recommend one of the following alternate methods of electing governing board members:

(a) That each member of the governing board be elected by the registered voters of the entire district.

(b) That one or more members residing in each trustee area be elected by the registered voters of that particular trustee area.

(c) That each governing board member be elected by the registered voters of the entire school district or community college district, but reside in the trustee area which he or she represents.

The recommendation shall provide that any affected incumbent member shall serve out his or her term of office and that succeeding board members shall be nominated and elected in accordance with the method recommended by the county committee.

Whenever trustee areas are established in a district, provision shall be made for one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members.

In counties with a population of less than 25,000, the county committee on school district organization or the county board of education, if it has succeeded to the duties of the county committee, may at any time, by

resolution, with respect to trustee areas established for any school district, ~~other than a community college district,~~ amend the provision required by this section without additional approval by the electors, to require one of the alternate methods for electing board members to be utilized.

SUBJECT: APPROVE/RATIFY GENERAL WAIVER REQUEST FOR EQUITY LENGTH OF TIME EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2017

Background: Pursuant to *EC 37202*, transitional kindergarten (TK) programs operated by a district must be of equal length to any kindergarten programs operated by the same district, unless there is an approved State Board of Education waiver on file. By statute, the maximum school day in kindergarten is 4 hours (*EC 46110*). An exception to this statute allows schools that have adopted an early primary program (extended-day kindergarten) to exceed 4 hours (*EC 8973*). Furthermore, *EC 48000* states that a TK shall not be construed as a new program or higher level service. The number of required instructional minutes for TK is 36,000 minutes per year; the minimum length of instructional time that must be offered to constitute a school day is 180 minutes (*EC 46117* and *46201*).

Rationale: The District operates several full-day kindergarten programs, but all TK programs are half day. In order to avoid any Education Code penalty, the District is seeking to waive requirements under Education Code §37202.

Funding: Not applicable.

Recommendation: Approve/Ratify General Waiver Request for Equity Length of Time effective July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2017.

Our kindergarten class operates as part of an early primary program, pursuant to EC 8970-8974, and two of our seventeen programs exceeds the maximum four-hour instructional day. The extended day at the two sites is a site based decision using site funds. The other 15 sites vary in minutes from 37,022 - 37,922 instructional minutes per week which is beyond the state minimum requirement of 36,000 minutes per year. Transitional Kindergarten reflects the minutes of the 15 sites. Half-day Transitional Kindergarten allows our younger students to acclimate to the public school setting on a shorter time frame. Our TK students are exceeding the state requirements for instructional minutes.

The Board of Trustees encourages the enrollment and appropriate placement of all school-aged children in school. The Superintendent or designee shall inform parents/guardians of children entering a District school at any grade level about admission requirements and shall assist them with enrollment procedures.

Before enrolling any child in a District school, the Superintendent or designee shall verify the child's age, residency, immunization, and other applicable eligibility criteria specified in law, the accompanying administrative regulation, or other applicable Board policy or administrative regulation.

In the event the Superintendent or designee reasonably believes false or unreliable evidence of residency has been provided by a parent/guardian, the following procedures apply:

1. The Superintendent or designee shall identify circumstances upon which the District may initiate an investigation, which shall, at a minimum, require the District employee to be able to identify specific, articulable facts supporting the belief that the parent/guardian of the pupil has provided false or unreliable evidence for residency. Examples of such situations include, but are not limited to, altered documents; credible information from the property owner or neighbor that the student does not reside at the address provided; results of a home visit by a District employee indicating the student does not reside at the address provided; credible information from the student stating he/she does not reside at the address provided; and/or mail sent by the school returned from the address provided.
2. The Superintendent or designee may use reasonable investigatory methods, as appropriate, to determine residency. These methods may include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Review of documentation
 - b. Home visit by District personnel
 - c. Interview of student and parent/guardian
 - d. Contacting the landlord or neighbors regarding whether or not the student resides at the address provided
3. The Superintendent or designee may hire a private investigator if the investigatory methods described above are inconclusive to determine whether the pupil resides in the District.
4. For any investigation conducted pursuant to this policy, the District shall:
 - a. Prohibit the surreptitious photographing or video recording of pupils who are being investigated. For purposes of this policy, "surreptitious photographing or video recording" means the covert collection of photographic or video graphic images of persons or places subject to an investigation. For the purposes of this policy, the collection of images is not covert if the technology is used in an open and public view.
 - b. Require that the employees and contractors of the District engaged in the investigation must identify themselves truthfully as such to individuals contacted or interviewed during the course of the investigation.

5. If the District determines that the pupil does not meet the residency requirements for school attendance in the District, the District shall provide the parent/guardian with the basis for the determination. The parent/guardian may appeal this determination to the Assistant Superintendent of Personnel Services within 10 business days of determination. If an appeal is made, the burden shall be on the parent/guardian to show why the decision of the District should be overruled.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the enrollment of a homeless or foster child or a child of a military family is not delayed because of outstanding fees or fines owed to the child's last school or for his/her inability to produce previous academic, medical, or other records normally required for enrollment.

In addition, no child shall be denied enrollment in a District school solely on the basis of his/her arrest, adjudication by a juvenile court, formal or informal supervision by a probation officer, detention in a juvenile facility, enrollment in a juvenile court school, or other contact with the juvenile justice system.

When enrolling in any District school, including a school in their attendance area, children whose parents/guardians reside within District boundaries shall be subject to the timelines established by the Board for open enrollment. Children whose parents/guardians do not reside within the District or who are not otherwise eligible for enrollment in the District may apply for interdistrict attendance in accordance with the timelines specified in applicable Board policies and administrative regulations.

The District's enrollment application shall include information about the health care options and enrollment assistance available to families within the District. The District shall not discriminate against any child for not having health care coverage and shall not use any information relating to a child's health care coverage or his/her interest in learning about health care coverage in any manner that would harm the child or his/her family. (Education Code 49452.9)

~~The Board of Trustees believes that all children should have the opportunity to receive educational services. Staff shall encourage parents/guardians to enroll all school-aged children in school.~~

~~The Superintendent/designee shall maintain procedures, which provide for the verification of all entrance requirements specified in law and in Board policies and regulations.~~

~~Verification of residency is required for the first enrollment of any student within the District. If the student moves from the school attendance area of first enrollment into a different school attendance area, a new verification of residency will be required. Definition of "residency" includes District residency, foster care residency, McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act residency, and other provisions as set forth in the Education Code.~~

~~No child shall be unconditionally admitted to any District school without presentation of a fully documented immunization record as required by law, unless otherwise exempted.~~
