Moved by Minard Duncan, seconded by Hilda Sugarman and carried unanimously to approve proposed Board Bylaws 9011 (Disclosure of Confidential/Privileged Information) & 9100 (Organization), revised Board Bylaw 9110 (Terms of Office), and deletion of Board Bylaw 9120 (Officers and Auxiliary Personnel), including the amended sentence "The term of office for members elected in regular elections shall be four years, commencing on the second Tuesday in December next succeeding their election. Board members' terms expire four years after their initial election on the second Tuesday in December following the election of new members".

2c. In order to maximize utilization of available current school sites, maintain fiscal responsibility, and minimize movement of students from one attendance zone to another, the K-8 model, while voluntary, meets District needs. It is recommended that we now designate Robert C. Fisler School as a K-8 school, but phase it in from K-6, K-7 to K-8. Making this determination now will allow other sites to consider plans to move forward with K-8 models. We should also adjust boundaries where necessary to minimize size impact of new K-8

schools adding seventh and then eighth graders. It is also recommended to utilize the "target" school sizes as a guide for future growth or boundary adjustments.

Dr. McCune, Mr. Mark Douglas, Dr. Patricia Godfrey, and Dr. Linda Caillet presented and explained the PowerPoint entitled "Recommendations for Addressing Increased Enrollment" delineating the following topics: 1) Administration's Recommendation, 2) How Did We Get Here? 3) Boundary Committee Vote, 4) Goals, 5) Assumptions, 6) Enrollment Concerns, 7) Target School Sizes, 8) Current Junior High Attendance Area, 9) Financial Considerations for Addressing Increased Enrollment, 10) Estimated Fiscal Impact – Convert Robert C. Fisler School to K-8 – Target Enrollment 750, 11) Estimated Fiscal Impact – Convert K-6 to K-8 – Target Enrollment 600-1,000, 12) Estimated Fiscal Impact – Convert Beechwood from K-6 to 6-8 - Target Enrollment 600, 13) Estimated Fiscal Impact - Increase Parks Junior High -Target Enrollment 1,050, 14) Estimated Fiscal Impact – Expand Ladera Vista Junior High – Target Enrollment 1,200, 15) Estimated Fiscal Impact – Expand Nicolas Junior High – Target Enrollment 1,200, 16) Housing Future Elementary Students, 17) Cost Comparisons, 18) K-8 Cumulative Cost Analysis, 19) Total Junior High Option Costs, 20) Options and Affect on Capacity, 21) Boundary Adjustment Recommendations, 22) Implementation Plan for Fisler and Future K-8 Schools, 23) Timelines, 24) Former GATE Configuration Committee Votes, 25) Recommended Board Direction for GATE. Jackie Pearce, Principal of Fisler School, spoke to the Board in support of the K-6, K-7, and K-8 phase-in at Fisler School. Members of the community spoke to the Board and Cabinet regarding equity in the District, K-8 pros and cons, etc.

Moved by Hilda Sugarman, seconded by Ellen Ballard and carried unanimously to designate Robert C. Fisler School as a K-7 school, phase it in from K-7 to K-8, adjust boundaries where necessary to minimize size impact of new K-8 schools adding seventh and then eighth graders, and utilize the "target" school sizes as a guide for future growth or boundary adjustments.

2d. Approve revised allocation of supplemental grant funds.

Moved by Hilda Sugarman, seconded by Ellen Ballard and carried unanimously to approve revised allocation of supplemental grant funds.

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

<u>Background</u>: The Principal Training Program, authorized by Assembly Bill 75, provides funding to

districts for training principals and vice principals using the State Board of Education approved training providers. The training provides site administrators with skills and knowledge necessary for their challenging and complex roles as instructional leaders. Our selected program has been customized to meet the needs of the site leaders in the

Fullerton School District.

AB 75 requires 80 hours of Core Training and 80 hours of follow-up practicum. The practicum hours are tailored to the individual needs of the site administrators. Site Administrators have two years to complete the program.

The training account the existence to demplote the program.

The training covers three integrated modules designed to support site administrators: Module I, Leadership and Support of Student Instructional Programs (45 hours in-class training and 20 hours individual practicum); Module 2, Leadership and Management for Instructional Improvement: Maximizing Financial and Human Resources (15 hours inclass training and 20 hours individual practicum); and Module 3, Instructional Technology to Improve Pupil Performance (20 hours in-class training and 20 hours individual practicum).

The approved provider selected by the Fullerton School District is the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE). The OCDE program will provide site administrators with deep exploration of newly adopted instructional materials, mastering the use of formative and summative data, creating the CDE required single school plan, establishing the culture and climate in the new accountability system, aligning teacher observation and instructional support, maximizing the use of technology resources, optimizing site financial and personnel management. Principals and Assistant Principals will participate in Module 2, Maximizing Financial and Human Resources, this

winter. A copy of the consultant agreement is on file in the Superintendent's office.

The cost for Module 2, Maximizing Financial and Human Resources, is \$800.00 per participant. The total cost of all three modules is \$3,600.00 per participant. The California Department of Education AB 75 Grant and the Bill Gates Foundation will reimburse the District for the cost of training 16 principals and seven assistant principals. Four additional principals will participate in the Training to be

paid by Title II, Teacher/Principal Quality federal funds (217) for a total of \$3,200.00.

EDUCATION SCHOOL AND OVERNIGHT FIELD TRIP FOR VALENCIA PARK

INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL

Background: Pathfinder Ranch Outdoor Education School provides students opportunities to

experience "hands on" science activities that have been introduced in the classroom. There will be a variety of academic activities offered to students such as animal ecology, animal husbandry, entomology, environmental topics, ethnobotany, forest/chaparral ecology, fresh water ecology, geology, and nature

observation.

Prior to the overnight field trip, the 6th grade classes at Valencia Park Intermediate School will have practiced normal academic grade level skills in reading, writing, and math with special emphasis on geology, landform interpretation, and physical geography. This study will occur before and after the field trip and will serve to integrate into social science and language arts.

Extensive classroom activities will have prepared the students for what they will experience on the field trip. Classroom preparation and follow up will enhance the learning of the students as they have the opportunity to experience, first hand, what they have been studying.

One hundred-thirty students will attend along with participating teachers: Robert Rivera, Mike Hubbard, Steven Dorsey, Thuy Cat-Aurelio, and Elena Perez-Wallace. The cost of the four-day trip is \$125.00 per student. Copies of the agreement and field trip request are on file in the Superintendent's office.

There is no cost to District, and transportation costs are included in the fund-raising efforts. The cost per student is \$125.00. All students are strongly encouraged to participate. Fund-raising activities are planned so that all students may attend regardless of economic status. Funding: Not applicable.

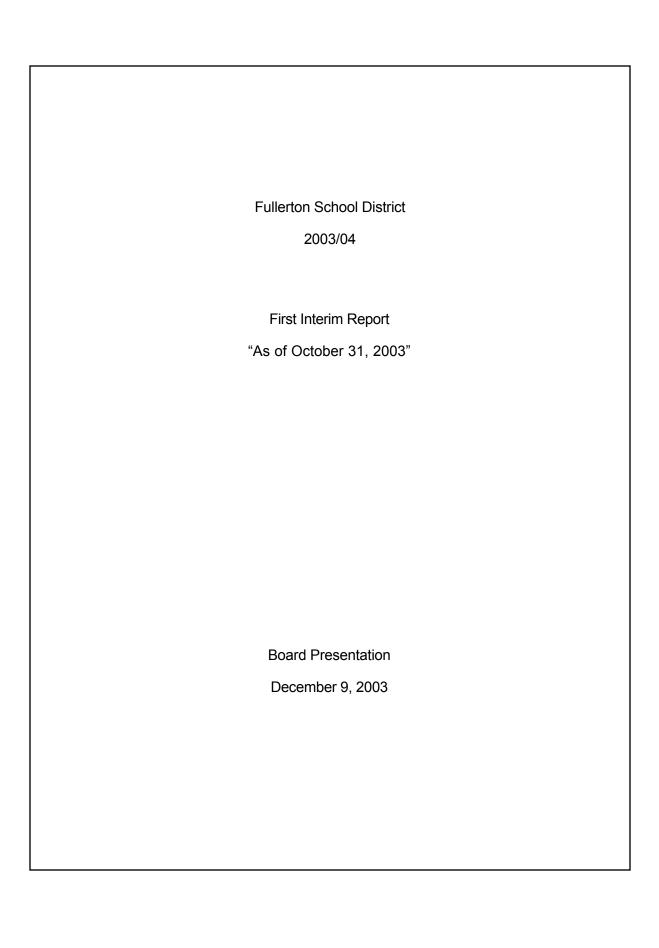

GENERAL FUND BALANCE

The general fund balance is projected to be \$5.8 million, reflecting \$2.1 million dollars deficit spending – prior to any salary and benefit settlements for this fiscal year. The overall 03/04 ending fund balance will exceed the AB 1200 3% recommended minimum reserve level. See the <u>General Fund Current and Future Years</u> section for information regarding Fullerton School District's potential financial difficulties in the following two years.

INCOME

Income is projected to be \$87.2 million, a \$2.5 million increase from the adopted budget. General Fund unrestricted income is unchanged from the adopted budget, and restricted income is projected to increase \$2.5 million. Accounting standards for restricted categorical programs require that unspent grants and entitlements be reduced from 03/04 budgets and re-appropriated in 04/05 after the fiscal year closes for 03/04, and thus final restricted income (and expense) will be less than currently budgeted. Future changes in projected lottery sales or interest income would serve to change General Fund income before the close of this school year, and changes will be reflected at year-end. The major highlights for both unrestricted and restricted income are listed below:

EXPENDITURES

Total expenditures are projected to be \$90.1 million, reflecting a \$0.9 million increase from the adopted budget. Unrestricted expenditure budgets were increased an additional \$1.5 million to reflect District action to un-restrict 02/03 restricted carryover of \$0.9 million as allowed by SBX1 18 late last year. This money was reallocated to the sites from which it came. An additional \$0.6 million of 03/04 School Improvement Supplemental Grant funds were unrestricted by designating these funds be redirected to Home to School Transportation. A corresponding decline in the general fund contribution for transportation encroachment has been reallocated to school sites in the amounts they were reduced from their School Improvement budgets. These two actions are intended to give school sites additional flexibility to address the unrestricted and restricted budget cuts they have endured beginning with the 02/03 budget year. Adjustments to salary and benefit projections resulted in equivalent reductions to unrestricted expenditure budgets, thus making unrestricted expenditures appear unchanged from Adopted Budget to First Interim.

Restricted expenditures are projected to increase \$0.9 million. Any additional unspent categorical funds as of June 30 will be reduced from 03/04 budgets and re-appropriated in the 04/05 year. As a point of information, at the end of the 02/03 year, \$3.0 million was reduced from appropriations (restricted fund balance and deferred revenue and expense) and re-appropriated in the 03/04 year. Collective Bargaining negotiations have not been completed with any bargaining units for this 03/04 year. The required AB1200 disclosure and corresponding budget adjustments will be presented to the Board as settlements are reached. Special education encroachment is projected to decrease \$0.3 million from the adopted budget. Student Services was able to fund \$0.1 million through use of their LEA MediCal funding. This decreases the total budgeted encroachment for the special education program (excluding special education transportation encroachment of \$0.1 million) to \$3.0 million for this 03/04 year. Encroachment last year was \$2.9 million. This increase in encroachment of \$0.1 million is a 2% increase above the prior year. Transportation encroachment is now budgeted at \$0.1 million for regular and special education home-to-school transportation as a result of the various categorical related adjustments.

GENERAL FUND CURRENT AND FUTURE YEARS

The District's First Interim Report incorporates the state 03/04 Adopted Budget approved in October 2003 and District audited financials for 02/03. District administration and Board direction was to "tighten belts" midway through the 02/03 year, resulting in a \$0.7 million increase to the 03/04 beginning fund balance! Thankfully, newly elected Governor Schwarzenegger's proposed mid-year cuts to the state budget did not include the K-12 education budget. There is concern with the Governor's proposal to rewrite the Proposition 98 calculation for future years. His proposal would limit K-12 funding to the current year low levels with no possibility to recapture the money K-12 has lost in these last two years. The current calculation would allow schools to recapture this funding when the state's revenues increase during an economic rebound. Further increasing the state budget deficit by \$4 billion is the repeal of the vehicle license fee implemented by former Governor Davis a few months earlier. This increased state deficit could lead to a larger Revenue Limit deficit.

Current year assumptions include a funded COLA of negative 1.2%, or a loss of \$0.7 M. Student growth projections of 200 (190 ADA) offsets this loss by adding \$0.8 M. Assumptions for future year projections include state COLAs of 2.1% (04/05) and 2.3% (05/06) however, these COLA increases are offset by continuing deficits in the revenue limit. Currently, 04/05 and 05/06 are projected to have revenue limit deficits of 5.0% for each year, thus eliminating any COLA increase. The historical employee attrition rate has been assumed for 04/05 and 05/06. Growth in pupil ADA is currently projected to increase 175 for 04/05 and 150 for 05/06. The statewide trend of ADA softening is partially offset by the added impact of two residential developments beginning to generate students this 03/04 school year. The District is constantly grappling with funding facility needs to house student enrollment increases. The current General Fund contribution of \$175,000 for annual growth facilities is greatly reduced from prior year annual amounts of \$600,000. Years 04/05 and 05/06 are budgeted at ZERO General Fund contributions in order to lessen the deficit spending of the general fund. Attendance boundary changes are anticipated to alleviate the need for additional growth facilities in growing areas. Developer Fees and other facility funds will be used to rent and/or purchase additional portable facilities if they are needed. Existing portable rental obligations are funded through the 05/06 year. Between now and the end of 05/06, it is anticipated the District may be able to remove some of these rental portables due to attendance boundary changes. If all rented portables are retained beyond 05/06, the cost benefit of rented versus purchased will need to be evaluated. The General Fund may be the funding source, or remaining one-time facility funds, or a combination of the two.

Salaries and employee benefits are not settled with any employee groups. January 2004 health and welfare premium increases result in additional expense of \$500,000 in the General Fund this fiscal year. Unemployment insurance has increased significantly. What cost the District \$20,000 last year is projected to cost the district \$45,000 this year. Other major factors impacting the General Fund include: Continuation of Class Size Reduction grades 1 and 2 Option 1, grade K Option 2; \$570,000 annual COP payment used to partially modernize twelve (12) schools in 99/00; years 04/05 and 05/06 the COP debt service payment paid from Building Fund reserves established by the Board of Trustees in 1999 for times of economic shortfall, thus draining reserves in this fund. The General Fund will resume making the annual payment in the 06/07 year; transportation encroachment is currently \$0.1 million for home-to-school transportation (regular and special education), due to reallocation of \$600,000 Supplemental Grant income from School Improvement funds and a Mega Item transfer of \$200,000 from School Improvement to regular home to school transportation; School sites have been allocated \$600,000 in unrestricted discretionary funds to offset the Supplemental Grant reallocation; special education operational encroachment is budgeted at \$3.0 million; no additional facilities for special education classrooms or support facilities are budgeted for future years.

OTHER FUNDS

The District's other funds are projected to have zero or positive fund balances.

<u>Background</u>: This Action Item presentation provides information on a new pilot program to be

implemented at Rolling Hills School in the Preschool Kindergarten Special Day Classroom. IDEA 97 indicates that preschool special education students should be integrated with nontypical peers for a portion of their program. The District, to date, has not had a preschool special education program with nondisabled peers available for this population and therefore has incurred

additional costs of nonpublic school placements for these children.

This program would bring typical same-age peers from the Rolling Hills attendance area into the special day class on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday to participate in the preschool program. The program will integrate typical peers with the special education students. Research has proven that children with disabilities learn from models of children without special needs.

A developmental curriculum will incorporate activities to stimulate language, fine and gross motor skills, creativity, problem solving abilities, and positive self-esteem. The preschool class will have one typical peer for each two to three children with special needs. Parent participation is encouraged but not mandated. The "Peer Buddies" will fill out a kindergarten enrollment packet. They must present a birth certificate and proof of current immunizations. The families participating in the program will be required to pay a minimal monthly fee of \$25.00 to cover program costs.

IMPLEMENTATION OF A POSITION CONTROL MODULE AND CUSTOMIZED

PROGRAMMING OF A HUMAN RESOURCES MODULE

<u>Background:</u> The District's Business Department has been using an outdated, "stand alone"

employee tracking software program originally implemented in the late 1980s. This software is no longer supported by the vendor. The District's Personnel Departments each maintain personnel data in independent spreadsheets or database software

programs.

The District has researched options and concluded a customized version of a Human Resources module is best. This will give the District the best possible solution to automate and integrate some of the Personnel and Fiscal Department functions. In addition, the ability to track, budget, and report all elements contained in this database is

an attribute.

The ultimate goal is to have an integrated database accessible to the Personnel and Business Departments, (i.e. "real time" data). Full integration for automated budget and encumbrance of salaries and benefits in the general ledger would eventually require a conversion from the current BiTech financial system to the Smartetools, LLC financial software. Conversion is possible in the next few years, but not a requirement of this contract.

The Position Control and HR software implementation cost is \$75,000. The annual license fee for the position control module is less than the annual license fee for the corresponding OCDE BiTech HR module. The license fee for the finance module would also be less than the current OCDE BiTech fee for finance. Two servers will also be purchased to run the HR software. This is a one-time cost estimated to be no more than \$25,000. Because OCDE payroll data is maintained on a customized program, an interface for data exchange (\$50,000) would also be a one-time cost if full integration is desired in the future.

There are additional programming options for enhancements the District would like to consider to expand the software. These options include applicant tracking (\$15,000) as well as allowing data flow to and from the current databases (\$10,000), and a web interface (\$15,000) for site access. These enhancements are optional, can be initiated at any time during the length of this contract, and are not currently budgeted.
