The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent's Office with supporting documents and information. The Board President and Superintendent shall decide whether a request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. Items not within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board may not be placed on the agenda. In addition, the Board President and/or Superintendent shall determine if the item is merely a request for information or whether the issue is covered by an existing policy or administrative regulation before placing the item on the agenda.

PUBLIC COMMENTS/PERSONS ADDRESSING THE BOARD – The Board meeting follows rules of decorum. Per Board Bylaw 9323, the Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board on any item of interest to the public that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, either before or during the Board's consideration of the item. At a time so designated on the agenda at a regular meeting, members of the public may bring before the Board-matters that are not listed on the agenda that are within the jurisdiction of the Board. The Board shall take no action or have discussion on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, except as authorized by law. Furthermore, the Board may respond to the public by referring the comment/question to the Superintendent for a response or by asking the Superintendent to report back to the Board concerning the matter.

Persons wishing to address the Board are requested to complete and submit a "Request to Speak" slip to the secretary. A person wishing to be heard by the Board shall first be recognized by the President and shall then proceed to comment, beginning with stating his/her name for the record. Individual speakers shall be allowed three minutes to address the Board on each agenda or nonagenda item. The Board limits the total time for public input on each item to 20 minutes. The total time allowed for public comment shall be 30 minutes. Public comments about an item that is on the posted agenda will be heard at the time the agenda item is considered by the Board. Public comments about an item that is not on the posted agenda will be heard at the beginning of the Board meeting agenda. With Board consent, the President may increase or decrease the time allowed for public presentation, depending on the topic and the number of persons wishing to be heard. The President may take a poll of speakers for or against a particular issue and may ask that additional persons speak only if they have something new to add.

SUBJECT: APPROVE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE CALIFORNIA SCHOOL CLIMATE, HEALTH, AND LEARNING SURVEY SYSTEM (CAL-SCHLS) AS THEY RELATE TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE CALIFORNIA HEALTHY KIDS SURVEY (CHKS) FOR THE 2013/2014 SCHOOL YEAR

- Background: The California Healthy Kids Survey is designed to produce data representative of all students in each school district, but not necessarily all students in the State of California. The survey is one of the assessment tools utilized in conjunction with the Coordinated School Health and Wellness Policy Report whose purpose is to ensure a total school environment that will promote and support student health and wellness.
- The California Healthy Kids Survey is mandated by the State of California Rationale: Department of Education to be administered every two years for students in grades 5, 7, 9 and 11 and meets a requirement of the Federal No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB). Fullerton School District is administering only those sections of the survey that are required by the State of California Department of Education. The State of California Department of Education funded the CHKS to assist schools in preventing youth health-risk behaviors and in promoting positive youth development, resilience and wellbeing. The survey provides elementary schools with the developmentally appropriate data they need to guide the implementation of health, prevention and youth development programs. The survey data will help guide the development of prevention programs targeting specific risk behaviors, as well as fostering youth assets and resilience that protect against these behaviors. Students in grade 5 must have parental permission to take the exam; students in grade 7 must have a letter from a parent if they wish to be excluded from the exam.
- <u>Funding:</u> The cost to the District to survey students in grades 5 and 7 will be paid from School Safety budget 352, not to exceed \$3,500.00.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Approve Memorandum of Understanding between Fullerton School District and the California School Climate, Health, and Learning Survey system (Cal-SCHLS) as they relate to the administration of the California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) for the 2013/2014 school year.

DISTRICT NAME:

This agreement outlines conditions to be met by the above named district and the California School Climate, Health, and Learning Survey System (Cal–SCHLS) Regional Center as they relate to the administration of the CHKS. The answer sheets will not be sent until a signed copy (or fax) of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is received.

DISTRICT AGREES TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

SURVEY ADMINISTRATION

- » **Grades and Schools.** Survey grades 5 through 12 as appropriate within the district. Please note: to receive the CDE subsidized price of 30 cents per enrollment number or target sample, the district must administer the Core Survey to grades 7 and 9 every two years.
- » **Parent Consent.** Follow the active parental consent process with grades below seven, and either active or passive parental consent with grade seven and above (model consent forms will be provided).
- » Follow written school board policy for active and/or passive consent, and provide notification to parents of the approximate date(s) of survey administration and the availability of survey instruments for review at school and/or district offices. This is required regardless of consent type.
- » **Privacy of Students.** When the students are taking the online survey, steps must be taken to insure that no other person, INCLUDING the teacher and other students, can see the monitor and how the student is answering. Privacy on either side and behind the student is essential to ensure honest answers and useful data.
- » Coordination. Provide one, district-level contact person for each participating district.
- » Surveys. Administer the Elementary survey to elementary students, and the Core Module A.
- » Use only the most recent, current version of the survey and the answer sheet provided by the county office of education and/or WestEd.
- » Expectations to deliver reports within eight to twelve weeks are contingent on use of correct versions of the survey instrument and answer sheets or online survey system. CAL-SCHLS is not responsible for transferring data from incorrect to correct answer sheets.

PAYMENT

- » For CDE subsidized surveys pay the 30 cents per student enrollment or target sample.
- » Postage and handling will be added to the total amount charged.
- » Additional fees apply for custom administrations and modules, answer sheet rush orders, school reports, data on disk, etc. The district or county organization is always responsible for these additional fees. Please see below for fees.

- B. An appropriate class subject or class period was identified and used.
- C. 100% of selected classrooms participated.

- D. The number of completed, usable answer forms or online submissions obtained per grade was 60% or more of the selected sample, or
- E. If active parental consent is used, 70% or more parents within each grade's selected sample returned signed permission forms, either consenting or not consenting to their child's participation.

If active consent is used and less than 60 percent of parents have not consented to their child's participation two days before the scheduled administration date, the survey should be postponed until either condition D or E can be met. *Note: If less than 25 students take the survey in a specific grade, the district may not be eligible for a report in that grade.*

SCHOOL CLIMATE SURVEY FOR STAFF

- » Conduct the online California School Climate Survey (CSCS) at each school participating in the district's CHKS. To facilitate planning and administration, this should be done around the same time the students are taking the CHKS.
- » The survey must be anonymous and should be offered to all staff working with grades five through twelve, as well as by all staff involved in health, safety, and prevention. It may also be completed by other school staff at the district's discretion.
- » Staff participation is voluntary. Staff who do not wish to participate shall not be required to do so.
- » There are no additional fees for the basic administration of the CSCS. Additional fees will be charged for custom work.

OTHER MISCELLANEOUS CONDITIONS

- » Read the *Guidebook for the California Healthy Kids Survey, Part I: Administration*, paying special attention to the section on active and passive consent procedures. In BOTH cases, specific tasks MUST be completed to insure that the rights of parents and pupils are protected.
- » Read the Guidebook for the California Healthy Kids Survey, Part III: School Climate Survey for Teachers and Other Staff.
- » Provide current student enrollment figures (or target sample if you are sampling) for all schools by grade level, and provide accurate staff counts by school.
- » Produce from the master copy the number of questionnaires needed.

2013-2014 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Agreement is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and Charissa A. Powers, Certified Auditory-Verbal Therapist hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services</u> to be provided by Contractor: **Provide assessment and consultation** services for determining auditory and verbal needs of students with disabilities in the District.

2. <u>Term</u>. Contractor shall commence providing services under this Agreement on **September 12, 2013** and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by **June 30, 2014**.

3. <u>Compensation</u>. District agrees to pay the Contractor for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement a total fee not to exceed Ten Thousand dollars (\$10,000.00). Payment shall be made at the rate of Seven Hundred Fifty dollars per comprehensive speech, language and auditory skill evaluation, One Hundred Fifty dollars (\$150.00) per hour for auditory verbal therapy, One Hundred Fifty dollars (\$150.00) per hour for consultation with IEP and mainstream support, One Hundred Fifty dollars (\$150.00) per hour for IEP attendance (each family to receive one IEP attendance per year at no charge). Contractor shall submit a detailed invoice to District for services satisfactorily rendered in performance of the required services under the terms of this Agreement.

4. <u>Expenses</u>. District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing services for District, except as follows: N/A.

5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Contractor, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees as they relate to the services to be provided under this Agreement. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.

6. <u>Materials</u>. Contractor shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement. Contractor's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

7. <u>Originality of Services</u>. Contractor agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the District and/or used in connection with this Agreement, shall be wholly original to Contractor and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to Contractor by District as a basis for such services.

8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>. Contractor understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. District shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the District.

9. <u>Standard for Performance</u>. The parties acknowledge that the District, in selecting the Contractor to perform the services hereunder, is relying upon the Contractor's reputation for excellence in the performance of the services required hereunder. The Contractor shall perform the services in the manner of one who is a recognized specialist in the types of services to be performed. Time is of the essence in this Agreement. All deadlines set forth in the Agreement are binding and may be modified only by subsequent written agreement of the parties.

10. <u>Termination</u>. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; (b) any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency. Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within thirty (30) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the thirty (30) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the District may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the District exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to

this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the Contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District. Written notice by District shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

11. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. Contractor agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the District and its Governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the Contractor or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this Agreement, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the District's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property, caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the Contractor, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this Agreement.

12. <u>Insurance</u>. The Contractor, at his/her sole cost and expense, shall insure its activities in connection with the services under this Agreement and shall obtain, keep in force, and maintain insurance as follows:

a. Comprehensive or Commercial Form General Liability Insurance (contractual liability included) with limits as follows: (minimum limits)

(3)	Personal and Advertising Injury	\$1,000,000
(4)	General Aggregate (Not Applicable to the	\$1,000,000

b. Business Automobile Liability Insurance for owned, scheduled, non-owned, or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. (Required only if the Contractor drives on behalf of the District in the course of performing services.)

c. Professional Liability Insurance with a limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, if applicable.

d. Workers' Compensation as required by California State law.

It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage and limits referred to under a., b., and c. above shall not in any way limit the liability of the Contractor. The Contractor shall furnish the District with certificates of insurance evidencing compliance with all requirements no later than five (5) business days from execution of this Agreement and prior to commencing services under this Agreement. Contractor agrees to provide a thirty (30) day written notice to District of cancellation, modification, or reduction in any insurance coverage required pursuant to this section. Such certificates shall:

- (1) Indicate that the District and its Governing Board, officers, and employees have been endorsed as additional insureds under the coverages referred to under a., and b., and:
- (2) Include a provision that the coverages will be primary and will not participate with not be excess over any valid and collectible insurance or program of self-insurance carried or maintained by the District.

13. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor. Any such assignment shall be null and void and shall be deemed a basis for termination of this Agreement.

14. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the District and shall be subject to the District's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. Contractor agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to Contractor, Contractor's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such services.

15. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this Agreement.

16. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.

17. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement.

18. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. Contractor agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, marital status or age of such persons.

19. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of District or Contractor to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

20. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section.

22. <u>Attorney Fees/Costs</u>. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorneys' fees.

2013-2014 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Agreement is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and **Dayle McIntosh Center For The Disabled** hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

Therefore, geotechnical consultant recommended the complete removal of the remaining asphalt, potential soil replacement, and additional asphalt installation. The additional work and potential soil replacement were beyond the change order limit, resulting in a new public bid for the remaining work. This change order credits the District for the work not completed on the original contract.

- SUBJECT: APPROVE/RATIFY AGREEMENT BETWEEN FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT AND ORANGE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS, ORANGE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (OCDE) FOR PROVISION OF POSITIVE BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTION AND SUPPORTS (PBIS) AND VIOLENCE PREVENTION EDUCATION SERVICES EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2014
- Background: Improving student academic and behavior outcomes is about ensuring all students have access to the most effective and accurately implemented instructional and behavioral practices and interventions possible. Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS) provide an operational framework for achieving these outcomes. More importantly, PBIS is not a curriculum, intervention, or practice, but is a decision-making framework that guides selection, integration, and implementation of the best evidence-based academic and behavioral practices for improving important academic and behavior outcomes for all students. In general, PBIS emphasizes four integrated elements: (a) data for decision making, (b) measurable outcomes supported and evaluated by data, (c) practices with evidence that these outcomes are achievable, and (d) systems that efficiently and effectively support implementation of these practices.
- Rationale: Participating schools are delegated into different tier/cohort groups and will benefit from PBIS trainings. School teams are comprised of teachers, support staff, and site administrator who will participate in the trainings and redesign their student behavior systems. The PBIS tiered behavior system compliments the Response to Intervention (RtI) pyramid, which is already implemented into Fullerton School District schools. The participating schools are as follows:

- <u>Funding:</u> The cost is not to exceed \$17,500 and is to be paid from the Unrestricted General Fund.
- Recommendation: Approve/Ratify Agreement between Fullerton School District and Orange County Superintendent of Schools, Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) for Provision of Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS) and Violence Prevention Education Services effective July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.

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FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT INCOME AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into this 1st day of July, 2013, by and between the Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa, California 92626, hereinafter referred to as SUPERINTENDENT, and Fullerton School District, 1401 West Valencia Dr., Fullerton, California 92833, hereinafter referred to as DISTRICT. SUPERINTENDENT and DISTRICT shall be collectively referred to as the Parties.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows: 1.0 <u>SCOPE OF WORK</u>. DISTRICT hereby engages SUPERINTENDENT as an independent contractor to perform the following described work and SUPERINTENDENT hereby agrees to perform said work upon the terms and

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1 conditions hereinafter set forth. Specifically, SUPERINTENDENT shall
2 provide the following services:

1.1 Provide support to district-wide PBIS implementation by
providing PBIS Leadership Team Training as described in the "Service
Delivery Plan Proposal for Fullerton School District" attached as
Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference herein.

2.0 <u>TERM</u>. This AGREEMENT shall commence on July 1, 2013 and end on June 30, 2014.

COMPENSATION. DISTRICT agrees to pay the SUPERINTENDENT for 3.0 services satisfactorily performed pursuant to Section 1.0 of this AGREEMENT the sum of Seventeen thousand five hundred dollars (\$17,500.00). DISTRICT'S payment to SUPERINTENDENT shall be made upon receipt of an itemized invoice from SUPERINTENDENT in duplicate. Payment shall be mailed to: Orange County Superintendent of Schools, Attn: Accounting Manager, 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa, California 92626-9050, or at such other place as SUPERINTENDENT may designate in writing.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. SUPERINTENDENT, in the performance of 4.0 this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. SUPERINTENDENT understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. SUPERINTENDENT assumes the full responsibility for the

1 acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate 2 to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. SUPERINTENDENT 3 shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, 4 social security and income taxes with respect to SUPERINTENDENT'S 5 employees. 6

5.0 HOLD HARMLESS.

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8 DISTRICT hereby agrees to defend all claims of loss, and Α. indemnify and hold harmless SUPERINTENDENT, the Orange County Board of Education, and its officers, agents, and employees from any and all liability and claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease, or death of any person or persons, or damage to any property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of CONTRACTOR, its officers, agents or employees, or the negligent condition of the property used, in the performance of this AGREEMENT.

SUPERINTENDENT hereby agrees to defend all claims of loss, and indemnify and hold harmless DISTRICT, its Governing Board, officers, agents and employees from any and all liability and claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease, or death, or death of any person or persons, or damage to any property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of SUPERINTENDENT, its officers, agents or employees, or subcontractors, in the performance of this AGREEMENT.

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9.0 <u>NOTICE</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. As of the date of this AGREEMENT, the addresses of the parties are as follows:

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10.0 <u>NON WAIVER</u>. The failure of SUPERINTENDENT or DISTRICT to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

11.0 <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any term, condition or provision of this AGREEMENT is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.

12.0 <u>GOVERNING LAW</u>. The terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California.

2013-2014 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Agreement is hereby entered into between the Fullerton School District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and <u>Arleen Bates</u> hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

d. Workers' Compensation as required by California State law.

It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage and limits referred to under a., b., and c. above shall not in any way limit the liability of the Contractor. The Contractor shall furnish the District with certificates of insurance evidencing compliance with all requirements no later than five (5) business days from execution of this Agreement and prior to commencing services under this Agreement. Contractor agrees to provide a thirty (30) day written notice to District of cancellation, modification, or reduction in any insurance coverage required pursuant to this section. Such certificates shall:

- (1) Indicate that the District and its Governing Board, officers, and employees have been endorsed as additional insureds under the coverages referred to under a., and b., and:
- (2) Include a provision that the coverages will be primary and will not participate with not be excess over any valid and collectible insurance or program of self-insurance carried or maintained by the District.

13. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor. Any such assignment shall be null and void and shall be deemed a basis for termination of this Agreement.

14. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the District and shall be subject to the District's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. Contractor agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to Contractor, Contractor's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such services.

15. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this Agreement.

16. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.

17. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement.

18. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. Contractor agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, marital status or age of such persons.

19. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of District or Contractor to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement, shall not be

deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

20. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section.

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of text books and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose, and;

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119, the Board is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the District, and bargaining unit leaders, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to provide 10-days' notice of the public hearings, and;

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district, and;

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teacher and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the District and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the State board of those subjects, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 24, 2013, which is on or before the eighth week of school and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board is required to make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the District has, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 or 60605.8 and Education Code Section 33126(b)(6) in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board:

- (i) Mathematics,
- (ii) Science,
- (iii) History-social science,
- (iv) English / language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program and Intensive Intervention,
- (v) Visual & Performing Arts.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing board makes the determination that each pupil of the District, has available sufficient textbooks and instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 or 60605.8 and Education Code Section 33126(b)(6) in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and

cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2013/2014 school year, the Fullerton School District, has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 or 60605.8 and Education Code Section 33126(b)(6) in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board for those subjects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2013/2014 school year, that the governing board of the Fullerton School District hereby certifies that as of this date, each pupil in the District in transitional kindergarten through grade eight has been provided with a standards-aligned textbook or basic instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the State Board in the areas of history/social science, mathematics, reading/language arts, science, and to each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course.
