


Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)

- The Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) is a requirement of LCFF Funding.
- LCFF funds every student in California at the same *base rate*, but districts receive varying amounts of additional funding based upon:
 - The <u>number of students</u> from the following target groups (*supplemental funding*):
 - English Learners
 - **■** Foster Youth
 - **■** Low-Income Students
 - Whether or not one or more of the above groups represent <u>55% or more of students</u> in the district (*concentration funding-FSD* not eligible)

What are the requirements of LCFF?

Key LCFF Requirements

Engage stakeholders in the development of a strategic plan

that explains how the district will use this funding to address 8 state priorities

and report on annual progress toward meeting those priorities.

This plan is called the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP)

LCAP goals, actions, and expenditures must be aligned to one or more of the 8 state priorities.


