- ☐ STATE BUDGET ACT IS PREDICATED ON THE PASSAGE OF MAY 19TH BALLOT MEASURES
  - ☐ IF THE MEASURES DON'T PASS, THE COST TO THE STATE WOULD BE APPROX. \$6 BILLION

### STATE PROPOSITIONS

- PROP. 1A RAINY DAY FUND
- ☐ PROP. 1B K-14 EDUCATION WOULD RECEIVE \$9.3 BILLION IN LIEU OF MAINTENANCE FACTORS UNDER PROP. 98
- PROP. 1C LOTTERY MODERNIZATION ACT. \$5 BILLION AT STATE
- PROP. 1D TAKE CHILD DEVELOPMENT MONIES
- PROP. 1E DIVERT MENTAL HEALTH MONIES
- PROP. 1F STATE OFFICERS SALARIES

STATE AND FEDERAL ECONOMY CONTINUE TO DETERIORATE
CALIFORNIA UNEMPLOYMENT = 11.2% - HIGHEST SINCEJUNE OF 1941
☐ UCLA ECONOMISTS PROJECT ECONOMY WILL  CONTINUE TO DETERIORATE THROUGH MID 2010  WITH UNEMPLOYMENT RISING TO OVER 12%

#### WHAT CAN WE EXPECT?

- ☐ LAO PROJECTS \$8 BILLION DEFICIT
- ☐ LAO PROJECTS \$3.6 BILLION DROP IN PROP. 98

  GUARANTEE THAT WOULD RESULT IN A \$600-\$1000 CUT

  PER ADA IN MID 2009/2010
- MANY HOLES IN THE BUDGET ACT. IT COULD TAKE SIX MONTHS INTO THE NEW BUDGET YEAR TO GET ACTION FROM THE LEGISLATURE
- ☐ WE ARE ADVISED TO ANTICIPATE FURTHER FUNDING REDUCTIONS IN 2009/2010 BASED ON LEGISLATIVE ACTION

## AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT (ARRA)

- ☐ FEDERAL MONEY WILL COME IN THREE FORMS, BUT THE LAO ADDS NOTES OF CAUTION (TITLE 1, IDEA, SFSF)
- ☐ MAXIMIZE THE BENEFIT OF FED FUNDS TO THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND
- RECOGNIZE THAT THESE ARE ONE TIME DOLLARS
- MONEY SHOULD BE USED FOR STATE PURPOSES SUCH AS PAYING OF MANDATED OBLIGATIONS OR PURCHASING A STATEWIDE DATA SYSTEM
- ☐ EDUCATION WAS NOT ON THE LAO'S RADAR SCREEN

## AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT (ARRA)

- ☐ "CURRENTLY THERE ARE MANY UNKNOWNS INCLUDING THE ACTUAL ALLOCATIONS TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS, WHEN THE FUNDING WILL BE RECEIVED, AND A DETERMINATION OF ALLOWABLE USES. THEREFORE, FUNDING FROM THE ARRA SHOULD NOT BE BUDGETED UNTIL YOU RECEIVE OFFICIAL NOTIFICATION OF AN ALLOCATION."

### TITLE I

- ☐ FOLLOW THE CURRENT TITLE I ALLOCATION FORMULAS
  AND "SUPPLEMENT NOT SUPPLANT"
- REQUIRED SET ASIDES
  - ☐ 5% FOR HIGHLY QUALIFIED TEACHER TRAINING
  - ☐ 20% FOR SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES FOR PROGRAM IMPROVEMENT
- SCHOOLS MAY BE REQUIRED TO DEMONSTRATE HOW
  THE FUNDS WERE USED TO IMPROVE STUDENT
  PERFORMANCE

# INDIVIDUAL DISABILITIES EDUCATION ACT (IDEA)

THESE MONIES, DESIGNATED FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION, WILL FLOW TO THE SELPAS AND TO DISTRICT'S BASED ON REGULATIONS STILL TO BE FORTHCOMING

## STATE FISCAL STABILIZATION FUNDS

- "WE STILL DO NOT HAVE INFORMATION
  RELATIVE TO WHEN ALLOCATIONS WILL BE
  POSTED, THE METHODOLOGY FOR
  ALLOCATIONS, AND RESTRICTIONS ON USES
  OF THE FUND OR THE REPORTING
  REQUIREMENTS."

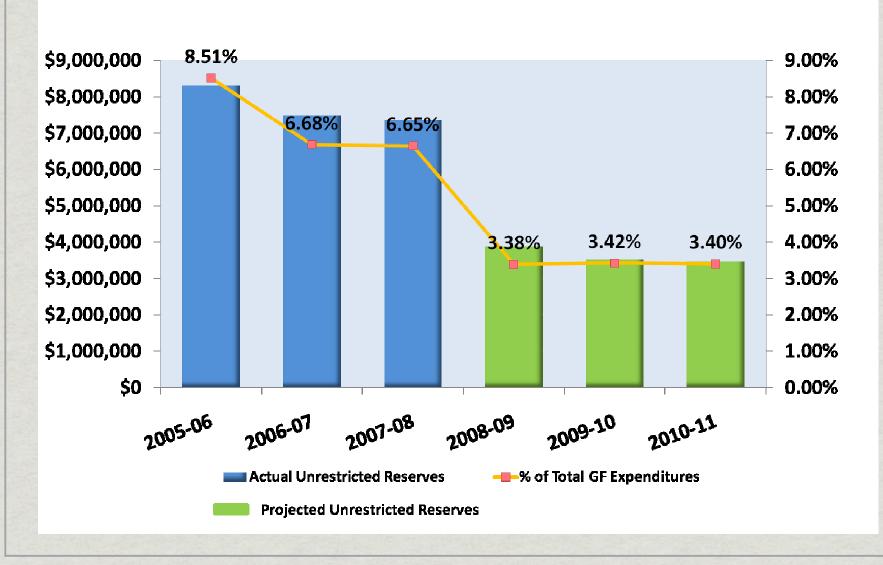
### CATEGORICAL FUNDING

- THE BUDGET ACT REDUCES MOST CATEGORICAL
  FUNDING BY 15.4% FOR 2008/2009 AND ADDITIONAL 4.5%
  IN 2009/2010. MOST STATE CATEGORICAL PROGRAMS
  HAVE FLEXIBILITY FOR THE USE OF THE FUNDS.
- MANY UNANSWERED QUESTIONS RE:FLEXIBILITY
- THESE FLEXIBILITY PROVISIONS ARE IN EFFECT FOR FIVE YEARS, 2008/2009 THROUGH 2012/2013

## RESERVES FOR ECONOMIC UNCERTAINTIES

OUR 3% RESERVE REQUIREMENTS
HAVE NOT CHANGED. THIS IS
CONSIDERED A BARE MINIMUM.

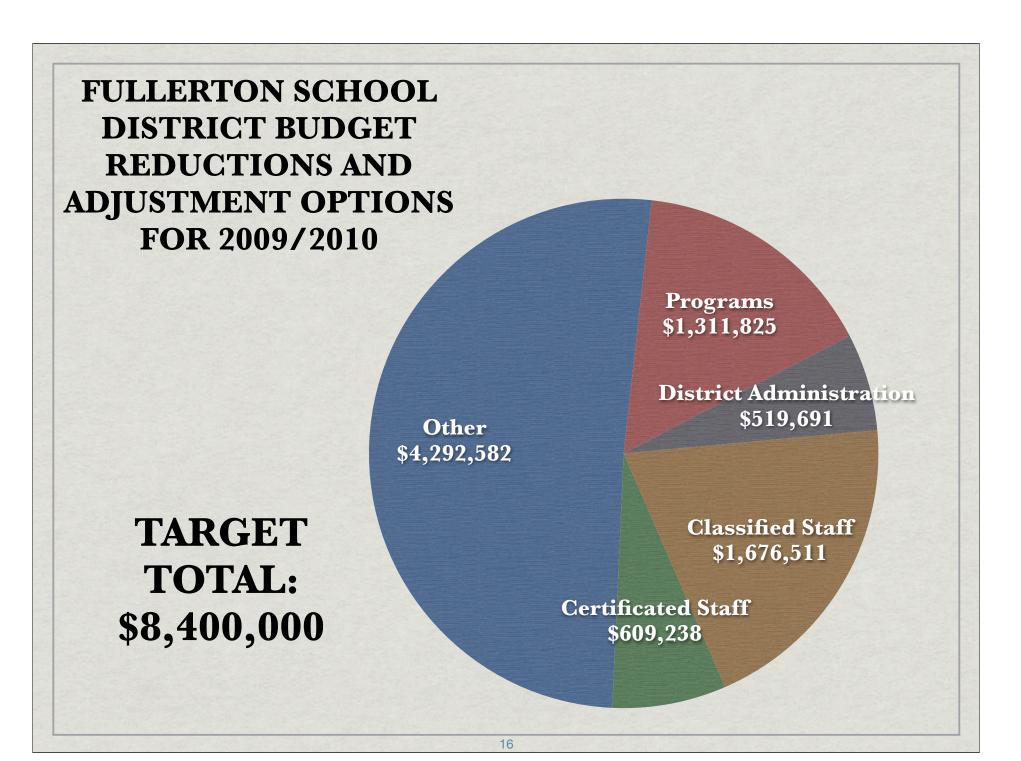
- "WE ADVISE DISTRICTS TO ADHERE TO THE MAY 15TH

  GOVERNOR'S JUNE 8TH REVISION OR FUTURE
  LEGISLATION."

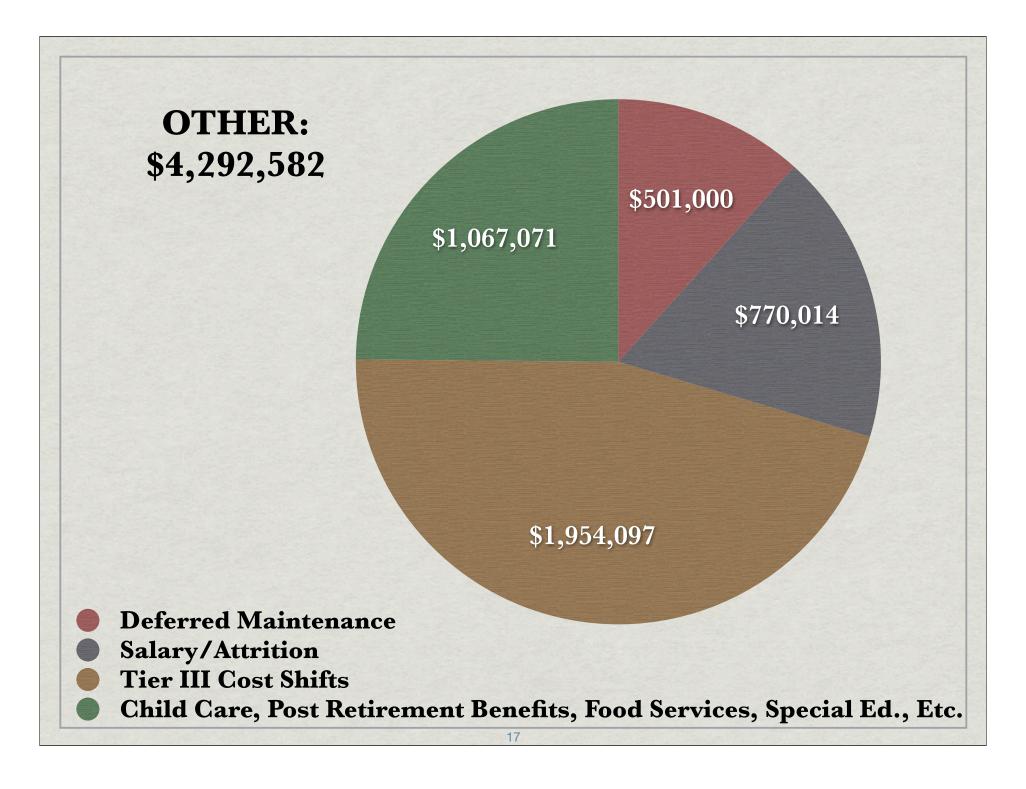
### CASH MANAGEMENT

- ☐ THE STATE BUDGET ACT DEFERS \$2 BILLION IN REVENUE
  LIMIT FUNDS AS WELL AS \$570 MILLION IN CSR K-3
  PAYMENTS FROM FEBRUARY TO JULY 2009
- ☐ IN ADDITION, \$1 BILLION IN REVENUE LIMIT

  APPORTIONMENTS ARE DEFERRED FROMJULY TO

  OCTOBER 2009
- \$1.5 BILLION IS DEFERRED FROM AUGUST TO OCTOBER 2009
- ☐ MANAGEMENT OF CASH FLOW IS CRITICAL

### CONCLUSION

"... WE BELIEVE THAT THERE IS A STRONG INDICATION THAT THERE WILL BE FURTHER MID-YEAR REDUCTIONS IN 09/10. WE DO NOT BELIEVE THAT SCHOOL DISTRICTS WILL RECEIVE BOTH THE ARRA FUNDS AND THE ENACTED BUDGET ALLOCATIONS. WE STRONGLY ENCOURAGE SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO DEVELOP CONTINGENCY PLANS THAT CAN BE IMMEDIATELY IMPLEMENTED IF 09/10 MID-YEAR REDUCTIONS ARE ENACTED.

### CONCLUSION

"...FURTHERMORE, SCHOOL DISTRICTS ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED NOT TO WAIT FOR THE MAY 19TH SPECIAL ELECTION, THE JUNE 8TH REVISION, OR POTENTIAL REVENUES FROM THE ARRA. SCHOOL DISTRICTS ARE ADVISED TO BEGIN PLANNING NOW FOR NECESSARY REDUCTIONS FOR 09/10 AND 10/11. AT THE SAME TIME WHILE PLANNING NECESSARY BUDGET REDUCTIONS FOR 09/10 AND 10/11, SCHOOL DISTRICTS CAN ALSO DEVELOP PROGRAM OR EXPENDITURE RESTORATION PRIORITIES IF MORE REVENUES ARE MADE AVAILABLE..."
