APPROVE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT WITH DR. LORETTA DONOVAN FOR EVALUATION OF THE LAPTOPS FOR LEARNING PROGRAM
The Fullerton School District launched its Laptops for Learning Program at three schools in the 2004-05 school year. Mr. Mark Warschauer, Department of Education, UCI, conducted the first year evaluation of this program. The laptop program was expanded in the 2005-06 school year due to program successes, which included promotion of the learning skills required for the 21 <sup>st</sup> century. Dr. Loretta Donovan, Department of Education, CSUF, will conduct an evaluation of the Laptops for Learning Program as a follow-up to the year one evaluation performed by Mr. Mark Warschauer. The purpose of this evaluation will be to continue to examine the impact of one-to-one computer access on learning in the Fullerton School District's laptop program.
Not to exceed \$2,000 from Budget #0152657719-5805.
Approve independent contractor agreement with Dr. Loretta Donovan for evaluation of the Laptops for Learning Program.

#### INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is herby entered into between the <u>Fullerton School District</u>, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT" and <u>Dr. Loretta Donovan</u>, hereinafter referred to as 'CONTRACTOR."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal, or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services requires; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experiences and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- Services to be provided by Contractor:
   <u>Dr. Loretta Donovan will provide an evaluation report for the District's Laptops</u> for Learning Program.
- Term. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this agreement on May 10, 2006, and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by June 30, 2006.
- <u>Compensation</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed <u>Two thousand</u> dollars (\$2,000.00). DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions:

Upon completion of services.

- Expenses. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: \_\_\_\_\_\_\_
- 5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this

AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees, or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security, and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR'S employees.

- 7. <u>Originality of Services</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies,

formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.

8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT'S express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all rights, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR'S name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance, and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

9. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:

(a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or

(b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or CONTRACTOR is adjudged as bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a received is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR'S insolvency.

Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within <u>-------</u> (------) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the <u>-------</u> (------) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing Board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage, or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees, or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any persons, including the DISTRICT or its officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm, or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT'S property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees, or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages, which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.

Insurance. Pursuant to Section 10, CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance with limits of \_\_\_\_\_\_

- 12. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR.
- 13. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The service completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT"S general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinance that are not or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR'S business, equipment, and personnel engaged in operations covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such operations.
- 14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR'S employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 15. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

- 16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. - 19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service; or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office.
