Background: Richman School improved from 16.4% (in 2004-05) to 21.7% (in 2005-06) total

students proficient on the CST, yet failed to meet AYP goals of 24.4%. Our growth is, in part, due to the support we have received from Choice of Action, LLC. Our data support that students are learning basic skills and procedures but lack fluency and comprehension in both basal reading and content area reading. To help us continue our positive growth and increase student

achievement, Choice of Action LLC will provide the following:

<u>Customized Professional Development</u> for all grade levels including: Planning Support; facilitate grade level and teacher planning sessions, In-Class Support; provide individualized coaching to individual teachers including demonstration lessons, coaching observations, and GLPD Support; facilitate grade level professional development (GLPD) meetings as requested.

<u>Customized Professional Development</u> will include: large group, small group, and one-on-one support based on the schoolwide professional development plan. Planning support will include the analysis of achievement data to identify student needs and to plan instructional sequences. Monthly days of service will average 8 to 12 days. Total days of Customized Professional Development not to exceed 90 days of service.

<u>Intervention Support</u> for teachers providing in-class interventions and staff working in the school's after school intervention program. Support will include: analysis of student data; development of materials to meet student needs; and the planning sessions. Monthly days of service will average one to two days. Total days of intervention support not to exceed 18 days.

<u>Technical Assistance to School Leadership</u> to promote protocols and programs supporting schoolwide alignment of the literacy initiatives (e.g. Accelerated Reader, Houghton-Mifflin, District benchmark assessments, and DIBELS). RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2000-1 (VAN DAELE) AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVYING OF SPECIAL TAXES WITHIN SAID DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Fullerton School District (the "Board") has heretofore taken proceedings pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, (the "Act") for the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2000-1 (the "District") for the purpose of providing educational facilities for the use of residents of the District; and

WHEREAS, following a special election of the qualified electors of the District, this Board on June 27, 2000, acting as the governing body of the District, adopted Ordinance No. 99/00-1 ("Ordinance") which provided for the levying and collection of special taxes within the District, "as provided in the Act and Ordinance and as approved by the qualified electors; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and appropriate that this Board levy and collect the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2006-2007, by the adoption of a resolution as specified by the Act and Ordinances:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1 In accordance with the Act and Ordinances, there is hereby levied upon all properties within the District, including all annexed territory, which are not otherwise exempt from taxation under the Act or Ordinances the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2006-2007 set forth in the Ordinances at the tax rates as set forth therein and in Exhibit "A" hereto, as may be amended without further action of the Board to reflect updated information on assessor's parcel numbers from the County of Orange. The Assistant Superintendent, Business Services is hereby authorized and directed to establish the final rates to be levied, which final rates shall not exceed the maximum rates.

Section 2 The above-authorized special taxes shall be collected in the same manner as ad valorem property taxes on the secured roll by the Treasurer-Tax Collector of the County of Orange and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for such ad valorem taxes.

Section 3. The Clerk and Assistant Superintendent of Business, are hereby authorized to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Orange County Auditor-Controller, together with other supporting documentation as may be required in order to place said special taxes on the secured property tax roll for Fiscal Year 2006-2007 and to perform all other acts which are required by the Act, Ordinances or by-law in order to accomplish the purpose of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE FULLERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2001-1 (AMERIGE HEIGHTS) AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVYING OF SPECIAL TAXES WITHIN SAID DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Fullerton School District (the "Board") has heretofore taken proceedings pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, (the "Act") for the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2001-1 (the "District") for the purpose of providing educational facilities for the use of residents of the District; and

WHEREAS, following a special election of the qualified electors of the District, this Board on August 28, 2001, acting as the governing body of the District, adopted Ordinance No. 01/02-1 ("Ordinance") which provided for the levying and collection of special taxes within the District, "as provided in the Act and Ordinance and as approved by the qualified electors; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and appropriate that this Board levy and collect the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2006-2007, by the adoption of a resolution as specified by the Act and Ordinances;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1 In accordance with the Act and Ordinances, there is hereby levied upon all properties within the District, including all annexed territory, which are not otherwise exempt from taxation under the Act or Ordinances the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2006-2007 set forth in the Ordinances at the tax rates as set forth therein and in Exhibit "A" hereto, as may be amended without further action of the Board to reflect updated information on assessor's parcel numbers from the County of Orange. The Assistant Superintendent, Business Services is hereby authorized and directed to establish the final rates to be levied, which final rates shall not exceed the maximum rates.

Section 2 The above-authorized special taxes shall be collected in the same manner as ad valorem property taxes on the secured roll by the Treasurer-Tax Collector of the County of Orange and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for such ad valorem taxes.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Clerk and Assistant Superintendent of Business, are hereby authorized to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Orange County Auditor-Controller, together with other supporting documentation as may be required in order to place said special taxes on the secured property tax roll for Fiscal Year 2006-2007 and to perform all other acts which are required by the Act, Ordinances or by-law in order to accomplish the purpose of this Resolution.

The Board Members are acting as three different entities when adopting the 2006-2007 Budget: (1) as the legislative body of the Fullerton School District identified as District 22; (2) as the legislative body of Community Facilities District No. 2000-01 (Van Daele) identified as District 40; and (3) as the legislative body of Community Facilities District No 2001-1 (Amerige Heights) identified as District 48.

The Board previously received the Proposed 2006-2007 Budget, and the 2006-2007 Budget was discussed at the June 27th Budget Workshop. Changes made to reflect the State adopted budget will be presented in the form of budget resolutions and recapped in the First Interim financial report

to be presented to the Board by December 15, 2006.

Funding: Not applicable.

Recommendation: Hold Public Hearing and adopt the 2006-2007 Annual Budget, including

certification regarding Self-Insured Workers' Compensation Claims.

SUBJECT: APPROVE SUPERINTENDENT'S RECOMMENDATIONS FROM COMMITTEES

<u>Background:</u> At the March 28 Board meeting the Board approved a number of budget reduction items.

At the same time a list of "Best Practices" was recommended by the District budget committee, and the Superintendent and Cabinet established a number of committees to

study these recommendations. The Superintendent charged the committees or

administrators with the responsibility of bringing a recommendation to cabinet on June 19 that would then be the basis of the Superintendent's recommendations to the Board on

June 27.

Attached are the items with appropriate recommendations supported by the

Superintendent.

<u>Funding:</u> Various funding accounts.

Recommendation: Approve Superintendent's recommendations from committees.

CMM:ds Attachment 1. Increase MAA claiming. MAA reimburses for administrative costs related to the implementation of Medi-Cal programs. Receipts are unrestricted and go into the General Fund. The District has been billing for coordinators, office staff, psychologists, nurses, Even and Early Start staff, and this year have added principals. The District is continuing to broaden to include other staff, e.g., speech and language specialists and other disciplines as appropriate.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Andrea Reynolds and Dr. Godfrey will analyze this topic with the support of Mark Douglas and Lourene Happoldt, and will report back to the Board.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

- 1) Allocate 25% of MAA income generated by school site staff (principals, assistant principals, office staff) to a separate budget to be distributed back to school sites based on a formula to be determined
- 2) Allocate remaining MAA income to existing costs currently funded from unrestricted general fund income in Special Education/Support Services to free up General Fund unrestricted dollars which reduces encroachment an equal amount.
- 2. Charge for use of facilities research underway. School facilities are widely used by community groups, scout troops, and organizations (including the PTA). Thought should be given to reviewing current charges for use of multipurpose rooms, classrooms, etc. This is especially true when For-Profit service providers offer programs in District facilities.

<u>Recommendation:</u> A District committee is looking at this already and will develop a recommendation. This will be coordinated by Rachel Grantham and Dr. Godfrey.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Adopt the cost structure presented for the 2006/07 academic year to cover General Fund actual direct costs for school support groups, with different pricing structure for "for profit" groups.

3. Increase Medi-Cal billing/charge more to Medi-Cal. While there is less leeway to increase billing than with MAA because Medi-Cal reimburses for actual services and restricts those reimbursements to then be spent on costs that are supplementing, not supplanting, other services, there is some possibility that the District could find ways to extend and further maximize claiming opportunities.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Andrea Reynolds and Dr. Godfrey will analyze this topic with the support of Mark Douglas and Lourene Happoldt, and will report back to the Board.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Continue maximum reimbursement billing to Medi-Cal for services rendered; review new July 2006 regulations in order to maximize reimbursements.

4. Conduct a market survey of unskilled/semi-skilled workers (salaries/compensation). Human resources can work with the Classified Personnel Commission to conduct a salary comparison survey with other districts to determine if any salary amounts are high and thus recommend restructuring the salary for General Fund savings.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Mr. Douglas will work with the Personnel Executive Director and Personnel Commission to develop a plan for implementation. An implementation plan will be reported back to the Board. Superintendent's Recommendation:

- •Continue to survey comparable districts for job descriptions and salaries.
- •Review positions offered by District to determine if lower level positions will serve needs.
- •Review report from Linda Caillet's committee on administrative support.
- No direct cost saving estimates.

5. Enforce criteria for 1 –1 special education aides. Ensure that the required criteria for supporting students with 1-1 instructional aides are enforced as stringently as possible.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Mr. Douglas will work with Special Ed to assure that this happens. Mr. Douglas will report back to the Board.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

- •Continue student assessment process.
- •Continue to refine placement rubric.
- •Develop a reduced dependency schedule.
- •Continue the practice of assigning support to the class, not a student.
- •Support school psychologist in limiting aide support.
- •Train general education teachers to educate special needs students.
- •Maintain a focus on all students being instructed so as not to sacrifice their learning experience.
- 6. Maximize rental of facilities (research underway). This coincides with Facilities Use Fee but focuses more fully on newly constructed facilities and actively marketing the use of those facilities by the community (e.g., NJB using the Ladera Vista gym on the weekends).

Recommendation: The study of this recommendation will be included in the study for #2.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Review marketing opportunities during inaugural 2006/07 for all facilities using fees developed in Best Practices #2.

7. Increase grant income. Proactively apply for competitive grants for District programs. Also, concentrate on opportunities from private and corporate foundations (e.g., the Beckman Foundation Grant for hands-on science) that offer higher levels of indirect offsets as well as fewer and less complex administrative requirements.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Billie Holt is working on this along with Educational Services, and we are experiencing more success all of the time. As grants are secured, the Board will be advised.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Site and District Office personnel consistently search, screen, apply and are awarded competitive grants and foundation awards annually. In addition, District Office staff sustain all Entitlement Grants via meeting all accompanying rules and regulations, most which undergo annual revisions. A partial listing of these is included in Dr. Godfrey's PowerPoint presentation and is always available through the desk of the Administrative Secretary, Educational Services.

8. Increase cost of student lunch by \$0.25. Research student lunch fees charged by neighboring districts. Although this action might result in a nominal drop in the number of lunches purchased, the additional income could offset that possible reduction in lunches served. The income could potentially offset some of the increased indirect costs Food Services will pay the General Fund.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Lisa Saldivar will review financial impact with plans to implement for the 06-07 school year. <u>Superintendent's Recommendation:</u>

Increase each elementary and middle school paid lunch by \$0.25 effective the 2006-07 school year.

9. Reduce contract services (number of vendors to monitor alarms). Maintenance Services will look into coordinating the contracts the District currently has with the three different alarm companies that monitor the alarms at schools throughout the District, potentially generating a cost savings.

<u>Recommendation:</u> The Director of Maintenance and Operations, Larry Lara, will facilitate this and report back to the Board upon completion.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Implement consolidation of contract services for monitoring alarm services to achieve the most effective purchasing rate.

10. Review cost recovery in Severely Handicapped program for non-resident students. Identify the students in this program who are transfers and then determine whether the District is fully reimbursed when providing required services. Action would be determined on a case-by-case basis.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Mr. Douglas will conduct this evaluation and report the results back to the Board Superintendent's Recommendation:

- •Support the SELPA in reviewing practices to maximize cost saving for severely handicapped students.
- •Improve current special needs programs within the District to limit sending students out to non-public programs.
- 11. Increase enrollments in free/reduced lunch program. Enrollment has dropped recently. A concentrated effort by the District to increase enrollment would generate additional income for Food Services and some District Categorical grants.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Dr. Godfrey and Lisa Saldivar will work to promote free and reduced lunch participation. A report will be made to the Board at the end of the year.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Food Services staff to actively market Food Services program offerings to PTAs and school groups; school staffs to communicate availability of Free/Reduced program to parents in a variety of settings.

- 12. School classroom parties restricted to ordering food from Food Services. Consider mandating that no outside vendors be used for school-based events (e.g., pizza). Will be studied to determine impact of pending new Federal nutrition requirements. This will be studied in conjunction with new Federal nutrition guidelines. Recommendation: A committee will be comprised of Lisa Saldivar, two PTA presidents, and a principal from both K-6 and 7-8. Dr. Kit Dameron will chair this study and report back to the Board. Superintendent's Recommendation:
- District staff and parent groups should utilize Food Services whenever possible when they require food items for classroom parties, classroom or group lunches, carnivals, PTA meetings, etc.
- District staff and parent groups should continue to be made aware of the advantages of utilizing Food Services for food items. For example, when using Food Services for classroom pizza parties, students on free lunch will be given pizza at no cost, and students on reduced lunch will be charged a reduced fee. This will be a cost savings for schools or parent groups. Additionally, schools or groups may utilize a combination of Food Services and outside vendors.
- In support of the State Advisory Committee on Nutrition, District personnel and parent groups should emphasize the importance of offering food and snacks with nutritional value.
- School and parent groups should be made aware of the Health Department requirements to ensure that food given to students meets their guidelines.

13. Review/bid self-insurance for worker's compensation and property/liability. Business Services to work with providers to determine whether a self-insured program would result in cost savings to the District given our improved record and proactive risk management programs.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Dr. Godfrey and Mark Douglas will work with staff to assess the possibilities of cost savings and will report back to the Board.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Continue current design for Property/Liability and Workers' Compensation insurance programs. The estimated cost of current property and liability structure is approximately 50% of the cost to buy a similar for-profit premium insurance policy.

14. Review/bid dental and vision self-insurance. Fiscal Services to work with current providers to determine whether a self-insured program would result in cost savings to the District. There would be no change to the covered benefits of the plans.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Dr. Godfrey will work with her staff to assess the possibilities of cost savings and will report back to the Board.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Transition to a self-insured dental program with an estimated savings of 5%; research feasibility of a self-insured vision program. The dental conversion to self-insurance can be implemented by January 1, 2007.

15. Investigate the possibility of alternative retirement plan for part time and seasonal classified employees. Personnel will review options for offering other plans with similar/same benefits that will save the District and employees cost.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Mr. Douglas will study this possibility and report back to the Board prior to implementation. Superintendent's Recommendation:

Cost savings: \$10,000 per year

- •Implement program for substitute teachers and classified substitutes not represented through CSEA or FETA starting 2006-2007.
- •Open negotiations with CSEA to offer the program to all employees who work less than 1,000 hours.
- 16. Revise Print Shop timelines to better be able to process PTA newsletters. Print Shop and PTA timelines prevent some PTAs from utilizing the shop for newsletters, and income is reduced accordingly. Ask Print Shop personnel to revise timelines and reach out to PTAs to encourage additional business.

Recommendation: Dr. Godfrey will work with Andrea Reynolds, Judy Lieb, and a representative of the PTA to assure that timelines area conducive to PTAs getting their work done by our Print Shop. The EMC will also be reviewed to assure that prices are appropriate and available to PTAs. A comparison of other EMCs will be conducted.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Increase the copy price in both EMC and Print Shop for all paper types by one cent instead of only B/W copies as approved by the Board on March 28; potential increased revenue (\$45,000) to be set aside as an equipment replacement reserve for both EMC and Print Shop.

17. Encourage paperless transactions where possible (e.g., newsletters via email). Reduced paper costs would be an obvious savings. May require some upfront time investment to provide adequate databases for distribution

Recommendation: A committee, chaired by Tony Anderson, will be established to study the possibilities and

will report back to the Superintendent.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

In an effort to expand the use of paperless transactions in the District, the Superintendent recommends that staff: 1) investigate the use of workflow management systems to support the electronic submission and routing of forms-based data, 2) expand the use of current paperless systems to insure maximum benefit from those systems, 3) reduce flyer distribution from the schools to parents by notifying parents either through a weekly mailing or via a school web page of flyers available at school for review, 4) expand the use of web-based calendaring systems to manage District resources and personnel, 5) expand the use of online registration systems for District events, and 6) provide curriculum support materials and guides as digital files on CD or other media or as files available on the District's web site.

18. Ask City to resume paying 100% of crossing guard costs instead of 50%/50% (\$112,000 annual District savings.) In 1996, during a City budget crunch, the District agreed to the City's request for the District to assume 50% of the costs of crossing guards. With the changes in educational funding, the Committee recommends that the City be asked to resume paying full costs after this ten-year hiatus.

Recommendation: The Superintendent will meet with the City Manager to determine the feasibility of making this change.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

The City is taking on the responsibility for crossing guards, and all future decisions regarding crossing guards will be decided by the City with input by District officials.

19. Establish a committee to study Transportation Operations in order to reduce encroachment of \$250,000. Committee to include parents and community members to identify areas they recommend can achieve savings or increased income.

<u>Recommendation:</u> A committee comprised of citizen representation, staff and experts will study the current transportation operation and will report back to the Superintendent. I recommend Tish Koch to facilitate this committee with Dr. Godfrey as Chair and Mike Brito and Mark Douglas providing support. Superintendent's Recommendation:

- Allocate an increased percentage of the Director of Transportation's salary and benefits to Fund 68, Workers' Compensation.
- Eliminate vacant relief driver position.
- Eliminate Ladera Vista route from the Beechwood attendance area in fiscal year 2006-07.
- Eliminate Clerical Assistant II position in the Transportation Department.
- Increase parent pay charges by 23% in fiscal year 2006-07, to \$270, and an additional 17% in fiscal year 2007-08, to \$315.
- Initiate a coordinated bell schedule at all schools to maximize transportation efficiency and support further implementation of Professional Learning Communities to improve student learning.
- 20. Study Administrative Support Service Levels District-wide.

Recommendation: A committee of administrators, citizen representation, Association representatives, and a PTA representative will study the current structure and make a recommendation to the Superintendent. Dr. Caillet will chair this committee with support provided by Mark Douglas.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Previous work has taken place in this area. A recommendation at that time was to bring in outside support to assist in an updated evaluation of needs as the next step. It is planned to move in this direction in the fall of 2006/07 when Dr. Caillet and Mr. Douglas convene their committee, review previous progress, assess current

needs and come to consensus on a plan to complete this work in time for implementation in the 2007/08 school year. Final recommendations will be shared with the Board of Trustees in the spring of 2007.

21. Communication is critical to public understanding and community support of the needs of the school District. A committee member recommended that better communication be established between the District and the community. The Superintendent recommends that the communication needs of the District be studied and that a recommendation be made as to the best way to address this need. The committee should include a PTA member, at least one Cabinet member, and at least one community member in the communications field. This committee will be chaired by the Superintendent.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

The Superintendent has reestablished the Superintendent's Advisory Committee, and regular meetings are being scheduled for next year on a regular basis. The Superintendent will continue to meet with employee representatives on a regular basis, as he has this year, and will continue to meet with PTA Presidents monthly.

22. The Superintendent's Cabinet will review current administrative assignments and evaluate future administrative needs based on current resources. Some schools may, in fact, need additional resources based on indicated needs such as AYP and NCLB indications.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Based on current information, the District will most likely realize a large number of retirements of administrative staff in July 2007. The Superintendent has developed a plan to address this issue and is working with the Board on recommendations that will help the District to continue to run smoothly while staffs are transitioning. Consequently, the further reduction in administrative staff at this time is not recommended.

23. Dr. Godfrey will work with Larry Lara, Dan Looney, Manny Reyes, and Mark Douglas to develop a midyear switch as quickly as possible and a final recommendation for the Board. Superintendent's Recommendation:

Implement planned schedule for Light/Heavy cleaning effective first day of school August 30, 2006.

SUBJECT: ADOPT DECLARATION OF NEED FOR FULLY QUALIFIED EDUCATORS

FOR THE 2006-2007 SCHOOL YEAR

Background: As of 1996, a "Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators" must be

completed and adopted yearly based on the anticipated need for the subsequent school year. This Declaration has to be Board adopted and submitted to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing before any credentials

may be renewed.

The Fullerton School District has the following general needs that may be met through the emergency credential and/or waiver process:

- Classroom teachers to meet authorization for instruction to limited English proficient students per Williams Lawsuit in schools ranked in deciles 1-3.
- All CORE Academic Subject teachers to become NCLB compliant.
- Filling English language development, special education positions for which a specialist credential is required in addition to a basic teaching credential.
- Filling Preschool, special education positions for which a specialist credential is required.
- Filling Speech Therapist positions where there is such a shortage of specialists.
- Filling positions at the junior high which are hard to find, i.e., home economics, health, foreign language, science, math, English or English Language Learners, and band.
- Obtaining certification for those teachers, who, because of scheduling needs, teach one or two periods outside their credentialed area, i.e., five periods of English and one period of physical education.
- Filling positions with teachers from out of state or private schools to allow these educators additional time to complete California credentialing requirements.

The Board of Trustees is required to adopt the "Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators" at a public meeting certifying that there may be an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the District's specific

employment criteria for identified positions. The completed Declaration is filed with the Commission on Teacher Credentialing and permits the District to obtain short-term certifications as needed during the school year.

<u>Funding:</u> Refer to the AB 1200 Report for general provisions.

Recommendation: Approve settlement agreement between the Fullerton School District and the

Fullerton Elementary Teachers Association (FETA) for 2006-2007 salary

adjustment and requires AB 1200 disclosures.

Proposed Settlement Agreement between the Fullerton School District and the Fullerton Elementary Teachers Association (FETA) for the 2006-2007 Salary Adjustment

ARTICLE 13 LEAVES OF ABSENCE

- H. Judicial and Official Appearance
- 1. Witness in Court

Teachers may be granted leave of absence with pay by the District for the following reasons:

- a. To appear as a witness in court.
- b. To respond to an official order from another governmental jurisdiction.

Payment shall not exceed the difference between witness fees and the teacher's regular earnings, less travel fees. No salary will be paid in cases where a teacher is a voluntary witness appearing in his/her own interests, except as provided under Personal Necessity Leave.

2. Jury Duty

The District shall grant a teacher a leave of absence with pay up to the amount of difference between the teacher's regular earnings and the amount received as jury fees.

An employee who receives a jury duty notice during the school year may request a postponement of jury duty from a work day (or days) to a non-work day (or days) and will receive substitute teacher pay rate for each day the employee is on jury duty during the non-work days upon validation of service.

ARTICLE 16 SALARIES

A. The Certificated Salary Schedule in effect on June 30, 2003 (Appendix A) shall be increased effective February 1, 2005 by 2.5%.

Effective July 1, 2005 The Certificated Salary Schedule shall be increased by 3.00%.

Effective February 1, 2006 The Certificated Salary Schedule shall be increased by 2.00%.

Effective July 1, 2006 The Certificated Salary Schedule shall be increased by 2.00 5.60%.

Effective February 1, 2007 The Certificated Salary Schedule shall be increased by 2.00%.

Contingency Language With Examples

STRS

If the State's present contribution to STRS is shifted to school districts, the employees in the STRS system will pay the increased amount through payroll reduction. Any increase above the projected funded Base Revenue Limit (BRL) of 5.0% for 2005-06 and 3.2% for 2006-07 will be placed directly on the salary schedule effective July 1 of 2005-06 and 2006-07 respectively, up to the amount of the increased STRS payroll deduction. Any funded BRL increase above this amount will be implemented as indicated below.

2005-2006 Increases

If the funded BRL is above 5.0% and there is no significant state funding shift to school districts, the District will supplement the July 1 salary increase by an amount up to 0.3%. If the increase is greater than 0.3%, the District will supplement the July 1 salary increase by half the difference between 0.3% and 0.5%. An additional .6% will be added to the July 1, 2006

salary schedule to resolve any additional salary concerns brought forth by the Mediation and its impact for 2005-2006. The salary averaging formula proposed for 2005-2006 is no longer in force. If the funded BRL increases greater than 0.5%, the parties will compare the average salary settlements as of February 1, 2006 of those elementary districts ranking above the District to the scheduled salary increase, and increase the salary schedule effective February to equal the average salary increase of the elementary districts ranking above the District. Excluded from these comparisons is any district that restructures its health and welfare benefit plans with the effect to raise salaries. Ex. If the increase in BRL for 2005-06 is 5.2% and there is no significant funding shift to the school district the 0.2% will be added to the proposed 3.0% for July 1 totaling 3.2%. If the increase in BRL moves to 5.4% the 0.1% above the 0.3% will be split evenly between the District and the July 1, 2005 salary adjustment. The increase would reflect a 3.35% increase in July 1, 2005. If the BRL moves to 5.8 % for 2005-06 the first 0.3% will be added to July 1, 2005 salary schedule plus 0.1 percent for the equal split for any amount between 0.3% and 0.5%. Prior to the averaging of salary increases the salary increase for July 1, 2005 would be 3.4%. The final adjustment would take place if the comparison districts that rank above Fullerton settle for an average greater amount than 5.5%. If they settle for more than 5.5% then the amount above would be added to the February 1, 2006 increase.

2006-2007 Increases

If the funded BRL is above 3.2%, and there is no significant state funding shift to school districts, the parties will compare the average salary settlements as of February 1, 2007 of those elementary districts ranking above the District to the scheduled salary increase, and increase the salary schedule effective February 1, to equal the average salary increase of the elementary districts ranking above the District. Excluded from these comparisons is any school district that restructures its health and welfare benefit plans with the effect to raise salaries.

If the comparison districts who rank above Fullerton settle for an average greater amount than 3.2% the amount above would be added to the February 1,2007 increase. If the average of the districts above FSD equals 3.4% then 0.2% will be added to the February 1, 2007 salary increase equaling a 2.2%.

2005-2006 and 2006-2007 Funding Decreases

If the funded BRL is below 5.0% for 2005-06 or below 3.2% for 2006-07, and there is no significant state funding shift to school districts, the District will decrease the February 1 salary increase by the amount that exceeds 0.3% or to the level of the average salary settlements as of February 1, 2006 or February 1, 2007, of those elementary districts ranking above the District depending on which is the least reduction. Excluded from these comparisons is any school district that restructures its health and welfare benefit plans with the effect to raise salaries.

Example #1

If the BRL falls to 4.7% for 2005-06, no change would occur to the February increase. If the BRL falls to 4.5%, the scheduled increase for February 1 would decrease by 0.2%, unless the average settlements of those districts above Fullerton equals a lesser amount. For instance, if the average settlement were 4.7% no reduction would occur, or if the average were 4.4% the reduction would not fall below the 4.5% indicated above.

Example #2

As in the example above, if there is not a change of at least 0.3% below the anticipated 3.2% change to the funded BRL for 2006-07, then no change would occur to the 2.0% + 2.0%

salary increases scheduled in 2006-07. If there were a reduction greater than 0.3%, the difference between 0.3% and the actual decrease would be reduced from the 2.0% salary increase scheduled for February 1, 2007. For instance, if the funded BRL is2.7% then the February 1 salary increase of 2.0% would be reduced to 1.8% (3.2% - 2.7% = 0.5%, then 0.5% - 0.3% = 0.2%, then 2.0% -0.2% = 1.8%).

Significant Funding Change

If there is a significant state funding change to District income or expense in 2005/06 or 2006/07, either party may request to reopen negotiations. An example of a significant state funding change is the Governor's proposed STRS shift from the state obligation to school districts. The cost to the District of this example is estimated to be 1% of General Fund Expenditures.

B. Effective June 30, 2004 Appendix C Section B- shall be modified in the following manner:

Class IV (Column IV)—Bachelor's Degree plus 60 semester units including a Master's Degree. The Masters requirement may be waived upon completion of a pre-approved program. In order to qualify for such a waiver, the unit member must:

- i) Currently be on Class III (Column III) of the Certificated Salary Schedule.
- ii) Submit a proposal to the PAR Joint Panel that is focused on education and,
 - a) Include a "thesis" like project,
 - b) Include the equivalent of 30 units of supporting coursework, not including courses that were previously counted for column movement (up to 6 units of coursework taken within the previous three years may be credited), and;
 - c) <u>Present on-going evidence of progression towards completion at predetermined benchmarks.</u>
 - d) Upon satisfactory completion of the program, as decided by the District and the PAR Joint Panel, movement to Class IV (Column IV) will be effective for the following pay period.

APPENDIX C

TEACHER SALARY SCHEDULE RULES

B. Teacher Salary Schedule

Teachers assigned to the Teachers Salary Schedule are those regular full-time teachers who are part of the Association's bargaining unit defined in Article II, Recognition, with the exception of Certificated Preschool Personnel.

The Teacher Salary Schedule attached hereto as Appendix A consists of four (4) columns arranged in horizontal order, which are based on numbers of units of acceptable study, and various vertical steps which are based upon the number of years of acceptable teaching experience. The four (4) columns and their requirements are as follows:

Class I (Col. I)	Bachelor's Degree
Class II (Col. II)	Bachelor's Degree up to 30 semester units
Class III (Col. III)	Bachelor's Degree plus 45 semester units
	including a Master's Degree or Bachelor's
	Degree plus 50 semester units

Class IV (Col. IV)

Bachelor's Degree plus 60 semester units

including a Master's Degree

Only those units which are:

1. Upper division or graduate level,

2. Specifically required for certification in an area in which the teacher is assigned, e.g., bilingual.

Probationary teachers with a SB 2042 preliminary credential, who have successfully completed the District's BTSA induction program, will be given credit for up to 30 semester units on Class II (Col. II) of the Certificated Salary Schedule.

Probationary teachers hired with a SB 2042 clear credential will be given credit for up to 30 semester units on Class II (Col. II) of the Certificated Salary Schedule, upon the completion of their probationary period.

Business Policy No.: 3513.3

<u>Tobacco Free Schools</u> Board Adopted:

The Governing Board recognizes the health hazards associated with smoking and the use of tobacco products, including the breathing of second-hand smoke, and desires to provide a healthy environment for students and staff.

The Board prohibits the use of tobacco products at any time in district-owned or leased buildings, on district property and in district vehicles.

This prohibition applies to all employees, students and visitors at any instructional program, activity or athletic event.

Smoking or use of any tobacco-related products and disposal of any tobacco-related waste are prohibited within 25 feet of any playground, except on a public sidewalk located within 25 feet of the playground.

HIRING AND PLACEMENT CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Board Adopted:

The Board of Trustees of the Fullerton School District has the right under law to regulate the location and assignment of the employees of the District. The Superintendent/designee, with the concurrence of the Board, shall assign all employees of the District to the positions in which they are to serve. This power to assign shall include the power to transfer an employee from one location, department, or unit to another within the District when the Superintendent/designee determines that the transfer is in the best interest of the District. At no time shall assignments and/or transfers be used in a punitive, retaliatory or discriminatory manner.

No person initially employed by the District nor any person currently employed by the District shall be assigned to a location where a close relative is assigned if such assignment is deemed by the Superintendent/designee to interfere with the supervision, security, safety, efficiency or morale of the unit. The Superintendent/designee in keeping with the law shall determine work locations and assignments. The best interests of the District, the students, and other employees shall be considered when making such decisions. This policy shall be applied when persons assigned to the same location become related by marriage or civil union.

No person initially employed by the District nor any current employee of the District shall be assigned to a department or location where he/she will be supervised by a close relative unless it is determined by the Superintendent/designee to be in the best interest of the District. Transfers shall be arranged as soon as possible when persons in a supervisory position becomes related by marriage or civil union to an employee under his/her supervision unless it is determined by the Superintendent/designee to be in the best interest of the District for the assignment to remain as is.

For the purpose of this policy, close relative is defined as follows: parent, step-parent, grandparent, or grandchild of the employee or of the spouse of the employee; and the spouse, civil union partner, son, son-in-law, daughter, daughter-in-law, or sibling of the employee or of the spouse of the employee or their children; or any relative or person living in the immediate household of the employee.
